### YESTERDAY

The A's lost to Colorado at Tucson, 10-4...Trevor Cahill started for the A's and allowed just one run in 5.0 innings pitched (5 h, 1 so)...he left with a 2-1 lead but Lenny DiNardo allowed five runs in 1.0 innings and Fernando Hernandez yielded four in 0.2 innings...DiNardo took the loss...Gabe Gross had a RBI single in the fourth inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead, his second of four hits on the day...Daric Barton hit a solo home run in the sixth inning and the A's scored two more runs in the eighth on a Cliff Pennington RBI triple and a Gross RBI double...Gross had four of the A's nine hits and Barton added two.

### A's vs. INDIANS

This is the only meeting between the A's and Indians this spring...last spring, the two clubs split four games with the A's winning twice in Phoenix and the Indians winning twice in Goodyear.

### IN CAMP

The A's have a total of 48 players in camp, which includes 35 players on the 40-man roster and 13 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 22 pitchers, four catchers, 12 infielders and 10 outfielders...the A's currently have 39 players on the 40-man roster.

### MINOR LEAGUE DATES

Minor League spring games began yesterday and run through April 3...extended Spring Training will begin April 8.

### A's ON THE AIR

The A's radio network will broadcast 13 games from Arizona this spring and all three games in the Bay Area...games can be heard in the Bay Area on XTRA Sports 860 AM...Ken Korach returns for his 15<sup>th</sup> year in the A's broadcast booth and will be joined by Vince Cotroneo (5<sup>th</sup>) and Ray Fosse, who enters his 25<sup>th</sup> season in the booth...Robert Buan will webcast all other games in Arizona on oaklandathletics.com...three remaining games from Arizona will be televised this spring, including one on Comcast SportsNet California -- March 24 against the Dodgers (7:35 pm) and one on Comcast SportsNet Bay Area -- March 25 against the Giants (7:05 pm)...MLB Network will air the March 26 game against the Cubs (1:00 pm)...CSNCA will also air the game on April 3 against San Francisco in Oakland (1:05 pm)...the A's begin the second year of a five-year agreement with the Spanish Beisbol Network (SBN) to broadcast all 162 regular season games in Spanish...veteran announcer Amaury Pi-González will again serve as the "Voice of the A's" for all Spanish broadcasts, with Manolo Hernández-Douen handling analyst duties.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three of the last four games after winning four of the previous five...are tied for third in the Cactus League in home runs (16), tied for fourth in walks (60) and rank fifth in doubles (39)...have grounded into just three double plays, which is three fewer than any other Major League team...have made 21 errors, which is tied for second in the CL...have been successful in 15 of 18 (83.3%) stolen base attempts...the pitching staff has allowed at least seven runs in 11 of the 16 games for a 6.59 ERA...have the highest ERA in the CL, are second in hits allowed (188) and tied for fourth in home runs allowed (15)...the A's are 5-3-1 at home after going 11-5-1 at Phoenix Municipal Stadium last spring...are 26-10-2 (.711) at Phoenix over the last three years...this is the A's 42<sup>nd</sup> Spring Training in Arizona and their 29<sup>th</sup> consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...with the rainout on March 7, the A's are now scheduled to play 32 games this spring, including 29 in Arizona before returning to the Bay Area for three games with the Giants on April 1 and 2 in San Francisco and April 3 in Oakland...the A's went 17-18-2 last spring and finished with a losing record for the first time since 2006 (15-17)...the 18 losses tied an Oakland spring record set in 1993 and matched in 2005...however, the 37 games played were an Oakland record, topping the previous high of 34 in 1993 and 2004.

**A's TOP PROSPECTS:** Eight of the A's top 10 prospects according to *Baseball America* began the spring in the major league camp...the list includes two players already on the A's 40-man roster in Chris Carter (#1) and Pedro Figueroa (#5)...six are non-roster invitees including Michael Taylor (#2), Grant Green (#3), Max Stassi (#4), Tyson Ross (#6), Jemile Weeks (#7) and Adrian Cardenas (#8)...the other two are Grant Desme (#8), who retired to become a priest, and Sean Doolittle (#10)...three of the A's top 10 appear on *Baseball America's* Top 100 Prospect List including Carter (#28), Taylor (#29) and Green (#52).

