ABOUT THE RANGERS: Texas and Oakland conclude their season series this afternoon...the Rangers have won 2 of the 1st 3 games and 3 of 5 overall since a 5-game losing streak...club has not captured back-to-back games since 3 straight wins in Cleveland, September 8-9...Texas has dropped 8 of 12 after opening September with a 7-2 record...club is 16-18 beginning Aug. 18, but has won 21 of 40, 24 of 45, 30 of 56, and 35 of last 62 contests...Texas is 35-29 (.547) since the All-Star break, the 4th-best record in the A.L., and is 73-57 (.561) since the start of May...current 83-68 (.550) record is 3rd-best 151-game mark in team history and is the 4th-best record among A.L. teams this season...Rangers are 15 games over .500 for 3rd time in last 5 days and have not been 16 over since September 15 (80-64).

WINNING SEASON: At 83-68, this is the Rangers' 1st winning season since 2004 (89-73) and just the 2nd in the last 10 seasons beginning 2000...it marks the club's 16th winning season overall since the franchise moved to Arlington in 1972...it also assures Ron Washington of his 1st winning season as a major league manager...The 83 victories match 1979, 1989, and 1990 for 11th most in club history, one back of 1974.

ROAD SUCCESS: The Rangers have won 5 of their last 6 away games and are 15-10 on the road since August 6...at 37-36 (.507) overall, the club is one of 3 A.L. teams with a winning road record and has matched its best away mark of the season, 5th time and 2nd in last 3 days...prior to that,club had not been one over on road since June 7 at 15-14...Texas has not been 2 games over .500 on the road at any time since April 17, 2008 at 5-3..the Rangers have had a winning road record just twice in the last 16 seasons, 44-37 in 1999 and 41-40 in 2006.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers gained a full game in the A.L. West standings for just the 2nd time in the last 20 days and are 6.5 GB the Angels...team has not been closer to Los Angeles since it was 6.0 GB on September 16...Texas remained 7.0 games back of Boston in the Wild Card chart and has lost 5.0 games to the Red Sox in the Wild Card standings in the last 12 days...the Rangers have been in 2nd place in the A.L. West for the last 75 days beginning July 11.

<u>CLOSE CALL:</u> With Wednesday's 9-8 win, 2 of the Rangers' last 3 victories have come by a single run, the other on September 19 vs, the Angels...prior to that, team had dropped last 2 games decided by a run since winning in New York, 10-9 on August 25...Texas is 19-15 in one-run decisions in 2009, 10-11 on the road.

VERSUS OAKLAND AND THE WEST: Despite winning 2 of 3 in this series, the Rangers have lost 4 of 6 and 8 of last 11 meetings with the A's beginning May 31...Texas is 8-10 overall against Oakland in 2009, its most losses in the season series since 2005 (8-11)...at the Oakland Coliseum, the Rangers are 4-5 in 2009, most defeats since 2007 (4-6)...in the all-time series, Texas leads, 284-276 with the A's having a 147-132 advantage at the Oakland Coliseum.

--The Rangers are 28-21 versus A.L. West opponents, the best mark in the division...Texas opened the season at 13-2 in the division, but is just 15-19 vs. A.L. West beginning May 31, losing 8 of 12...Texas is 11-10 in A.L. West parks.

ON THE BASES: The Rangers had 4 steals on Wednesday, their 6th 4+SB game of 2009, and rank 2nd in the majors with 143, behind only Tampa Bay (182)...Texas has been successful on an ML best 81.71 (143-175) of its tries with current club record 81.70 (67-82) in 2005...Texas recorded its 17th double steal of the season in the 5th inning on Wednesday.

THIRTY AT TWENTY: Elvis Andrus had a pair of stolen bases on Wednesday, giving him 31 for the season, the 2nd most ever for a Ranger rookie behind the 33 for Cecil Espy in 1988...heis just the 7th rookie short-stop in American League history to steal at least 30 bases in a season:

--Andrus has been successful on his last 7 steal tries and 88.6% (31 of 35) for the season, the 4th best percentage in the A.L. (20+ SB)...that figure is the 7th best percentage of any major league rookie (20 or more SB) since 1950.

