A's vs. ANGELS

The A's trail in the season series 6-8...have lost five of six in Oakland but are 5-3 in Anaheim...neither team has swept a series of three or more games since June 29-July 1, 2004 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland...the two clubs have played 27 series of three or more games since then...the A's lost the season series last year, 9-10, the fourth time in the last five years season series has been the decided 10-9...the A's have lost four of the five season series over that span and are 51-58 against the Angels since 2004...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 356-281 against the A's are 356-281 a Angels...that includes 184-133 in Oakland and 172-148 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 405-358 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has 26 saves, which is an on-going Oakland rookie record and tied for sixth most by a rookie in American League history...ranks ninth among all AL pitchers this year.

Rajai Davis has a career high 13game hitting streak (21 for 56, .375)...has a .343 (83 for 242) average since the break, which is third best in the American League...has a .338 (106 for 314) average since June 1, which is fifth best in the majors.

Michael Wuertz leads American League relievers and ranks second in the majors with a career high 100 strikeouts...the strikeouts are sixth best by a reliever in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On **September 26, 1954**, the Philadelphia Athletics play at New York in their last game ever and defeat the Yankees, 8-6...on **September 26, 1974**, Jim Hunter tosses a seven-hitter to defeat the Minnesota Twins 2-1. It is his 25th win which establishes an Oakland record ...on **September 26, 2002**, A's clinch their 2nd AL West title in the last three years and win their 100th game of the season with a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won 10 of the last 12 games, 12 of the last 15 and 15 of the last 19...that includes a season high tying seven-game winning streak that was snapped Monday night (also June 2-8)...went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 43-37 (.538) since June 29...had the worst record in the American League as late as June 3 but are now tied for ninth with Chicago...the A's are 18-30 (.375) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season ended today and 56-50 (.528) against everyone else.

LOSING RECORD AND LAST PLACE: The A's are 74-80 and need to go 7-1 over the final eight games to avoid finishing with a losing record for the third consecutive season...have not had a losing record in three straight seasons since 1993-98 when they had six straight...have spent each of the last 146 days (since May 3) and 152 days this year in sole possession of last place in the American League West...the days in last are second most in Oakland history and the A's will break the record of 153 days set in 1997...the "tragic" number for clinching last place is three...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...however, by going 3-5 over the last eight games the A's will post their best record over the last three years.

SERIES NOTES: The A's just split the four-game series with Texas and are now 4-0-4 over the last eight series...that's their longest stretch of consecutive series without a loss since July 27-Sept. 3, 2006 when they went 10-0-1 over an 11 series stretch...have not lost a series since Aug. 24-26 (swept at Seattle).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are batting .283 (673 for 2380) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best batting average in the American League and the majors (Yankees, .296; Angels, .285)...the Oakland record for batting average after the All-Star Break is .279 in 2006...have a Major League leading 75 stolen bases, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1989 (90)...also lead the majors in doubles after the break (152), rank third in runs (366) and fourth in extra base hits (224).

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 16-7 (.696) in the month of September, which is the best record in the majors...have clinched a winning record in a month for the first time since June of 2008 (16-10), snapping a streak of eight consecutive months without a winning record...that equaled the second longest streak in Oakland history...are batting .301 (246 for 817) this month, second best in the majors (Yankees, .304)...hit .296 in July and that was the second best single month batting average in Oakland history (.305 in August, 1995)...also lead the majors in runs (144), doubles (59), extra base hits (86) and stolen bases (26)...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.10 ERA (72 er in 209.1 ip), which is second best in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors in their last three games, including two last night and three in each of the previous two games...have at least one error in a season high seven consecutive games (13 errors total) after compiling a season high tying seven game errorless streak...have 98 errors for the season with eight games remaining...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 1.92 ERA (23 er in 108.0 ip) over the last 12 games while holding the opposition to a .209 (84 for 402) batting average, including .162 (16 for 99) with runners in scoring position...now have a 4.20 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have allowed just one home run in the last 10 games, including a streak of eight consecutive games without a home run, which was the A's longest homerless streak in eight years...have allowed 146 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-3 with a 3.19 ERA (36 er in 101.2 ip) over the last 19 games but are 51-58 with a 4.61 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (856.1) in the American League and the fourth fewest wins...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 111 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...have started a rookie pitcher in 85 of the last 107 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June

OFFENSE: Adam Kennedy stole his 20th base of the season Thursday, giving the A's two players with 20 or more steals (Davis, 40) for the first time since 1995 (Henderson and Javier)...the A's now have 129 stolen bases for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League and the majors...over the last 16 years, the only time the A's have stolen more bases was in 1998 when they had 131...walked a season high nine times Thursday and now have 505 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...are batting .262, which equals the highest the average has been outside the first eight games of the season...rank last in the AL in home runs (131) and slugging percentage (.399), have the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.329) and the fourth fewest extra base hits (444)...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's embark on their final road trip of the season, a six-game jaunt to Los Angeles (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0), marking just their second winning road trip of more than one series this year...are now 15-10 (.600) over the last 25 road games but are 34-42 (.447) for the season...will finish with a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (4-0) and Texas (2-2), giving the A's back-to-back winning homestands for the first time this year...have won eight of the last 10 games in Oakland and are 40-38 (.513) at home for the season...have finished with a losing record at home just once over the previous 11 seasons (40-41 in 2007)...close out the home schedule with a three-game series with the Angels next weekend.

PLAYERS USED: Henry Rodriguez became the A's 26th pitcher this year Monday night, tying the Oakland record set in 1997...Eric Munson also made his A's debut Monday and Oakland has now used 51 players this year, which matches last years total for second most in Oakland history...the record of 54 was set in 2007...a total of 107 different players have appeared in at least one game for the A's over the last three years, ranging from Jack Cust (432 games) to Munson, Rodriguez, Kevin Melillo and Chad Reineke (1 game each).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th appearance and eighth start of the season...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments this yea and are 20-16 (.556) when he starts in his career...has tossed six innings in just one of his seven starts and has tossed five innings or less in each of his last six starts...allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer twice.

