YESTERDAY

The A's shutout the Giants on five hits in San Francisco, 9-0...Justin Duchscherer started for the A's and tossed 6.0 innings, allowing three of the hits and walking two while striking out six...Jerry Blevins, Craig Breslow and Tyson Ross pitched one scoreless inning of relief each...Kevin Kouzmanoff had a RBI double in the first inning to open the scoring and Kurt Suzuki followed with а two-run homer...Rajai Davis Kouzmanoff had RBI singles in the third inning and Coco Crisp had a two-run single in the A's three-run fifth inning...Eric Sogard had a sacrifice fly in the eighth to complete the A's scoring...the A's collected a spring high 17 hits, including three each by Crisp, Kouzmanoff and Suzuki.

A's vs. GIANTS

This is the fifth of six meetings between the A's and Giants this spring...the two clubs have split the first four games, with the A's winning the first game in San Francisco last night, losing the only meeting in Phoenix and splitting two contests in Scottsdale...last spring, the A's went 4-3 against San Francisco...split two games in Phoenix, Scottsdale and San Francisco and won the only game in Oakland.

IN CAMP

The A's have a total of 34 players in camp plus one player on the DL (Meloan)...the total includes 33 players on the 40-man roster and one non-roster invitee...the breakdown includes 18 pitchers, two catchers, seven infielders and seven outfielders...the A's currently have 40 players on the 40-man roster plus one player on the 60-day disabled list.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped a five-game winless streak last night and are now 12-15-3 (.450)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive spring (went 17-18-2 last year)...the last time the A's finished the spring with a winning percentage under .450 was in 1990 when they went 6-10 (.375)...the A's record is tied for ninth best among the 15 Cactus League teams, but it is the best mark among the four American League West teams...have three tie games, which are the A's most ties during the spring since moving to Arizona in 1969...the shutout last night lowered the A's ERA to 5.62, which is the lowest it has been since the fourth game of the spring (March 8)...however, it is the fourth highest ERA in the majors...rank third in the majors in most hits (316) and tied for third in most walks (118)...are tied for the Cactus League lead in hit by pitches (16), rank second in walks (121), third in home runs (29) and fourth in most strikeouts (206)...have grounded into seven double plays in the last five games after hitting into eight over the first 25 contests...the 15 GIDP overall are the fewest in the majors...are tied for third in the majors with 33 errors...this is the A's 42nd Spring Training in Arizona and their 29th consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...with the rainout on March 7, the A's are now scheduled to play 32 games this spring, including 29 in Arizona.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

