A's vs. ANGELS

The A's trail in the season series, 7-9...have lost five of six in Oakland but went 6-4 in Anaheim...neither team has swept a series of three or more games since June 29-July 1, 2004 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland...the two clubs have played 28 series of three or more games since then...the A's lost the season series last year, 9-10, the fourth time in the last five years the season series has been decided 10-9...the A's have lost four of the five season series over that span and are 52-59 against the Angels since 2004...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 357-282 against the Angels...that includes 184-133 in Oakland and 173-149 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 406-359 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has 26 saves, which is an on-going Oakland rookie record and tied for sixth most by a rookie in American League history...ranks ninth among all AL pitchers this year.

Rajai Davis is batting .326 (86 for 264) since the break, which is eighth best in the American League.

Kurt Suzuki has 87 RBI and will become just the second catcher in Athletics history to lead the team in RBI...Frankie Hayes had 78 for the Philadelphia A's in 1944.

Michael Wuertz leads American League relievers and ranks second in the majors with a career high 100 strikeouts...is the third Oakland reliever (sixth time) to strikeout 100 or more in a season.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On October 2, 1930 George Earnshaw tosses a six-hitter as the A's defeat St. Louis 6-1 in Game 2 of the World Series...on October 2, 2001 Miguel Tejada hits his 30th home run of the season, making the A's the first team in major league history to have both their shortstop and third baseman (Eric Chavez) hit 30 home runs.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a four-game losing streak, which is one short of the season high of five (April 18-24 and June 23-28)...however, are 16-8 since September 5, which is tied with Atlanta, Colorado and New York (AL) for the best record in the majors over that span...went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 44-41 (.518) since June 29...are 75-84 and will finish with a losing record for the third consecutive season...have not had a losing record in three straight seasons since 1993-98 when they had six straight...will finish in last place in the American League West for the seventh time in Oakland history and the first time since 1998 (also 1977, 1979, 1993, 1995 and 1997)...have spent each of the last 152 days (since May 3) and 158 days this year in sole possession of last place in the West...will break the all-time Athletics record for most days in sole possession of last place following the conclusion of play tomorrow as the 1921 and 1946 Philadelphia A's spent 159 days in last year...the A's 75 wins match last years total and are one short of the 2007 total of 76.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are batting .281 (718 for 2552) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best batting average in the American League and the majors...the Oakland record for batting average after the All-Star Break is .279 in 2006...have a Major League leading 77 stolen bases, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1989 (90)...also lead the majors in doubles after the break (160), rank third in runs (391) and fifth in extra base hits (237)...the Oakland record for post-break doubles is 164 in 2001.

PITCHING: The A's rank third in the American League with a 4.25 ERA...have allowed 154 home runs and hit 35 batters, both of which are the fewest in the AL...have 1099 strikeouts, which is second most in Oakland history and 18 short of the record of 1117 set in 2001.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .262, which is currently the 10th highest single season batting average in Oakland history...rank fourth in the American League and the majors with 131 stolen bases...those are the most steals by an A's team since the 1998 club also had 131...the last time the A's stole more than 131 bases was in 1992 when they had 143...have 521 walks and the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...rank last in the AL in home runs (135) and slugging percentage (.398) and have the fourth fewest extra base hits (457)...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs in a non-strike season is last years club, which finished with 125.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 51-62 with a 4.75 ERA...have the second fewest innings pitched (875.1) in the American League, the fourth fewest wins and the fourth highest ERA...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...the only time in Oakland history A's starters had fewer than 900 innings pitched in a non-strike season was in 1997 (858.2)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 114 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...have started a rookie pitcher in 88 of the last 112 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 19 errors in the last 12 games, with Tuesday night's game in Seattle the only error-free game they have played during that stretch...now have 104 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League and the most by an A's team since 2003 (107)...had committed fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's close out the season with this three-game homestand against Los Angeles...are 40-38 (.513) in Oakland and need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the 10th time in the last 11 years (were 40-41 in 2007)...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (4-0) and Texas (2-2), giving the A's back-to-back winning homestands for the first time this year...have won eight of the last 10 games in Oakland...went 2-4 on the last road trip against Los Angeles (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and finished with a 35-46 (.432) record on the road, marking the third consecutive season the A's finished the year with a losing record on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 19-31 (.380) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season ended today and 56-53 (.514) against everyone else...are 15-23 (.395) in one-run games and will finish with a losing record for the first time since 1998 (16-19)...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a winning percentage under .400 in one-run games was in 1980 (16-26, .381)...are 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970.

