#### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 20, 1939** – The Yankees defeat the Boston Red Sox, 2-0, on Opening Day in Fenway Park. Red Ruffing throws a complete game shutout, allowing seven hits and one walk with five strikeouts. Bill Dickey hits a solo home run. An ailing Lou Gehrig goes 0-for-4 in his final Fenway appearance, and Ted Williams goes 1-for-4 in his Major League debut in the only game to ever feature both players.

#### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 21, 2009:** Starter Andy Pettitte does not strike out or walk a batter in 7.0IP as the Yankees win the first night game in Yankee Stadium history, 5-3. He is the first Yankee to pitch at least 7.0IP without recording a walk or strikeout since pitching coach Dave Eiland in a 7-4 Yankees victory on 10/6/91 vs. Cleveland.

**AT A GLANCE:** Tonight the Yankees play the first game of a three-game series at Oakland at 10:05 p.m...is the start of a nine-game, 10-day road trip to Oakland (Tuesday-Thursday), Los Angeles-AL (Friday-Sunday) and Baltimore (4/27-29)...will visit the White House during their off day on 4/26 to commemorate their 2009 World Championship...won their most recent game, 5-2, on Sunday vs. Texas to extend their winning streak to a season-high four games...won two-of-three from the Angels from 4/13-15 and swept Texas from 4/16-18 to finish with a 5-1 record on their first homestand of the season...have won seven of their last eight overall games and are 9-3 this season, marking their best 12-game start since 2003, when they began 10-2...is one of the club's four-best 12-game starts in the last 25 years (also were 9-3 in 2000 and 1988)...have won each of their first four series of the season for just the third time in franchise history and first time since 1926, when the club won its first five series (also won first four series in 1922)...after the current road trip, will return home for a six-game homestand with three games vs. the White Sox (4/30-5/2) and three vs. Baltimore (5/3-5)...of the Yankees' 22 April games, seven are at home (5-1 thus far) and 15 are on the road (4-2 thus far)...matches the Yankees' April home/road splits from 2009...are scheduled for an off day each Monday in April (4/5, 12, 19, 26).

**SUNDAY IN THE PARK:** The Yankees defeated Texas, 5-2, on Sunday to complete a series sweep...**LHP Andy Pettitte** started and earned the win, allowing just 2ER in 8.0IP (4H, 3BB, 4K) and improving to 2-0...was his second time in the last two seasons pitching as far into a game (also 8/31/09 at Baltimore, 8.0IP)...**1B Mark Teixeira** (1-for-4) snapped a 40AB homerless stretch from the start of the season with a solo home run to lead off the third inning...**SS Ramiro Pena** (1-for-4) put the Yankees ahead for good with a two-run bases-loaded single in the third in his first start of the season...**C Jorge Posada** (2-for-4) hit a seventh-inning solo home run...**3B Alex Rodriguez** (1-for-1) reached base in all four of his plate appearances (single, 3BB)...**RHP Mariano Rivera** recorded his fifth save in five chances this season (1.0IP, 2K)...**SS Derek Jeter** did not play due to a head cold...the Yankees dedicated the game to the memory of longtime employee Harvey Winston, a 22-year member of the Yankees organization who unexpectedly passed away in January.

**EXHIBIT A:** Since **3B Alex Rodriguez** returned from the disabled list on 5/8/09, the Yankees are 110-51 in all games (90-44 in 2009 regular season; 11-4 in 2009 postseason; and 9-3 in 2010)...have scored 906 runs over the stretch, averaging 5.63 runs/game.

**R** Rodriguez hit his 584<sup>th</sup> career HR in Saturday's win vs. Texas, breaking a tie with Mark McGwire for sole possession of eighth place all-time (Frank Robinson-586HR is seventh)...snapped a 41AB homerless stretch to begin 2010, his longest such stretch since 1995 (HR in 49<sup>th</sup> AB) and third longest of his career (0HR in 54AB in 1994 rookie season).

**BRONX BURNERS:** The Yankees are third in the Majors with 15SB (Gardner-7, Granderson-4, Jeter-2, Cano-1, Rodriguez-1), trailing only Tampa Bay (18) and Kansas City (17)...last led the AL in team stolen bases in 1985 (155SB) and last led the Majors in 1938 (91SB).

**GETTING AHEAD OF THE GAME:** The Yankees are 7-0 this season when leading after six innings...were 71-2 in such games in 2009...*the club's 78-2 record in such games over the past two seasons is the best such mark in the Majors*...the team with the next fewest such defeats has three times as many losses (St. Louis, six losses when leading after six innings).

