A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series, 9-6...have won seven of the last eight games after losing five of the first seven...went 5-4 in Texas and are 4-2 in Oakland...need one more win to clinch their first season series win over the Rangers since 2005...are 34-38 against Texas since 2006...the A's are 275-282 against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 145-131 in Oakland and 129-151 in Texas...have an all-time record of 372-364 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded his 25th save of the season last Thursday, an on-going Oakland rookie record...has converted each of his last 20 save opportunities, which is also an Oakland rookie record...leads ML rookies and ranks ninth among all AL pitchers in saves.

Rajai Davis is batting .347 (76 for 219) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best average in the AL...he is batting .340 (99 for 291) since June 1, which is the fifth best average in the majors over that span.

Kurt Suzuki has a team leading 79 RBI...in Athletics history, the only catcher to lead the team in RBI was Frankie Hayes, who had 78 for Philadelphia in 1944.

Ryan Sweeney is batting .351 (20 for 57) with eight doubles and 14 RBI in 15 games in September.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On September 21, 1970 Vida Blue no hits the Minnesota Twins in the A's 5-0 win at the Coliseum...only a fourth inning, two out walk to Harmon Killebrew prevented Blue from tossing a perfect game...on September 21, 1992 Dennis Eckersley becomes the second pitcher in Major League history to record 50 saves when he preserves Ron Darling's 6-5 win at Chicago...he would go on to save a franchise record 51 games and win both the American League MVP and Cy Young awards. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven straight, nine of the last 10 and 12 of the last 14 games to move to seven games under .500 for the first time since June 22...went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 40-35 (.533) since June 29, which is the fifth best record in the American League over that span...were officially eliminated from the playoffs last Tuesday in game 144...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 143...have spent each of the last 141 days (since May 3) and 147 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the 147 days in last matches the 1979 club for second most in Oakland history...the record is 153 days in 1997...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...the A's are 17-30 (.362) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season ended today and 54-48 (.529) against everyone else.

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have matched their season high with a seven-game winning streak...also won seven in a row from June 2-8...the last time the A's won more than seven straight was from June 8-18, 2006 when they had a 10-game winning streak...have outscored the opposition 45-12 during the winning streak and have never trailed...the pitching staff has compiled a 1.29 ERA (9 er in 63.0 ip) while holding the opposition to a .179 (40 for 223) batting average, including .077 (4 for 52) with runners in scoring position...the offense is batting .310 (76 for 245).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 13-5 in the month of September, which is tied with Boston for the best record in the majors...with one more win, the A's will clinch a winning record in a month for the first time since June of 2008 (16-10)...currently have a streak of eight consecutive months without a winning record, which equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998...have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season, the first time they have done that since 1993.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-0 on this eight-game homestand against Cleveland (4-0) and Texas (four games)...now have a six-game home winning streak, which is their longest since August 11-September 1, 2006, when they won 10 straight home games...went 4-3 on the last homestand and are 38-36 (.514) at home for the season...finished with a losing record at home just once over the previous 11 seasons (40-41 in 2007)...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0), marking just their second winning road trip of more than one series this year...are now 14-10 (.583) over the last 24 road games but are 33-42 (.440) for the season...will finish with a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season.

PLAYERS USED: John Meloan became the 49th player to appear in a game for the A's yesterday, which equals the third highest single season total in Oakland history...used 51 players last year and an Oakland record 54 players in 2007...he is the 25th pitcher the A's have used this year, which is one short of the Oakland record of 26 set in 1997...a total of 105 different players have appeared in at least one game for the A's over the last three years, ranging from Jack Cust (408 games) to Meloan, Kevin Melillo and Chad Reineke (1 game each).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's have a five-game winning streak against American League West teams but are 19-25 (.432) against the West for the season...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 24-38 (.387) record against Western division teams and 47-40 (.540) against teams from the Central and East.

SERIES NOTES: The A's swept the four-game series from Cleveland, their first four-game sweep since August 26-29, 2005 at Baltimore, a span of 39 series...it was the A's first four-game series sweep in Oakland since August 23-26, 2004, also against Baltimore...the A's have won three straight series for just the second time this year (August 3-12)...are 4-0-3 over the last seven series and have not lost a series since getting swept at Seattle, August 24-26...the seven series without a loss is the A's longest stretch since July 27-September 3, 2006 when they went 10-0-1 over an 11 series stretch...swept a three-game series at Texas last week...it was the A's first sweep since June 5-7 against Baltimore, snapping a streak of 27 consecutive series without a sweep, which equaled the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has lowered the season ERA .15 runs to 4.24 during the current winning streak...now have the fourth lowest ERA in the American League...has not allowed a home run in the last five games, equaling their longest streak over the last two years (July 8-12, 2008)...has allowed 145 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-1 with a 3.08 ERA (26 er in 76.0 ip) over the last 14 games but are 48-56 with a 4.65 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (830.2) in the American League and the fourth fewest wins...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 107 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...have started a rookie pitcher in 81 of the last 102 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of their last two games after putting together a season high tying seven game errorless streak...now have 87 errors with 13 games remaining...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 34-29 (.540) since the All-Star Break, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are batting .282 (622 for 2208), which is third best in the AL and fourth best in the majors...hit .246 before the break...have a Major League leading 71 stolen bases since the break, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1991 (71)...also lead the majors in doubles after the break (140), rank third in runs (331) and fourth in extra base hits (206).

