A's vs. ANGELS

The A's trail in the season series, 7-8...have lost five of six in Oakland but are 6-3 in Anaheim...neither team has swept a series of three or more games since June 29-July 1, 2004 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland...the two clubs have played 27 series of three or more games since then...the A's lost the season series last year, 9-10, the fourth time in the last five years the season series has been decided 10-9...the A's have lost four of the five season series over that span and are 52-58 against the Angels since 2004...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 357-281 against the Angels...that includes 184-133 in Oakland and 173-148 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 406-358 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has 26 saves, which is an on-going Oakland rookie record and tied for sixth most by a rookie in American League history...ranks ninth among all AL pitchers this year.

Rajai Davis has a career high 14game hitting streak (22 for 62 .355)...has a .339 (84 for 248) average since the break, which is fifth best in the American fifth best in the American League...has a .334 (107 for 320) average since June 1, which is fifth best in the majors.

Michael Wuertz leads American League relievers and ranks second in the majors with a career high 100 strikeouts...the strikeouts are sixth best by a reliever in Oakland history

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On September 27, 1912, Eddie Plank pitches 19 innings but the A's lose to Washington 5-4...on September 26, 1970, Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California ...on September 26, 1989, Mick Maore Bick Honeyreutt **1989**, Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas. The win clinches the A's second consecutive A.L. West Championship.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight games, 11 of the last 13, 13 of the last 16 and 16 of the last 20...that includes a season high tying seven-game winning streak that was snapped Monday night (also June 2-8)...went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 44-37 (.543) since June 29...had the worst record in the American League as late as June 3 but are now ninth (.484)...the A's are 19-30 (.388) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season ended today and 56-50 (.528) against everyone else

LOSING RECORD AND LAST PLACE: The A's are 75-80 and need to go 6-1 over the final seven games to avoid finishing with a losing record for the third consecutive season...have not had a losing record in three straight seasons since 1993-98 when they had six straight...have spent each of the last 147 days (since May 3) and 153 days this year in sole possession of last place in the American League West...the days in last are second most in Oakland history and the A's will break the record of 153 days set in 1997...the "tragic" number for clinching last place is three...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...however, by going 2-5 over the last seven games the A's will post their best record over the last three years.

SERIES NOTES: By opening with two wins, the A's clinch another series and are now 5-0-4 over their last nine series...that's their longest stretch of consecutive series without a loss since July 27-Sept. 3, 2006 when they went 10-0-1 over an 11 series stretch...have not lost a series since Aug. 24-26 (swept at Seattle).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are batting .285 (692 for 2424) since the All-Star Break, which is the second best batting average in the American League and the majors (Yankees, .295)...the Oakland record for batting average after the All-Star Break is .279 in 2006...have a Major League leading 76 stolen bases, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1989 (90)...also lead the majors in doubles after the break (157), rank second in runs (381) and third in extra base hits (232).

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 17-7 (.708) in the month of September, which is the best record in the majors...have clinched a winning record in a month for the first time since June of 2008 (16-10), snapping a streak of eight consecutive months without a winning record...that equaled the second longest streak in Oakland history...are batting .308 (265 for 861) this month, best in the majors...hit .296 in July and that was the second best single month batting average in Oakland history (.305 in August, 1995)...also lead the majors in runs (159), doubles (64), extra base hits (94) and stolen bases (27)...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.26 ERA (79 er in 218.1 ip), which is second best in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors in their last four games, including two in both games this series and three in each of the previous two games vs. Texas...have committed at least one error in a season high eight consecutive games (15 errors total) after compiling a season high tying seven game errorless streak...have 100 errors for the season, which is the most by an Oakland team since 2003...had made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equalled the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.31 ERA (30 er in 117.0 ip) over the last 13 games while holding the opposition to a .214 (94 for 439) batting average, including .171 (20 for 117) with runners in scoring position...now have a 4.21 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...have allowed just three home runs in the last 11 games, including a streak of eight consecutive games without a home run, which was the A's longest homerless streak in eight years...have allowed 148 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-3 with a 3.51 ERA (41 er in 105 ip) over the last 20 games but are 51-58 with a 4.65 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (859.2) in the American League and the fourth fewest wins...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 111 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...have started a rookie pitcher in 85 of the last 108 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2