**OPENING CHAPTER:** Yankees starters are allowing just 7.42 hits per 9.0IP (74.0IP, 61H), the second-best mark in the American League and fourth-best in the Majors (St. Louis-6.27; Toronto-6.80; and San Francisco-7.36)...are 7-2 with a 3.41 ERA as a group in 2010 (28ER in 12 games => 2.33ER/G)...went 5-1 on the club's recent six-game homestand from 4/13-18 (2.17 ERA, 37.1IP, 27H, 9ER, 15BB, 36K, .205 opp. BA).

**FROM THE TOP:** **SS Derek Jeter** is batting .380 (19-for-50) in 2010...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, it marks his highest batting average through his first 50 at-bats of a season since 1999, when hit .440 (22-for-50)...leads all Major League *leadoff hitters* in hits, HR (3) and RBI (9).

**N\_YORK YANK\_S:** Yankees fielders have not committed an error in their last 10G, after making four in their first 2G...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, it is *the longest April errorless streak in franchise history*...set an all-time Major League record with 18-straight errorless games from 5/14-6/1/09.

**MILESTONE WATCH:** **SS Derek Jeter** has 440 career doubles and needs 2 doubles to tie Don Mattingly for third place on the franchise's all-time list...**RHP Mariano Rivera** has 1,011 career strikeouts and needs 3K to tie Roger Clemens (1,014) for 10<sup>th</sup> place on the club's all-time list.

**April 20, 2010 at Oakland Athletics**

**PITCHING IN:** On Monday in Vallejo, Calif., **LHP CC Sabathia** tossed the ceremonial first pitch at the first night game of the North Vallejo Little League Spring Classic...earlier this year underwrote the rebuilding of North Vallejo Little League's Thurmon Field through his PitCCh In Foundation...the new aspects of the field include: the irrigation system, infield dirt, bases and home plate, pitching rubber, dugouts, fencing, and 37,000 square feet of sod...the reconstruction of the field was the latest in a series of projects by the foundation, a 501 (c)(3) national non-profit founded by CC and his wife, Amber...the mission of the PitCCh In Foundation is to enrich the lives of inner city youth by working to raise self-esteem through education and athletic activities.

**BATTER UP:** The Yankees have scored three-or-more runs in each of their first 12 games in 2010...is the longest such stretch by a Yankees team since the 2000 club scored three-or-more in each of its first 15G...are the last remaining team this season to have such a streak.

**SAVINGS PLAN: RHP Mariano Rivera** Has converted 61 of his last 65 save chances *on the road* after blowing his first two road SVOs in 2007...has a 1.03 road ERA (61.1IP, 7ER) over the last three seasons (2008-10), while holding opponents to a .158 batting average (34-for-215).

✪ Has converted 118-of-123 (95.9%) total save opportunities after blowing his first two chances in 2007, marking the best ratio in the Majors over that span since 4/21/07...has converted his last 50 save opportunities at home (last blown save at home on 8/13/07 vs. Baltimore), marking the second-longest such streak all time (Eric Gagne-51).

**GO-GO CANO!** In Saturday's win vs. Texas, **2B Robinson Cano** had his 10-game hitting streak from the start of the season snapped...is currently batting .340 (16-for-47) with 10R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 10RBI, and 2BB in 12 starts at 2B.

✪ The *Elias Sports Bureau* notes that his 27-game April hitting streak which was snapped on Saturday vs. Texas was the longest in American League history, surpassing Goose Goslin's 25-game mark from April 1926-27...*Elias* also notes it was the longest April streak by any MLB player since the Giants' Dan McGann hit in 28 straight April games from 1903-06...owns a .357 (50-for-140) combined batting average over the last two Aprils with 28R, 9 doubles, 9HR and 26RBI, hitting safely in 31-of-34 contests.

**TIMELESS: LHP Andy Pettitte** has held opponents to 2ER or less in each of his three starts this season...his 1.35 ERA is *his lowest through three starts* of any season in his career and his three total ER is tied for his fewest allowed through his first three starts (also 2007)...has won his first two decisions of a season for the second straight year and sixth time in his career (also 1996, '97, 2001 and '03).

**ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS: Manager Joe Girardi** won his 200<sup>th</sup> regular season game as Yankees Manager on Saturday vs. Texas...his 9-3 start in 2010 is the best of his managerial career (6-6 in 2009 and 2008; with NYY; and 3-9 in 2006 w/ Florida).

**SEVEN-UP:** The Yankees have won 17 straight regular season games after the score was tied at the end of the seventh inning, including two such games this season...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the Yankees' winning streak in such games is the longest in the Modern Era (since 1900), eclipsing the 1906 Giants' 16-game winning streak in such games.

