HAPPY ANNIVERSARY

Today is the 33rd anniversary of the Mariners first-ever game, April 6, 1977...Seattle hosted the California Angels in the Kingdome.

NOTHING EXTRA

The Mariners did not allow an extra base hit to the A's last night, just the 32nd time (in 472 games) that has happened... Seattle is 24-8 when they limit Oakland to only singles...while it has only happened 32 times in 34 seasons (since '77), it has happened 5 times since the start of 2009, and Seattle is 4-1.

THE ROSTER

The Mariners 25-man Opening Day roster includes 11 pitchers, 2 catchers, 5 infielders, 5 outfielders and 2 designated hitters... the youngest and oldest players on the roster are the same for the second straight season... **Matt Tuiasosopo** (5/10/86) at 23 years, 10+ months is the youngest...the oldest is **Ken Griffey Jr.** (11/21/69) at 40 years, four+ months.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

C Adam Moore and RHPs **Doug Fister** and **Kanekoa Teixeira** are on an Opening Day roster for the first time in their careers...Teixeira is the only player on the 25-man roster who will be making his Major League debut when he appears in a game.

OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener a week from today, Monday, April 12, returning the favor and hosting the Oakland A's... Seattle is 21-12 all-time in the first game of the season, including going 6-2 in home openers after starting the season on the road...won 3-2 (10) last season in the home opener after beginning the season in Minnesota.

TICKET INFORMATION

Single game tickets for the 2010 Seattle Mariners season are on sale **NOW**...tickets are available without a service charge at the Safeco Field Box Office and at Seattle Mariners Team Stores... for Opening Day, only a handful of scattered single tickets remain but tickets are still available as part of various Mariners ticket plans...tickets remain for every other Mariners home game, including **Felix Hernandez'** home debut on April 16...for more information visit: www.mariners.com/tickets.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 34th season-opening roadtrip tonight in Oakland... tonight is the 2nd (1-0) game of a 4-game series against the A's and a 7-game road trip to open the season (also 3 games at Texas)...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on FSN in high definition and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is the 2nd (1-0) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2010...7 of the Mariners first 10 games will come against the A's...Seattle opens and closes the season with a 4-game sets vs. the A's...the Mariners and A's will play 9 games in the Coliseum (also May 17-18 and Sept. 6-8) and 10 games at Safeco Field (April 12-14, Aug. 9-11 and Sept. 30-Oct. 3)...the Mariners were 14-5 vs. the A's last season (6-4 on the road, 8-1 at home); Seattle is 38-20 vs. the A's since 2007...the Mariners trail the all-time series 202-270, and trail the series at the Coliseum 87-151 (.363)...the Mariners have won the last 4 games vs. the A's.

KOTCHMAN'S DEBUT...**Casey Kotchman** went 2-for-4 with 4 RBI in his Mariners debut last night...he plated a run with a double in the first inning, a sacrifice fly in the third and provided the game-winner with a 2-run single in the top of the 9th inning...the 4 RBI are tied for 2nd-most in a Mariners debut, trailing 5 RBI by **Richie Sexson** on Opening Day in 2005 (4/4/05), and tying **Al Chambers** (7/23/83) and **Leon Roberts** (4/9/78)...it is also the 4th-most RBI by a Mariner on Opening Day behind **Jim Presley** (6, 1986), **Jim Maler** (5, 1982) and **Sexson** (5, 2005).

RUNNING WILD...the three stolen bases last night marked the first by the Mariners on Opening Day since 1992...prior to last night Seattle had only recorded 9 stolen bases all-time on Opening Day, with the previous high being 2 in 1985 (1 each by **Spike Owen** & **Dave Henderson**)...**Chone Figgins** became the first player in club history to post a multi-steal game on Opening Day.

FELIX IS QUALITY...**Felix Hernandez** recorded a no-decision last night (6.2,3,3,3,6,4) in his third career Opening Day assignment, but did notch his club-record-tying 14th consecutive quality start (at least 6.0 IP, 3 or less ER)...during the streak (dating back to 8/1/09), Felix is 8-1 with a 2.16 ERA (24 ER, 100.0 IP)...right-hander **Erik Hanson** also had a streak of 14 straight quality starts from July 27, 1990-April 9, 1991.

ICHIRO STREAKING VS. A'S...**Ichiro** is riding a current 21-game hitting streak against the A's after going 1-for-4 last night...during the streak (dating back to 8/24/08), Ichiro is batting .380 (35x92) with 4 doubles, 1 triple and 7 RBI...it is Ichiro's third-longest hitting streak in his career vs. an opponent, trailing a 26-game streak against the Royals (4/14/05-4/15/08) and a 22-game streak against the White Sox (4/27/01-5/11/03)...he has also recorded 20-game hitting streaks against the Red Sox, Blue Jays and Twins.

DOUBLE YOUR FUN...the Mariners turned four double plays last night, just the 47th game in team history with four or more in a 9-inning game...Seattle's club record is 5 (May 1, 1980) and last night was the 46th time with four double plays in a game.

STILL STREAKING...**Casey Kotchman** handled 13 chances (12 putouts and an assist) perfectly last night...it was his 186th consecutive errorless game, the second-longest active streak in the Majors (**Youkilis**, 238)...Kotchman almost didn't make it out of the 1st inning, as his throw hit **Barton** in the back and ricocheted into the outfield; however **Barton** was ruled out for leaving the baseline.