BRIEFLY: Is 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA (2 er in 9.0 ip) in four games, one start, since he returned to Oakland when rosters expanded on September 1...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 7.40 ERA in five start assignments...his

final start came on May 1 at Seattle and he was called on to pitch in relief two days later in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss...allowed the winning run to score in the 15th inning to take the loss and was optioned to Sacramento on May 5 after going 1-2 with a 7.40 ERA in six games, five starts...went 7-1 with a 3.49 ERA in 12 starts with the River Cats before being recalled July 6 to take Dallas Braden's turn after he was placed on the bereavement list...started and lost on July 7 at Boston and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game...went 1-5 with a 6.79 ERA in nine starts before returning to Oakland September 1.

EIGHT UNDER 26: Is 25 years old and is one of eight pitchers under the age of 26 to start at least five games for the A's this year (Anderson, Braden, Cahill, G. Gonzalez, Mazzaro, Mortensen, Outman)...that is the most in Oakland history and it equals the most in Athletics history (1915, 1966, 1967)...this is the 10th time since 1900 that a Major League team has had at least eight pitchers under the age of 26 make at least five starts...in addition to the four A's teams, the other teams are the 2008 Florida Marlins, the 1979 and 1980 Detroit Tigers, the 1910 St. Louis Browns and St. Louis Cardinals and the 1909 Boston Red Sox (all ages based on players age on June 30).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed three home runs in 36.0 innings, an average of 0.75 per nine innings...allowed just 10 home runs last year for an average of 0.54 per nine innings, which was second lowest in the American League (Lee, CLE 0.48)...has allowed just 19 home runs in 268.1 career innings, an average of 0.64 per nine innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 4.60 ERA (8 er in 15.2 ip) and .297 (19 for 64) opponents batting average in four games, three starts in Oakland and 0-3 with a 7.97 ERA (18 er in 20.1 ip), .413 (38 for 92) opponents average and all three of his home runs in seven games, four starts, on the road...now has a 10-4 career record in his home ballparks and is 3-12 on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-2 with a 7.03 ERA (25 er in 32.0 ip) in seven starts this year and 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) in four relief appearances...now has an 11-14 record and a 5.31 ERA (134 er in 227.0 ip) in 42 career starts and is 2-2 with a 5.88 ERA (27 er in 41.1 ip) in 39 relief appearances

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-4 win over Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland...the A's scored five times in the second inning and he shutout the Indians on three hits over the first three innings...allowed his only run in the fourth inning on a Hafner RBI single and left after five innings with a 5-1 lead

EVELAND vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-2 with a 5.64 ERA (22.1 ip, 24 h, 14 r, 14 er, 10 bb, 18 so, 0 hr) in four career starts...lost his only start in Oakland (2 er in 5.1 ip, 3.38 ERA) and is 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA (12 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts at Anaheim...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-4 A's win at Los Angeles April 8...allowed three runs in six innings, and all three runs came in the fourth inning...allowed a RBI single to Rivera, a RBI double to Napoli and a sacrifice fly to Aybar...left trailing 3-0 as Adenhart tossed 6.0 shutout innings...the A's scored three times in the eighth and three times in the ninth for the win.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 8-6 with a 4.94 ERA in 21 starts v Sacramento...led the River Cats with in strikeouts (92), ranked second in innings pitched (124.0), tied for second in wins and third in games started...had a 7-1 record and a 3.49 ERA over his first 12 starts and ranked 10th in Pacific Coast League in ERA when he was promoted to Oakland on July 6...then went 1-5 with a 6.79 ERA in nine starts after he was optioned back to Sacramento following his start on July 7 at Boston ... the River Cats were 12-9 (.571) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 21 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed home runs in 124.0 innings (0.87 per nine innings)...yielded a .273 opponents batting average, including .274 (99 for 361) by right-handed hitters and .270 (34 for 126 by left-handers...opponents hit .266 (37 for 139) with runners in scoring position, including .175 (10 for 57) with RISP and two outs.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Edgar Gonzalez (0-3, 5.22 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 26th appearance and sixth start of the season ... has allowed one run in three of his five starts this year and is 0-2 with a 5.24 ERA (13 er in 22.1 ip) as a starter... his first two appearances this year were starts and the other three starts have come over his four September appearances... is 0-1 with a 5.21 ERA (22 er in 38.0 ip) in 20 relief appearances... is now 8-21 with a 5.77 ERA (129 er in 201.1 ip) in 40 career starts and 6-3 with a 5.94 ERA (77 er in 116.2 ip) in 65 career relief appearances... has not won a game since April 24, 2008 at Los Angeles (NL) while pitching for Arizona... allowed three runs on seven hits in 5.1 innings in a 6-4 Diamondbacks victory... is 0-5 with a 5.76 ERA (57 er in 89.0 ip) in 38 games, including seven starts, since then...in his last start, he was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Texas Monday in Oakland (3.1 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 3 so) ... allowed an unearned run in the first inning as a Blalock RBI single followed a Kennedy error ... yielded three more runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Borbon and a RBI double by Murphy and two in the fourth on a RBI single by Murphy and a RBI double by Byrd ...this is his first career start against the Angels, as he has no decisions and a 3.38 ERA (5.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so) in two career relief appearances, both this year in Oakland... tossed a scoreless sixth and seventh innings on July 16 (2 h, 1 so) and then allowed two runs in 3.1 innings on July 18 (1 h, 3 bb).
