A's vs. INDIANS

The season series is even at two games each as the A's won the first meeting in Oakland last night after losing two of three in Cleveland in July...the A's lost the season series last year 4-5 and have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and four of the last five...are 22-28 against the Indians since 2004...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 239-212 against the Indians...that breaks down to 126-93 in Oakland and 113-119 in Cleveland...all-time, the A's are 874-1005 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded his 25th save of the season last night, an on-going Oakland rookie record...has converted each of his last 20 save opportunities, which is also an Oakland rookie record...leads ML rookies and ranks tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in saves.

Rajai Davis stole his 39th base of the season last night, which is fourth in the American League and the most by an Athletic not named Rickey Henderson since Jose Canseco had 40 steals in 1988...he is batting .345 (71 for 206) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best average in the AL.

Kurt Suzuki has a team leading 78 RBI...in Athletics history, the only catcher to lead the team in RBI was Frankie Hayes, who had 78 for Philadelphia in 1944.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On **September 18, 1930** The A's clinch their second consecutive AL Championship with a 14-10 win over Chicago...on **September 18, 2000** Jason Giambi breaks Jose Canseco's single season RBI record as he drives in two runs in the A's 12-3 win at Baltimore...Giambi would go on to finish the season with 137 RBI...on **September 18, 2002** Billy Koch saves his 40th game in the A's 7-4 win over Anaheim to become the first pitcher in Major League history with 40 saves and 10 wins in the same season.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four consecutive games, which is the A's second longest winning streak of the season...the season best in seven straight from June 2-8...have also won six of the last seven games and nine of the last 11 and are 10 games under .500 for the first time since June 26...the A's went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 37-35 since then (June 29)...swept a three-game series at Texas to start the week, just their third series sweep of the season and their first since June 5-7 against Baltimore in Oakland...that snapped a streak of 27 consecutive series without a sweep, which equaled the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the A's first sweep of a series of three or more games on the road since June 13-15 of last year at San Francisco...are 24-38 (.387) against Western division teams and 44-40 (.524) against teams from the Central and East...were officially eliminated from the playoffs Tuesday night in game 144 and were eliminated from the American League West Sunday in game 142...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 143...have spent each of the last 138 days (since May 3) and 144 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

PITCHING: The A's allowed two runs last night after allowing one run in the three-game series at Texas...have allowed just three runs in the last four games (3 er in 36.0 ip, 0.75), marking the 13th time in Oakland history the A's allowed three runs or less over a four-game span...the last time was June 1-4 when they allowed three runs in a four-game series against Minnesota...the four-game stretch has lowered the season ERA one-tenth of a run from 4.39 to 4.29...the A's have allowed a .142 (17 for 120) opponents batting average over the last four games...rank fourth in the American League in ERA and are tied for the second fewest home runs (145).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 10-5 in the month of September, which is tied with Boston for the second best record in the American League (New York, 11-5)...have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season, the first time they have done that since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's are 17-28 (.378) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 51-50 (.505) against right-handed starters...the mark against lefties is second worst in the American League (Kansas City, 18-36)...are batting .244 against left-handed pitchers and .265 against righties...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the AL (Seattle, .254).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone six consecutive games without an error, which is the second longest errorless streak of the season...went seven consecutive errorless contests from August 5-11...have 85 errors for the season with 16 games remaining...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 31-29 since the All-Star Break...are batting .278 (584 for 2103), which is third best in the American League and fourth best in the majors...hit .246 before the break...have a Major League leading 69 stolen bases since the break, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1991 (71)...also lead the majors in doubles after the break (133), rank third in runs (310) and fifth in extra base hits (196).

OFFENSE: The A's have 16 stolen bases in the last nine games and rank fourth in the American League and the majors with 123 steals for the season...over the last 16 years, the only time the A's have stolen more bases was in 1998 when they had 131...rank last in the AL in home runs (125) and slugging percentage (.394), second to last in extra base hits (416), have the third fewest triples (16) and are fourth in lowest batting average (.259) and lowest on-base percentage (.326)...have 480 walks and are on pace for 532 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...are on pace to hit 139 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-1 with a 3.36 ERA (21 er in 56.1 ip) over the last 10 games and are 46-56 with a 4.71 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (816.0) in the American League, the fourth fewest wins and the fourth highest ERA...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...Brett Tomko and Edgar Gonzalez started the first two games of the Texas series to begin the week, marking just the seventh time this year and the first time since May 9-10 the A's had back-to-back games in which they did not start a rookie...have started a rookie pitcher 105 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 79 of the last 99 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this eight-game homestand against Cleveland (1-0) and Texas (four games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 35-36 (.493) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0), marking just their second winning road trip of more than one series this year...are now 14-10 (.583) over the last 24 road games but are 33-42 (.440) for the season...will finish with a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Vin Mazzaro on the disabled list today, marking the 17th time this year and the 64th time since the start of the 2007 season the A's have used the DL...the 17 players have combined to miss 884 games, an average of 52.0 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 28th start of the season and his career...this is his third professional season...the A's are 12-15 (.444) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings 15 times, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 21 times.

TWO-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has won each of his two starts in September (5 er in 12.0 ip, 3.75 ERA) for the fourth two-game winning streak of his career...has never won three in a row.

