A's vs. ANGELS

The A's have lost the season series for the fifth time in the last six years as they trail 7-10 with two games remaining...went 6-4 in Anaheim but are 1-6 in Oakland...the A's most losses ever to the Angels in Oakland is seven in 2006...are now 52-60 against the Angels since 2004...the season series has been decided 10-9 four times in the previous five seasons...neither team has swept a series of three or more games since June 29-July 1, 2004 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland...the two clubs have played 28 series of three or more games since then...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 357-283 against the Angels...that includes 184-134 in Oakland and 173-149 in Los Angels...all-time, the A's are 406-360 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has 26 saves, which is an on-going Oakland rookie record and tied for sixth most by a rookie in American League history...ranks ninth among all AL pitchers this year in saves.

Kurt Suzuki has 88 RBI and will become just the second catcher in Athletics history to lead the team in RBI...Frankie Hayes had 78 for the Philadelphia A's in 1944.

Michael Wuertz leads American League relievers and ranks second in the majors with a career high 100 strikeouts...is the third Oakland reliever (sixth time) to strikeout 100 or more in a season.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On October 3, 1989 Dave Henderson and Mark McGwire homer and Rickey Henderson steals two bases as the A's defeat Toronto 7-3 in Game 1 of the ALCS...on October 3, 2001 the A's defeat Texas 5-4 to finish the regular season with a 17-game home winning streak...on October 3, 2006 Frank Thomas hits two home runs in Game 1 of the ALDS, a 3-2 A's win at Minnesota. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost a season high tying five consecutive games for the third time this year (also April 18-24 and June 23-28)...however, are 16-9 since September 5, which is tied for the second best record in the American League over that span (Minnesota, 17-9)...went 31-43 (.419) over the first 74 games this year but are 44-42 (.512) since June 29...are 75-85 and will finish with a losing record for the third consecutive season...have not had a losing record in three straight seasons since 1993-98 when they had six straight...will finish in last place in the AL West for the seventh time in Oakland history and the first time since 1998 (also 1977, 1979, 1993, 1995 and 1997)...have spent each of the last 153 days (since May 3) and 159 days this year in sole possession of last place in the West...the 159 days in last match the all-time Athletics record for most days in sole possession of last place set by the 1921 and 1946 Philadelphia A's...the A's 75 wins match last years total and are one short of the 2007 total of 76.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff struck out 14 last night to bring the season total to 1113...that is four short of the Athletics franchise record of 1117 set in 2001 and it ranks fifth in the American League this year...the A's have compiled a 5.94 ERA (33 er in 50.0 ip) over the last six games, but have a 4.26 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the AL...have allowed the fewest home runs (155) and hit the fewest batters (35) in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .210 (34 for 162) with 12 runs scored during the current five-game losing streak...are now hitting .262 for the season, which is the 10th highest single season batting average in Oakland history...rank fourth in the American League and the majors with 132 stolen bases...those are the most steals by an A's team since the 1992 club had 143...have 521 walks and the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...rank last in the AL in home runs (135) and slugging percentage (.398) and have the fourth fewest extra base hits (459)...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs in a non-strike season is last years club, which finished with 125.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are batting .281 (726 for 2586) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best batting average in the American League and fourth best in the majors...the Oakland record for batting average after the All-Star Break is .279 in 2006...have a Major League leading 78 stolen bases, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1989 (90)...also lead the majors in doubles after the break (162), rank third in runs (393) and fifth in extra base hits (239)...the Oakland record for post-break doubles is 164 in 2001.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-5 with a 9.72 ERA (27 er in 25.0 ip) over the last six games and are now 51-63 with a 4.76 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (881.1) in the American League, the fourth fewest wins and the fourth highest ERA...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...this will mark just the second time in Oakland history A's starters have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched in a non-strike season (858.2 ip in 1997)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 115 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...have started a rookie pitcher in 89 of the last 113 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 19 errors in the last 13 games and have 104 errors for the season...that is fourth most in the American League and the most by an A's team since 2003 (107)...had committed fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this season-ending three-game homestand against Los Angeles...are 40-39 (.506) in Oakland and need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the 10th time in the last 11 years (were 40-41 in 2007)...went 6-2 on the last homestand and have won eight of the last 11 games in Oakland...went 2-4 on the last road trip against Los Angeles (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and finished with a 35-46 (.432) record on the road, marking the third consecutive season the A's finished the year with a losing record on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 19-32 (.373) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season ended today and 56-53 (.514) against everyone else...are 23-32 (.418) against the American League West teams,, which is their worst mark in divisional play since 1999 (15-21, .417)...are 15-23 (.395) in one-run games and will finish with a losing record for the first time since 1998 (16-19)...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a winning percentage under .400 in one-run games was in 1980 (16-26, .381)...are 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970.

