HOF? AT LEAST HE'S ELIGIBLE

Ichiro is now eligible for the Hall of Fame...when he led off the game Monday, it gave him 10 MLB years...whenever he retires he'll be eligible for the BBWAA to vote on his candidacy five years later.

NOTHING EXTRA

The Mariners did not allow an extra base hit to the A's Monday, just the 32nd time (in 473 games) that had happened...Seattle is 24-8 when it limits Oakland to only singles...while it has only happened 32 times in 34 seasons (since '77), it has happened 5 times since the start of 2009, and Seattle is 4-1.

THE ROSTER

The Mariners 25-man Opening Day roster includes 11 pitchers, 2 catchers, 5 infielders, 5 outfielders and 2 designated hitters...the youngest and oldest players on the roster are the same for the second straight season...

Matt Tuiasosopo (5/10/86) at 23 years, 10+ months is the youngest...the oldest is **Ken Griffey Jr.** (11/21/69) at 40 years, four+ months.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

C Adam Moore and RHPs **Doug Fister** and **Kanekoa Texeira** are on an Opening Day roster for the first time in their careers...Teixeira made his MLB debut last night.

OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener a week from today, Monday, April 12, returning the favor and hosting the Oakland A's...Seattle is 21-12 all-time in the first game of the season, including going 6-2 in home openers after starting the season on the road...won 3-2 (10) last season in the home opener after beginning the season in Minnesota.

TICKET INFORMATION

Single game tickets for the 2010 Seattle Mariners season are on sale **NOW**...tickets are available without a service charge at the Safeco Field Box Office and at Seattle Mariners Team Stores...for Opening Day, only a handful of scattered single tickets remain but tickets are still available as part of various Mariners ticket plans...tickets remain for every other Mariners home game, including **Felix Hernandez'** home debut on April 16...for more information visit: www.mariners.com/tickets.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 34th season-opening roadtrip tonight in Oakland... tonight is the 3rd (1-1) game of a 4-game series against the A's and a 7-game road trip to open the season (also 3 games at Texas)...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on FSN in high definition and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is the 3rd (1-1) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2010...7 of the Mariners first 10 games will come against the A's...Seattle opens and closes the season with a 4-game sets vs. the A's...the Mariners and A's will play 9 games in the Coliseum (also May 17-18 and Sept. 6-8) and 10 games at Safeco Field (April 12-14, Aug. 9-11 and Sept. 30-Oct. 3)...the Mariners were 14-5 vs. the A's last season (6-4 on the road, 8-1 at home); **Seattle is 38-21 vs. the A's since 2007**...the Mariners trail the all-time series 202-271, and trail the series at the Coliseum 87-152 (.364)...the Mariners lost last night but have won 4 of their last 5 games vs. the A's.

NOTHING NEW HERE...both of the Mariners games this season have been decided by one (2-1 loss yesterday) or two runs (5-3 win on Opening Day)...that is nothing new for the Mariners, as they tied a club record last season with 86 of 162 games (53%) decided by two-or-fewer runs...in 2009, Seattle led the Majors in one-run games (55), one-run victories (35-20) and combined to go 51-35 (.593) in games decided by two-or-fewer runs.

EARLY FOR EXTRAS...the Mariners and A's played an early extra inning affair last night...marks the earliest (by game #) extra inning contest since opening the 1996 season with a 3-2 win over the White Sox in 12 innings (3/31/96)...the Mariners went 11 innings in their third game of the season in 2003 (7-6 win @OAK).

GUTIERREZ IS STREAKING...Franklin Gutierrez is riding a current 7-game hitting streak, which includes the last 5 games of 2009 and the first two games of this season...during the streak, he is batting .385 (10x26) with 4 doubles, 4 RBI and 6 runs scored.

ICHIRO STREAKING VS. A'S...**Ichiro** is riding a current 22-game hitting streak against the A's after going 1-for-3 last night...during the streak (dating back to 8/24/08), Ichiro is batting .379 (36x95) with 4 doubles, 1 triple and 7 RBI...it is Ichiro's (tie) 2nd-longest hitting streak in his career vs. an opponent, trailing a 26-game streak against the Royals (4/14/05-4/15/08) and matching a 22-game streak against the White Sox (4/27/01-5/11/03)...he has also recorded 20-game hitting streaks against the Red Sox, Blue Jays and Twins.

