ANGELS BRIEFING: Halos have won five of six games to move back to a season-high 30 games over .500...95 wins on season rank T3rd most in club history with 2005 squad...Angels have won a 3rd consecutive AL West title and 5th in last 6 seasons...2009 marks the club's 8th all-time Division crown and 9th all-time playoff berth (6th this decade)...Angels will open the playoffs at home against the Boston Red Sox in the Division Series for the third consecutive season and fourth time in six years (Angels are 1-9 in last 10 playoff games vs. Red Sox)...Halos have been in first place for 85 consecutive days...Since a .500 record of 29-29 on June 11th, Angels are 66-36...After a losing record in April (9-12), Angels are 86-53 since...Halos finished 16-12 in September and have a .500 or better record in 20 of last 21 months...Angels are 28-27 against A.L. West opponents and 67-38 vs. rest of MLB.

STANDS ALONE: Mike Scioscia is the first Manager in MLB history to guide his team to the playoffs six times in his first 10 years managing.

HE DOES IT ALL: With his 30th stolen base last night, Abreu became just the 5th player in history to have five different seasons with 100 RBI and 30 SB. Hall-of-Famer Honus Wagner did it 7 times, Hall-of-Famer Hugh Duffy and Barry Bonds each did it 6 times, while Hall-of-Famer Ty Cobb and Abreu have done it 5 times apiece.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: Joe Saunders is 6-0 with a 2.44 ERA (44.1 IP – 12 ER) in seven starts since returning from the DL...He was named the Angels Player of the Month for September.

SEPTEMBER SIZZLE: Angels led the Majors in September with a 2.96 ERA (249.2 IP – 82 ER).

ROAD RUNNERS: Angels lead AL with 46 road wins this season...Since the 2004 season, Angels have the best road record in MLB (273-211).

DID YOU KNOW? The 2009 Angels, 2007 Tigers and 1930 Cardinals are the only teams in MLB history with 10 players with at least 50 RBI (Source – Elias).

CLUB RECORD SET: Angels have set a single-season club record of 874 runs scored, a mark previously held by the Angels first playoff team in 1979 (866 runs)...Halos rank 2nd in MLB with 874 runs in 160 games, an average of 5.5 per game...Of the nine Angel teams that reached 800 runs in club history, five have come during Mike Scioscia's tenure.

THREE-PEAT! Angels are the first AL West team to win three straight division titles since the 1988-1990 Oakland A's...Angels' five division titles since 2004 are the most in baseball...Prior to Mike Scioscia's tenure (2000-09), Angels had just three playoff appearances in 39 years (1979, 1982 & 1986).

Vs. OAKLAND: Angels lead 2009 series 10-7...Athletics (2006, 2002-03) and Angels (2007-09, 200405) have claimed last eight AL West crowns...Of the last 73 games between the teams, 41 have been decided by two runs-or-fewer, including 24 one-run decisions.

STARTERS ON A ROLL: Angel starters have logged a 2.56 ERA over last 32 games (214.2 IP – 61 ER) and allowed two earned runs or less in 26 of last 36 outings...Angel starters have lowered season ERA from 5.00 to 4.46 over last 36 games to move from 12th in AL to 4th...Halo starters have gone at least six innings in 23 of last 30 games...Angels' starters lead AL with six shutouts and are tied for AL-lead with 68 wins.

FUENTES FACT: With 47 saves, Brian Fuentes has set an American League record for most saves by a pitcher in his first season with a team (previously 45 by Joe Borowski with 2007 Indians)...The major-league mark is 53 saves by Randy Myers in 1993, his first season with the Cubs (Source – Elias).

90 WINS: Angels have reached 90 victories for the sixth time in eight seasons and 10th time overall...Yankees and Red Sox are only other teams with at least 90 wins six times this decade.

KENDRICK'S COMEBACK: Since Howie Kendrick's recall from Salt Lake on July 4th, he is the majors top hitter batting .367 (66/180) – min. of 175 plate appearances.

OFFENSE ON RECORD PACE: Angels lead the Majors in several offensive categories including: Team Average (.285) and Avg. with RISP (.295) and rank 2nd in MLB in Hits (1,584) and Runs (874).

- Halos have 213 multi run-scoring innings (2nd most in MLB).
- .285 team batting average is on par to break club record of .284 set in 2007.

COMEBACK KIDS: Halos rank 2nd in Majors with 46 comeback wins (NYY is tops with 50)...46 comeback wins are a new club record, besting the mark of 45 set in 2004...Angels have nine wins this season with trailing by four runs or more.

