YESTERDAY

The A's lost to the Chicago Cubs in Phoenix, 4-2...Brett Anderson started for the A's and tossed 1.2 scoreless innings (1 h, 2 bb, 3 so) but Gio Gonzalez allowed two runs in 2.0 innings of relief for the loss...Andrew Bailey tossed a scoreless sixth inning but Fautino De Los Santos did not retire any of the six batters he faced (3 h, 6 r, 6 3 er, 2 bb) in the Cubs seven-run seventh inning...Craig Breslow pitched a scoreless eighth and Cedrick Bowers a scoreless ninth...the A's collected just four hits, including a leadoff home run by Kurt Suzuki in the fourth inning and a two-run home run by Josh Donaldson in the eighth...the A's two other hits were a Coco Crisp single in the third and an Eric Chavez infield single in the sixth.

A's vs. RANGERS

This is the first of two meetings between the A's and Rangers this spring...the two clubs also meet in Surprise March 26...the A's lost the only meeting last spring, 8-5 at Surprise.

IN CAMP

The A's have a total of 63 players in camp, which includes 40 players on the 40-man roster and 23 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 30 pitchers, six catchers, 17 infielders and 10 outfielders.

MINOR LEAGUE DATES

Pitchers and catchers have reported to minor league training camp at Papago Park...position players report Friday, March 12 with the first workout scheduled for the same day...minor league spring games begin March 19 and run through April 3...extended Spring Training will begin April 8.

A's ON THE AIR

The A's radio network will broadcast 13 games from Arizona this spring and all three games in the Bay Area...games can be heard in the Bay Area on XTRA Sports 860 AM...Ken Korach returns for his 15th year in the A's broadcast booth and will be joined by Vince Cotroneo (5th) and Ray Fosse, who enters his 25th season in the booth...Robert Buan will webcast all other games in Arizona on oaklandathletics.com...four A's games from Arizona will be televised this spring, including one on Comcast SportsNet California -- March 24 against the Dodgers (7:35 pm) and one on Comcast SportsNet Bay Area -- March 25 against the Giants (7:05 pm)...MLB Network will air games on March 7 against the Angels (4:00 PT tape delay) and March 26 against the Cubs (1:00 pm)...CSNCA will also air the game on April 3 against San Francisco in Oakland (1:05 pm).

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have split their first four games this spring, with both of their losses coming against the Cubs...are 2-1 at home after going 11-5-1 at Phoenix Municipal Stadium last spring...are 23-8-1 (.734) at Phoenix over the last three years...rank last in the Cactus League in batting (.220) but are tied for third in home runs (6)...this is the A's 42nd Spring Training in Arizona and their 29th consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...with the rainout on Sunday, the A's are now scheduled to play 32 games this spring, including 29 in Arizona before returning to the Bay Area for three games with the Giants on April 1 and 2 in San Francisco and April 3 in Oakland...the A's went 17-18-2 last spring and finished with a losing record for the first time since 2006 (15-17)...the 18 losses tied an Oakland spring record set in 1993 and matched in 2005...however, the 37 games played were an Oakland record, topping the previous high of 34 in 1993 and 2004.

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Eight of the A's top 10 prospects according to *Baseball America* are in camp this spring...the list includes two players already on the A's 40-man roster in Chris Carter (#1) and Pedro Figueroa (#5)...six are non-roster invitees including Michael Taylor (#2), Grant Green (#3), Max Stassi (#4), Tyson Ross (#6), Jemile Weeks (#7) and Adrian Cardenas (#8)...the other two are Grant Desme (#8), who retired to become a priest, and Sean Doolittle (#10)...three of the A's top 10 appear on *Baseball America's* Top 100 Prospect List including Carter (#28), Taylor (#29) and Green (#52).