SERIES NOTES: The A's were swept at Seattle to start the week, snapping a streak of nine consecutive series without a loss, which was the A's longest such streak over the last three years...went 5-0-4 over the previous nine series and the last series loss prior to that also came in a sweep at Seattle, August 24-26.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used an Oakland record tying 26 pitchers this year (also 1997)...51 players have appeared in a game, matching last year for second most in Oakland history...the record of 54 was set in 2007...a total of 107 different players have appeared in at least one game for the A's over the last three years...have used the disabled list 17 times this year and 64 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 17 players have combined to miss 982 games, an average of 57.8 games per stint...the A's have five players who will be eligible for free agency following the season (Crosby, Duchscherer, Garciaparra, Kennedy, Tomko)...a minimum of six players will be eligible for arbitration (Casilla, Cust, E. Gonzalez, Hairston, Munson, Wuertz)...Joey Devine (2 years, 171 days) and Rajai Davis (2 years, 167 days) are likely "Super 2"-arbitration eligible players...Kurt Suzuki is the next highest service time at 2 years, 113 days.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's batted .297 in September, which was second best in the majors to the Yankees (.299)...it was also the second best single month batting average in Oakland history (.305 in August, 1995)...led the majors in runs (167), doubles (66) and stolen bases (28) and ranked second in hits (284) and on-base percentage (.367)...the doubles were the second best total in Oakland history (67 in September, 2004), the on-base percentage was sixth best and the runs were seventh best and the most since August, 2001 (188)...the pitching staff compiled a 3.68 ERA, which was third best in the American League...had a 17-10 (.630) record, which was second best in the AL and the first time the A's finished a month with a winning record since they went 16-10 in June of 2008...that snaps a streak of eight consecutive months without a winning record, which equaled the second longest streak in Oakland history.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and ninth start of the season...the A's are 5-3 (.625) in his starting assignments this yea and are 21-16 (.568) when he starts in his career...has tossed six innings in just one of his eight starts and has tossed five innings or less in each of his last seven starts, which is longest streak by an A's starter this year...allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer twice.

BRIEFLY: Is 1-0 with a 5.11 ERA (7 er in 12.1 ip) in five games, two starts, since he returned to Oakland when rosters expanded on September 1...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 7.40 ERA in five starting

assignments...his final start came on May 1 at Seattle and he was called on to pitch in relief two days later in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss...allowed the winning run to score in the 15th inning to take the loss and was optioned to Sacramento on May 5 after going 1-2 with a 7.40 ERA in six games, five starts...went 7-1 with a 3.49 ERA in 12 starts with the River Cats before being recalled July 6 to take Dallas Braden's turn after he was placed on the bereavement list...started and lost on July 7 at Boston and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game...went 1-5 with a 6.79 ERA in nine starts before returning to Oakland September 1.