GET USED TO THE AL WEST...the Mariners open the season playing their first 10 games against AL West division opponents (7 vs. OAK, 3 vs. TEX)...Seattle opened the 2006 season with 7 consecutive games vs. the AL West, and amazingly opened the 2001, 2003 and 2004 seasons with 19 consecutive games against division opponents.

KOTCHMAN'S DEBUT...**Casey Kotchman** went 2-for-4 with 4 RBI in his Mariners debut Monday...he plated a run with a double in the first inning, a sacrifice fly in the third and provided the game-winner with a 2-run single in the top of the 9th inning...the 4 RBI are tied for 2nd-most in a Mariners debut, trailing 5 RBI by **Richie Sexson** on Opening Day in 2005 (4/4/05), and tying **Al Chambers** (7/23/83) and **Leon Roberts** (4/9/78)...it is also the 4th-most RBI by a Mariner on Opening Day behind **Jim Presley** (6, 1986), **Jim Maler** (5, 1982) and **Sexson** (5, 2005).

FELIX IS QUALITY...**Felix Hernandez** recorded a no-decision Monday (6.2,3,3,3,6,4) in his third career Opening Day assignment, but did notch his club-record-tying 14th consecutive quality start (at least 6.0 IP, 3 or less ER)...during the streak (dating back to 8/1/09), Felix is 8-1 with a 2.16 ERA (24 ER, 100.0 IP)...right-hander **Erik Hanson** also had a streak of 14 straight quality starts from July 27, 1990-April 9, 1991.

DOUBLE YOUR FUN...the Mariners turned four double plays Monday, just the 47th game in team history with four or more in a 9-inning game...Seattle's club record is 5 (May 1, 1980) and Monday was the 46th time with four double plays in a game.

STRING THEM TOGETHER...the Mariners have recorded 11 hits this season, but have yet to record more than one hit in an inning.

NEW FACES...Seattle begins the 2010 season with 7 players who did not appear in a game for the Mariners last season, compared to 9 new faces to open the 2009 season...the 2010 new faces are: pitchers **Brandon League**, **Kanekoa Texeira** & **Cliff Lee (15-day DL)**; infielders **Chone Figgins** & **Casey Kotchman** and outfielders **Milton Bradley** & **Eric Byrnes**...13 players who were on last season's Opening Day roster return to this year's, including: 6 pitchers (**David Aardsma**, **Erik Bedard** (15-day DL), **Felix Hernandez**, **Shawn Kelley**, **Mark Lowe** & **Ryan Rowland-Smith**); 1 catcher (**Rob Johnson**); 2 infielders (**Jose Lopez** & **Matt Tuiasosopo**); 2 outfielders (**Franklin Gutierrez** & **Ichiro Suzuki**) and 2 designated hitters (**Ken Griffey Jr.** & **Mike Sweeney**)...finally, 8 players who played with Seattle at some point last season return to this year's Opening Day squad: 4 pitchers (**Doug Fister**, **Ian Snell**, **Jason Vargas** & **Sean White**), 1 catcher (**Adam Moore**); 2 infielders (**Jack Wilson** & **Jack Hannahan-DL**) and 1 outfielder (**Ryan Langerhans**).

DID YOU KNOW?...that a third of **Adam Moore's** career starts have gone extra innings?...last night was the 6th game he's started in his MLB career; two have gone to extras, last night and his MLB debut, which went 14.0 innings...he's caught 59.2 innings in his six career starts.

ABOUT ROWLAND-SMITH...

- 27-year-old left-hander makes his first start of the '10 season tonight at Oakland...made his second career Opening Day roster (also '09).
- Made 16 starts last season, going 5-4 with a 3.74 ERA (40 ER, 96.1 IP).
- Has made 61 of 88 career ML appearances as a reliever, but 27 of last 30 appearances have been starts.
- Made Major League debut June 22, 2007 vs. Cincinnati in relief...Ken Griffey Jr. was first ML strikeout.
- Spent entire career with Seattle...selected by Twins 2004 Rule 5 Draft, returned to Seattle during spring training.
- Born in Sydney, Australia...resides during the off-season in Newcastle, Australia & Seattle...signed as non-drafted free agent Nov. 19, 2000 by Mariners scout Barry Holland.
- Rode mountain bike to Safeco Field several times during the 2008 season when living on Mercer Island (7 miles).
- On provisional roster for Australia for 2009 World Baseball Classic, but declined to play in order to compete for spot in Seattle starting rotation...also on the provisional roster in 2006.
- Pitched for Australia in the 2004 Summer Olympics and won a silver medal...went 2-0 with a 1.23 ERA in 4 games.
- Only player ML history with a hyphenated last name.
- Can be followed on Twitter (@hyphen18).
- Is 3-3-1, 2.73 ERA (25 ER, 82.1 IP) in 27 G/9 GS career vs. AL West.

