### FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

**C Adam Moore** and RHPs **Doug Fister** and **Kanekoa Teixeira** are on an Opening Day roster for the first time in their careers...Teixeira is the only player on the 25-man roster who will be making his Major League debut when he appears in a game.

### OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener a week from today, Monday, April 12, returning the favor and hosting the Oakland A's... Seattle is 21-12 all-time in the first game of the season, including going 6-2 in home openers after starting the season on the road...won 3-2 (10) last season in the home opener after beginning the season in Minnesota.

### TONIGHT'S TILT...

...the Mariners open their 34th season with a road tilt at the Oakland A's...tonight is the first game of a 4-game series against the A's and a 7-game road trip to open the season (also 3 games at Texas)...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on FSN in high definition and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

### FOR OPENERS...

...the Mariners are 18-15 in season openers, winning 6-1 at the Twins in 2009...the Mariners have won 3 straight season openers and 4 of the last 5...first time to win three straight openers since 1995-97 (have not won 4 straight since a 5-game OD win streak 1982-86)...prior to win in 2005, had lost 6 of previous 7 openers dating back to 1998...**OPENERS vs. THE A'S**...2010 marks the 7th time in club history the Mariners will open the season against the A's, and 4th time opening a season at The Coliseum (last: 2003)...Seattle is 3-3 all-time on Opening Day against the A's, 0-3 in Oakland, 3-0 in Seattle...Seattle lost in Oakland in 1988 (1-4), 1989 (2-3) and 2003 (0-5); Mariners won in Seattle in '85 (6-3), 2001 (5-4) and 2007 (4-0)...**NIGHT OPENERS**...the Mariners open the season with a night game for the second straight season, but just the third time over the last nine seasons (since April 1, 2003 at Oakland)...Mariners are 15-9 in night openers.

### ROAD OPENERS...

...the Mariners open on the road for the second straight season ('09 at MIN), but only the second time since 2003 (at OAK) and only the 9th time in club history...Seattle is 3-5 in season openers on the road...Mariners opened the season on the road in 1982 (at MIN), 1987 (at CAL), 1988 (at OAK), 1989 (at OAK), 1990 (at CAL), 1994 (at CLE), 2003 (at OAK) and 2009 (at MIN)...the Mariners are 9-24 all-time in the first road game of the season; win last year snapped a 3-game losing streak but Seattle has still lost 5 of the last 7.

### SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...

...tonight is the first of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2010...7 of the Mariners first 10 games will come against the A's...Seattle opens and closes the season with a 4-game sets vs. the A's...the Mariners and A's will play 9 games in the Coliseum (also May 17-18 and Sept. 6-8) and 10 games at Safeco Field (April 12-14, Aug. 9-11 and Sept. 30-Oct. 3)...the Mariners were 14-5 vs. the A's last season (6-4 on the road, 8-1 at home); Seattle is 37-20 vs. the A's since 2007...the Mariners trail the all-time series 189-180-1, and trail the series at the Coliseum 86-151 (.363)...the Mariners have won the last 3 games vs. the A's, but have dropped the last two in the Coliseum (Sept. 5-6).

### GET USED TO THE AL WEST...

...the Mariners open the season playing their first 10 games against AL West division opponents (7 vs. OAK, 3 vs. TEX)...Seattle opened the 2006 season with 7 consecutive games vs. the AL West, and amazingly opened the 2001, 2003 and 2004 seasons with 19 consecutive games against division opponents.

### FOR STARTERS...

**Felix Hernandez** will make his third career Opening Day start for Seattle (also 2007 vs. A's, 2009 vs. Twins)...Felix is one of just 8 pitchers in club history to make multiple Opening Day starts: Randy Johnson (6 starts), Jamie Moyer (4), **Felix Hernandez** (3), Glenn Abbott (3), Mike Moore (3), Freddy Garcia (3), Mark Langston (3), Jeff Fassero (2)...**Felix's two career Opening Day wins is tied (with Johnson) for most in Mariners history.**

### NOW PLAYING LEFT FIELD...

...with his start in left field today, **Milton Bradley** becomes the 23rd different player to start in left field on Opening Day for the Mariners in the past 34 years...Raul Ibanez (4), Phil Bradley (3), Mark McLemore (2), Darren Bragg (2), Greg Briley (2), Bruce Bochte (2), Tom Paciorek (2) and Randy Winn (2) all have multiple Opening Day starts in left field...14 different guys have one start each in LF.