**ONE-TWO PUNCH: LHP CC Sabathia** and **RHP A.J. Burnett** have pitched back-to-back games 22 times since joining the Yankees in 2009...of those 22 instances, the Yankees lost both games once – 6/20-21/09 at Florida...the two have combined for 36 wins and 414K with the Yankees.

**FRONT-LOADED:** The Yankees will play 32 of their first 51 games (62.7%) against teams that finished 2009 with a winning record (are 9-3 in those games so far)...of those 32, there are 20 contests against the other three 2009 American League playoff teams (8G vs. BOS, 6G vs. LAA and 6G vs. MIN)...from 5/28 through the end of the season (111 games), will play just 18 games against 2009 playoff teams (10G vs. BOS, 2G vs. LAA, 3G vs. PHI, 3G vs. LAD).

**27<sup>th</sup> HEAVEN:** The Yankees won their unprecedented 27<sup>th</sup> World Championship in 2009 after going 103-59 and finishing with Baseball's best regular season record...collected their 16<sup>th</sup> AL East title since Divisional play began in 1969, tying the Braves (16) for most division titles all time...recorded their most wins since 2002 (103-58) and reached 100 wins in a season for the 19<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history, first since 2004 (101-61)...the Phila./KC/Oakland Athletics (10 seasons of 100-or-more wins) are the only other club in Major League history with 10-or-more such seasons ...the 2009 Yankees' 114 combined regular- and postseason wins tied the 1927 Yankees for the second-most in a single year in franchise history behind the 1998 squad's 125 wins.

**ALL IN THE FAMILY:** This season **RHP Mariano Rivera**, **SS Derek Jeter** and **C Jorge Posada** became *the first trio of teammates in MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL history* to play together in each of 16 straight seasons (1995-2010) -- credit: *Elias Sports Bureau*...among MLB players, they passed the 15-season Milwaukee Brewers trio (1978-92) of Jim Gantner, Paul Molitor and Robin Yount...the second-longest trios in Yankees franchise history played 13 years together (Bill Dickey, Lefty Gomez and Red Ruffing from 1930-42; and Whitey Ford, Elston Howard and Mickey Mantle from 1955-67).

**OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS:** The Yankees will begin a three-game series at Oakland tonight...is the first of 10 games between the teams this season, marking their most contests since 1999 (Yankees won the season series, 8-4)...went 7-2 vs. the A's in 2009, marking their sixth season series win in the 2000s and second straight...have won 12 of their last 15 games vs. Oakland, including an eight-game winning streak from 6/12/08-7/24/09, their most consecutive wins vs. the A's since 1993-94.

**AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM:** The Yankees will begin a three-game series vs. the A's in Oakland tonight...is their first of six games at Oakland this season (also 7/5-7)...went 2-1 at Oakland in 2009, winning the road season series for the eighth time in the last 12 years since 1998...the Yankees are 13-8 (.619) at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum since the start of the 2004 season, the highest winning pct. by any AL team in Oakland over the span...had lost 11 of the previous 15 games there from 2001-03.

**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** The Yankees will welcome the A's to the Bronx for a four-game series from 8/30-9/2...went 5-1 at home against the A's in 2009 including a win in the first-ever night game at Yankee Stadium on 4/21...have won the home season series in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2004-05...have won eight of their last nine home games vs. the A's and are 18-9 vs. Oakland in the Bronx since the start of the 2004 season.

## TONIGHT'S STARTER: RHP JAVIER VAZQUEZ (0-2, 9.82 ERA)

**RHP Javier Vazquez**, 33, will make his third start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...will be his eighth career start vs. Oakland and first since August 2008...**last started** on 4/14 vs. Los Angeles-AL, recording the loss in a 5-3 Angels victory (5.1IP, 6H, 4ER, 2BB, 4K)...has lost the first two starts of a season for the first time in his career and started a season 0-2 for the third time (also 1998 and 2005)...**was acquired** from the Braves along with LHP Boone Logan in exchange for OF Melky Cabrera, RHP Arodys Vizcaino and LHP Mike Dunn on 12/22/09...is in the fifth year of a five-year contract through 2010.

**INNING AFTER INNING:** Surpassed 2500.0 career IP in his last start (2501.0), becoming the 189<sup>th</sup> pitcher all-time to reach the plateau and one of just five active players – including teammate Andy Pettitte – to reach the mark.

**EUREKA!** Has lost just one of his last five starts in the state of California since the start of the 2008 season, going 3-1 with a 2.80 ERA (35.1IP, 11ER) in starts at Angel Stadium, Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum, San Francisco's AT&T Park, San Diego's PETCO Park and Dodger Stadium.

