<u>WINNING SEASON:</u> At 82-68, the Rangers have clinched their first winning season since 2004 (89-73) and just the 2nd in the last 10 seasons beginning 2000...it marks the club's 16th winning season overall since the franchise moved to Arlington in 1972...it also assures Ron Washington of his 1st winning season as a major league manager...Texas won at least 88 games 3 times in a 4-year span from 1996-99, capturing the A.L. West Division title in 1996, 1998, and 1999.

ROAD MAP: The Rangers had a 4-game road winning streak ended on Tuesday, losing for the 1st time since September 6 at Baltimore...club is 14-10 on the road since August 6 and is 36-36 (.500) overall, the 3rd best away winning percentage in the A.L...the Rangers have had a winning road record just twice in the last 16 seasons, 44-37 in 1999 and 41-40 in 2006.

--Texas scored a single run on Tuesday after producing double figure run totals in each of the previous 4 games, just the 2nd time in team history and 8th in the majors since 1954 that had occurred.

HERE'S THE SITUATION--UNCHANGED: The Rangers, Red Sox, and Angels all lost on Tuesday...in this 3-8 span, Texas lost 5.0 games to Boston in the Wild Card standings, going from 2.0 to 7.0 GB...the club has also dropped 2.5 games in the A.L. West standings in this span, going from 5.0 to 7.5 games behind Los Angeles, a position in which the Rangers have been the last 3 days...that matches Texas' largest division deficit of the season (also September 18)...the Rangers have been in 2nd place in the A.L. West for the last 74 days beginning July 11.

VERSUS OAKLAND AND THE WEST: The Rangers have lost 4 of 5 and 8 of the last 10 meetings with the A's beginning May 31...Texas is 7-10 overall against Oakland in 2009, its most losses in the season series since 2005 (8-11)...at the Oakland Coliseum, the Rangers are 3-5 in 2009, most defeats since 2007 (4-6)...in the all-time series, Texas leads, 283-276 with the A's having a 147-131 advantage at the Oakland Coliseum. --The Rangers are 27-21 versus A.L. West opponents, the best mark in the division...Texas opened the season at 13-2 in the division, but is just 14-19 vs. A.L. West beginning May 31, losing 8 of 11.

WHERE'S THE LONG BALL?: The Rangers have gone 28 innings over 3+ games since Hank Blalock homered in the 6th inning on Saturday vs. the Angels...the 3-game homer drought matches the club's longest of 2009, May 16-19...last longer dry spell was 4 straight games, June 9-13, 2007...Blalock's blast is the team's only homer in the last 6 games with just 2 leaving the yard in the last 9 contests...these are the longest such streaks since Texas homered once in 7 games, July 16-22, 2007 and twice in 10 games, July 13-22, 2007.

--Extra base hits have also been scarce...Texas has one or fewer EBH in 6 of the last 9 games with 13 total in this span (10 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR).

ELVIS ON THE BASEPATHS: Elvis Andrus recorded his 29th stolen base of the season on Tuesday, matching David Hulse (1993) for the 2nd most ever for a Ranger rookie behind the 33 for Cecil Espy in 1988...he needs one steal to become just the 7th rookie shortstop in American League history to steal 30 bases in a season:

--Andrus has been successful on 87.9% (29 of 33) of his steal tries...that matches Eckstein (29-33) in 2001 for the 7th best percentage of any major league rookie (20 or more SB) since 1950.

--Since 1950, there have been 29 A.L. rookies with at least 30 SB in a season...Boston's Jacoby Ellsbury (50) was the last in 2008.

--Andrus leads M.L. rookies in steals and tops A.L. rookies in games (133), at bats (440), runs (68), hits (119), and triples (9).

A RARE COMBINATION: Only one player in Rangers history has produced the combination of 30+ home runs, 50+ walks, and 20+ steals in a single season...that was Rafael Palmeiro with 37 HR, 73 BB, and 22 SB in 1993...two Rangers have a chance to do that in 2009...Nelson Cruz is one walk shy at 32 HR/49 BB/20 SB, and Ian Kinsler is one homer shy at 29 HR/52 BB/29 SB...since 2001, this has been accomplished just 5 times in the American League; 3 by Alex Rodriguez with the Yankees (2004-05-07) and each by the White Sox' Magglio Ordonez (2001) and the Indians' Grady Sizemore (2008)...the last set of A.L. teammates to do it was Ken Griffey, Jr. and Rodriguez with the Mariners in 1999.

ANOTHER RARE COMBO: In the 8th inning on Tuesday, Guillermo Moscoso threw 2 wild pitches and Ivan Rodriguez allowed 2 passed balls...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time that a major league team allowed both 2 wild pitches and 2 passed balls in one inning was July 30, 2000, when Tampa Bay did it at Kansas City, also in the 8th inning

--Last night was the 1st time that Rodriguez had permitted as many as 2 passed balls in an inning since April 2, 2003 vs. Philadelphia with Florida...and yes, that also took place in the 8th inning.