EIGHT UNDER 26: Is 25 years old and is one of eight pitchers under the age of 26 to start at least five games for the A's this year (Anderson, Braden, Cahill, G. Gonzalez, Mazzaro, Mortensen, Outman)...that is the most in Oakland history and it equals the most in Athletics history (1915, 1966, 1967)...according to baseball-reference.com, this is the 10th time since 1900 that a Major League team has had at least eight pitchers under the age of 26 make at least five starts...in addition to the four A's teams, the other teams are the 2008 Florida Marlins, the 1979 and 1980 Detroit Tigers, the 1910 St. Louis Browns and St. Louis Cardinals and the 1909 Boston Red Sox (all ages based on players age on June 30).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed four home runs in 39.1 innings, an average of 0.92 per nine innings...allowed just 10 home runs last year for an average of 0.54 per nine innings, which was second lowest in the American League (Lee, CLE 0.48)...has allowed just 20 home runs in 271.2 career innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 4.60 ERA (8 er in 15.2 ip) and .297 (19 for 64) opponents batting average in four games, three starts in Oakland and 0-3 with a 8.75 ERA (23 er in 23.2 ip), .402 (43 for 107) opponents average and all four of his home runs in eight games, five starts, on the road...now has a 10-4 career record in his home ballparks and is 3-12 on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-2 with a 7.64 ERA (30 er in 35.1 ip) in eight starts this year and 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) in four relief appearances...now has an 11-14 record and a 5.43 ERA (139 er in 230.1 ip) in 43 career starts and is 2-2 with a 5.88 ERA (27 er in 41.1 ip) in 39 relief appearances.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 15-10 win at Los Angeles last Saturday...tossed just 3.1 innings and allowed eight runs, five earned...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed a three-run home run to Rivera in the bottom of the first...was also charged with five of the Angels six runs in the fourth inning and the A's trailed 9-2 after four...Oakland then scored four in the fifth, two in the sixth, one in the seventh and six in the eighth for the win.

EVELAND vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-2 with a 6.66 ERA (25.2 ip, 29 h, 22 r, 19 er, 14 bb, 19 so, 1 hr) in five career starts...lost his only start in Oakland (2 er in 5.1 ip, 3.38 ERA) and is 0-1 with a 7.52 ERA (17 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts at Anaheim...has no decisions and a 7.71 ERA (9.1 ip, 13 h, 11 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 5 so) in two starts this year...the first no decision came in a 6-4 A's win at Los Angeles April 8...allowed a RBI single to Rivera, a RBI double to Napoli and a sacrifice fly to Aybar in the fourth...left trailing 3-0 as Adenhart tossed 6.0 shutout innings...the A's scored three times in the eighth and three times in the ninth for the win...also had a no decision in his last start last Saturday (see last start above).

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 8-6 with a 4.94 ERA in 21 sta Sacramento...led the River starts with Cats in strikeouts (92), ranked second in innings pitched (124.0), tied for second in wins and third in games started...had a 7-1 record and a 3.49 ERA over his first 12 starts and ranked 10^{th} in Pacific Coast League in ERA when he was promoted to Oakland on July 6...then went 1-5 with a 6.79 ERA in nine starts after he was optioned back to Sacramento following his start on July 7 at Boston...the River Cats were 12-9 (.571) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 21 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed 12 home runs in 124.0 innings (0.87 per nine innings)...yielded a .273 opponents batting average, including .274 (99 for 361) by right-handed hitters and .270 (34 for 126 by left-handers...opponents hit .266 (37 for 139) with runners in scoring position, including .175 (10 for 57) with RISP and two outs.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Edgar Gonzalez (0-4, 5.51 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 27th appearance and seventh start of the season...has not won a game since April 24, 2008 at Los Angeles (NL) while pitching for Arizona...is 0-6 with a 5.94 ERA in 39 games, including eight starts, since then...has allowed one run in three of his six starts this year but has allowed five or more in his other three and is 0-3 with a 5.93 ERA as a starter...is 0-1 with a 5.21 ERA in 20 relief appearances...has allowed a .230 opponents batting average against right-handed hitters and .351 against left-handers...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss at Los Angeles last Sunday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (10.1 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 2 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances against Los Angeles, including one start...all three appearances have come this year.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

 The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.85 ERA (19 er in 92.2 ip) over its last 23 games and has a 3.45 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (LAD, 3.13)...the last time the A's bullpen led the AL in ERA was in 1990...has 504 strikeouts,

 which is an Oakland record, the most in the AL, second most in the majors (SD, 513) and fourth most in AL history (CLE, 527 in 2001; NYY, 523 in 2008; NYY, 507 in 1996)...has allowed just 41 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...the pen leads the AL in innings pitched (548.0), has the second lowest opponents batting average (.241) and the third best save percentage (76.0%)...also leads the AL in first batter strikeouts (115), has the third fewest first batter walks (29) and is tied for third in first batter grounded into double plays (7)...has a 2.79 ERA (84 er in 270.2 ip) and 12 home runs allowed in Oakland compared to a 4.09 ERA and 29 home runs allowed on the road