Daric Barton has walked at least once in each of his last six games (11 walks total) and has 21 walks overall, which are six more than any other major leaguer...they are also the most walks by an Athletic during the spring since stats are first available in 1991...the previous best was 17 by Mark McGwire in 1991...ranks third in the Cactus League in on-base percentage (.507)...leads the A's in walks...is 4 for 26 (.154) over his last 12 games...Travis Buck hit his team leading fourth home run Wednesday, which is tied for seventh in the CL...eight of his 12 hits are for extra bases (three doubles, one triple, four home runs)...is tied for the team lead in runs (12)...is 7 for 20 (.350) over his last eight games...has appeared in 16 games in right field, eight in left field and one in center field... Eric Chavez played third base and shortstop Wednesday, his only defensive appearances at a position other than first base all spring...made 12 starts at first and has made just one regular season appearance at first base (August 21, 2001 vs. Cleveland)...has five career appearances at shortstop...is 4 for 33 (.121) over his last 11 games after hitting safely in each of his first three contests (4 for 8, .500)...**Coco Crisp** has hit safely in each of his last six games (11 for 21, .524) and 10 of 11 games overall...returned to the lineup March 22 after being out 12 days because of a strained left hamstring...is 12 for 28 (.429) in eight games since his return...six of his last seven starts have been in center field...his other five starts have been at designated hitter...has batted leadoff in all 11 of his games...Jack Cust is 4 for 13 (.308) with five walks over his last five games after going 0 for 13 with nine strikeouts over his previous four games...has appeared in 15 games at designated hitter and one in left field...**Rajai Davis** is 5 for 31 (.161) over his last seven games after missing eight days due to an abdominal strain...is tied for eighth in the CL in steals (5)...has appeared in 10 games in left field and seven in center field...has batted leadoff 10 times and second in the six games he and Crisp were both in the starting lineup...**Mark Ellis** is 16 for 44 (.364) over his last 14 games after going 1 for 6 over his first three contests...Jake Fox had his second multiple hit game yesterday and is 4 for 10 (.400) over his last five games after going 3 for 38 (.079) over his first 18 contests...has appeared in 11 games at third base, 10 at catcher, seven in left field and one in right field...Gabe Gross is 2 for 14 (.143) over his last eight games after going 7 for 15 (.467) over his previous five contests...has appeared in nine games in center field, nine in right field and four in left field...**Kevin Kouzmanoff** had his first three hit game last night and is 7 for 15 (.467) with six RBI over his last four contests...is tied for second in the CL in doubles (7) and tied for ninth in RBI (15)...leads the A's in doubles and RBI...has appeared in 19 games, all at third base...has batted cleanup 18 times and third once...**Eric Patterson** is 14 for 41 (.342) with seven RBI over his last 15 games after going 5 for 25 (.200) with one RBI over his first 10 contests...has appeared in 16 games in center field, nine at second base and four in left field...**Cliff** Pennington had his first three-hit game last Saturday and is 14 for 39 (.359) over his last 14 games after going 2 for 10 (.200) over his first five contests...is tied for fifth in the CL in walks (11) and ranks seventh in stolen bases (6)...leads the A's in steals and is tied for the lead in runs (12)...has appeared exclusively at shortstop on defense...Landon Powell is 4 for 28 (.143) with 13 strikeouts over his last 15 games...has appeared exclusively at catcher on defense...Adam Rosales is 4 for 31 (.129) over his last 11 games after going 8 for 15 (.533) over his previous six games...played four positions Wednesday (second, third, short and left)...has appeared in 15 games at shortstop, five at second base, five at third base, one in left field and one in right field...**Kurt Suzuki** went 3 for 4 last night for his first multiple hit game...was 2 for 29 (.069) over his previous 11 games...has batted fifth in each of his last six games...has also hit third 11 times and cleanup once...**Ryan Sweeney** has hit safely in each of his last eight games (9 for 27, .333) and is 19 for 52 (.365) over his last 16 contests after going 1 for 10 over his first four games...leads the A's in hits (20)...has appeared exclusively in right field on defense.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#49 BRETT ANDERSON LHP (0-1, 6.08 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the spring...allowed six runs in 5.0 innings in his last start after allowing just three runs in 8.1 innings (3.24 ERA) over his first three starts...also pitched in a simulated game against minor leaguers March 23...was one of two 21-year olds to spend the 2009 season in the A's starting rotation...set an Oakland rookie record with 150 strikeouts...led the A's pitching staff in strikeouts and wins (11) and finished second in starts (30)...compiled an 11-11 record and 4.06 ERA...led all Major League rookies in strikeouts...tied for third among American League rookies in games started, ranked fourth in innings pitched (175.1) and tied for fourth in wins...his strikeouts broke the previous Oakland rookie record of 141 set by Pokkand rookie record of 141 set by

ALSO SCHEDULED TO PITCH

#59 EDWAR RAMIREZ RHP (0-0, 4.50 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fifth appearance of the spring, his fourth since he was traded to the A's March 24 for minor league infielder Gregorio Petit...has allowed one run in three of his four outings but has eight strikeouts in 6.0 innings...began the spring in the Yankees organization but was designated for assignment March 1 before spring games began...traded to Texas for cash considerations March 9 and made his only appearance with the Rangers March 15 against San Francisco when he allowed one run in 1.1 innings...made 20 relief appearances with New York in 2009, posting no decisions and a 5.73 ERA over two stints... opponents batted .281, including .302 (16 for 53) by left-handed hitters and .250 (9 for 36) by right-handers...13 of his 20 appearances were scoreless...stranded 14 of 21 inherited runners (66.7%)...retired 11 of 20 first batters faced (55.0%).

#63 HENRY RODRIGUEZ RHP (0-0, 4.82 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance of the spring...has allowed four runs in his last four outings (4.0 ip, 5 h, 5 bb, 5 so) after holding the opposition scoreless over his previous four outings (4.1 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 5 so)...made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2009 and posted a 2.25 ERA and .235 opponents batting average in three games in September...pitched exclusively in relief for the first time as a professional and combined for a 2-1 record and a 5.18 ERA in a career-high 40 relief appearances with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Sacramento...also had a career high four saves...struck out 82 in 48.2 innings for an average of 15.16 per nine innings, which was the highest mark of his career...allowed a .222 opponents batting average, including .190 against right-handed hitters and .275 against lefties.

#31 BRAD ZIEGLER RHP (0-0, 3.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance of the spring...has not allowed a run in six of his last seven outings (2 er in 7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA)...has not yielded a home run in 9.0 innings...was 2-4 with seven saves and a 3.07 ERA in 69 relief appearances last year...allowed two home runs in 73.1 innings for an average of 0.25 per nine innings, the third lowest mark among American League relievers... now has yielded four home runs in 133.0 career innings or 0.27 per nine innings...led AL relievers and ranked second in the majors with 14 grounded into double plays (Affeldt, SF 18)...ranked third among AL relievers in most hits allowed (82) and had a .293 opponents batting average...that included a .265 (45 for 170) mark against right-handed hitters and .336 (37 for 110) against left-handers.
