Texas Rangers (82-67) at Oakland A's (71-79)

ABOUT THE RANGERS: Texas has won 2 of 3 after Monday's 10-3 victory to open this brief 4-game roadtrip...the Rangers have lost 6 of 8 and 7 of 10 after opening September with a 7-2 record...club is 15-17 beginning Aug. 18, but has won 20 of 38, 23 of 43, 29 of 54, and 34 of last 60 contests...Texas is 34-28 (.548) since the All-Star break, still the 4th-best record in the A.L., and is 72-56 (.563) since the start of May...current 82-67 (.550) record matches the 4rd-best 149-game mark in team history and is the 4th-best record among A.L. teams this season...Rangers are 15 games over .500 for 2nd time in last 3 days and have not been 16 over since September 15 (80-64).

WINNING SEASON: At 82-67, the Rangers has clinched their first winning season since 2004 (89-73) and just the 2nd in the last 10 seasons beginning 2000...it marks the club's 16th winning season overall since the franchise moved to Arlington in 1972...it also assures Ron Washington of his 1st winning season as a major league manager...Texas won at least 88 games 3 times in a 4-year span from 1996-99, capturing the A.L. West Division title in 1996, 1998, and 1999.

KING OF THE ROAD: The Rangers have won 4 straight away from home, matching the team's longest road win streak of the year, April 27-May 6...Texas' last road winning streak of more than 4 games was 6 wins in a row, April 29-May 15, 2006...club is 14-9 on the road since August 6 and at 36-35 overall, has matched its best away record of the year at one game over .500, the 4th time, 1st since June 7 at 15-14...Texas has not been 2 games over .500 on the road at any time since April 17, 2008 at 5-3...the Rangers are one of just 3 clubs in the A.L. and 9 in the majors with a winning road record...the Rangers have had a winning road record just twice in the last 16 seasons, 44-37 in 1999 and 41-40 in 2006.

RUNS ON THE ROAD: Texas is hitting .375 (63-168) with 7 homers and 41 runs in its last 4 road games to raise its away average from .240 to .249...the club has scored at least 10 runs in all 4 of those games beginning with the opener of a doubleheader on September 8 in Cleveland, just the 2nd time in club history that has been accomplished, the other June 3-20, 1994 at Boston (3) and Chicago (1).

--This is just the 8th time in the last 56 seasons (1954-2009) for any team to score 10-or-more runs in at least 4 consecutive road games...the last was Boston, Aug. 24-26, 2007, all at Chicago-AL, including a DH on 8/24/07...since 1954, the only team with double-digits in more than 4 straight away from home was Atlanta, 5 straight from July 14-18, 2006.

JULIO BORBON has recorded 16 stolen bases since returning to the majors on August 8, 3rd most in the majors in that span to 22 for Oakland's Rajai Davis and 19 for Houston's Michael Bourn...Despite playing in just 33 games, Borbon ranks 4th among A.L. rookies in steals (16).

HERE'S THE SITUATION: The Rangers gained a game in the wild card standings on Monday to move within 7.0 games of Boston...it is the 1st time the team has gained a full game on the Red Sox since September 4...in this 3-7 span, Texas lost 5.0 games in the Wild Card race...the club has also dropped 2.5 games in the A.L. West standings in this span, going from 5.0 to 7.5 games behind Los Angeles...that matches Texas' largest division deficit of the season (also September 18)...the Rangers have been in 2nd place in the A.L. West for the last 73 days beginning July 11.

VERSUS OAKLAND AND THE WEST: The Rangers snapped a 3-game losing streak to the A's on Monday but have lost 7 of the last 9 meetings beginning May 31...Texas is 7-9 overall against Oakland in 2009 after going 12-7 in all of 2008...the Rangers were 10-9 in the series in both 2006 and 2007 and have not lost more than 9 games to the A's since 2005 (8-11)...at the Oakland Coliseum, the Rangers are 3-4 in 2009...in the all-time series, Texas leads, 283-275 with the A's having a 146-131 advantage at the Oakland Coliseum.

--The Rangers are 27-20 versus A.L. West opponents, the best mark in the division...Texas opened the season at 13-2 in the division, but is just 14-18 vs. A.L. West beginning May 31, losing 7 of 10.

