ABOUT THE RANGERS: Texas opens a brief 4-game roadtrip in Oakland tonight...team was 2-7 on the final extended homestand of 2009 against Seattle (1-2), Oakland (0-3), and LA of Anaheim (1-2)...the Rangers have lost 6 of 7 and 7 of 9 after opening September with a 7-2 record...club is 14-17 beginning Aug. 18, but has won 19 of 37, 22 of 42, 28 of 53, and 33 of last 59 contests...Texas is 33-28 (.541) since the All-Star break, still the 4th-best record in the A.L., and is 71-56 (.559) since the start of May...current 81-67 (.551) record matches the 4rd-best 148-game mark in team history and is the 4th-best record among A.L. teams this season...Rangers are 14 games over .500 for 2nd time in last 3 days, fewest games over the .500 mark since August 31 (72-58)...club has not been as few as 13 games over .500 since August 11 at 62-49.

SEASON WINS: At 81-67, the Rangers has clinched their first .500 or better season since 2004 (89-73) and just the 2nd in the last 10 seasons beginning 2000. Texas won at least 88 games 3 times in a 4-year span from 1996-99, capturing the A.L. West Division title in 1996, 1998, and 1999.

ROAD RECAP: Beginning this evening, Texas will play 11 of its final 14 regular season games in A.L. West parks...After this 4-game set in Oakland, the club closes the home schedule with 3 contests versus Tampa Bay...the Rangers conclude the year with 4 games in Anaheim and 3 in Seattle.

The Rangers have won 3 straight away from home, the team's longest road win streak since 3 in a row, May 22-24, all in Houston...longest road winning streak of the year is 4 games, April 27-May 6...club is 13-9 on the road since August 6 and at 35-35 overall, is at .500 away from Arlington for the 1st time since July 10 at 20-20...team has not had a winning road mark since June 7 at 15-14...the Rangers are one of 4 clubs in the A.L. and 10 in the majors with a road record of .500 or better...the Rangers have had a winning road record just twice in the last 16 seasons, 44-37 in 1999 and 41-40 in 2006.

LOSING GROUND: During the 2-7 homestand, Texas lost 6.0 games in the Wild Card race, going from 2.0 to a season high 8.0 games behind Boston...the club also dropped 2.5 games in the A.L. West standings, going from 5.0 to 7.5 games behind Los Angeles...that matches Texas' largest division deficit of the season (also September 18)...this is the furthest the Rangers have been from any potential playoff spot all season (at least 7.5 GB in both races)...Texas has been in 2nd place in the A.L. West for the last 72 days beginning July 11.

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers and A's meet for the final time in 2009 with this 4-game series...Texas was swept by Oakland in a 3-game set in Arlington, September 14-16, and has lost 7 of the last 8 meetings beginning May 31...in that span, the Rangers have been outscored, 44-18, including 19-1 in the 3 games last week...Texas is 6-9 overall against Oakland in 2009 after going 12-7 in all of 2008...the Rangers were 10-9 in the series in both 2006 and 2007 and have not lost more than 9 games to the A's since 2005 (8-11)...at the Oakland Coliseum, the Rangers are 2-4 in 2009 after going 21-18 the previous 4 seasons, 6-4 in 2008...in the all-time series, Texas leads, 282-275 with the A's having a 145-131 advantage at the Oakland Coliseum.

--The Rangers are still 26-20 versus A.L. West opponents, the best mark in the division...Texas opened the season at 13-2 in the division, but is just 13-18 in last 31 games vs. A.L. West beginning May 31, losing 7 of 9.

HOMESTAND TO FORGET: The Rangers lost all 3 series on the 2-7 homestand with the Mariners, A's, and Angels...this is the 1st time that the club has dropped at least 3 straight series in Arlington since it lost 3 straight in a 2-7 homestand with Tampa Bay, Detroit, and Cleveland, August 15-24, 2008.

Texas was outscored 48-19 in the 9 games on the homestand...club batted just .204 (57-279) with 6 homers, 2 in the last 7 games, and had a .135 (7-52) mark with runners in scoring position...team ERA for the 9 games was 5.11 (46 ER/81.0 IP).

