Texas Rangers (13-12) at Oakland A's (13-13)

RHP Rich Harden (1-1, 4.56) vs. LHP Dallas Braden (3-1, 4.20)

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 3-game series in Oakland tonight, the 2nd and final stop on this 6-game roadtrip...Texas has won 3 in a row since losing to Chicago on Thursday, sweeping the Mariners in Seattle over the weekend...it matches the team's longest winning streak of the season (April 11-14) and tied Baltimore for the 2nd longest current win streak in the A.L. to Detroit's 5...last longer winning streak for the Rangers was 4 victories in a row, Sept. 1-4, 2009...club has captured 5 of 6 and 8 of its last 11 games beginning April 22...at 13-12, Texas has matched its record after 25 games of 2009 (14-12 after 26)...this is 1st time the club has been over the .500 mark since April 15 at 5-4.

AT THE TOP: With Sunday's victory, the Rangers moved into 1st place in the A.L. West for the 1st time since being in a tie for the top spot on April 14...team was also tied for 1st on April 5 and 6...this is the 1st time that Texas has been in sole possession of 1st place since July 10, 2009, the final of the 65 days that the club occupied the top position a year ago...the Rangers also had a half game lead on that day...last bigger advantage in the A.L. West was a full game on July 8, 2009.

ROAD SUCCESS: The Rangers has won 4 consecutive away games since losing in Boston on April 21...is the team's longest away winning streak since 4 wins in a row, Sept. 8-21, 2009...last longer such streak was 6 straight away victories, April 29-May 15, 2006...Texas has started the year 6-6 on the road for the 2nd straight season (7-6 after 13 games...Texas is one of 7 A.L. clubs with a .500 or better road record in 2010, the only A.L. West team.

SEATTLE SERIES: A recap of the weekend in Seattle:

- The Rangers won all 3 games for their 1st sweep of a series home or road since Sept. 8(DH)-9, 2009 at Cleveland (3 games).
- The Rangers all games of a series for the 1st time ever in 30 lifetime series at Safeco Field...Texas' last sweep of a series in Seattle was April 13-15, 2009 (3 games), the last time club ever played at the Kingdom.
- The Rangers and Mariners played 32.0 innings in the 3 games, the most for a Rangers in a 3-game series since 36.0, also vs. Seattle, May 22-24, 2004...those were a pair of 9.0 and an 18-inning contest.
- The Rangers had a pair of extra inning games in a 3-game series for the 1st time since May 12-14, 2008, again vs. the Mariners...team had 2 extra inning contests in a 4-game series, May 19-22, 2008 at Minnesota.
- The Rangers won 2 extra inning games in series of at least 3 games for the 1st time since July 25 (12 IP) and July 27 (10 IP), 1996 at Chicago.
- The Rangers allowed just one unearned run in the final 17 innings of the Seattle series and issued just 4 runs/3 ER in 32.0 innings in the 3 games vs. the Mariners to lower the season ERA from 3.92 to 3.48.
- The Rangers won all 3 games despite batting .224 (26-116) and have just 2 extra base hits.

AND ANOTHER THING: According to Baseball-Reference.com, it was only the 2nd time that the Rangers won 2 games in same series in which the opposing starter didn't allow a run in an outing of at least 7.0 innings...Cliff Lee pitched 7.0 SHO innings on Friday and Doug Fister blanked Texas for 8.0 innings on Sunday...the only other occasion was July 10-11 1998, when Texas won at Oakland in games started by Tom Candiotti (8.0 IP) and Blake Stein (7.0 IP).

DOWN TO FINAL OUT: David Murphy's 2-out 9th inning single tied Sunday's game en route to a win...it is the 1st time that the Rangers have won when trailing down to their final out in the 9th inning or later since April 24, 2009 at Baltimore when Michael Young hit a 2-run homer in the top of the 9th to give the Rangers a 5-4 win (Elias Sports Bureau).

TAKING A LEAD: The Rangers have had a lead at some point in 23 of 25 games this season...club's 10 losses in games with a lead match Baltimore for most in the majors.

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers and A's meet for the 1st time in 2010 in this 3-game series...Texas was just 8-11 versus Oakland in 2009 after going 32-25 from 2006-08...the team lost 9 of the last 12 meetings a year ago beginning May 31...Texas was 4-6 at Oakland Coliseum in 2009 after going 21-20 from 2005-08...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 284-277 overall with the A's having a 147-133 advantage in Oakland...Texas was blanked 3 times by the A's a year ago and were outscored, 19-1 in a 3-game set in Arlington, Sept. 14-16.