STARTERS ARE VICTORS: Kevin Millwood's victory on Monday was the 64th by a Texas starter in 2009, the most of any A.L. club and 3rd in the majors behind St. Louis (66) and Colorado (65)...it is the most wins by the Rangers' rotation since 1999 (65) and the 7th most ever...the rotation owns 24 of the team's last 26 wins beginning July 30...Rangers' starters have a .566 (64-49) winning percentage, currently the 2nd highest in team history to a .615 (75-47) mark in 1996.

LOW ERAS: Kevin Millwood lowered his ERA on Monday to 3.79, joining Scott Feldman (3.62) to give the Rangers a pair of qualifiers with ERAs under 4.00...dating back to 1972, Texas has had 60 qualifying pitchers (162.0+ IP in full season) with earned run averages under 4.00...however, only 2 of those have been compiled in the last 12 seasons (beginning 1997), both by Kenny Rogers, 3.84 in 2002 and 3.46 in 2005...the last time that Texas has 2 qualifiers with sub-4.00 ERAs was 1993, Roger Pavlik at 3.41 and Kevin Brown at 3.59.

THE ANDRUS FILE: Elvis Andrus is batting .299 (52-174) over the last 50 games to rise from .251 to .271, 2nd highest among qualifying ML rookies to Florida's Chris Coghlin (.310)...overall, he is tied for 4th in A.L. in triples (8) and sac bunts (11) and is tied for 9th with 28 steals, most by an ML rookie and matching the 3rd most ever by a Texas rookie...Andrus **leads A.L. rookies in games (132), at bats (436), runs (67), hits (118), and triples** and is among the leaders in total bases (2nd, 166), walks (2nd, 36), multi-hit games (T3rd, 25), and extra base hits (4th, 28).

JUST SMOAKIN': Rangers minor leaguer Justin Smoak hit his 9th homer in the United States' 4-3 victory over Australia in the final Round 2 IBAF World Cup game on Monday in Italy...the 9 homers are the most of any player in the tournament and are a Team USA World Cup record, shattering the old mark of 6 by Tino Martinez...the USA improved is 8-1 with 8 straight wins and plays its 1st Final Round game Tuesday as the top seed vs. Venezuela.

SALTY HAS SURGERY: Catcher Jarrod Saltalamacchia had right shoulder surgery for Thoracic Outlet Syndrome on Monday in Dallas...Dr. Greg Pearl performed the surgery, which consisted of the removal of a rib...Saltalamacchia is expected to be fully ready for spring training...LHP Matt Harrison, who had similar surgery on his left shoulder on July 27, made his 1st game appearance since surgery on Monday, throwing 22 pitches in 1.0 inning in an Instructional League game in Surprise, AZ.

SHORTS: The Rangers are 3rd in the majors with 138 stolen bases behind Tampa Bay (181) and the Angels (140)...Texas has been successful on a major league best 81.7 of its steal tries (138 of 169), matching 2005 (67 of 82) for the best mark in club history...Texas has allowed just 33 unearned runs in 2009, 2nd fewest in the majors to Philadelphia (31)...club record for fewest in a season is 50 in both 1996 and 1999...Eddie Guardado appeared in his 906th game on Monday, tying Cy Young for 21st on the all-time list...Mariano Rivera is 20th with 911...Texas was 6-for-21 with runners in scoring position Monday, its most AB with RISP since 22 on August 22, 2008 at Boston.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#20 Brandon McCarthy, RHP
(7-3, 4.97)

TONIGHT: The 25-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 15th start and appearance of the season tonight in the 2nd of 4 games against the Athletics here in Oakland...will be working on 6 days' rest, as his last start came in a 6-1 loss to the A's last Tuesday back in Arlington...was named a full-time member of the rotation on Sept. 4 by manager Ron Washington...tonight's start would be McCarthy's 4th since being activated from the 60-day disabled list on Sept. 1, going 2-1, 5.17 (9 ER/15.2 IP) in 3 starts thus far...made 5 starts on a rehab assignment in August before being reinstated...**has posted a career-high 7 wins** this season, which is tied for the 2nd-highest total by any starter in the majors with **14 starts-or-less**, behind only the Angels' Matt Palmer (8-1, 4.99 in 12 starts)...previous best for a single season had been 5 victories in 2007 (23 games/22 starts)...has gone 4-2, 4.25 (23 ER/48.2 IP) over his last 8 starts for Texas to lower season ERA over a run from 6.10 to 4.97.