OFF-SEASON MOVES: The A's signed RHP Ben Sheets as a free agent Jan. 26 and he brings with him 221 career starts in eight years of service...last year, the five pitchers in the A's starting rotation at the beginning of the season combined for just 63 starts...other off-season additions to the 40-man roster include IF Jake Fox (trade with Cubs, Dec. 3), RHP Bobby Cassevah (Rule 5 draft, Dec. 10), OF Coco Crisp (free agent, Dec. 23), 3B Kevin Kouzmanoff (trade with Padres, Jan. 16), IF Adam Rosales (trade with Reds, Feb. 1), OF Gabe Gross (free agent, Feb. 1) and IF Steve Tolleson (waivers from Twins, Feb. 1)...in addition, RHP Justin Duchscherer and OF Jack Cust both became free agents before re-signing with the A's.

COACHING STAFF: Manager Bob Geren welcomes back his entire coaching staff from last season...they include bench coach Tye Waller, pitching coach Curt Young, hitting coach Jim Skaalen, first base coach Todd Steverson, third base coach Mike Gallego and bullpen coach Ron Romanick.

A's EN ESPAÑOL: The A's begin the second year of a five-year agreement with the Spanish Beisbol Network (SBN) to broadcast all 162 regular season games...last year marked the first time in club history the A's featured Spanish broadcasts for every regular season game, home and away...veteran announcer Amaury Pi-González will again serve as the "Voice of the A's" for all Spanish broadcasts, with Manolo Hernández-Douen handling analyst duties.

MEDIA INFORMATION: The A's clubhouse is open to members of the media with proper credentials beginning at 8:00 am...the clubhouse may be closed at certain times for team meetings, etc...please do not lounge or conduct interviews in the weight room/exercise area...once the game begins, the clubhouse is open only to those media who need access to players who have completed their work for the day...A's manager Bob Geren will be available to the media each morning in the first base dugout at 9:15 am...Geren will also be available on the field following the conclusion of the game...at Phoenix Municipal Stadium, members of the media will be allowed in the dugout area and foul territory behind home plate extending down to (but not past) first and third base until the batting cage is removed from the field of play...at that point, all media members must leave the field...the A's dugout will remain accessible to the media until 45 minutes before game time...still photographers and television camera crews with proper credentials must stay in assigned areas at all times...no roving is permitted...still photographers or television camera crews are not allowed in the clubhouse, training room or weight room...lunch is available to members of the media with proper credentials in the patio area in the right field corner of Phoenix Municipal Stadium...the A's are able to provide complimentary lunches to beat writers, play-by-play broadcasters and designated team officials only.

TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for A's spring training home games are available at the Phoenix Municipal Stadium Box Office, on-line at oaklandathletics.com/spring or by calling (877) 493-BALL (2255)...the box office hours of operations are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, and during all home games...tickets for all A's regular season home games can be purchased at all the usual ticket outlets, including the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum Box Office, online at oaklandathletics.com and all Tickets.com outlets, or over the phone by calling (877) 493-BALL...season, group and luxury suite tickets can be purchased by calling (510) 638-GoA's (4627).

Travis Buck hit his first home run of the spring Friday against Milwaukee to start the A's seven-run rally in the sixth inning...**Adrian Cardenas** is one of four players to play in all four games this spring and he is hitless in five at bats...**Chris Carter** homered in his first at bat of the spring last Thursday in the eighth inning at Mesa...is one of four players to play in all four games...**Eric Chavez** has hit safely in each of his two games, both starts at first base...has made just one regular season appearance at first base (August 21, 2001 vs. Cleveland)...**Coco Crisp** has hit safely in each of his two games this spring, both starts at designated hitter...**Josh Donaldson** hit his first home run of the spring yesterday against the Cubs, a two-run shot in the eighth inning...**Jake Fox** has appeared in three games (one at third base, one at catcher, one in left field) and is hitless in five at bats...**Eric Patterson** is one of four players to appear in all four games this spring (two at second base, two in center field)...**Anthony Recker** was 2 for 2 with a home run and three RBI Friday against Milwaukee...**Adam Rosales** has reached base safely in each of his three games this spring, including a home run last Thursday in the fifth inning at Mesa...**Kurt Suzuki** hit his first home run of the spring yesterday in the fourth inning against the Cubs...**Michael Taylor** is one of four players to appear in all four games this spring.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#53 TREVOR CAHILL RHP (0-1, 9.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his second start of the spring...took the loss in the A's spring opener last Thursday against the Cubs at Mesa...was one of two 21-year olds to spend the season in the A's starting rotation and led the Oakland pitching staff in starts (32), innings pitched (178.2) and losses (13)...was 10-13 with a 4.63 ERA...led Major League rookies in games started...ranked second among American League Rookies in innings pitched, tied for seventh in wins and ninth in strikeouts (90)...the games started fell one short of the Oakland rookie record of 33 set by Joe Blanton in 2005 and he is one of eight rookie 10-game winners in Oakland history...set an Oakland rookie record by allowing 27 home runs, breaking the previous mark of 24 by John Wasdin in 1996...it tied the franchise record set by Dan Pfister in 1962.