PITCHING A PLUS: The Rangers allowed just one unearned run in the final 17 innings of the Seattle series and issued just 4 runs/3 ER in 32.0 innings in the 3 games vs. the Mariners to lower the season ERA from 3.92 to 3.48, 3rd in the A.L. behind Tampa Bay (3.01) and Seattle (3.25) and lowest since April 18 (3.41)...team ERA is 6th best in the majors...Texas has a 3.93 mark (64 ER/146.1 IP) over the last 16 games to rise from season-low 2.67...the 3.48 mark is the team's lowest ERA through 25 games since 1993 (2.99).

--Texas has allowed 4 runs/3 ER in 41.0 innings in the last 4 road games to lower the road ERA from 4.54 to 3.10, trailing only Tampa Bay (2.23) and San Francisco (3.04) among major league clubs.

--The rotation has posted a 2.03 ERA (9 ER/40.0 IP) in the last 6 games to go from 4.15 to 3.56, 4th in the A.L. and best since April 23 (3.48)...starters have logged at least 6.0 innings in 8 straight games, the team's longest such streak since 10 games in a row, May 8-19, 2009

A BIRTHDAY SAVE: Neftali Feliz earned his 5th save of the year on Sunday on his 22nd birthday...it is just the 5th time that a Ranger has saved a game for the club on his birthday, the 1st since Francisco Cordero in 2004:

QUALITY CONTROL: By allowing 1 run in 7.0 innings on Sunday, C.J. Wilson has opened the season with 5 consecutive quality starts, becoming the first Texas starter to open the year with at least 5 straight QS since Kevin Brown (6) in 1993...Wilson is just the 5th pitcher in club history to do so as members of a Rangers season-opening rotation (as opposed to starting their seasons in the bullpen).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

**#40 Rich Harden, RHP
(1-1, 4.56)**

WHEN THE LIGHTS GO DOWN: The 28-year-old right-hander is set to make his 6th start and appearance tonight against the Oakland Athletics, his former team (see below)...will be working on regular 4 days' rest for a 3rd consecutive outing looking for back-to-back wins, as he earned his first victory in a Rangers uniform in Wednesday's 6-5 win over Chicago-AL...now owns a 40-0 record when receiving at least 4 runs of support in a start, but has received 3 runs-or-less in 4 of his 5 starts this season...has held right-handers to a .216 (8-37) average, with opponents batting .250 (21-84) overall...has a career record of 15-7, 3.51 (79 ER/202.1 IP) in 37 games/32 starts...signed with Texas on Dec. 10, 2009 and opened the year as the club's no. 2 starter...spent the past season-and-a-half with the Chicago Cubs...made 25 starts in consecutive seasons for the first time in his career...his 3.39 ERA from 2003-09 was the 8th-lowest figure among all major league pitchers with at least 125 starts in that span.

LAST START: Earned his first Texas victory on Wednesday in Arlington in a 6-5 win over the White Sox, posting his 2nd quality start of the season (6.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R-ER, 5 BB, 2 SO, 1 HR, 87 pitches-46 strikes)...tossed a season-low 87 pitches and averaged 14.5 pitches-per-inning, fewest in any start this year...in a match-up with Jake Peavy, held Chicago scoreless through 5.0 before allowing Carlos Quentin's one-out 3-run homer in the 6th...induced 3 groundball doubleplays, including 2 that ended innings...hit a pair of batters, both to lead off an inning...was relieved by Darren Oliver with a 5-3 advantage in the 7th...the Rangers offense plated 5 runs in the first inning and added one more in the 7th.

FAMILIAR DIGS: Is set to make his first career appearance against an Oakland organization that drafted the right-hander in the 17th round of the 2000 June draft...spent the better part of his first 8 professional seasons with the A's before a July trade sent him to the Chicago Cubs prior to that club's playoff run in 2008...in 6 major league seasons with Oakland (2003-08), Harden compiled a 36-19 record with a 3.42 ERA (206 ER/541.2 IP) over 97 games, going 36-19, 3.48 (205 ER/530.2 IP) in 89 starts.

AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY STADIUM: Has gone 18-9 with a 2.98 ERA (97 ER/293.0 IP) in 49 career games at this venue, including 18-9, 3.01 (97 ER/290.0 IP) in 47 starts...set to make his 48th career start, which would tie him for 20th all-time at this facility...Catfish Hunter fronts that list with 140 career starts in Oakland...Harden's lifetime .216 (231-1069) opponents average ranks 9th all-time among qualifiers...ironically, Nolan Ryan has the lowest all-time mark at .197...Harden's last start here came in a 5-0 win over Philadelphia on June 26, 2008 (8.0 SHO IP).

