ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Applied the brakes to a season-high four-game losing streak yesterday... still have lost five of the last seven, and eight of the last 12 games...are now 7-10 over the last 17 games after starting the year 6-2...own a 13-12 mark and half-game lead in the American League West over the second-place Texas Rangers (12-12)... this is the A's 25th consecutive day with at least a share of first place in the division (21 days alone in first, four days tied for first)...that is the A's longest streak of consecutive days in first since 2006 when they spent the final 65 days of the season in first...had no days in first from May 13, 2008 through the end of the 2009 season...the last time the A's were not in first was April 6, the second game of the season, when they were in a tie for second...fell to 12-12 after Friday's 10-2 setback to the Jays, the first time they had fallen to the .500 mark since April 6 when they were 1-1...the last time the A's were above .500 after 25 games was 2008, when they were 15-10...spent just one day over .500 last year (2-1, April 8)...went 75-87 last year, their third consecutive season with a losing record...it marks the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in three straight seasons since 1993-98 when they had six straight.

IN APRIL: The A's were 12-12 in April...it marked the third time in the last six years that Oakland finished April with exactly a .500 record (also 12-12 in 2005 and 2006)...had 15 stolen bases, which are the A's most in the first month of the season since swiping 19 bases in April of 1998...the bullpen recorded three saves, their fewest in a full month of April since 1994 when they had one...the three save opportunities were their fewest in a full month of April since 1981 when they had just one (starters completed 17 of 21 games that year in April).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's used the disabled list for the 10th time this year Friday when Kurt Suzuki was added...in 2005 the A's used the DL eight times the entire season...have now used the DL 74 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...began the year with six players on the DL and it currently stands at nine (Anderson, Buck, Crisp, Devine, Ellis, Meloan, Outman, Suzuki, Wuertz)...last had nine players on the DL at once on May 29, 2008...have had at least five players on the DL all year and have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this six-game road trip against Tampa Bay (0-2) and Toronto (1-2)...yesterday's 4-3 win severed a six-game road losing skein...are 4-7 on the road compared to 9-5 at home...return home following today's game for a six-game homestand against Texas (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-1), New York (1-2) and Cleveland (2-1)...are batting .235 (88 for 375) on the road compared to .272 at home...have the fourth lowest road batting average in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 7.68 ERA (35 er in 41.0 ip) in the first five games of the road trip after posting a 2.93 ERA over the first 20 games of the season...have a 5.17 ERA (53 er in 92.1 ip) on the road, which is second highest in the American League, compared to 2.83 at home, which is second lowest...have a 3.82 ERA overall, which ranks sixth...are tied for the AL lead in shutouts (3) and rank fourth in opponents batting average (.243)...have yielded 11 home runs in the last five games after allowing just 12 over the first 20 contests...of the 11 homers served up on this trip, three have been with two runners on and one with one runner aboard, while seven have been solo shots.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 10.17 ERA (26 er in 23 ip) on the road trip after starting the season with a 9-3 record and 2.65 ERA...have tossed four innings or less in three of last five games... starters are now 10-7 with a 3.88 ERA (61 er in 141.2 ip) for the season...rank fifth in the American League in ERA and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (14)...have not allowed a run in six of the first 25 games and have yielded three runs or less 18 times...the A's are 8-2 in games started by Justin Duchscherer (4-1) and Dallas Braden (4-1) and 5-10 in all other games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .283 (81 for 286) with 40 runs scored and 24 extra base hits (16 doubles, 2 triples, 6 home runs) over the last eight games after hitting .215 with 27 runs scored and 16 extra base hits (11 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs) over the previous nine contests...have third fewest home runs in the American League (16)...have been successful in 17 of 20 (85.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League behind Toronto (87.5%, 14 of 16)...scored six runs Tuesday and lost, the first time this year the A's have scored more than three runs in a game and lost...are 12-1 when scoring four runs or more and 1-11 when scoring fewer than four runs in a game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last five games after a season best six-game errorless streak...now have 17 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...however, Oakland has been error-free in its last two games and five of the last seven contests dating back to April 24.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-2 (.778) in day games, which is the best record in the majors...have a 6-10 (.375) record at night...the A's are 4-1 in one-run decisions, which is the best record in the American League...however, the five one-run games are tied for second fewest with Cleveland to the Yankees' two...the A's have three walk-off wins this year after tallying just five in all of 2009...are 10-5 (.667) when scoring first and 3-7 (.300) when the opponent scores first...after starting the season with a major league long streak of 14 consecutive days without a day off, the A's are in a 22-day stretch from April 19 to May 10 where they are scheduled to have four days off...went 9-5 over the first 14 games and are 4-7 since the first off day on April 19...the A's 25 games played are tied with Chicago (NL), Detroit, Los Angeles (AL) and Toronto for the most in the majors.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The A's posted their first win of the season over Toronto yesterday and are now 1-2 vs. the Blue Jays this season...Oakland lost the season series last year for the second consecutive season, 3-6...lost two of three here in Toronto and dropped four of six in Oakland in '09...have lost 14 of their last 18 games to the Blue Jays, including eight of the last 10 at Rogers Centre...hit .211 against Toronto last year, their lowest mark ever against the Blue Jays...all-time, the A's are 191-165 against the Blue Jays...that includes 92-85 in Oakland, 99-78 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has a career high 18.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to September 6 of last year...he has converted each of his last 24 save opportunities, which is the second longest streak in Oakland history. His last blown save came June 16 at Dodger Stadium. Dennis Eckersley owns the all-time A's mark for consecutive saves with 40 in 1991-92.