THE ANDRUS FILE: Elvis Andrus is batting .304 (51-168) over the last 49 games to rise from .251 to .272, 2nd highest among qualifying ML rookies to Florida's Chris Coghlin (.310)...overall, he is tied for 4th in A.L. in triples (8) and sac bunts (11) and is tied for 9th with 28 steals, most by an ML rookie and matching the 3rd most ever by a Texas rookie...Andrus leads A.L. rookies in games (131), at bats (430), runs (65), hits (117), and triples and is among the leaders in total bases (2nd, 165), walks (2nd, 36), multi-hit games (T3rd, 24), and extra base hits (4th, 28).

SMOAKIN': Rangers minor leaguer Justin Smoak hit 2 more homers in the United States' 12-3 victory over Italy in a Round 2 IBAF World Cup game on Sunday in Italy...It was Smoak's 3rd 2-homer game, an IBAF World Cup single tournament record, and gives him 8 total homers in the United States' 8 games to date...Fellow Rangers minor leaguer Kasey Kiker earned his 2nd win of the tournament as the USA improved to 7-1 with 7 straight wins since an opening round loss to Venezuela...Team USA is hosting Australia in the final Round 2 Game on Monday before moving on to the final round with 7 other countries.

ON THE BASEPATHS: The Rangers had 2 more stolen bases on Sunday to increase the club total to 137, 3rd in the majors behind Tampa Bay (181) and the Los Angeles Angels (140)...figure is the 3rd highest in Rangers history behind 196 in 1979 and 154 in 1977...Texas has been successful on a major league best 81.547 of its steal tries (137 of 168), just ahead of Philadelphia at 81.538 (106 of 130)...current success percentage is 2nd best in club history, topped only by 81.7% (67 of 82) in 2005...Since 1990, only 2 A.L. clubs have posted a highest steal percentage success rate than the 2005 and 2009 Rangers: 84.1% for Baltimore in 1994 and 82.4% for Toronto in 1995:

SALTY HAS SURGERY: Catcher Jarrod Saltalamacchia was scheduled to undergo right shoulder surgery for Thoracic Outlet Syndrome today in Dallas...Dr. Greg Pearl performed the surgery...LHP Matt Harrison had similar surgery on his left shoulder on July 27.

MISCELLANEOUS: Texas has allowed just 32 unearned runs in 2009, 2nd fewest in the majors to Philadelphia (31)...club record for fewest in a season is 50 in both 1996 and 1999...Rangers have 4 players with 15 or more steals (Andrus, Kinsler, Cruz, Borbon), most since 1987 (4)...Jan Kinsler was the only Ranger to accomplish that in 2008 (26)...Bobby Jones, Rangers manager at class AAA Oklahoma City, is on this trip.

#33 Kevin Millwood, RHP (10-10, 3.94)

TODAY: The 34-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 29th start and appearance in the opener of this 4-game series in Oakland...will be pitching on extended 8 days' rest, during which he participated in several throwing sessions with pitching coach Mike Maddux to work on his mechanics...last started Sept. 12 vs. Seattle in the first game of the club's most recent homestand...is a 10-game winner for the 8th time in his career, as one more victory would give him most since 2006 (16-12), his first campaign with Texas...has one win over his last 8 starts and just 2 wins over his last 12 starts beginning July 1...has still held opponents to 3 runs-or-less in 12 of his last 19 outings and carries a 3.94 ERA this season, which ranks 18th in the A.L....has surpassed his 2008 total (11) with 15 quality starts this season, 2nd-most on the staff behind Feldman (18)...ranks among staff leaders in strikeouts (1st, 109), starts (T1st), innings (2nd, 175.2)...has held left-handers to a .231 avg. in '09, over 30 points lower than his career mark (.267)...opposition batting just .224 (39-174) with RISP...has career record of 25-20, 3.88 (165 ER/382.2 IP) in 66 regular season games/63 starts occurring on or after Sept. 1...is 3-3, 5.80 (35 ER/54.1 IP) in 9 starts against A.L. West opponents this season.

