The A's lost to San Francisco last night in Scottsdale, 6-3...Jason Jennings started for the A's and took the loss, allowing two runs in 3.0 innings (4 h, 3 bb, 4 so)...Brad Ziegler then allowed two runs in the inning before Wuertz and Edwar Ramirez pitched a scoreless inning of relief each...Tyson Ross finished the game by allowing two runs, one earned, in 2.0 innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings on RBI singles by Mark Ellis, Ryan Sweeney and Cliff Pennington...the trie three RBI singles, Pennington added a single and Travis Buck tripled.

A's vs. CUBS

This is the fourth and final meeting between the A's and Cubs this spring...the A's are 1-2 against Chicago, losing the only game in Mesa March 4 (3-9) and splitting two games in Phoenix March 8 (L, 3-10) and 17 (W, 7-4)...last spring, the A's were 0-2-1 against the Cubs...lost the only game in Mesa and had a loss and a tie in the Cactus League finale in Phoenix

The A's have a total of 40 players in camp, which includes 36 players on the 40-man roster and four noninvitees...the breakdown pitchers, includes 20 three catchers, nine infielders and eight outfielders...the A's currently have 40 players on the 40-man roster

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 1-3-1 over the last five games and are a spring low two games under .500 for the fourth time...rank third in the Cactus League in walks (84) and tied for third in home runs (21)...have grounded into just eight double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...rank second in the majors with 28 errors (Colorado, 29)...have been successful in 19 of 22 (86.3%) stolen base attempts...the pitching staff has allowed the second most hits in the majors (244) and has the fourth highest ERA (6.07)...the A's are 6-4-2 at home after going 11-5-1 at Phoenix Municipal Stadium last spring...are 27-11-3 (.695) at Phoenix over the last three years...this is the A's 42nd Spring Training in Arizona and their 29th consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...with the rainout on March 7, the A's are now scheduled to play 32 games this spring, including 29 in Arizona before returning to the Bay Area for three games with the Giants on April 1 and 2 in San Francisco and April 3 in Oakland...the A's went 17-18-2 last spring and finished with a losing record for the first time since 2006 (15-17)...the 18 losses tied an Oakland spring record set in 1993 and matched in

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Eight of the A's top 10 prospects according to Baseball America began the spring in the major league camp...the list includes two players already on the A's 40-man roster in Chris Carter (#1) and Pedro Figueroa (#5)...six are non-roster invitees including Michael Taylor (#2), Grant Green (#3), Max Stassi (#4), Tyson Ross (#6), Jemile Weeks (#7) and Adrian Cardenas (#8)...the other two are Grant Desme (#8), who retired to become a priest, and Sean Doolittle (#10)...three of the A's top 10 appear on Baseball America's Top 100 Prospect List including Carter (#28), Taylor (#29) and Green (#52).