LAST 14 STARTS: Is 6-3 with a 3.31 ERA (33 er in 89.2 ip), .232 (76 for 328) opponents batting average and six home runs over his last 14 starts after going 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs over his first 13 starts.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start, which is tied with Cahill for the team lead...is attempting to become the third pitcher in Oakland history under the age of 22 to win 10 games (see chart on lower left) and the seventh rookie 10-game winner (last by Joe Blanton, 12 in 2005)...Trevor Cahill has nine wins, giving the A's two 21-year olds with at least nine wins for the first time in Oakland history...that last time it happened in franchise history was in 1966 in Kansas City (Nash, 12 and Hunter, 9)...the last Major League team to have two pitchers under the age of 22 with at least nine wins is the 1984 Kansas City Royals (Bret Saberhagen, 10 and Mark Gubicza, 10).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Leads Major League rookies with 129 strikeouts, which is the third best rookie total in Oakland history...is tied for second among American League rookies in starts (27), ranks third in innings pitched (158.2) and tied for seventh in wins (9)...has one of five shutouts by an AL rookie this year and one of 11 complete games.

MORE LEADERS: Is tied for fourth in the American League in grounded into double plays (22) and tied for eighth in unearned runs (10).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or less in 13 of his 27 starts and his season run support of 4.54 (80 rs in 158.2 ip) is ninth lowest in the American League...is 0-9 in his 13 starts with run support of two runs or less and 9-1 with run support of three runs or more.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 5-3 with a 3.57 ERA (32 er in 80.2 ip) in 14 starts on five or more days rest and 4-7 with a 5.19 ERA (45 er in 78.0 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest.

21-YEAR OLDS WITH 25 OR MORE STARTS: Is making his 28th start of the season, which is fourth in Oakland history and sixth in Athletics history by a player under the age of 22...fellow 21-year old Trevor Cahill has made 30 starts...this is the first time in the history of the Athletics franchise the A's have had two pitchers under the age of 22 make at least 25 starts in the same season...the last Major League team to do it is the 1980 Chicago White Sox and the only other American League team to do it is the 1912 St. Louis Browns...according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the seventh ML team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 25 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .226 (12 for 53) average with runners in scoring position over his last 14 starts after opponents hit .386 (27 for 70) with RISP over his first 13 starts...has allowed a .317 average with RISP for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League...opponents are 6 for 12 (.500) with the bases loaded.

THE LONG BALL: Has yielded 13 of his 19 home runs on the road and nine with two outs...six have been hit by the opponents number seven hitter...allowed a three-run home run to Lowell in the first inning on July 29, snapping a six-start, 39.0-inning, 154-batters homerless streak.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA in six starts in the month of August after going 2-1 with a 1.87 ERA and .168 opponents batting average in five starts...led all American League pitchers in opponents batting average in July, ranked second in ERA (Washburn, SEA 1.44) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (33)...had an ERA of 5.00 or more in each of the first three months.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 win at Minnesota last Saturday...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed sacrifice flies to Span in the third inning and Kubel in the fourth inning...those were the only two runs he would allowed in seven innings and he retired each of the final eight batters he faced...the A's scored twice in the fifth for the win.

ANDERSON vs. CLEVELAND: Is making his first career appearance and start.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-6, 6.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18th appearance and 15th start of the season...is 1-4 with a 7.55 ERA and .303 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his previous four starts...has a 6.31 ERA, which is third highest among American League pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched...has struck out 89 batters in 82.2 innings, an average of 9.69 strikeouts per nine innings...that is the sixth highest ratio in the AL among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched...his 89 strikeouts rank seventh among AL rookies...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-0 loss at Minnesota last Sunday (3.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance and start against the Indians, a 5-2 A's win at Cleveland on July 5 of this year (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so).

22-22, 3.59 ERA (491.1 ip, 455 h, 216 r, 196 er, 174 bb, 433 so, 39 hr) **Save/Save Opportunities: 35/47 (74.5%)**
 The A's bullpen now has a 15.0-inning scoreless streak and has compiled a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) over its last nine games and now has a 3.59 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...has 433 strikeouts, which is an Oakland record and are also the most in the AL...the pen also leads the AL in fewest home runs (39), ranks second in innings pitched (491.1), has the third fewest walks (174) and is third in save percentage (74.5%)...also leads the AL in first batter strikeouts (97) and ranks tied for second in first batter grounded into double plays (7)...has issued the third fewest walks (26) against first batters in the AL...has a 2.83 ERA (75 er in 238.2 ip), 12 home runs allowed and 67 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.31 ERA (121 er in 252.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 107 walks issued on the road.

- Notched his 25th save last night which is on-going Oakland rookie record (previous: 23 by Huston Street in 2005)...leads Major League rookies and ranks tied for eighth among all American League pitchers in saves...the save last night also ties him with Jorge Julio (BAL, 2002) for the seventh most ever by an AL rookie.
- Has now converted each of his last 20 save opportunities, which is also an Oakland rookie record, topping Street's mark of 18 in 2005...the streak is the second longest active streak in the AL (Rivera, 36)...has a 1.45 ERA (37.1 ip, 24 h, 6 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 37 so, 2 hr) during the streak, which spans 33 games dating back to June 17.
- Ranks second among AL relievers in strikeouts (85), third in innings pitched (78.1), fourth in opponents batting average (.176), fourth in ERA (1.95) and tied for fifth in wins (6).
- Has retired each of his last 18 first batters faced and they are hitting .136 (8 for 59) for the season, which is sixth lowest in the AL...also has struck out 19 first batters faced which is tied for seventh most among AL relievers.
- Ranks second among AL rookies in games pitched (63) and ninth in strikeouts (85)...his games pitched are fourth most by a rookie in Oakland history (Small, 71 in 1997; Street, 67 in 2005; Lacey, 64 in 1977).
- Made his second appearance against Cleveland last night...has converted the save in both of his outings (2.1 ip, 2 h, 3 so).
- Had his streak of 16 games and 16.2 innings without a walk come to an end last Saturday when he walked Morneau with two outs in the ninth.