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League and the majors with 125 stolen bases...over the last 16 years, the only time the A's have stolen more bases was in 1998 when they had 131...are batting .261, which is the highest the season average has been outside the first eight games of the season...rank last in the AL in home runs (128) and slugging percentage (.397)...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125...have 486 walks and the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 25^{th} appearance and fifth start of the season...it will be the 40^{th} start of his career...the A's are 1-3 (.250) in his starting assignments and his teams are 13-26 (.333) when he starts in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: allowed one run in three of his four starts this year and is 0-1 with a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) as a starter...his first two appearances this year were starts and the other two starts have come over his three September appearances...is 0-1 with a 5.21 ERA (22 er in 38.0 ip) in 20 relief appearances...is now 8-20 with a 5.64 ERA (124 er in 198.0 ip) in 39 career starts and 6-3 with a 5.94 ERA (77 er in 116.2 ip) in 65 career relief appearances.

LIMITED ACTION: Has pitched just three times over the last 36 days, four times over the last 43 days and five times over the last 49 days.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-0 with a 3.34 ERA (11 er in 29.2 ip) and .219 (23 for 105) opponents batting average in 14 games in Oakland and 0-2 with a 6.26 ERA (19 er in 27.1 ip) and .322 (37 for 115) average in 10 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .217 (23 for 106) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters and .325 (37 for 114) against left-handers...has 9 walks and 22 strikeouts against righties and 16 walks and 13 strikeouts against lefties...yielded no home runs over his first 20 games and 45.1 innings but has allowed two in his last four games and 11.2 innings...both of his home runs have been hit by lefthanded hitters and both have been solo shots...has yielded a .333 (34 for 102) average against the one through four hitters and .220 (26 for 118) to the five through nine hitters.

MORE RELIEF: Tossed at least 1.0 inning in each of his 20 relief appearances including 2.0 or more 11 times...his longest outing was 3.2 innings on August 8 at Kansas City...allowed 2 of 11 (18.2%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced hit .211 (4 for 19)...allowed just two runs over his first four relief appearances (7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA) but then allowed nine runs in 9.2 innings over his next five outings (8.38 ERA)...posted a 3.00 ERA (5 er in 15.0 ip) over an eight-game stretch from July 3 to August 2...has allowed six runs over his final three relief outings (6.1 ip, 8.53 ERA).

BRIEFLY: Was signed by the A's as a free agent to a minor league contract on February 9 and went 1-2 with a 10.93 ERA in six games, three starts, this spring...began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 3-2 with a 5.22 ERA in seven games, all starts, when he was selected by Oakland on May 19.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his A's debut, an 8-7 loss to Arizona in 11 innings May 23 in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Drew in the first inning and that began a stretch of nine consecutive batters retired...allowed four hits and a walk over the first five innings and then walked the first two batters in the sixth...was relieved by Wuertz with a 5-1 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning to hand him a no decision.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the second game of the doubleheader on May 29 at Texas...the A's scored a run in the top of the first but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the first on RBI doubles by Hamilton and Blalock and a two-run single by Teagarden...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Young in the fourth inning.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss on September 1 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Olivo in the second...that was the only run he would allow in 5.0 innings pitched...left with the scored tied at 1-1 and the bullpen allowed three runs in the sixth inning for the loss

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win at Texas last Tuesday...blanked the Rangers on one hit and one walk over the first three innings and then allowed a leadoff home run to Murphy in the fourth...had a 4-1 lead when he allowed a German double and an Andrus walk to start the fifth...was relieved by Breslow, who escaped the jam, but tossed just 4.0 innings and did not qualify for the decision.

LAST WIN: Has not won a game since April 24, 2008 at Los Angeles (NL) while pitching for Arizona...allowed three runs on seven hits in 5.1 innings in a 6-4 Diamondbacks victory...is 0-4 with a 5.46 ERA (52 er in 85.2 ip) in 37 games, including six starts, since then.

GONZALEZ vs. TEXAS: Is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts this year at Texas...the loss came in the A's 5-2 loss in the second game of the doubleheader on May 29 (see second start above)...then had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win last Tuesday (see last start above)

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a 5.22 ERA in seven starts with Sacramento...allowed a .300 opponents batting average, including .323 (21 for 65) against left-handed hitters and .284 (27 for 95) against right-handers...allowed four home runs, but just one over his last five starts and 27.2 innings...was 2-1 with a 3.47 ERA in four starts at home and 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA in three starts on the road...tossed six or more innings in two of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer four

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (9-12, 4.54 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 31st start of the season and his career... is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA and .177 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the winning streak matches the longest of his career...is now 4-7 with a 5.44 ERA over his last 15 starts after going 5-5 with a 3.68 ERA over his first 15 starts...picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start when he combined with Wuertz and Bailey on a one-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Texas last Wednesday (7.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is attempting to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history under the age of 22 to win 10 games and the eighth rookie 10-game winner...is 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (20.0 ip, 14 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 3 hr) in three career starts against Texas.