SERIES NOTES: The A's were swept at Seattle to start the week, snapping a streak of nine consecutive series without a loss, which was the A's longest such streak over the last three years...went 5-0-4 over the previous nine series and the last series loss prior to that also came in a sweep at Seattle, August 24-26.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used an Oakland record tying 26 pitchers this year (also 1997)...51 players have appeared in a game, matching last year for second most in Oakland history...the record of 54 was set in 2007...a total of 107 different players have appeared in at least one game for the A's over the last three years...have used the disabled list 17 times this year and 64 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 17 players have combined to miss 975 games, an average of 57.4 games per stint...the A's have five players who will be eligible for free agency following the season (Crosby, Duchscherer, Garciaparra, Kennedy, Tomko)...a minimum of six players will be eligible for arbitration (Casilla, Cust, E. Gonzalez, Hairston, Munson, Wuertz)...Joey Devine (2 years, 171 days) and Rajai Davis (2 years, 167 days) are likely "Super 2"-arbitration eligible players...Kurt Suzuki is the next highest service time at 2 years, 113 days.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's batted .297 in September, which was second best in the majors to the Yankees (.299)...it was also the second best single month batting average in Oakland history (.305 in August, 1995)...led the majors in runs (167), doubles (66) and stolen bases (28), ranked second in hits (284) and on-base percentage (.367) and third in slugging (.455) and extra base hits (96)...the doubles were the second best total in Oakland history (67 in September, 2004), the on-base percentage was sixth best and the runs were seventh best and the most since August, 2001 (188)...the pitching staff compiled a 3.68 ERA, which was third best in the American League...had a 17-10 (.630) record, which was second best in the AL and the first time the A's finished a month with a winning record since they went 16-10 in June of 2008...that snaps a streak of eight consecutive months without a winning record, which equaled the second longest streak in Oakland history...it was the A's best record in a month since going 21-6 (.778) in August of 2006.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA in four starts in September after going 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts in the month of August...had compiled an ERA over 7.00 in each of the first five months of his career...this year, he had a 7.27 ERA in May, 7.27 in June and 7.48 in July...last year, he had a 7.25 ERA in August and 8.49 in September.

LAST EIGHT STARTS: Is 2-4 with a 5.93 ERA (27 er in 41.0 ip), .270 (43 for 159) opponents batting average and 28 walks in 41.0 innings over his last eight starts after going 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA, .189 opponents batting average and 11 walks in 24.2 innings over his previous four starts.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 99 batters in 92.2 innings, an average of 9.62 strikeouts per nine innings...that is the third highest ratio in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...his 99 strikeouts rank sixth among AL rookies and he needs one more to become the eighth rookie in Oakland history to fan 100 in a season.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on six days rest today...is 0-1 with a 28.59 ERA (18 er in 5.2 ip) in two starts on six or more days rest this year, both against Minnesota...is 6-4 with a 3.84 ERA (33 er in 77.1 ip) on 14 starts on five days rest or less.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-4 with a 6.85 ERA (34 er in 44.2 ip) and .302 (54 for 179) opponents batting average in nine starts in Oakland compared to 4-2 with a 4.69 ERA (25 er in 48.0 ip) and .270 (51 for 189) opponents average in

with a 4.69 ERA (25 er in 48.0 ip) and .270 (51 for 189) opponents average in 10 games, seven starts on the road...has allowed 10 of his 13 home runs in Oakland.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA (9 er in 30.0 ip) in five games, four starts, against American League West teams and 3-5 with a 7.18 ERA in 14 games, 12 starts, against everyone else.

SOME LIKE IT HOT: Tossed 6.1 shutout inning in his last start with a first pitch temperature of 81 degrees...is now 5-2 with a 2.85 ERA (13 er in 41.0 ip) in seven starts where game time temperature is 72 and above and 0-2 with a 12.42 ERA (23 er in 16.2 ip) in four starts with a temperature of 62 or less...is 2-2 with a 5.33 ERA (15 er in 25.1 ip) in five starts with the temp in between.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-4 with a 6.18 ERA (35 er in 51.0 ip) and .310 (65 for 210) opponents batting average in 11 games, nine starts, at night compared to 3-2 with a 5.18 ERA (24 er in 41.2 ip) and .253 (40 for 158) opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts, during the day...has allowed 10 of his 13 home runs at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .285 opponents batting average, which includes a .352 (32 for 91) mark against left-handed hitters and .264 (73 for 277) against right-handers...has yielded six of his 13 home runs to lefties and has a .670 opponents slugging percentage against lefties and .404 against righties...has allowed a .378 (17 for 45) average and six of his 13 home runs against the opponents number three hitter.