### NEW FACES...

...Seattle begins the 2010 season with 7 players who did not appear in a game for the Mariners last season, compared to 9 new faces to open the 2009 season...the 2010 new faces are: pitchers **Brandon League**, **Kanekoa Teixeira** & **Cliff Lee (15-day DL)**; infielders **Chone Figgins** & **Casey Kotchman** and outfielders **Milton Bradley** & **Eric Byrnes**...13 players who were on last season's Opening Day roster return to this year's, including: 6 pitchers (**David Aardsma**, **Erik Bedard** (15-day DL), **Felix Hernandez**, **Shawn Kelley**, **Mark Lowe** & **Ryan Rowland-Smith**); 1 catcher (**Rob Johnson**); 2 infielders (**Jose Lopez** & **Matt Tuiasosopo**); 2 outfielders (**Franklin Gutierrez** & **Ichiro Suzuki**) and 2 designated hitters (**Ken Griffey Jr.** & **Mike Sweeney**)...finally, 8 players who played with Seattle at some point last season return to this year's Opening Day squad: 4 pitchers (**Doug Fister**, **Ian Snell**, **Jason Vargas** & **Sean White**), 1 catcher (**Adam Moore**); 2 infielders (**Jack Wilson** & **Jack Hannahan-DL**) and 1 outfielder (**Ryan Langerhans**).

### OPENING DAY FACTS...

**Ken Griffey Jr.** is making his 13th career OD start for the Mariners tonight; that's second (Edgar Martinez, 15) on the Mariners all-time list...Griffey has 13 OD hits (tied with Martinez) and has more home runs (8) and RBI (15) than any other player...**Mariners Opening Day Fact Sheet is Page 5 of today's notes.**

### DID YOU KNOW?...

...that **Ken Griffey Jr.** is tied for the all-time lead in Opening Day home runs?...Griffey is tied with Frank Robinson with 8 homers on Opening Day...Eddie Matthews, Willie Mays and Babe Ruth are tied for third with 7 OD home runs...all 8 of Ken's Opening Day homers have come during his 12 years as a Mariner: (1990, 1993, 1995, 1997-2, 1998, 1999, 2009).

**ABOUT HERNANDEZ...**23-year-old right-hander (turns 24 on Thursday) is making his first start of the season and the 105th of his Major League career...also his 3rd career Opening Day start.

- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at DET...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest MLB pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84...Rijo was 19 years, 54 days old on July 6, 1984 (NYY at MIN) in relief appearance.
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in M's history & 2nd-youngest pitcher.
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old as non-drafted free agent on July 4, 2002.
- Selected to 2009 All-Star game (1st in career)...was 23 years, 97 days, becoming the 5th-youngest M's All-Star.
- Finished 2nd in the 2009 AL Cy Young race behind Zack Greinke (Kansas City); won 2009 Seattle Sports Pro Star of the Year; Named Mariners 2009 MVP Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter for the BBWAA.
- Tossed at least 6.0 IP in 104 of 138 GS (75%), including 70 of last 83 starts (84%)...629.2 IP since start of 2007 is 5th-most among AL starters.
- 2nd pitcher in club history to post a season (2009) of 200.0 IP, 200 K's, 15 W and sub 3.00 ERA...Randy Johnson accomplished this in 1995 & 1997.
- is 9-5, 2.79 ERA (38 ER, 122.2 IP) in 19 career starts in April.

**OPENING DAY...**making his third career Opening Day start tonight vs. the Athletics...was the Mariners OD starter on April 6, 2009 at MIN (W, 8.0,5,1,1,3,6) and April 2, 2007 vs. OAK (W, 8.0,3,0,0,2,12).