LAST START...made final spring tuneup vs. the Rockies on April 2 at Isoptopes Park in Albuquerque...pitched in cold and windy conditions, allowing 9 hits, 5 runs and 2 home runs in 4.1 innings.

SPRING REVIEW...made 6 official spring starts, going 0-2 with a 6.26 ERA (16 ER, 23.0 IP)...pitched at least 5.0 innings in 2 of last 3 starts.

LONE QUALITY START...recorded the Mariners lone quality start of the spring, allowing 5 hits and 1 run in 7.0 innings March 28 against the Cubs...suffered the loss in the Mariners 1-0 loss.

SEASON STARTERS...also made his 2009 season debut against the A's at Oakland Coliseum (4/10/09) as the Mariners No. 5 starter...recorded a no-decision allowing 4 hits and 2 runs (0 ER) in 3.1 innings...left after throwing 82 pitches/42 strikes...did not pitch again until July 24 after spending time on the disabled list (left triceps tendinitis) and with AAA Tacoma.

THE GOAL IS TO GO DEEP...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 19 of 27 starts, including 11 of his last 14...recorded career-high 6 consecutive quality starts July 29-Sept. 16, 2009...pitched at least 7.0 innings in 8 of 15 starts in 2009.

DOWN UNDER...Rowland-Smith is one of four native Australians to appear on an Opening Day roster in 2010...he joins Grant Balfour (TB), Peter Moylan (ATL) and Brad Thomas (DET)...according to Stats Inc, there have been 24 Major League players born in Australia, with Rowland-Smith's 88 career pitching appearances ranking 4th all-time (Graeme Lloyd, 568).

CRAZY EIGHTS...tossed career-high 8.0 innings in back-to-back starts (8/30 vs. KC & 9/4 at OAK)...joined **Felix Hernandez** as only other Mariners starter to record consecutive 8.0-inning starts last season.

NO CHANCE LEFTIES...held left-handers to a .195 batting average (17x87) in 2009, with only 2 home runs allowed...prior to last season, lefties hit .302 (60x199) with 7 home runs...has been steady against right-handers in his career, limiting to a .234 batting average (93x397).

SAFE AT HOME...went 4-2 with a 2.70 ERA (17 ER, 56.2 IP) in 8 starts at Safeco Field last season...recorded a quality start in 7 of his 8 Safeco appearances, including 7 consecutive to end the season...overall is 7-5, 3.14 in 42 home appearances, including going 6-4, 3.00 (35 ER, 105.0 IP) in 16 starts...**compared to 4-2, 4.25 in 46 road appearances, including 2-2, 4.69 in 11 starts.**

Fister is scheduled to make his first start of the season in tomorrow's series finale against the A's...made first career Opening Day roster...**SPRING TRAINING:** Went 0-3 with a 6.94 ERA (8 ER, 11.2 IP) in 5 starts...left his start 3/19 at Cincinnati after being hit by a line drive in the arm...made only one official start after that, allowing 6 hits and 3 runs in 4.0 innings 4/3 vs. Colorado in Albuquerque...**2009:** Made his Major League debut in 2009, going 3-4 with a 4.13 ERA (28 ER, 61.0 IP) in 11 G/10 GS...tossed at least 6.0 IP in 7 of 10 GS, including 5 quality starts...recorded **1st ML win 8/16 vs. NYY (7.0,8,3,3,0,4,HR)**...1st GS 8/11 vs. CWS tossed 6.0 ShO IP, allowing 1 hit becoming the first Seattle rookie to ever toss at least 6.0 ShO IP on 1 hit or less...selected from AAA Tacoma on Aug. 8...made ML debut that night w/scoreless 9th out of bullpen...was 6-4, 3.81 ERA (45 ER, 106.1 IP) in 22 apps, 17 GS with Rainiers...walked only 11 batters & struck out 79 in 106.1 innings.