ALSO SCHEDULED TO PITCH

#63 HENRY RODRIGUEZ RHP (0-0, 9.00)

Is scheduled to make his second appearance of the spring...allowed a run in the fifth inning in his first outing last Saturday against the Angels...made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2009 and posted a 2.25 ERA and .235 opponents batting average in three games in September...pitched exclusively in relief for the first time as a professional and combined for a 2-1 record and a 5.18 ERA in a career-high 40 relief appearances with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Sacramento...also had a career high four saves...struck out 82 in 48.2 innings for an average of 15.16 per nine innings, which was the highest mark of his career...also walked 39, for an average of 7.21 per nine innings, and had nine wild pitches (1.66 per nine innings)...allowed a .222 opponents batting average.

#64 JUSTIN SOUZA RHP (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his second appearance of the spring...struck out the side in the eighth inning in his first outing last Thursday at Chicago (NL) and allowed one hit...was acquired by the A's last year from the Seattle Mariners organization for infielder Jack Hannahan July 11 and was assigned to Double-A Midland...went 0-2 with a 10.35 ERA in five starts before a shoulder injury ended his season Aug. 4...was 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 20 games, 14 starts, at Double-A West Tenn and combined for a 6-8 record and a 4.78 ERA in 25 games, 19 starts, overall...it was the first time in his career he had more starts than relief appearances...yielded just five home runs, or 0.46 per nine innings...allowed a .274 opponents batting average.

#59 MATT WRIGHT RHP (1-5, 6.75 ERA at Triple-A Omaha in 2009)

Is scheduled to make his first appearance of the spring...the non-roster invitee signed a minor league contract with the A's Nov. 25...began the 2009 season on the disabled list and went 1-5 with a 6.75 ERA in nine games, eight starts, with Triple-A Omaha before he was released July 6...allowed a .299 batting average, including .250 (13 for 52) against left-handed hitters and .324 by right-handers (34 for 105)...opponents hit .322 with runners in scoring position, but that mark dropped to .190 with RISP and two outs...pitched for Licey in the Dominican Winter League following the season and went 1-2 with a 2.27 ERA in nine games, six starts...held the opposition to a .228 batting average and did not allow a home run in 31.2 innings.

#31 BRAD ZIEGLER RHP (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his second appearance of the spring...allowed an unearned run in the seventh inning last Friday against Milwaukee...was 2-4 with seven saves and a 3.07 ERA in 69 relief appearances last year...allowed two home runs in 73.1 innings for an average of 0.25 per nine innings, the third lowest mark among American League relievers... now has yielded four home runs in 133.0 career innings or 0.27 per nine innings...led AL relievers and ranked second in the majors with 14 grounded into double plays (Affeldt, SF 18)...ranked third among AL relievers in most hits allowed (82) and had a .293 opponents batting average...that included a .265 mark against right-handed hitters and .336 against left-handers...opponents hit .384 with runners in scoring position.