DARREN O'DAY has posted a 1.65 overall earned run average with the Mets and Rangers and a 1.74 figure in just the A.L. with Texas in 2009..both totals are the 2nd lowest among qualifying M.L.and A.L.relievers (0.3 INN/team's games) to the Yankees' Phil Hughes at 1.30...O'Day's 1.74 mark in 51.2 frames with the Rangers is the 2nd lowest in club history among all pitchers with at least 50.0 innings to a 1.57 mark by Jim Kern in 143.0 frames in 1979.

SHORTS: The Rangers are 3rd in the majors with 139 stolen bases behind Tampa Bay (181) and the Angels (141)...Texas allowed a pair of unearned runs on Tuesday, just the 3rd time this season the club has had more than one unearned run in a game: 3 on April 12 at Detroit and 2 on April 28 vs. Oakland...Rangers have scored one or fewer runs in 6 of the team's last 9 games...David Murphy ranks 5th in the A.L. for September with 15 runs scored...Rangers have hit 6 homers in 8 games at the Oakland Coliseum this season...Trevor Cahill joins Seattle's Felix Hernandez as the only pitchers with 3 wins against Texas in 2009.

TONIGHT: The 23-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 17th major league start and appearance of the season tonight in the 3rd installment of this 4-game series in Oakland...set to pitch on regular 4 days' rest, as he made his first career start against the Angels on Friday in Arlington...has 8 wins this season, tied for 3rd-most on the staff despite not earning his first victory until July 3...his 3.25 ERA ranks 5th among A.L. hurlers with at least 16 starts...has gone 8-4, 3.15 (33 ER/94.1 IP) in 15 starts since being recalled by Texas on June 28...his 8 victories in that span are tied for 4th-most in the A.L., 4 behind teammate Scott Feldman, who leads with 12...has a 1.93 ERA over his last 2 starts (3 ER/14.0 IP), a stretch that included the first complete game of his pro career on Sept. 13 vs. Seattle (more below)...has logged at least 7.0 innings in 6 of his last 11 outings...has won 7 of his last 12 starts...his 7 wins since the All-Star break are tied with the Cubs' Randy Wells for most by any rookie in the majors...is 2-2 with a 2.89 ERA (12 ER/37.1 IP) in 6 career starts against the A.L. West, all coming this season.

LAST START: Took the loss in Friday's 2-0 defeat to the Angels in Arlington, despite giving up just a pair of runs (5.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 4 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 97 pitches-58 strikes)...allowed just a 2-out, RBI-single to Torii Hunter in the 1st inning and a solo homer to Vladimir Guerrero to lead off the 3rd...also issued a career-high 4 walks after giving up 2-or-less in 5 straight starts...Texas was shut out for the 4th time in 5 games, while Scott Kazmir earned his first win with Los Angeles after tossing 6.0 scoreless frames.

BETTER THAN AVERAGE: Opponents are batting .233 (88-377) against Hunter, including .203 (38-187) by right-handed hitters, 2nd-lowest of any pitcher in the majors with at least 16 starts behind Atlanta's Tommy Hanson (.190 avg. vs. RH)...opposition has just 14 hits over 83 at-bats with runners in scoring position this season (.169) and is batting .081 (3-07). 37) with runners in scoring position and 2-outs.

ON THE ROAD: Has made just 6 of his 16 starts this season on the road, going 2-1 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP)...5 of those road starts have come in his last 9 outings, as 6 of his first 7 starts this season took place in Arlington...his pair of wins came in back-to-back road starts on Aug. 6 at Oakland (2 ER/7.0 IP) and Aug. 12 at Cleveland (0 ER/7.2 IP)...just 2 of the 10 home runs he has allowed this season have come on the road...opponents are batting .246 (35-142) on the road, just .226 (53-235) at home...has made just 7 of his 19 career starts away from Arlington, going 2-2, 4.99 (22 ER/39.2 IP).

The 26-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 28th start and 31st appearance tomorrow in the finale of this 4-game series in Oakland...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest after earning the victory in the Rangers' 3-2 win on Saturday over LA of Anaheim (6.2 IP, 4 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 92 pitches/59 strikes)...helped the Rangers snap a 5-game losing streak, which had matched a season-high...picked up his career-high and teambest 17th victory of 2009...relieved by Neftali Feliz with none on and 2-out in the 7th inning...Texas ended a 25-inning scoreless streak when Chris Davis hit a soft ground ball past shortstop Maicer Izturis in the 3rd inning that went for an RBI-double to give the Rangers a 1-0 lead...is just the 11th different pitcher in Texas history to have at least one season of 17-or-more wins...he has the most wins of any Texas pitcher since Kenny Rogers won 18 in 2004, most by a Rangers right-handed pitcher since Aaron Sele won 18 games in 1999...is the 3rd-youngest player in team history to record a 17-win season, bettered only by Steve Comer in 1979 and Bobby Witt in 1990...has won 8 of his last 10 starts and 8 of his last 9 decisions...over his last 6 starts, Feldman is 5-1, 2.06 (9 ER/39.1 IP) to drop season figure from 4.06 to 3.62, 9th in A.L...is 12-1, 2.43 (24 ER/89.0 IP) away from Rangers Ballpark in Arlington this season and 3-3, 4.37 (23 ER/47.1 IP) in 12 games/7 starts in his career.