**Daric Barton** doubled and homered yesterday and is tied for the Cactus League lead with five doubles...also ranks second in on-base percentage (.548), sixth in batting (.440) and eighth in walks (6)...**Corey Brown** is 1 for 13 (.077) over his last seven games...**Travis Buck** is 1 for 7 over his last four games...four of his five hits are for extra bases (two doubles, two home runs)...is tied for ninth in the Cactus League in home runs (2)...**Adrian Cardenas** is 6 for 12 (.500) over his last eight games after going 0 for 5 over his first four games...has appeared in six games at third base and five at second base...**Matt Carson** was hitless over his first 12 at bats this spring before delivering a RBI double in the eighth inning Thursday against Arizona...**Chris Carter** has four hits and three are for extra bases (two doubles, one home run)...is 1 for 9 with two walks over his last seven games...**Eric Chavez** is 1 for 12 over his last four games after hitting safely in each of his first three contests (4 for 8, .500)...is tied for ninth in the Cactus League with two home runs...each of his seven games have been starts at first base...has made just one regular season appearance at first base (August 21, 2001 vs. Cleveland)...**Coco Crisp** has hit safely in each of his three games, all starts at designated hitter batting leadoff...has not played since March 9 because of a strained left hamstring...**Jack Cust** is tied for fourth in the Cactus League in doubles (4)...five of his seven hits are for extra bases (also has one home run)...has appeared in 10 games at designated hitter and one in left field...**Rajai Davis** was scratched from the lineup Wednesday with an abdominal strain and has not played since Monday...has hit safely in each of his last three games (6 for 11, .545) after going 1 for 19 over his first six games...is tied for 10th in the Cactus League in steals (3)...has appeared in five games in left field and four in center field...has batted leadoff eight times and second in the only game he and Crisp were both in the starting lineup...**Josh Donaldson** is 0 for 5 over his last three games after going 2 for 3 over his first four contests...has two hits, both for extra bases (one double, one home run)...**Mark Ellis** is 7 for 19 (.368) over his last six games after going 1 for 6 over his first three games...**Jake Fox** is 0 for 7 over his last three games and has just two hits overall, including a home run last Sunday against Kansas City...has appeared in six games in left field, four at catcher, four at third base and one in right field...**Gabe Gross** was 4 for 4 yesterday against Colorado in Tucson and added two RBI...he is tied for fifth in the Cactus League in RBI (9)...has appeared in six games in center field, three in right field and one in left field...**Kevin Kouzmanoff** is 4 for 9 (.444) over his last three games after going 3 for 19 (.158) over his first six contests...has appeared in nine games, all at third base batting cleanup...**Eric Patterson** is 5 for 26 (.192) over his last eight games after going 3 for 9 (.333) over his first five contests...has appeared in eight games in center field, four at second base and two in left field...**Cliff Pennington** is tied for the Cactus League lead in triples (2) and is tied for eighth in walks (6)...is 4 for 10 (.400) over his last four games after going 2 for 10 (.200) over his first five contests...**Gregorio Petit** has reached base safely in five of the six games in which he has an at bat...**Landon Powell** is 1 for 12 with eight strikeouts over his last six games...**Anthony Recker** was 2 for 2 with a home run and three RBI in his first game but is 0 for 5 in five games since then...**Adam Rosales** ranks third in the Cactus League in on-base percentage (.516) and is tied for eighth in batting (.423)...is 8 for 18 (.444) over his last seven games...has appeared in seven games at shortstop, two at second base, two at third base and one in right field...**Eric Sogard** is 5 for 12 (.417) over his last eight games...has appeared in seven games at second base, two at shortstop and one at third base...**Kurt Suzuki** is 0 for 5 over his last two games after going 1 for 3 in each of his first six games...all eight of his games have been starts at catcher batting third...**Ryan Sweeney** has back-to-back multiple hit games (4 for 6, .667) and is 8 for 18 (.444) over his last six games after going 1 for 10 over his first four games...**Michael Taylor** is 1 for 11 (.091) over his last six games...**Steve Tolleson** has appeared in eight games at shortstop, three at third base and two at second base.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

### #29 JASON JENNINGS RHP (1-0, 3.18 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and first start of the spring...tossed a scoreless fifth and sixth innings March 11 against Milwaukee and picked up the win...the non-roster invitee signed a minor league contract with the A's Feb. 28...went 2-4 with a 4.13 ERA over 44 relief appearances for Texas last year before being designated for assignment Aug. 27...led the Rangers staff with 61.0 relief innings through Aug. 26, which tied for the 10th-highest total in the American League...was granted his unconditional release Aug. 31...marked his first campaign in a major league bullpen, as he entered the 2009 season with just one career relief appearance and 180 starts...opponents hit .286, including .257 against right-handers.

## ALSO SCHEDULED TO PITCH

### #54 VIN MAZZARO RHP (0-0, 5.40 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance of the spring...tossed 3.0 shutout innings in his only start, March 9 at Kansas City...has allowed five runs in 5.1 innings in his two relief appearances...began the 2009 season at Triple-A Sacramento but made 17 starts for the A's before right shoulder tendinitis ended his season early...was 2-2 with a 2.38 ERA in 10 games, nine starts, with the River Cats before he was promoted to Oakland June 2...went 4-9 with a 5.32 ERA with the A's and made his final start Aug. 29...allowed a .319 batting average, including .316 against right-handed hitters and .321 against left-handers...his opponents average dropped to .250 with runners in scoring position, including .133 with RISP and two outs...received run support of three runs or less in 14 of his 17 starts.

### #45 MARCUS McBETH RHP (1-0, 6.23 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fifth appearance of the spring...has not allowed a run in three of his four outings...the non-roster invitee signed a minor league contract with the A's Dec. 12...had two stints with Boston last year but did not appear in a game...compiled a 2-3 record, three saves and a 2.69 ERA in a team leading 44 games, including one start, at Pawtucket...ranked second among International League relievers in opponents batting average (.194) and fewest base runners per nine innings (9.97) and fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.86)...issued a career high 30 walks...allowed a .189 opponents batting average overall, including .181 against right-handed hitters and .200 against lefties.