--Andrus leads M.L. rookies in steals and tops A.L. rookies in games (134), at bats (445), runs (69), hits (120), and triples (8).

THE HAMMER: Hank Blalock has started last 5 games at 1st base, going 8-for-20 (.400) with 3 doubles, 2 HR and 8 RBI...prior to this, Blalock had not started since Sept. 6...he has both of the Rangers' homers over the last 7 games as his 4th inning blast on Wednesday snapped the club's drought of 31.0 innings without a long ball...Hank had all 3 of the club's extra base hits on Wednesday (2 2B/HR) and he has 5 of the team's 11 EBH over the last 5 contests (3 2B/2 HR)...he now has 25+ homers in 4 different seasons with his blast on Wednesday.

--Blalock is batting .341 (42-123) with 10 homers and 32 RBI in 32 games in September the last 2 seasons.

FELDMAN FILE: Notes on today's Rangers starter:

- His 17 wins are 3rd most in the majors behind C.C. Sabathia (18-7) and Adam Wainwright (18-8)...a Rangers pitcher has recorded at least 18 wins in a season only 9 times, last by Kenny Rogers (18-9) in 2004...the last righthander to do it was Aaron Sele (18-9) in 1999.
- His club record 12 road wins (12-1) are tied with Sabathia (12-5) for the ML lead...no ML pitcher has recorded more than 12 road victories in a season since 2002, when Anaheim's Jarrod Washburn went 13-3...the last ML righthander with at least 13 road victories was Atlanta's Gred Maddux (13-0) in 1995 and the last A.L. RHP was Chicago's Jack McDowell (13-3) in 1993.
- He has recorded wins in a club-record 8 consecutive road starts, the longest such streak by a major league pitcher since Jon Garland won 10 straight road starts for the White Sox from May 17-Aug. 24, 2006.
- His only road defeat in 2009 was on June 19 at San Francisco...he has won his last 12 starts in opposing A.L. parks since losing on September 13, 2008 here in Oakland.

FINAL THREE AT HOME: The Rangers close the home portion of the regular season schedule with 3 games vs. Tampa Bay this weekend...Texas is 4-2 vs. the Rays, sweeping 3 games in Arlington, July 3-5...club is 46-32 at home in 2009 after a 40-41 mark a year ago.

SHORTS: The Rangers are 20-19 in day games this season, 12-13 on then road...Texas has played a major league low 39 day games in 2009...Texas tops the majors by converting 78.6% (44-56) of its save attempts, just off the team mark of 78.8% in 2004...club is tied with Colorado for 2nd in the majors with 65 starters wins, 2 back of St. Louis and team's most since 1999 (65)...team had 68 in 1998.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#39 Scott Feldman, RHP (17-5, 3.62)

TODAY: The 26-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 29th start and 32nd appearance of '09 in the series finale here in Oak-town...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest, as he last started on Saturday vs. LA of Anaheim, earning his 17th win...opened season with 3 relief outings, but has started 27 straight beginning April 25, going 17-5 with a 3.28 ERA in 28 starts as a member of the Texas rotation...beginning Aug. 2, has gone 8-1 with a 2.95 ERA (21 ER/64.0 IP) over his last 10 starts to lower his overall season ERA from 3.99 to 3.62, 10th in the A.L...Texas is 20-8 in Feldman's starts this season...has established new career highs in starts, wins, innings and strikeouts...his current 3.28 ERA as a starter would be the lowest by a Texas starter since Nolan Ryan (2.91, 27 starts) and Jose Guzman (3.08, 25 starts) in 1991.

LEADERBOARD: Overall: His 17 wins rank 2nd in the A.L. and 3rd in the majors, this despite not making a start until April 25...the only pitchers with more wins in 2009 are Yankees' C.C. Sabathia (18) and Cardinals' Adam Wainwright (18)...beginning with that first start on April 25, Feldman's 17 wins are tied with Sabathia for most in the majors...his .773 winning pct. is best in the A.L. and 2nd-best in the majors...ranks 6th in the A.L. with a .241 opp. avg. and 10th with a 3.62 ERA...his career-long 7-game win streak from Aug. 2-Sept. 9 is T2nd-longest in A.L. in '09...As a starter. Among A.L. starters, ranks with league leaders in opponents slugging pct. (3rd, .341), opponents OPS (3rd, .643), ERA (5th, 3.28), home runs per 9 (5th, 0.69), opponents batting avg. (5th, .236), and baserunners per 9 (9th, 10.96)... Texas: Leads the Rangers in wins (17), ERA (3.62) and quality starts (18), while ranking among staff leaders in starts (2nd, 28), innings pitched (2nd, 176.2) and strikeouts (2nd, 104).