LAST START: McCarthy took the loss on Tuesday vs. Oakland, a 6-1 Texas defeat in Arlington (3.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R-3 ER, 3 BB, 2 SO, 0 HR, 80 pitches/45 strikes)...lost for just the 3rd time in 14 outings this season while working 3.0-plus innings, his shortest start since lasting 0.2 of an inning on Sept. 15, 2008 vs. Detroit...departed with none out and 2 men on in the 4th inning...was relieved by Doug Mathis who allowed both runners to score on a 2-run single by Rajai Davis...Texas snapped a 22-inning scoreless streak with David Murphy's solo homer to lead off the 4th inning...the Rangers also committed 2 of their 3 errors on the night behind McCarthy, matching a season-high, done just once previously on April 8 vs. Cleveland...McCarthy had won 4 straight decisions and suffered his first loss since his first career complete game shut out on May 24 at Houston.

VS. OAKLAND: Set to make his 4th start and appearance against the A's, as he has gone 1-2, 7.62 (11 ER/13.0 IP) in his previous 3 outings...took the loss in a 9-6 defeat on May 7 here at Oakland-Alameda Coliseum (4.0 IP, 7 H, 7 R-ER, 3 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 81 pitches-54 strikes)...earned the victory in the Rangers' 14-1 victory on May 30 in Arlington (6.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-ER, 3 BB, 2 SO, 0 HR, 87 pitches/54 strikes)...allowed his only run of that contest on Kurt Suzuki's 2-out, RBI-double in the 1st inning...has gone 1-3, 8.15 (16 ER/17.2 IP) in 6 career games vs. Oakland, including 1-3, 10.29 (16 ER/14.0 IP) in 4 starts.

ON THE ROAD: Set to make his 8th start of the season away from Arlington, as he has gone 3-2 with a 6.10 ERA (28 ER/41.1 IP) in 7 previous outings on the road...his road ERA is nearly 3 runs higher than his home ERA (3.76)...has completed at least 5.0 innings in 5 of his 7 starts, going 6.0-or-more innings 3 times...opponents are batting .302 on the road vs. .196 at home...has won 2 consecutive road decision dating back to his complete game shutout on May 24 at Houston...will be looking for his first victory at Oakland-Alameda County Stadium, as he has gone 0-2, 9.35 (9 ER/8.2 IP) in 3 games/2 starts in his career...his 9.35 ERA in Oakland is the highest of any road city where he has made at least 2 starts.

ROAD TO RECOVERY: Was on the disabled list June 5-Aug. 31 with a stress fracture in his right shoulder blade...made 5 starts with Oklahoma City (AAA) in August on injury rehabilitation assignment...prior to beginning rehab stint, McCarthy participated in several throwing sessions at Rangers Ballpark with pitching coach Mike Maddux...goal was to alter mechanics in such a way to prevent a recurrence of the shoulder blade injury...made 5 consecutive starts for the RedHawks from August 8-27, working on no more than 4 days' rest at a time...went 0-1 with a 4.15 ERA (10 ER/21.2 IP) overall with 20 strikeouts and 9 walks...opposition batted .247 (20-81), with right-handers hitting at just a .229 clip (8-35)...worked on 3 days' rest between his first and 2nd outings and then on 4 days' every start thereafter...increased his innings and pitch counts in each of his first 4 outings, with a high of 7.0 innings and 95 pitches in his 4th start on Aug. 22 at Omaha...took the loss in his debut for the RedHawks on Aug. 8 at Sacramento (5 ER/1.0 IP)...combined for 14 strikeouts over his final 2 appearances (13.0 IP)...tossed 6.0 shutout innings and allowed just 2 hits in his last start on Aug. 27 at Iowa (G2) in a 2-1 loss to Triple-A affiliate of the Cubs...lineup featured several players with major league service time, including So Taguchi, Micah Hoffpauir and Luis Rivas.

SHUTOUT: Posted his first career complete game shutout in a 5-0 win over the Astros on May 24 at Minute Maid Park in Houston (9.0 IP, 9 H, 0 R-ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 0 HR, 124 pitches-83 strikes)...the victory finished Rangers' 3-game sweep...it marked the first individual shutout ever by a Texas pitcher in Interleague play...joined Philadelphia's Brett Myers (8/20/08 vs. WSH) as the only pitchers in the past 3 seasons to allow 9-or-more hits in a shutout and matched the most hits allowed by any pitcher in an Interleague shutout (4th time)...marked his first career complete game of any kind, as his 124 pitches was a career high...it was just the 15th individual shutout at Minute Maid Park, with McCarthy becoming just the 4th opponent to pull the trick...only other pitchers with shutouts against the Astros at Minute Maid (2000-09): Cincinnati's Pete Harnisch (7/19/00), Philadelphia's Robert Person (5/7/01), and Pittsburgh's Dave Williams (8/14/05).