Adam Rosales is batting .421 (8 for 19) on this road trip and is hitting .400 (12 for 30) away from the Oakland Coliseum this year. He's also hitting at a .367 clip (11 for 30) with 5 runs and 4 RBI in his last eight games.

Ryan Sweeney has reached base safely via hit or walk in all 23 of his games this year...that is the longest streak in the majors this year and it is the longest reaching base streak by an Athletic to start the season since Jeremy Giambi had a 25 game streak in 2002...it matches his career high of 23 (August 30-September 26, 2009).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975**, Reggie Jackson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform in the A's 4-3 win at Chicago...in **2001**, Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Toronto. Miguel Tejada homers twice and drives in four runs.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season, which will tie him for the American League lead...the A's are 1-4 (.200) in his starting assignments and his teams are 110-116 (.487) in his 226 career starts...has tossed 6.0 innings or less in each of his five starts this year and eight straight dating back to September 11, 2008, which is the longest streak of his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in two of his five starts and walked three batters or more all four times...has issued 14 walks for the season, which is tied for 10th most in the AL.

EIGHT RUNS: Allowed eight runs in 4.0 innings in his last start after allowing eight runs total over his first four starts and 23.0 innings...the eight runs were his most in a game since April 15, 2007 at St. Louis when he also allowed eight and the eight earned runs were his most since August 15, 2005 at Colorado when he allowed 10.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-2 with a 5.00 ERA in five starts in the month of April and is now 15-19 with a 4.19 ERA in 42 career starts in the month...is a combined 36-21 with a 3.33 ERA (186 er in 502.1 ip) in 75 starts in May and June and is 36-45 with a 3.92 ERA from July 1 through the end of the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .267 (16 for 60) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .356 (16 for 45) against right-handers...however, has issued 12 of his 14 walks to lefties...opponents are batting .435 (10 for 23) when leading off an inning.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.80 ERA (1 er in 5.0 ip) in the first inning and an 8.40 ERA (14 er in 15.0 ip) in innings two through four...has not allowed a run after the fourth inning (7.0 ip).

ALL STARTS: Has made 226 career appearances and all have been starts...those are the fourth most appearances in major league history among pitchers who have never made a relief appearance.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss to Seattle on Opening Night April 5 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 27, 2008 against the Chicago Cubs when he was the losing pitcher in the Brewers 7-3 loss (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so, 1 hr)...became the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in the last five years (Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...it was his seventh career Opening Day start and he is 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (12 er in 41.2 ip) in those seven starts...among active pitchers, only Buehrle (CWS), Halladay (PHI), Hernandez (WASH minors) and Oswalt (HOU), with eight each, have more...allowed one run in each of the first three innings, including a Kotchman RBI double in the first, a Johnson home run in the second and a Kotchman sacrifice fly in the third...left trailing 3-0 but the A's scored once in the sixth and twice in the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in an A's loss, a 4-3 loss at Los Angeles April 10...allowed a RBI double to Matsui in the third but the A's scored a run in the top of the fourth to tie the game...he then allowed two in the bottom of the fourth on a Kendrick RBI double and an Aybar RBI single...left after six innings trailing 3-1 but the A's scored single runs in the seventh and eighth to get him off the hook.