OFFENSE: Adam Kennedy stole his 20th base of the season Thursday, giving the A's two players with 20 or more steals (Davis, 40) for the first time since 1995 (Henderson and Javier)...the A's now have 130 stolen bases for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League and the majors...over the last 16 years, the only time the A's have stolen more bases was in 1998 when they had 131...walked a season high nine times Thursday and now have 513 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...are batting .264, which is the team's highest average since the eighth game of the season...rank last in the AL in home runs (134), second to last in slugging percentage (.402), have the fourth fewest extra base hits (452), and the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.330)....over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are in the midst of their final road trip of the season, a six-game jaunt to Los Angeles (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0), marking just their second winning road trip of more than one series this year... are now 16-10 (.615) over the last 26 road games but are 34-42 (.447) for the season...will finish with a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (4-0) and Texas (2-2), giving the A's back-to-back winning homestands for the first time this year...have won eight of the last 10 games in Oakland and are 40-38 (.513) at home for the season...have finished with a losing home record once over the previous 11 years (40-41 in 2007)...end 2009 at home with three games vs. the Angels next weekend.

PLAYERS USED: Henry Rodriguez became the A's 26th pitcher this year Monday night, tying the Oakland record set in 1997...Eric Munson also made his A's debut Monday and Oakland has now used 51 players this year, which matches last years total for second most in Oakland history...the record of 54 was set in 2007...a total of 107 different players have appeared in at least one game for the A's over the last three years, ranging from Jack Cust (433 games) to Munson, Rodriguez, Kevin Melillo and Chad Reineke (1 game each).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 26^{th} appearance and sixth start of the season...it will be the 41^{st} start of his career...the A's are 1-4 (.200) in his starting assignments and his teams are 13-27 (.325) when he starts in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Has allowed one run in three of his five starts this year and is 0-2 with a 5.24 ERA (13 er in 22.1 ip) as a starter...his first two appearances this year were starts and the other three starts have come over his four September appearances...is 0-1 with a 5.21 ERA (22 er in 38.0 ip) in 20 relief appearances...is now 8-21 with a 5.77 ERA (129 er in 201.1 ip) in 40 career starts and 6-3 with a 5.94 ERA (77 er in 116.2 ip) in 65 career relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .222 (26 for 117) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters and .352 (43 for 122) against left-handers...has 9 walks and 24 strikeouts against righties and 18 walks and 14 strikeouts against lefties...yielded no home runs over his first 20 games and 45.1 innings but has allowed two in his last five games and 15.0 innings...both of his

home runs have been hit by left-handed hitters and both have been solo shots...has yielded a .345 (48 for 139) average against the one through five hitters and .210 (21 for 100) to the six through nine hitters.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has not won a game since April 24, 2008 at Los Angeles (NL) while pitching for Arizona...allowed three runs on seven hits in 5.1 innings in a 6-4 Diamondbacks victory...is 0-5 with a 5.76 ERA (57 er in 89.0 ip) in 38 games, including seven starts, since then.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 4.36 ERA (16 er in 33.0 ip) and .258 (32 for 124) opponents batting average in 15 games in Oakland and 0-2 with a 6.26 ERA (19 er in 27.1 ip) and .322 (37 for 115) average in 10 games on the road.

MORE RELIEF: Tossed at least 1.0 inning in each of his 20 relief appearances including 2.0 or more 11 times...his longest outing was 3.2 innings on August 8 at Kansas City...allowed 2 of 11 (18.2%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced hit .211 (4 for 19)...allowed just two runs over his first four relief appearances (7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA) but then allowed nine runs in 9.2 innings over his next five outings (8.38 ERA)...posted a 3.00 ERA (5 er in 15.0 ip) over an eight-game stretch from July 3 to August 2...has allowed six runs over his final three relief outings (6.1 ip, 8.53 ERA).