FOUR UNDER THE AGE OF 24: Has made 16 starts this year and is one of four Oakland pitchers under the age of 24 to make at least 15 starts (all season ages are based on players age as of June 30)...this is the third time in Athletics history and the first time in Oakland history the A's have had four pitchers under the age of 24 make at least 15 starts...the last time was by the 1967 Kansas City A's (Dobson, Hunter, Nash and Odom) and the other time was by the 1906 Philadelphia A's (Bender, Coakley, Coombs and Dygert)...according to baseball-reference.com, it is the 12th time it has happened in Major League history, the first time since the 2006 Florida Marlins (Nolasco, Olsen, Johnson, Sanchez)...no American League team has done it since the 1967 A's.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento for the third time on June 24 and is 6-6 with a 5.57 ERA (52 er in 84.0 ip) in 17 games, 16 starts, since his return...his first stint was from May 2 to 4 and he pitched 5.0 innings of relief on May 3 in the A's 8-7, 15-inning loss at Seattle (5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...his second stint was from May 18 to 19 and he pitched 3.2 innings of relief on the 18th at Tampa Bay (6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

LAST START: He combined with Wuertz and Bailey on a five-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Los Angeles a week ago today...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed four of the hits while walking one...allowed just two runners into scoring position, including a one-out triple by Aybar in the sixth...struck out Abreu and got Guerrero to foul out to end that threat.

GONZALEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (9.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 11 so) in two career appearances, both starts at Anaheim...picked up the win in his only start this year, his last start a week ago today at Los Angeles (see last start above)...had a no decision in his other start, a 6-5 A's win on August 27, 2008 at Los Angeles...the A's scored a run in the first and five more in the second and he blanked the Angels on a hit and four walks over the first three innings...was then charged with four runs in the fourth inning, including a two-run single by Aybar...tossed 3.0 innings and left with a 6-3 lead.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 2.51 ERA (61.0 ip, 42 h, 21 r, 17 er, 34 bb, 71 so, 5 hr) in 12 games, all starts, at Triple-A Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion...had the lowest opponents batting average (.194) and ranked second in strikeouts (71)...the batting average included a .188 (28 for 149) mark against right-handed hitters and .209 (14 for 67) against left-handers...allowed all five of his home runs to righties...his opponents batting average dropped to .160 (8 for 50) with runners in scoring position...the River Cats were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in five of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Dana Eveland (2-3, 7.09 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and ninth start of the season...is 1-0 with a 5.11 ERA in five games, two starts, since he returned to Oakland when rosters expanded on September 1...is 2-0 with a 4.60 ERA and .297 opponents batting average in four games, three starts in Oakland and 0-3 with a 8.75 ERA, .402 opponents average and all four of his home runs in eight games, five starts, on the road...now has a 10-4 career record in his home ballparks and is 3-12 on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 15-10 A's win at Los Angeles last Saturday (3.1 ip, 5 h, 8 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...is 0-2 with a 6.66 ERA (25.2 ip, 29 h, 22 r, 19 er, 14 bb, 19 so, 1 hr) in five career starts against the Angeles.

The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.81 ERA (18 er in 89.2 ip) over its last 22 games and has a 3.45 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (LAD, 3.12)...the last time the A's bullpen led the AL in ERA was in 1990...has 500 strikeouts, Save/Save Opportunities: 38/50 (76.0%) which is an Oakland record, the most in the AL, second most in the majors (SD, 512) and fourth most in AL history (CLE, 527 in 2001; NYY, 523 in 2008; NYY, 507 in 1996)...has allowed just 41 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...the pen leads the AL in innings pitched (545.0), has the second lowest opponents batting average (.240) and the third best save percentage (76.0%)...also leads the AL in first batter strikeouts (114), has the third fewest first batter walks (29) and is tied for third in first batter grounded into double plays (7)...has a 2.79 ERA (83 er in 267.2 ip) and 12 home runs allowed in Oakland compared to a 4.09 ERA and 29 home runs allowed on the road