LAST START: Took his 2nd consecutive loss in an 8-3 defeat on Sept. 12 vs. Seattle (3.2 IP, 8 H, 5 R-ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 69 pitches/39 strikes)...logged 3.2 innings in his 2nd-shortest outing of the season, behind only his 2.0-inning start on July 26 at Kansas City, which he exited due to injury (tightness, left glute muscle)...permitted 8 hits, 2 shy of a season-high, with 4 of those going for extra bases (3 doubles, one HR)...the contest endured a combined delay of 1-hour, 23-minutes due to substantial rainfall...the game was officially ended by the umpires prior to the completion of all 9 innings, first time for such an occurrence in Arlington since 1984.

RECENTLY: Through the end of June, Millwood went 8-5 with a 2.64 ERA (33 ER/112.2 IP) over his first 16 starts this season...logged at least 6.0 innings in all but one of the 16 outings...opponents batted .237 (101-426) in that span with 14 homers and 36 walks against 70 strikeouts...in 12 starts since July 1, he has gone 2-5 with a 6.29 ERA (44 ER/63.0 IP)...has gone fewer than 6.0 full innings 7 times in that span...opponents have batted .303 (77-254) with 10 homers and 31 walks against 39 strikeouts.

VS OAKLAND: Set to make his 3rd start of '09 against the Athletics, as he has gone 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (4 ER/14.0 IP) in 2 previous outings, both in Arlington...earned 2nd victory of '09 in a 5-4 win on April 28 (4 R-2 ER/8.0 IP)...charged with unearned runs in both the 3rd and 5th innings on errors, then gave up game-tying homer to Sweeney to lead off 7th...pitched scoreless 8th, then Texas scored game-winning run on Cruz RBI single in bottom half of that frame...also took a no-decision in a 5-4 loss on May 31 (2 ER/6.0 IP)...has a career record of 5-3, 3.66 (34 ER/83.2 IP) in 15 starts against the Athletics...has not pitched at Oakland-Alameda County Stadium since Sept. 13, 2007...has a career record of 1-3, 5.32 (14 ER/23.2 IP) in 4 starts at this venue, having lost 3 straight games.

ON THE ROAD: Has gone 3-7 with a 4.71 ERA (45 ER/86.0 IP) in 14 road starts this season compared to 7-3 with a 3.21 ERA (32 ER/89.2 IP) in 14 home starts...will be his 4th start away from Arlington in 5 chances...is 1-4, 6.12 (29 ER/42.2 IP) over his last 8 starts, but has received 3 runs of support or less 6 times...opponents are batting .265 (90-339) with 8 HR on the road, compared to .258 (88-341) with 16 HR at home.

ACHY BREAKY: Is 2-3, 5.32 (27 ER/45.2 IP) in 9 starts since the All-Star break...has a career record of 72-55, 3.69 (438 ER/1069.1 IP) in the 2nd "half"...his 3.46 ERA entering the All-Star break was 12th-lowest in the A.L....was 2nd-lowest ERA at the break for a Texas right-handed starter since the club moved into Rangers Ballpark in 1994, lowest since Bob Tewksbury's 3.25 in 1995...it was the 4th-lowest figure overall for a Texas pitcher at the break in that span (1994-2009), behind only Tewksbury in '95 and a pair of efforts by Kenny Rogers, as Rogers had a 2.54 at the break in 2005 and a 3.05 at the break in 1995...opponents batted .249 before the break, but have a .295 avg. in the 2nd "half".

MAN OF THE MONTH: Millwood has received 2 of the club's 6 Player of the Month awards so far this season...was named Rangers Player of the Month for June after going 4-1,1.30 (5 ER/34.2 IP) over 5 starts, 3rd-lowest ERA of any pitcher in the A.L. and majors...was also honored for April after going 2-2, 2.13 (9 ER/38.0 IP) over 5 starts.