**FOR STARTERS...**Felix Hernandez will make his third career Opening Day start for Seattle (also 2009 at MIN)...is one of just 7 pitchers in club history to make at least 3 Opening Day starts: Randy Johnson (6 starts), Jamie Moyer (4), Glenn Abbott (3), Mike Moore (3), Freddy Garcia (3), Mark Langston (3), Felix Hernandez (3).

**FIRST STARTS...**Since making his first Opening Day roster in 2006, Felix 1-1 with 0.64 ERA in his first start of the season...he has allowed 1 run or less in all four starts, allowing 15 hits with 12 walks and 12 strikeouts 25.

**HE'S GOING STREAKING...**dating back to Aug. 28, 2009 Felix is 7-0 with a 1.79 ERA (12 ER, 60.1 IP) in 8 starts...this streak ties his career winning streak at 7 (last done: 5/24-7/22/09).

**ROAD WARRIOR...**in his career Felix is 29-22 with a 3.48 ERA (170 ER, 440.0 IP) in 68 starts on the road...has won 8 of his last 9 road decision dating back to June 10, 2009...in 2009 set the Mariners single-season road ERA record (previously by R. Johnson in 1995 -- 7-1, 2.35).

**MARINERS K'S...**in Mariners history, ranks 6th with 810 career strikeouts (Freddy Garcia is 5th with 819)...also ranks 2nd in club history averaging 8.06 strikeouts per 9.0 IP.

**IN THE LAST 4 YEARS NO ONE HAS BEEN BETTER...**since 2006, Felix ranks 2nd in the AL with 733 strikeouts...only Justin Verlander has struck out more batters during this stretch (739)...also during this stretch, Felix ranks 5th in the AL in ERA (1. Zach Greinke - 2.99, 2. Roy Halladay - 3.11, 3. CC Sabathia - 3.35, 4. John Lackey - 3.50, Felix Hernandez - 3.53).

**2009 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...**

- Led the AL with .792 winning percentage...also among the AL leaders in wins (T1st), ERA (2nd), starts (T2nd), IP (3rd), K's (4th) and K/9.0 IP (7th).
- Recorded a quality start in 24 of last 25 starts, going 15-2 with a 1.98 ERA (40 ER, 182.0 IP) from May 24-end of the season.
- The Mariners went 25-9 in his 34 starts...followed a Mariners loss in 23 of 34 starts, going 15-4 with a 2.46 ERA (44 ER, 161.0 IP) in those games.
- Etched name in Mariners single-season record book, ranking 3rd in ERA (2.49, T4th in wins (19), 4th in winning % (.792), T8th in IP (238.2), 9th in strikeouts (217), 9th in starts (34)...set Mariners record for wins by RHP
- Named AL pitcher of the Month for June (3-0, 0.94) and Sept. (6-0, 1.52)...first player in club history to earn 2 honors during the same season.

**TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP IAN SNELL (5-2, 4.20 ERA in '09)**

28-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 1st start of season tomorrow against Oakland...**SPRING TRAINING:** went 1-4 with a 7.13 ERA (19 ER, 24.0 IP) in 6 ST starts...allowed 31 hits with 3 walks and 18 strikeouts over 24.0 innings...**2009:** acquired from Pittsburgh in 7-player trade (w/SS Jack Wilson) on July 29, 2009...went 5-2 with a 4.20 ERA (30 ER, 64.1 IP) in 12 starts with Seattle...went 2-8, 5.36 (48 ER, 80.2 IP) in 15 starts for the Pirates...also 2-2, 0.96 (4 ER, 37.1 IP) in 6 starts for Indianapolis (AAA) in the International League...**CAREER:** is 38-48 with a 4.71 ERA in 140 games/128 starts in career...vs. OAK -- making 3rd career start vs. OAK...went 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER, 11.0 IP) in 2 starts with the Mariners vs. OAK in 2009.