HE'S ON PACE FOR 162...**Rob Johnson** homered in his first AB last night, a solo shot to LF...he did not homer last season until at-bat #139 and finished the season with two homers in 258 AB.

GET USED TO THE AL WEST...the Mariners open the season playing their first 10 games against AL West division opponents (7 vs. OAK, 3 vs. TEX)...Seattle opened the 2006 season with 7 consecutive games vs. the AL West, and amazingly opened the 2001, 2003 and 2004 seasons with 19 consecutive games against division opponents.

NOW PLAYING LEFT FIELD...with his start in left field last night, **Milton Bradley** became the 23rd different player to start in left field on Opening Day for the Mariners in the past 34 years...**Raul Ibanez** (4), **Phil Bradley** (3), **Mark McLemore** (2), **Darren Bragg** (2), **Greg Briley** (2), **Bruce Bochte** (2), **Tom Paciorek** (2) and **Randy Winn** (2) all have multiple Opening Day starts in left field...15 different guys, including **Milton**, have one start each in LF.

NEW FACES...Seattle begins the 2010 season with 7 players who did not appear in a game for the Mariners last season, compared to 9 new faces to open the 2009 season...the 2010 new faces are: pitchers **Brandon League**, **Kanekoa Teixeira** & **Cliff Lee** (15-day DL); infielders **Chone Figgins** & **Casey Kotchman** and outfielders **Milton Bradley** & **Eric Byrnes**...13 players who were on last season's Opening Day roster return to this year's, including: 6 pitchers (**David Aardsma**, **Erik Bedard** (15-day DL), **Felix Hernandez**, **Shawn Kelley**, **Mark Lowe** & **Ryan Rowland-Smith**); 1 catcher (**Rob Johnson**); 2 infielders (**Jose Lopez** & **Matt Tuiasosopo**); 2 outfielders (**Franklin Gutierrez** & **Ichiro Suzuki**) and 2 designated hitters (**Ken Griffey Jr.** & **Mike Sweeney**)...finally, 8 players who played with Seattle at some point last season return to this year's Opening Day squad: 4 pitchers (**Doug Fister**, **Ian Snell**, **Jason Vargas** & **Sean White**), 1 catcher (**Adam Moore**); 2 infielders (**Jack Wilson** & **Jack Hannahan**-DL) and 1 outfielder (**Ryan Langerhans**).

DID YOU KNOW?...that **Ichiro** is now eligible for the Hall of Fame?...when he led off the game last night, it gave him 10 years in the Majors...whenever he retires he'll be eligible for the BBWAA to vote on his candidacy five years later.

ABOUT SNELL...

- 28-year-old right-hander is making his first start of the season and 141st appearance, 129th start of ML career.
- Traded to Seattle with Jack Wilson on July 29, 2009.
- Spent entire career prior to trade in Pirates organization...selected by Pirates in 26th round of 2000 June Draft.
- Made Major League debut Aug. 20, 2004 with Pittsburgh at St. Louis...surrendered one hit (a solo home run to John Mabry), 3 walks and 2 strikeouts in 2.0 innings.
- Recorded first victory Sept. 19, 2005, against Roger Clemens and the Houston Astros...allowed only three singles in 8.0 innings of work.
- Pitched Puerto Rico in the 2009 World Baseball Classic...his stepfather has Puerto Rican ancestry.
- On January 28, 2007, the Delaware Sportswriters and Broadcasters Association honored Snell as the "John J. Brady Athlete of the Year", an award given annually to the best athlete from Delaware.
- Born in Dover, DE & currently resides in Bradenton, FL.
- Is 38-48, 4.74 ERA (386 ER, 732.1 IP) in 128 career GS...0-0, 3.60 (25.0 IP, 10 ER) in 12 relief appearances.
- Making his 8th career start vs. an AL West opponent...is 3-2, 3.53 ERA (17 ER, 43.1 IP).

SPRING RECAP...1-4, 7.13 ERA (19 ER, 24.0 IP) in 6 starts this spring, striking out 18 while walking just 3...in three road starts he went 1-1 with a 3.27 ERA (4 ER, 11.0 IP)...lost his final four starts...among American League pitchers in the Cactus League ranked T8th with 18 strikeouts.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME...in his last 7 road starts dating back to June, is 3-1 with a 3.32 ERA (15 ER, 40.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts...in 5 road starts with Seattle is 2-1, 3.14 ERA (10 ER, 28.2 IP) with 19 strikeouts.

FINISHING STRONG...In final 9 starts of season, went 5-1, 3.00 ERA (17 ER, 51.0 IP)...allowed 2 earned runs or less in 7 starts.

NICE FIRST IMPRESSION...struck out 17 batters, including 13 straight, in his first AAA start for Indianapolis (vs. Toledo) after being optioned by the Pirates...walked just 1 batter...finished with a no-decision despite allowing just 1, unearned run in 7.0 innings.

2009 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...

- Acquired from Pittsburgh 7-player trade on July 29 with Jack Wilson.
- In final 9 starts of season, went 5-1, 3.00 ERA (17 ER, 51.0 IP)...allowed 2 earned runs or less in 7 starts.
- His 3.00 ERA from Aug. 15-end of season ranked 8th-best in the AL...5 wins were tied for 6th-best.
- Had 3.81 ERA (11 ER, 26.0 IP) in his 5 no-decisions with Seattle, leaving the game with the lead 3 times and tied the other 2 games...Seattle lost all 5 of his no-decisions.
- Lost 9 of first 11 decisions (w/ PIT & SEA) before winning 5 of his final 6.