THIRD START: He picked up his first win since September 6, 2008 in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore April 15...tossed 6.0 shutout innings despite allowing five hits and walking three...stranded eight base runners and left runners in scoring position in four of his six innings...left with a 5-0 lead and the bullpen allowed single runs in the seventh and ninth innings.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to New York April 21 in Oakland...allowed back-to-back triples to Rodriguez and Cano to start the fourth and Cano scored on a groundout to make the score 2-0...Hughes no-hit the A's over the first seven innings before Oakland scored its only run in the eighth.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-6 loss at Tampa Bay last Tuesday...allowed four runs in the second inning on a Pena RBI single, a Jaso RBI double and a Bartlett two-run single...the A's tied the game with a four-run third inning but he allowed three-run home run to Burrell in the bottom of the third...also allowed a Brignac home run to lead off the fourth.

SHEETS vs. TORONTO: Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (14.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 8 so) in two career starts, both on June 18...the last one came in 2008 in Milwaukee in a 5-4 Brewers win...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Zaun in the fourth inning...the Brewers came back with two in the bottom of the fourth and he allowed one more run in the sixth...his first start came in Toronto June 18 in a 5-2 win...allowed a solo home run to Zaun in the second and an unearned run in the seventh on an Adams RBI double.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-3 with an 11.20 ERA (13.2 ip, 23 h, 20 r, 17 er, 10 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in five games, all starts...allowed a .354 (23 for 65) opponents batting average...struck out nine batters in his last two starts (9.1 ip) after fanning just one over his first three (4.1 ip)...did not retire a batter in his third start March 15 at Cincinnati as he faced 10 batters in the first inning with all 10 scoring...allowed six runs in the White Sox seven-run third inning in his second start, March 10...also pitched in a minor league game March 25.

2009 RECAP: Became a free agent following the 2008 season with Milwaukee but did not sign with another team...missed the entire 2009 season after undergoing surgery on his right elbow in February.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: The four-time National League All-Star signed a one-year contract with the A's after missing the entire 2009 season after undergoing elbow surgery...spent the first eight years of his career with Milwaukee and is the Brewers all-time leader in strikeouts (1206)...also ranks fifth in wins (86) and sixth in ERA (3.72)...his 1206 strikeouts from 2001-08 were fourth most in the NL over that span and his 18 complete games tied for second most...started for the NL in the 2008 All-Star Game...was also an All-Star in 2001, 2004 and 2007.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Dallas Braden (3-1, 4.20 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead... was the losing pitcher in his last start Wednesday at Tampa Bay, his first loss of the season... it snapped a career best four-game winning streak dating back to July 31 of last year... his three wins this year are tied for second most in the American League... is 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA (30.1 ip, 34 h, 15 r, 13 er, 15 bb, 31 so, 1 hr) in eight career appearances, five starts against Texas... is 0-2 with a 6.08 ERA (9 er in 13.1 ip) in four games, two starts, in the Coliseum and 1-0 with a 2.12 ERA (4 er in 17.0 ip) in four games, three starts, at Rangers Ballpark... went 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (11.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 bb, 12 so) in two starts last year.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

3-5, 3.71 ERA (77.2 ip, 66 h, 35 r, 32 er, 36 bb, 76 so, 9 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 4/4 (100.0%)

The bullpen has converted each of its four save opportunities...the A's are the only major league team without a blown save...however, the four save opportunities are tied for the fewest in the majors with Atlanta...the four saves are tied for the fewest in the American League (Cleveland) and tied for fourth fewest in the majors...the pen has not blown a save since August 28, 2009 and has converted each of its 13 save opportunities in 58 games since then...has a 4.59 ERA (17 er in 33.1 ip) on the road and a 3.05 ERA (15 er in 44.1 ip) at home...ranks second in the AL in strikeouts (76) and fourth in opponents batting average (.229)...the pen has allowed two home runs over the last four games and now has nine for the season, which is tied for fifth most in the AL...first batters faced are 9 for 60 (.150) with eight walks (.250 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is tied for second lowest.

- Has not allowed a run in nine outings this year (8.1 ip, 6 h, 1 bb, 6 so) and now has a **career high 18.1-inning scoreless streak** dating back to September 6 of last year...his previous high was 15.1 innings from June 14 to July 19, 2009...last allowed a run September 5, 2009 against Seattle and has not allowed a run in 31 of his last 32 outings since July 31, 2009 (2 er in 31.2 ip, 0.57 ERA).
- Has converted each of his three save opportunities this year and has a streak of 24 consecutive saves dating back to last year, which is **the second longest streak in Oakland history**...his last blown save came June 16, 2009 at Los Angeles (NL).
- Posted a 1.15 ERA in 11 appearances in April last year and finished with a 0.79 ERA (2 er in 22.2 ip) in 19 career April outings including this season.
- Has a win, is 3 for 3 in save opportunities and has not allowed a run or a hit in five career outings against Toronto (7.1 ip, 9 so).
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).