LAST START: Earned win on Saturday vs. LAA in Arlington, a 3-2 Texas victory in matchup with Jered Weaver (6.2 IP, 4 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 92 pitches/59 strikes)...exited after retiring first 2 batters in order in the 7th...3 of 4 hits allowed were singles, lone exception being a solo homer by Mike Napoli in the 5th...other run scored on Torii Hunter RBI single in the 4th...retired final 6 batters faced after the homer, and retired 9 of final 10 around the homer...Frank Francisco escaped a bases loaded, one-out jam in the 9th by inducing a game-ending 6-3 GIDP from Howie Kendrick to end the game and secure Feldman's 17th win...Hank Blalock made an error in that inning to allow Kendry Morales to reach.

<u>JUST WIN BABY:</u> He is just the 11th different pitcher in Texas history to have at least one season of 17-or-more wins...he has the most wins by any Texas pitcher in a season since Kenny Rogers won 18 in 2004, **most wins by a Rangers right-handed pitcher since Aaron Sele won 18 games in 1999...at 26, is the 3rd-youngest player in team history to record a 17-win season, bettered only by Steve Comer in 1979 and Bobby Witt in 1990.**

STREAKIN': Won a career-high 7 straight decisions from Aug. 2-Sept. 9, longest streak by a Texas starter since Kenny Rogers won 9 straight from April 27-June 17, 2005...it matched the 2nd-longest win streak ever by a Texas right-hander, longest by a righty since Rick Helling won 7 straight from June 26-Sept. 6, 1999...only right-hander with a longer streak was Bobby Witt's club-record 12-gamer in 1990.

VS. OAKLAND: Set to make his 4th start of the season against the the Athletics, having gone 2-1 with a 4.91 ERA (10 ER/18.1 IP) in 3 starts in '09...took loss in last outing vs. A's on Sept. 14 in Arlington, a 9-0 Texas defeat in which Brett Tomko tossed a 5-hit shutout (6.1 IP, 6 H, 6 R-ER)...Feldman exited with a quality start intact, one out and bases loaded in the 7th trailing 3-0, but Jason Grilli allowed all 3 inherited runners to score...Feldman had not allowed a run over the first 5.0 frames, but gave up 3 in the 6th and was charged with 3 in the 7th after Grilli let them score...picked up victories on May 6 here at the Coliseum (3-2 win) and on May 29 in Arlington (5-2 win) after permitting just 2 runs over 6.0 innings in both starts...has a career-mark of 3-3, 4.37 (23 ER/47.1 IP) over 12 career games vs. the A's, including 3-3, 4.79 (22 ER/41.1 IP) in 7 starts...has limited Oakland's offense to a .230 (34-148) avg. as a starter...has posted quality starts in 5 of those 7 outings...attended Burlingame High School, located just south of San Francisco.

<u>DAY_DREAMS</u>: Has gone 4-0, 2.06 (8 ER/35.0 IP) in 6 games/5 starts in day games this season, including **4-0**, **1.10 (4 ER/32.2 IP) in 5 day starts**...enters this start with a scoreless streak of 19.0 innings in day games since allowing a first inning run on Aug. 13 in Cleveland...has won 4 straight starts in day games, all on the road.

ROAD RUNNER: Tied for major league lead with 12 road wins (also Sabathia), a Texas club record...has won 8 consecutive road starts (note it is consecutive starts, not decisions over a longer period) entering his outing today in Oakland, already the longest such streak in club history...his 8 straight road wins are the most by a major league pitcher since Jon Garland won 10 straight road starts for the White Sox from May 17-Aug. 24, 2006...is 12-1 with a 2.58 ERA (26 ER/90.2 IP) in 15 games/14 starts on the road this season, including 12-1, 2.43 (24 ER/89.0 IP) in 14 road starts...his current 2.58 road ERA would be the 5th-lowest in team history (minimum 81.0 IP), and lowest since Nolan Ryan's 2.52 figure (28 ER/100.0 IP) in 1989.