HOME GROWN: 22 of the 35 players on the current roster are products of the Angels' farm system, including 4 of 5 starting pitchers and all 4 catchers.

SPEED & SMALL BALL: Angels rank 1st in Majors with 34 bunt hits...Halo baserunners have advanced from first base to third on a single 118 times (most in Majors)...Angels rank 3rd in Majors with 148 stolen bases...Halos have stolen 100-or-more bases in nine consecutive seasons, the only team in MLB to make that claim.

NICK ADENHART (1986-2009): Angels are honoring Nick Adenhardt with a black encircled #34 patch above the heart of the home and road uniforms...Team keeps a locker intact for Adenhardt at home and on the road...His jersey is hung in the dugout during each game...Adenhardt (22), Courtney Stewart (20) and Henry Pearson (25) were tragically killed by a drunk driver in a hit-and-run car accident in the early hours of April 9th...A fourth passenger, Jon Wilhite (24), sustained critical injuries but has recently returned home and is on his way to an amazing recovery.

LAST THREE STARTS: Dropped 3-2 decision to A.J. Burnett and New York, Sept. 23 at Angel Stadium...Allowed three runs on six hits in six innings...Walked three batters and struck out four...Eighth consecutive quality start...All three runs scored in fourth inning, snapping 14-inning scoreless streak... Left game trailing, 3-2...**In previous start**, defeated Tommy Hunter and Texas, 2-0, Sept. 18 at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington...Shutout the Rangers through six innings, scattering six hits while striking out five...Has thrown 11-consecutive scoreless innings...First start without allowing a walk since April 13 vs. New York...All six hits allowed were singles...Retired last five batters faced...Left game leading, 2-0.

LAST COMPLETE GAME: Defeated Josh Beckett and Boston, 3-0, July 3, 2008 at Tropicana Field...First career complete game shutout...Allowed just two hits through nine innings while walking two and striking out 10...Struck out Manny Ramirez with the bases loaded in the third...Retired 15 of 17 batters at one point...Threw 120 pitches, 84 strikes.

STRIKEOUT HIGH: 13 – August 25, 2007 against Oakland at Tropicana Field (14-3 win, 8 IP).

WIN STREAK: 6 – May 10, 2008 to June 6, 2008...Posted an 0.88 ERA in that span (41 IP – 4 ER).

- Had 14-inning scoreless streak snapped in fourth inning of last start, Sept. 23 vs. New York (3-2 loss).
- Has made five starts with the Angels since being acquired from Tampa Bay on August 28th going 1-2 with a 2.01 ERA (31.1 IP – 7 ER)...**He has received a total of eight runs of support over the five starts (1.6 per start).**
- Acquired from Tampa Bay Rays on August 28th in exchange for minor leaguers Alexander Torres (LHP), Matthew Sweeney (INF) and a PTBNL (Sean Rodriguez, INF).
- **Since the 2006 season, Kamir's 9.50 K's per 9 IP average leads the Majors.**
- Was placed on the disabled list on May 21 and missed 33 games.
- Has a 3.16 ERA (145.1 IP – 51 ER) in September, best of any month in career.
- Was 12-8 with a 3.49 ERA (152.1 IP – 59 ER) in 27 starts in 2008.
- Is 56-46 with one shutout and a 3.85 ERA (865.1 IP – 370 ER) lifetime.

#53 BOBBY ABREU (OF) - (AH-BRAY-U)