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

Daric Barton is 2 for 12 (.167) over his last six games, including a four-walk game last Saturday against Chicago (NL)...ranks second in the Cactus League in walks (10), third in on-base percentage (.500) and tied for seventh in doubles (5)... Travis Buck tripled last night against San Francisco and six of his seven hits are for extra bases (three doubles, one triple, two homers)...is 3 for 17 (.176) over his last eight games...Chris Carter is 1 for 15 with two walks and eight strikeouts over his last 11 games...has four hits and three are for extra bases (two doubles, one home run)... Eric Chavez is 2 for 22 (.091) over his last seven games after hitting safely in each of his first three contests (4 for 8, .500)...has not drawn a walk this spring...each of his 10 games have been starts at first base...has made just one regular season appearance at first base (August 21, 2001 vs. Cleveland)...**Coco Crisp** returned to the lineup Monday after being out since March 9 because of a strained left hamstring and is 1 for 7 in two games since his return...the one hit was his first home run of the spring, Monday against the Mariners...started in center field Wednesday night after his first four starts came at designated hitter...has batted leadoff in all five of his games...Jack Cust went 2 for 2 with two walks Wednesday night after going 0 for 13 with nine strikeouts over his previous four games...has appeared in 12 games at designated hitter and one in left field...Rajai Davis returned to the lineup Wednesday night for the first time since March 15 due to an abdominal strain...is 0 for 7 in two games since his return after going 6 for 11 over his final three games before the injury...has appeared in six games in left field and five in center field...has batted leadoff nine times and second in the two games he and Crisp were both in the starting lineup...Mark Ellis went 1 for 3 with a RBI last night against San Francisco after missing two games with tightness in both of his hamstrings...is 10 for 26 (.385) over his last nine games after going 1 for 6 over his first three games...Jake Fox is 0 for 12 over his last seven games and has just two hits overall...has appeared in seven games in left field, six at third base, five at catcher and one in right field... Gabe Gross had two RBI Monday against the Mariners and is tied for ninth in the Cactus League in RBI (11)...is 7 for 17 (.412) with five RBI over his last seven games, including a 4 for 4 performance a week ago today against Colorado in Tucson...has appeared in eight games in center field, four in right field and three in left field...**Kevin Kouzmanoff** doubled twice Monday against the Mariners and is tied for seventh in the Cactus League in doubles (5)...is 8 for 23 (.348) over his last eight games after going 3 for 19 (.158) over his first six contests...has appeared in 14 games, all at third base...has batted cleanup in 13 of those games and third once...has not drawn a walk this spring...**Eric Patterson** is 0 for 2 over his last two games after hitting safely in each of his previous six games (8 for 20, .400) with six RBI and four walks...is tied for fifth in the Cactus League in triples (2)...has appeared in 11 games in center field, seven at second base and two in left field...Cliff Pennington is 9 for 23 (.391) over his last nine games after going 2 for 10 (.200) over his first five contests...is tied for third in the Cactus League in walks (9), tied for fifth in triples (2), tied for seventh in steals (4) and ranks eighth in on-base percentage (.465)...**Landon Powell** is 2 for 18 (.111) with 10 strikeouts over his last nine games...**Anthony Recker** is 1 for 8 over his last eight games after going 2 for 2 in his first game...**Adam Rosales** is 1 for 16 over his last five games after going 8 for 15 (.533) over his previous six games...has appeared in nine games at shortstop, four at second base, three at third base and one in right field...**Kurt Suzuki** is 2 for 19 (.105) over his last seven games...has hit safely in eight of his 13 games and has gone 1 for 3 in each of those eight games...hit fifth last night...has also batted third 11 times and cleanup once...Ryan Sweeney is 13 for 33 (.394) over his last 11 games after going 1 for 10 over his first four games...Michael Taylor is 4 for 11 (.364) over his last seven games...has not drawn a walk this spring...Steve Tolleson is 0 for 6 over his last seven games after going 4 for 9 over his previous six games...has appeared in nine games at shortstop, six at third base and two at second base...has not struck out this spring.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#51 DALLAS BRADEN LHP (0-0, 4.50)

Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the spring...has issued just one walk in 10.0 innings...faced A's minor leaguers March 16, a scheduled off day...was the A's Opening Day starter last year and went 8-9 with a 3.89 ERA in 22 starts before a rash led to nerve damage in his left foot, ending his season in August...his wins, ERA, opponents batting average (.268), starts, innings pitched (136.2) and strikeouts (81) were the best of his three seasons in the majors...the opponents batting average included a .203 mark against left-handed hitters and .290 against right-handers...allowed just nine home runs in 136.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine

innings...was 7-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 18 starts before the All-Star Break and had the seventh lowest ERA in the AL...then went 1-2 with a 7.40 ERA and .324 opponents batting average in four starts after the break.

ALSO SCHEDULED TO PITCH

#39 BRAD KILBY LHP (0-0, 7.71 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his seventh appearance of the spring...has allowed at least one run in three of his six outings...has yielded seven hits in 7.0 innings, including three home runs...spent nearly the entire 2009 regular season at Triple-A Sacramento and went 4-2 with two saves and a 2.13 ERA in 45 relief appearances to earn a Sept. 1 call-up to Oakland...was 1-0 with a 0.53 ERA in 11 games, one start, with the A's...allowed a .164 batting average, which included a .132 (5 for 38) mark against right-handed hitters and .217 (5 for 23) against left-handers...struck out 20 in 17.0 innings, an average of 10.59 per nine innings...with Sacramento, he fanned 77 in 63.1 innings, an average of 10.94 strikeouts per nine innings...allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .150 against right-handed hitters.

#31 BRAD ZIEGLER RHP (0-0, 3.68 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance of the spring...allowed two runs in 1.0 inning last night against San Francisco after not allowing a run in his previous four outings (4.1 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...was 2-4 with seven saves and a 3.07 ERA in 69 relief appearances last year...allowed two home runs in 73.1 innings for an average of 0.25 per nine innings, the third lowest mark among American League relievers... now has yielded four home runs in 133.0 career innings or 0.27 per nine innings...led AL relievers and ranked second in the majors with 14 grounded into double plays (Affeldt, SF 18)...ranked third among AL relievers in most hits allowed (82) and had a .293 opponents batting average...that included a .265 (45 for 170) mark against right-handed hitters and .336 (37 for 110) against left-handers.