## 2010 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

### SPRING ODDS AND ENDS...

- **Franklin Gutierrez** led the team and ranked T6th among AL Cactus League players with 15 RBI...tied for team HR lead with **Matt Tuiasosopo** (3).
- The Mariners had to come from behind in 6 of their 12 victories.
- **Chone Figgins** ranked 2nd in the Cactus League with 16 walks...recorded at least one walk in 13 of 21 games.
- Mariners ranked 3rd in the AL with 34 stolen bases, trailing only CWS (39) and LAA (37).
- 12 different pitchers recorded the Mariners 12 wins.

**CACTUS LEAGUE**...the Mariners finished their 34th spring in the Cactus League with a 12-18-2 record...went 3-2-1 over last 6 spring games...have an all-time record of 449-498-22 (.475) in 969 all-time spring training games...completed the 17th spring playing at Peoria Stadium, and have an all-time record of 123-142-9 at the stadium...2010 saw the addition of one team to the Cactus League, with the Cincinnati Reds relocating to Goodyear.

**LONG SPRING**...the Mariners and Giants played the first Cactus League game on March 3 at Peoria Stadium, when the rest of the Arizona teams opened on March 4...the Mariners and Giants also played the final exhibition game among all Major League games, closing out the spring schedule April 4 at AT&T Park.

**PACK THEM IN**...the Mariners drew 120,358 fans to Peoria Stadium this spring, an average of 8,597 fans for the 14 home games (had one rainout)...in 17 dates at Peoria Stadium last spring, the club averaged 7,113 fans per game...the team has drew 10,000+ in 5 of the last 9 home games, including a Cactus League record crowd of 13,629 March 28 vs. the Chicago Cubs...Seattle has now drawn at least 100,000 fans in 12 of the last 13 spring trainings...the total home attendance is 2nd-highest among all AL clubs (NYY - 136,781) and ranked 4th in the Cactus League.

**MR. MARCH - MATT TUIASOSOPO**...**Matt Tuiasosopo** made his second straight Opening Day roster after another impressive Cactus League showing...Tuiasosopo hit .321 (18x56) with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 3 home runs and 8 RBI...over the last 2 spring trainings, Tuiasosopo has combined to bat .374 (43x115)...Tuiasosopo played every position during spring training except pitcher and catcher.

**CAREER-HIGH STEALS FOR ICHIRO**...**Ichiro** set a spring training career-high with 8 stolen bases, ranking 2nd among AL players (Bourjos, LAA - 9)...the 8 SB are one better than his previous spring high of 7 set in 2002...overall, Ichiro batted .257 (19x74).

**TEXEIRA NAME ROY**...relief pitcher **Kanekoa Teixeira** was named the Peoria Diamond Club Rookie of the Year...Teixeira went 1-0 with a 2.40 ERA (4 ER, 15.0 IP)...through his first 10 outings, the Rule 5 selection from the Yankees has allowed only 1 ER.

**SWEEN-DOG**...Mike Sweeney finished Cactus League play batting .500 (20x40) with 10 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs and 10 RBI...he recorded at least one hit in 10 of his 14 games, including 6 multi-hit games...he ended his torrid spring going 5-for-11 (.455) over the last 4 games.

**WALK-OFF SLAM**...**Ken Griffey Jr.** hit a walk-off grand slam March 26 to lift the Mariners to a 6-5 win over the Reds...during the course of Mariners history (regular season), there have been 62 walk-off home runs, including eight walk-off slams (last: Richie Sexson, 8/8/06 vs. TB)...there has been only one walk-off grand slam in club history when the team was trailing by three runs: **Phil Bradley** hit a walk-off grand slam against the Minnesota Twins on April 13, 1985 vs. Ron Davis (Mariners were trailing 7-4, won 8-7).

**SPRING SHUTOUT**...the Mariners shut out the Diamondbacks 4-0 on March 20...the pitching foursome of **Felix Hernandez**, **David Aardsma**, **Shawn Kelley** and **Kanekoa Teixeira** combined to limit Arizona to only 3 hits...it was the first shutout by the Mariners in spring training since 1994 when John Cummings got the win in the Mariners 7-0 victory over the Rockies on March 19.
