ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their winning streak snapped at a season high tying seven games last night (also June 2-8)...have now won nine of the last 11 games and 12 of the last 15...went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 40-36 (.526) since June 29, which is the fifth best record in the American League over that span...were officially eliminated from the playoffs a week ago today in game 144...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 143...have spent each of the last 142 days (since May 3) and 148 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the days in last are second most in Oakland history and the A's will break the record of 153 days set in 1997...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998) and the "tragic" number for clinching last behind Seattle is six...the A's are 17-30 (.362) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season ended today and 54-49 (.524) against everyone else.

PLAYERS USED: Henry Rodriguez became the A's 26th pitcher this year last night, tying the Oakland record set in 1997...Eric Munson also made his A's debut last night and Oakland has now used 51 players this year, which matches last years total for second most in Oakland history...the record of 54 was set in 2007...a total of 107 different players have appeared in at least one game for the A's over the last three years, ranging from Jack Cust (409 games) to Meloan, Munson, Rodriguez, Kevin Melillo and Chad Reineke (1 game each).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 13-6 in the month of September, which is tied with Boston and Colorado for the best record in the majors...with one more win, the A's will clinch a winning record in a month for the first time since June of 2008 (16-10)...currently have a streak of eight consecutive months without a winning record, which equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998...have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season, the first time they have done that since 1993.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this eight-game homestand against Cleveland (4-0) and Texas (0-1)...had their six-game home winning streak snapped last night, which was their longest since August 11-September 1, 2006, when they won 10 straight home games...went 4-3 on the last homestand and are 38-37 (.507) at home for the season...finished with a losing record at home just once over the previous 11 seasons (40-41 in 2007)...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0), marking just their second winning road trip of more than one series this year...are now 14-10 (.583) over the last 24 road games but are 33-42 (.440) for the season...will finish with a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season...leave following the game Thursday for the final road trip of the season, a six-game jaunt to Los Angeles (three games) and Seattle (three games).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's had their five-game winning streak against American League West teams snapped last night and are 19-26 (.422) against the West for the season...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 24-39 (.381) record against Western division teams and 47-40 (.540) against teams from the Central and East.

SERIES NOTES: The A's swept the four-game series from Cleveland, their first four-game sweep since August 26-29, 2005 at Baltimore, a span of 39 series...have won three straight series for just the second time this year (August 3-12)...are 4-0-3 over the last seven series and have not lost a series since getting swept at Seattle, August 24-26...the seven series without a loss is the A's longest stretch since July 27-September 3, 2006 when they went 10-0-1 over an 11 series stretch...swept a three-game series at Texas last week, snapping a streak of 27 consecutive series without a sweep, which equaled the fourth longest streak in Oakland history.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 10 runs last night after allowing just 12 runs total during the seven-game winning streak...now have a 2.13 ERA (17 er in 72.0 ip) over the last eight games while holding the opposition to a .207 (55 for 266) batting average, including .137 (10 for 73) with runners in scoring position...now have a 4.27 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have not allowed a home run in the last six games, equaling the longest streak over the last three years (July 16-22, 2007)...have allowed 145 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-2 with a 3.52 ERA (31 er in 79.1 ip) over the last 15 games but are 48-57 with a 4.68 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (834.0) in the American League, the fourth fewest wins and the fourth highest ERA...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 107 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...have started a rookie pitcher in 81 of the last 103 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last three games after putting together a season high tying seven game errorless streak...now have 89 errors for the season with 12 games remaining...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 34-30 (.531) since the All-Star Break, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are batting .280 (627 for 2237), which is third best in the AL and fourth best in the majors...the Oakland record for batting average after the All-Star Break is .279 in 2006...have a Major League leading 71 stolen bases since the break, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1991 (71)...also lead the majors in doubles after the break (140) and rank fourth in runs (334) and extra base hits (207).

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League and the majors with 125 stolen bases...over the last 16 years, the only time the A's have stolen more bases was in 1998 when they had 131...are batting .261, which matches the highest the average has been outside the first eight games of the season...rank last in the AL in home runs (129) and slugging percentage (.396)...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125...have 488 walks and the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series, 9-7...have won seven of the last nine games after losing five of the first seven...went 5-4 in Texas and are 4-3 in Oakland...need one more win to clinch their first season series win over the Rangers since 2005...are 34-39 against Texas since 2006...the A's are 275-283 against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 145-132 in Oakland and 129-151 in Texas...have an all-time record of 372-365 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded his 25th save of the season last Thursday, an on-going Oakland rookie record...has converted each of his last 20 save opportunities, which is also an Oakland rookie record...leads ML rookies and ranks ninth among all AL pitchers in saves.

Rajai Davis is batting .347 (77 for 222) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best average in the AL...he is batting .340 (100 for 294) since June 1, which is the fifth best average in the majors over that span.

Kurt Suzuki has a team leading 79 RBI...in Athletics history, the only catcher to lead the team in RBI was Frankie Hayes, who had 78 for Philadelphia in 1944.