BRIEFLY: Was signed by the A's as a free agent to a minor league contract on February 9 and went 1-2 with a 10.93 ERA in six games, three starts, this spring...began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 3-2 with a 5.22 ERA in seven games, all starts, when he was selected by Oakland on May 19.

2009 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his A's debut, an 8-7 loss to Arizona in 11 innings **May 23** in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Drew in the first inning and that began a stretch of nine consecutive batters retired...allowed four hits and a walk over the first five innings and then walked the first two batters in the sixth...was relieved by Wuertz with a 5-1 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning to hand him a no decision...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the second game of the doubleheader on **May 29** at Texas...the A's scored a run in the top of the first but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the first on RBI doubles by Hamilton and Blalock and a two-run single by Teagarden...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Young in the fourth inning...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss **September 1** in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Olivo in the second...that was the only run he would allow in 5.0 innings pitched...left with the scored tied at 1-1 and the bullpen allowed three runs in the sixth inning for the loss...had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win at Texas **September 15**...blanked the Rangers on one hit and one walk over the first three innings and then allowed a leadoff home run to Murphy in the fourth...had a 4-1 lead when he allowed a German double and an Andrus walk to start the fifth...was relieved by Breslow, who escaped the jam, but tossed just 4.0 innings and did not qualify for the decision.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Texas last Monday in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the first inning as a Blalock RBI single followed a Kennedy error...yielded three more runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Borbon and a RBI double by Murphy and two in the fourth on a RBI single by Murphy and a RBI double by Byrd...left after 3.1 innings, trailing 6-0.

GONZALEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Has no decisions and a 3.38 ERA (5.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so) in two career relief appearances, both this year in Oakland...tossed a scoreless sixth and seventh innings on July 16 (2 h, 1 so) and then allowed two runs in 3.1 innings on July 18 (1 h, 3 bb).

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a ERA in seven starts with 5.22 Sacramento...allowed a .300 opponents batting average, including .323 (21 for 65) against left-handed hitters and .284 (27 for 95) against right-handers...allowed four home runs, but just one over his last five starts and 27.2 innings...was 2-1 with a 3.47 ERA in four starts at home and 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA in three starts on the road...tossed six or more innings in two of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer four

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (10-12, 4.45 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 32nd start of the season and his career ... has tossed six or more innings in 16 of his 31 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and walked two batters or fewer 21 times... Is 4-0 with a 2.28 ERA (7 er in 27.2 ip) and .202 (20 for 99) opponents batting average over his last five starts, which is the longest winning streak of his career... Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start, a 9-1 victory over Texas (5.1 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 1 so) on Tuesday... is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history under the age of 22 to win 10 games... according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the 13th team since 1900 to have two pitchers under the age of 22 win at least 10 games each... the last team to do it was the 1984 Kansas City Royals (Bret Saberhagen, 10 and Mark Gubicza, 10)... Is 0-2 with a 1.89 ERA (19.0 ip, 15 h, 5 r, 4 er, 7 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three career starts vs. Seattle, both this year.

24-22, 3.51 ERA (528.2 ip, 485 h, 229 r, 206 er, 189 bb, 481 so, 40 hr) Save/Save Opportunities: 38/50 (76.0%) The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.87 ERA (15 er in 72.1 ip) over its last 18 games and has a 3.51 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (LAD, 3.11)...has 481 strikeouts, which is an Oakland record, the most in the AL and second most in the majors (SD, 497)...Abreu's home run off Kilby last night was the pen's first in 18 games and 70 innings...still has allowed just 40 homers for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...leads the AL in innings pitched (528.2), has the second lowest opponents batting average (.243), third best save percentage (76.0%) and tied for the fourth fewest walks (189...also leads the AL in first batter strikeouts (109), has the third fewest first batter walks (29) and is tied for third in first batter grounded into double plays (7), has a 2.79 ERA (83 er in 267.2 ip) and 12 home runs allowed in Oakland compared to a 4.26 ERA (123 er in 260 ip) and 28 home runs allowed on the road