2009: Opened the year as the Rangers' number 3 starter and made every scheduled outing leading up to his DL stint beginning June 5...has nearly tripled the number of outings he made last season, as forearm and finger injuries limited him to 5 starts in 2008, when he went 1-1, 4.09 (10 ER/22.0 IP)...including his CG on May 24 at Houston, he has completed an outing with either the lead (8) or the score tied (3) in 11 of his 14 starts...has exited a game trailing just 3 times, all resulting in losses...has held the opposition to 3 runs-or-less in 7 of 14 outings, posting quality starts in 6 of those...has surrendered 13 home runs, although 9 of those have been solo shots...did not allow a home run in 3 straight starts from May 19-30, first time to do that since 3 straight Aug. 5-Sept. 11, 2007...posted victories in 3 straight decisions over his first 5 starts to open the year from April 9-May 2...won his season debut on April 9 vs. Cleveland (3 ER/5.0 IP) in the Rangers' 3rd game of the year...earned 2nd victory in a 5-4 win on April 21 at Toronto (3 ER/6.0 IP), winning a matchup with Roy Halladay...posted a win against the White Sox, his former team, on May 2 in Arlington in a game that endured 4 separate rain delays (1 ER/5.0 IP)...posted 3 consecutive quality starts from May 19-30 for just 2nd time in his career (also 4 straight, Aug. 30-Sept. 27, 2005)...recorded first career CG shutout (5-0 win) on May 24 at Houston (more above)...matched career-high with his 5th win in a 14-1 victory on May 30 vs. Oakland...earned win in game 2 of a doubleheader on Sept. 1 vs. Toronto to secure a twin-bill sweep of the Jays in a 5-2 Texas victory (1 ER/6.1 IP)...lone run allowed came on an RBI double by his final batter faced, Lyle Overbay, in the 7th inning.

CAREER: McCarthy has yet to spend a full season with Texas since being acquired from Chicago-AL in a 5-player trade in December 2006...opened the season after a healthy spring as the team's #3 starter for the 2nd time in 3 seasons, then endured his recent DL stint...earned the same role out of spring training in 2007, his first year with the club, before missing time because of a blister and stress fracture in his right shoulder blade...was out for most of 2008 with right forearm inflammation that limited him to 5 starts following his recall in late August...worked out at Rangers Ballpark for much of the offseason and participated in a pitching mini-camp in January 2009...acquired by Texas, along with OF David Paisano, from Chicago-AL in a 5-player trade on Dec. 23, 2006.

The 23-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 17th major league start and appearance of the season on Wednesday night in the 3rd installment of this 4-game series in Oakland...scheduled to work on regular 4 days' rest, as he took the loss in Friday's 2-0 defeat to the Angels on Friday in Arlington, despite giving up just a pair of runs (5.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 4 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 97 pitches-58 strikes)...allowed just a 2-out, RBI-single to Torii Hunter in the 1st inning and a solo homer to Vladimir Guerrero to lead off the 3rd...Texas was shut out for the 4th time in 5 games, while Scott Kazmir earned his first win with Los Angeles after tossing 6.0 scoreless frames...Hunter has a 1.93 ERA over his last 2 starts (3 ER/14.0 IP), a stretch that included the first complete game of his pro career on Sept. 13 vs. Seattle (7-2 victory in Game 1)...has gone 8-4, 3.15 (33 ER/94.1 IP) in 15 starts since being recalled by Texas on June 28...his 8 victories in that span are tied for 4th-most in the A.L...has won 7 of his last 12 outings overall...set to make his 3rd start against Oakland this season, going 1-0 with a 3.65 ERA (5 ER/12.1 IP) in a pair of outings thus far...took a no-decision in a 6-3 win over the Athletics on May 29 in Arlington (3 ER/5.1 IP) and earned a 6-4 victory on Aug. 6 in Oakland (2 ER/7.0 IP)...has gone 2-1 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) over 6 road starts this season, recording quality starts in 4 of those...opponents are batting .233 against Hunter this season, while right-handers have hit just .203, 2nd-lowest in the majors behind only Atlanta's Tommy Hanson (.190 avg. vs. right-handers)...has completed at least 5.0 innings in all 16 starts this season.