Ryan Sweeney is batting .350 (21 for 60) with eight doubles and 14 RBI in 16 games in September.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On **September 22, 1912**, for the second time in 11 days, Eddie Collins steals six bases in a game, an American League record that still stands today...on **September 22, 1913** 19-year old Herb Pennock and Eddie Plank combine to blank Detroit 1-0 to clinch the AL pennant...on **September 22, 1989** Dave Stewart pitches seven innings in the A's 5-2 win at Minnesota to win his 20th game of the season and the 100th of his career...it is his third consecutive 20 win season with the A's.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 31st start of the season and his career...the A's are 15-15 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in 16 of his 30 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 20 times.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (6 er in 22.0 ip) and .177 (14 for 79) opponents batting average over his last four starts...the winning streak matches the longest of his career (also June 6-22)...is now 4-7 with a 5.44 ERA (50 er in 82.2 ip) over his last 15 starts (since June 27) after going 5-5 with a 3.68 ERA over his first 15 starts.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start...is attempting to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history under the age of 22 to win 10 games (see chart on lower left) and the eighth rookie 10-game winner...Brett Anderson has 10 wins and with one more win for Cahill, the A's will have two 21-year olds with 10 wins for the third time in franchise history...the other two times are 1914 (Joe Bush, Rube Bressler, Herb Pennock) and 1913 (Joe Bush and Byron Houck)...since 1900, only 12 Major League teams have had at least two pitchers under the age of 22 with at least 10 wins...the last team is the 1984 Kansas City Royals (Bret Saberhagen, 10 and Mark Gubicza, 10).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in losses (12), tied for fifth in home runs (26), tied for seventh in walks (68) and tied for eighth in starts (30)...is averaging 4.70 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fourth lowest in the AL...his strikeout to walk ratio of 1.29 is second lowest in the majors.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Has set an Oakland rookie record with 26 home runs, topping the previous mark of 24 set by John Wasdin in 1996...his 12 losses are tied for fourth most by a rookie in Oakland history and he is one of seven Oakland rookies to make 30 starts...leads Major League rookies in games started (30)...leads American League rookies in innings pitched (168.1), ranks eighth in strikeouts (88) and tied for eighth in wins (9).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in his last seven starts (42.0 ip) after allowing at least one home run in nine consecutive games from June 22 to August 6 (15 home runs total)...that equaled the third longest streak in Oakland history...has allowed 26 home runs for the season and 20 of those have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for the most in the American League and is third most in Oakland history...only Catfish Hunter (26 in 1973 and 21 in 1969) has allowed more home runs against lefties...20 have been hit at home, which is the most in the majors and a Coliseum record, breaking the mark of 19 set by Hunter in 1973...however, 20 of the home runs have been solo shots...allowed just eight home runs in 238.2 career minor league innings.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or less in 16 of his 30 starts and is 1-8 in those starts...however, has five games with run support of nine or more and has season run support of 5.88 (110 rs in 168.1 ip), which is fourth highest in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .265 opponents batting average, which drops to .221 (33 for 149) with runners in scoring position, the 10th lowest mark in the American League...opponents are hitting .186 (13 for 70) with RISP and two outs and .111 (1 for 9) with the bases loaded...has held the opponents number three hitters to a .176 (13 for 74) batting average, which is fifth lowest in the American League.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-3 with a 2.43 ERA (15 er in 55.2 ip) and .212 (42 for 198) opponents batting average in nine starts against American League West teams and 6-9 with a 5.59 ERA (70 er in 112.2 ip) and .289 (129 for 447) in 21 starts against everyone else.

21-YEAR OLDS: Is the third pitcher under the age of 22 in Oakland history and the fifth in Athletics history to make 30 starts...fellow 21-year old Brett Anderson has made 28 starts...according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the seventh Major League team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 25 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

LAST START: He combined with Wuertz and Bailey on a one-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Texas last Wednesday...allowed a leadoff single to Byrd in the second followed by a walk to Kinsler...he then retired each of the next 17 hitters and 18 of the final 19...tossed 7.0 innings and struck out a career high seven.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (20.0 ip, 14 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 3 hr) in three career starts...the first win came in the A's 9-4 victory in Oakland on May 7...allowed just one run on five hits in 7.0 innings and did not walk a batter...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a Davis home run...then took the loss in the A's 6-4 loss on August 6, also in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first, but he allowed solo home run to Blalock in the second and Young in the third to tie the game...also allowed a Young RBI single in the fifth and a Byrd sacrifice fly in the sixth and was charged with one of the Rangers two runs in the seventh...combined with Wuertz and Bailey on a one-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Texas on September 16...allowed a leadoff single to Byrd in the second followed by a walk to Kinsler...he then retired each of the next 17 hitters and 18 of the final 19...tossed 7.0 innings and struck out a career high seven.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Clayton Mortensen (2-2, 6.14 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and fifth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento September 4 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-1 with a 3.50 ERA in three starts since his return...won his second consecutive start in his last outing, a 5-2 A's win over Cleveland last Thursday (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Rangers in his career...was acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals in the Matt Holliday trade on July 24...combined for a 9-8 record and a 4.39 ERA in 23 minor league starts with Sacramento and Triple-A Memphis in the St. Louis organization.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

23-22, 3.59 ERA (509.1 ip, 473 h, 225 r, 203 er, 180 bb, 455 so, 39 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 37/49 (75.5%)

The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.00 ERA (12 er in 54.0 ip) over its last 13 games and has a 3.59 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...has 455 strikeouts, which is an Oakland record and are also the most in the AL...the pen also leads the AL in fewest home runs (39), ranks second in innings pitched (509.1), has the third fewest walks (180) and is third in save percentage (75.5%)...also leads the AL in first batter strikeouts (102) and ranks tied for second in first batter grounded into double plays (7)...has issued the third fewest walks (27) against first batters in the AL...has a 2.88ERA (82 er in 256.2 ip), 12 home runs allowed and 73 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.31 ERA (121 er in 252.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 107 walks issued on the road.