THE CENTURY MARK: Millwood has thrown 100-or-more pitches in 23 of his 28 starts this season, T8th-most in the A.L. and 4 shy of the ML lead (27)...Millwood is averaging **105.4 pitches-per-start, 12th-highest figure in the A.L.** (Verlander leads majors with 111.3)...reached century mark in just 13 of his 29 starts in '08.

INNINGS EATER: Millwood ranks 2nd on the Texas staff with 175.2 innings pitched, 23rd in the A.L....entered his start on July 26 with the 5th-most innings in the league before his 2-week layoff (left glute tightness)...he has logged at least 6.0 full innings in all but 8 of his 28 starts this season, but has gone less than 6.0 in 5 of 6 and 6 of his last 8 outings...has gone at least 7.0 innings 12 times (none since June 21 at San Francisco)...opened season with 7 consecutive outings of 7.0-or-more innings to establish the 4th-longest season-opening streak in team history...was 2nd-longest stretch of Millwood's career to throw at least 7.0 frames, other an 8-game run of 7.0-or-more innings from July 27-Sept. 3, 1999 with Atlanta.

COMPLETE EFFORTS: Has been responsible for 5 of the Rangers' 13 complete games spanning the past 2 seasons (2008-09), including 2 of 6 in 2009...has lost both of his CG efforts this season: April 18 vs. KC (2 ER/9.0 IP) and May 21 at DET (4 ER/8.0 IP)...has actually taken losses in 3 of the 5 CG he has thrown beginning 2008, which stand as the only 3 instances in the last 5 seasons (2005-2009) for a Texas pitcher to lose a CG.

2009 HIGHLIGHTS: Has factored into the decision in 20 of his 28 outings this season with the club going 13-15 overall...earned first Opening Day victory as a Ranger on April 6 vs. Cleveland, allowing just one run on 5 singles over 7.0 innings in a 9-1 win...was his 4th consecutive start in a Texas season opener to set a new club record...took a tough-luck, 2-0 loss on April 18 vs. Kansas City, as both Millwood and Royals starter Zack Greinke tossed com-

plete games...it was just the 3rd game in Rangers Ballpark history (1994-2009) to feature only 2 total pitchers, the others Aug. 13, 1995 vs. Toronto and May 27, 1996 vs. Chicago-AL...was handed his 2nd complete game loss on May 21 at Detroit in a 4-3 loss...earned a victory opposite Angels lefty Joe Saunders on May 15 vs. LA of Anaheim in his 50th career start at Rangers Ballpark, a 10-8 Texas win...won 3 straight starts from June 5-June 16, all following Texas losses...snapped the Rangers' 8-game losing streak at Fenway Park in a 5-1 win on June 5 vs. the Red Sox, allowing one run over 7.0 frames...earned the victory on June 11 vs. Toronto, tossing 7.2 shutout innings in what was just the 8th 1-0 game ever played at Rangers Ballpark...clinched 2009 Silver Boot Trophy, beating Houston 6-1 on June 16 (1 ER/7.0 IP)...earned career victory no. 150 on June 26 vs. San Diego...his 9 runs allowed July 6 at LA of Anaheim matched career high (3rd time)...earned first of team's 3 victories in a home sweep of the Red Sox on July 20 (2 ER/6.0 IP), first Texas sweep of Boston since taking 3 games from May 1-2, 2004 in Arlington...left start on July 26 at Kansas City after 2.0 IP and missed 12 days from July 27-Aug. 7 due to tightness in left glute muscle...earned his 10th win in a 10-9 victory on Aug. 25 at New York-AL (5 ER/5.2 IP).

CAREER: Right-hander is in his fourth season with Texas...signed a five-year contract with the club in December of 2005, and needs to reach certain statistical thresholds this season to activate a vesting option for 2010...won the American League's 2005 ERA crown with Cleveland, edging Minnesota's Johan Santana, as the Tribe was in contention into late September that year...also ranked second in the National League in ERA in 1999...he tossed a no-hitter with Philadelphia on April 27, 2003 vs. San Francisco.