**SPRING RECAP:** Was 3-0 with a 4.19 ERA in five spring training starts, allowing 18H and 9ER in 19.1IP (6BB, 18K, 4HR)...led the staff in wins, strikeouts and innings pitched...tied for the third-most wins among AL hurlers this spring...the Yankees won each of the five games he started.

**2009 RECAP:** In his lone season with Atlanta, went 15-10 with a career-low 2.87 ERA and 238K in 32 starts...came in fourth place in the NL Cy Young voting, receiving one second-place vote...ranked third in the Majors (second in the NL) in K/BB ratio (5.41), fourth (second in the NL) in strikeouts, fifth (third in the NL) with 9.77 K/9.0IP and ninth (sixth in the NL) in ERA...ranked second in the NL in opponents' on-base percentage (.266), tied for fourth in wins, fifth in innings pitched and opponents' batting average (.223), and sixth in ERA.

**SECOND GO-ROUND:** Rejoins the Yankees this season having spent one prior season in the organization in 2004 after being acquired from Montreal on 12/16/03 in exchange for Nick Johnson, Juan Rivera and Randy Choate...went 14-10 with a 4.91 ERA and was named to the AL All-Star team in his lone season in pinstripes...following the season he was traded to the Diamondbacks in exchange for LHP Randy Johnson.

**ROAD WARRIOR:** Suffered the loss in his first start of the season on the road at Tropicana Field...marked his first road loss since 6/17/09 at Cincinnati, snapping a personal seven-game road winning streak over his final nine road starts in 2009 w/ Atlanta (7-0 with a 2.57 ERA)...went 10-2 with a 2.80 ERA and a .210 opponent's batting average overall in 16 road starts in 2009...all three of his complete games came on the road last season (6/17 at Cincinnati, 9/13 at St. Louis and 9/25 at Washington).

**GOOD TO GO:** Has never appeared on the disabled list in his entire career, joining only Derek Lowe and Livan Hernandez as one of the three longest-active pitchers who have never been sidelined on the D.L.

**HE GETS AROUND:** His last start vs. Los Angeles-AL marked his first career start in the current Yankee Stadium...also marked the 42<sup>nd</sup> stadium in which Vazquez has made a start, tying Livan Hernandez for second most among all active pitchers behind Jamie Moyer (47), credit: *Elias*...became the seventh different stadium he has made a home start in.

**KEEP IT CONSISTENT:** Recorded at least 10 wins and 150K in each of the last 10 seasons during the 2000s, becoming the 10<sup>th</sup> pitcher in Major League history to reach the totals each season over a span of at least 10 years (credit: *Elias*)...joins Steve Carlton as the only two pitchers to accomplish the feat over a "conventional decade."

- Is the only active pitcher to record at least 10 wins, 30 starts and 150K in each of the last nine seasons.
- Has reached 200.0IP in nine of the last 10 seasons, falling just shy of the mark in 2004 with the Yankees (198.0IP)...joins Dan Haren, Mark Buehrle and Bronson Arroyo as the only Major Leaguers to toss at least 200.0IP in each of the last five seasons.

**RING 'EM UP:** Has struck out at least one batter in 322 consecutive games dating back to 5/16/00, marking the eighth-longest such streak since 1954 and second-longest among active pitchers behind Pedro Martinez (327).

- Has struck out 10 or more batters in a game 40 times in his career, the fifth-most such double-digit K games among active pitchers behind Pedro Martinez (108), Johan Santana (47), John Smoltz (44) and Kerry Wood (41).

**GOLDEN BOY:** Has not committed an error over his last 76 starts since August 2007 and has made just two miscues over the last five seasons (2006-10)...has received Gold Glove consideration in eight of the last nine seasons (2001-03, '05-09), finishing as high as third place in 2001 with Montreal.

**FIVE ALIVE:** Tossed at least 5.0 innings in each of his 32 starts in 2009...only seven Major League pitchers tossed 5.0 or more innings in more games, three NL starters (Adam Wainwright-34, Dan Haren-33 and Randy Wolf-33)...reached 6.0IP 28 times and 7.0IP 18 times.

**PITCH PRESERVATION:** Averaged 15.11 pitches per inning pitched in 2009, 10<sup>th</sup> lowest in the Majors...ranked seventh in the NL, averaging 103.6 pitches per game...over the previous decade (2000-09), threw 65.9% of his pitches for strikes, marking the 14<sup>th</sup>-best percentage in the Majors (min. 1,000IP).