- Has reached 100 RBI for the 7th consecutive season - Albert Pujols is the only other player in MLB with the same streak.
- Has played at least 150 games for the 12th consecutive season (see box to right).
- With his 30th stolen base last night, Abreu became just the 5th player in history to have five different seasons with 100 RBI and 30 SB...He joins Honus Wagner, Hugh Duffy, Ty Cobb and Barry Bonds apiece.
- Just the second player Angels' history with at least 100 RBIs and 30 steals (Bobby Bonds had 115 RBIs and 41 steals in 1977).
- 86 RBI his last 110 games (spanning to May 25th) to rank 2nd in AL in RBI during that stretch.
- 8th in AL with 102 RBI...Leads Angels with 23 go-ahead RBI.
- T3rd in AL with 94 walks...Patient hitter who has taken 67.4% of pitches has seen (2nd most in MLB)...Has walked at least twice in 22 games this season and three times on seven occasions.
- Batting .359 (56/156) with RISP to rank 4th in AL.
With 30 stolen bases, has 20+ stolen bases in 11 consecutive seasons (1999-2009), the longest current streak in MLB.
- Owns a career OBP of .406, good for 10th among MLB actives.
- Named AL Player of the Month for July...Batted .380 (38/100) with 28 RBI in 26 games, becoming first Angel to reach those figures since Tim Salmon batted .390 with 32 RBIs in 27 games in July 1997...2nd Player of the Month honor in his career (May, 2005).
- First inning double June 7th at Detroit was 2,000th hit of his career...He is just the fifth Venezuelan player to reach the 2,000 hit mark as he joins Hall of Famer Luis Aparicio (2,677 hits), Omar Vizquel (2,674), Andrés Galarrága (2,333) and Dave Concepción (2,326)...With 252nd career HR 8/16 @ Bal, passed Tony Armas for third place for home runs by Venezuelans (Galarraga 399; M. Ordonez 278).
- CAREER NOTES: Two-time All-Star (2004 & 2005), Gold Glove recipient (2005) and Silver Slugger honoree (2004)...One of five players with 100 RBI and 100 runs scored in each of past two seasons (2007-08)...Has played in at least 150 games in each of last 11 seasons (1998-2008)...Only active player with a .300 career batting average, .400 on-base percentage, 200 homers and 250 stolen bases.

With his 250th career HR Aug. 6th at Chicago, Abreu became one of only six players in MLB history with: **250 HR, 2000 H, 1000 R, 1000 RBI, 1000 BB and 300 SB**

ANGELS MISC. 2009 NOTES

THE MANAGER: In his 10th season with the Angels, Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the AL...He is one of 30 managers in MLB history to guide the same franchise at least 10 straight seasons...Tony LaRussa accomplished the feat twice and is the lone manager to do so...Under Scioscia, the Angels have claimed four division titles in last five seasons. The four division crowns in the five-year span have surpassed the total (3) for the franchise over the previous 42 seasons...Two of Mike's former coaches are now managers (Joe Maddon - TB & Bud Black - SD).

BIG JOHN STUD: John Lackey earned the 100th win of his career (8 IP, 0 ER, 6 SO), 8/30 vs. Oak....Since 1973 (Frank Tanana's first season), four pitchers who made their big-league debut with the Angels have gone on to win at least 100 games for the franchise (Tanana, Mike Witt, Chuck Finley and Lackey)...Lackey has won at least 10 games in each of his last seven seasons (every year since 2003). Only two other pitchers in Angels history won 10-or-more games in seven consecutive seasons: Nolan Ryan (eight years in a row, 1972-1979) and Finley (seven, 1993-1999).

POWER IMPROVEMENT: Through the first 58 games (June 11th), the Angels had a total of 44 home runs and ranked 10th in the AL with a .404 slugging pct...Since that point, the Halos have clubbed 128 long balls in 102 games and enter today's game ranked 5th in the Majors in slugging percentage (.442).

POWER PLAYERS: Halos are on pace to have at least four players (Morales, Rivera, Napoli & Hunter) finish with 20+ home runs...Angels have not had long ball production like that since the 2000 season when five players hit at least 25 home runs (Anderson, Erstad, Glaus, Salmon & Vaughn).

NOT SINCE 1934: Each of the nine players in the Angels' batting order on August 18th at Cleveland came out of the contest with a season's average of .300 or higher...Marked first time since the 1934 Detroit Tigers (Sept. 9th) that any MLB team finished a game-at least 100 games into a season-with each player in its starting batting order hitting .300 or better (Courtesy of ELIAS)

WHAT A BARGAIN: The annual Team Marketing Report's Fan Cost Index (FCI) shows the Angels continue to make an effort to hold prices down in light of the countries' economic conditions. The Angels, with an average ticket price of \$20.05, were hailed as "baseball's best bargain."

ANGELS RANK #1 IN SPORTS: ESPN THE MAGAZINE'S 2009 "Ultimate Standings" rank all 122 MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL franchises by "how much they give back to fans for all the emotion, money and time they invest in their favorite teams." The Angels came in at #1 in all of sports in the Ultimate Standings because "they understand the importance of value, performance and effort -- and did so long before the recession hit." For the last six years (2004-09), Angels have also ranked #1 in MLB.

3 MILLION FANS: Angels have reached 3 million fans for the 7th consecutive season, a streak only the Yankees and Dodgers have also accomplished.