CONNECT FOUR: Allowed just a single run over 4 starts from Aug. 23-Sept. 9, going 4-0 with a 0.34 ERA (1 ER/26.1 IP) in that span...he became the first right-hander in team history to allow as little as one run over a span of 4 starts, regardless of the length of those starts...the only other pitcher for Texas to accomplish that feat was Kenny Rogers - twice - in both 1995 and 2005 (0 runs over 4 starts in both seasons)...opponents batted just .183 (17-93) with one extra-base hit (double) over those 4 starts.

<u>DRAFT AND FOLLOW</u>: As a 30th round selection in the 2003 June draft out of the College of San Mateo (CA), Feldman is **one of just 5 Texas draft picks ever to have 17+ wins for Texas**, joining Kenny Rogers (2 times), Bobby Witt (1), Helling (1) and Kevin Brown (1)...he is the first Rangers draft selection with a 10-win season for Texas since Kenny Rogers had 14 wins in 2005.

AUGUST AND EVERYTHING AFTER: Feldman was named the Rangers August Player of the Month, and as one of 3 runners up in A.L. Pitcher of the Month voting, after going 5-0, 2.89 (12 ER/37.1 IP) in 6 games/starts...tied for major league lead in wins in August (also 5 y C.C. Sabathia, Ubaldo Jimenez, and Chris Carpenter)...his 2.89 ERA ranked 6th in A.L. for the month...allowed just one home run in the 6 starts...his 5 wins was most by a Texas pitcher in the month of August since Aaron Sele had 5 wins in August 1999...it marks one of just 26 times in team history for a pitcher to record at least 5 wins in a single month, most by a Texas pitcher in any month since Kenny Rogers had 6 wins in May 2005.

START ME UP: Since joining the Texas rotation, Feldman has gone 17-5, 3.28 (62 ER/170.0 IP) over his 28 starts to lower his season figure from 12.15 to 3.62...has gone at least 5.0 innings in all but one of those 28 starts, allowing 3 runs-or-less 22 times...has gone at least 6.0 innings on 22 different occasions and at least 7.0 innings 4 times...has issued 2 walks-or-less in 22 of 28 starts, allowing more than 3 just twice...all 17 victories this season have come in starts, as he has exited in position to win 19 of his 28 outings...has received an average of 5.40 runs of support per 9 innings in starts...has started 5 of the Rangers' 11 shutouts in '09 (but no CG)...won 5 straight decisions after entering the rotation, but fell one shy of matching the club record for consecutive winning decisions by a starter to begin a season...won 4 consecutive road starts to open the season, just the 3rd pitcher in Rangers history to accomplish that feat...exited game with score tied in starts on May 12 vs. Seattle, May 17 vs. LAA, and June 13 vs. LAD, but received just one run of support combined in those 3 starts, despite a 0.52 ERA (1 ER/17.1 IP)...has left a start trailing just 5 times...took no decision despite 5.0 shutout innings on June 13 vs. Los Angeles after a lights-related delay of 1:41 ended his night...game was tied 0-0, but Texas would go on to lose 3-1...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and outdueled Zack Greinke, who held the A.L.'s lowest ERA entering the contest, in a 2-0 victory on July 24 at Kansas City...won start Aug. 2 vs. Seattle on 3 days' rest, the first time for a Texas starter to do that since Adam Eaton won on Aug. 10, 2006 vs. Seattle...pitched on short rest after throwing just 71 pitches in 2.1 innings on July 29 vs. Detroit, allowing season-high 6 runs in that game...earned win, recording 7 K's and 121 pitches, on Aug. 7 at LA of Anaheim to open series win over the Angels...allowed 22 consecutive singles (no XBH) from July 29-Aug. 18...recorded careerhigh 11 strikeouts on Aug. 23 at Tampa Bay, mo

RELIEF IN 2009: Feldman made 3 relief appearances for the Rangers to begin his season, allowing 9 runs over 6.2 innings (12.15 ERA), with 6 strikeouts and 4 walks...his last relief outing came in an 8-7 loss on April 22 at Toronto in 11 innings.