ROAD RUNNER: Scheduled to make his 3rd road start of 2010, as he has gone 0-1, 5.59 (6 ER/9.2 IP) through a pair of outings thus far...took no decision in 4-2 win on April 12 at Cleveland (2 ER/6.0 IP) and earned only loss of season in a 5-2 defeat at Yankee Stadium on April 18 (4 ER/3.2 IP)...over the last 3 seasons (2008-10), Harden has gone 11-5 with a 2.47 ERA (37 ER/134.2 IP) over 23 road starts, which currently stands as the lowest road ERA in the majors during that span (min. 20 road starts)...also has the lowest opponents average on the road over last 3 seasons at .209 (101-484).

2010 NOTES: Team is 3-2 in his 5 starts...has more walks (23) than strikeouts (22)...leads the majors with 5 hit batters...averaging 8.4 SO/9 IP...does not qualify for league-leader status, as his 23.2 IP is 2nd-fewest in the A.L. among pitchers with at least 5 starts...is averaging 20.0 pitches-per-inning, most on the Texas staff...has allowed one home run in 4 of 5 outings, at least 90 pitches in all but one start...made Texas debut in club's 2nd game of the season, a 7-4 loss on April 7 vs. Toronto...permitted solo HR to Alex Gonzalez to lead off 3rd inning, only hit allowed...in total, he recorded 8 strikeouts with 5 walks over 3.2 innings, becoming just 2nd Texas pitcher in the last 14 seasons (1997-2010) to combine for at least 5 walks and at least 8 strikeouts in an outing (also John Thomson in CG win on May 18, 2003 at New York-AL...took no decision in club's 4-2, 10-inning win on April 12 at Cleveland, Tribe's home opener...gave up 2-out, first-inning solo HR to Shin-Soo Choo...beginning with final out of first inning, retired 14 of 17 faced until Choo's one-out single in the 6th...Nelson Cruz won game with 2-run HR in 10th...suffered first loss in a 5-2 defeat on April 18 at Yankee Stadium, logging just 3.2 innings for the 2nd time this season (4 ER)...gave up a solo HR to Mark Teixeira to lead off the 3rd...as a last minute replacement for Scott Feldman (stomach virus), Harden had his scheduled start moved up one day and took the mound on April 23 vs. Detroit (2 ER/4.1 IP)...did not factor into the decision, despite exiting with a 3-2 lead...both runs allowed came on Miguel Cabrera's 2-run single in the 5th...Elvis Andrus' bases-loaded walk-off single in 9th gave Texas a 5-4 win.

WE STAND ON GUARD FOR THEE: Harden is a native of Victoria, British Columbia, about 25 miles from Port Angeles, Washington, north of Seattle...with his Texas debut on April 7 vs. Toronto, he became just the 10th Canada native ever to appear for the Rangers, including the 7th pitcher:

MISSING BATS: Struck out 171 batters for the Cubs in 2009, marking the 2nd-highest single-season total of his career behind only 181 strikeouts in 2008...the Rangers have not had a pitcher eclipse 170 strikeouts in a single season since RHP Aaron Sele compiled 186 strikeouts in 1999...Harden recorded 171 strikeouts in 141.0 innings (10.91 SO/9 IP) last season, as he has led the majors in strikeouts per 9 innings for a 2nd straight year (minimum 25 starts)...has averaged 9.35 strikeouts per 9 innings in his big league career (2003-09), the highest figure among any major league pitcher in that span (minimum 125 starts).

2009: Went 9-9 with a 4.09 ERA (64 ER/141.0 IP) in 26 games/starts for Chicago-NL, his only full season in the National League...was the 2nd-highest single-season starts total of his career (31 GS in 2004) and his 3rd-highest innings total...team was 13-13 in his starts...worked at least 6.0 frames in 15 starts and 7.0-or-more innings 5 times...allowed 2-or-fewer earned runs in 18 of 26 outings with 14 quality starts...had an ERA nearly 3 times higher at Wrigley (5.99) than on the road (2.00)...went 6-2 in 11 starts on road, 3-7 over 15 starts at home...had a 2.55 ERA (19 ER/67.0 IP) in 12 starts after the All-Star break, this after 5.47 figure (45 ER/74.0 IP) before the break...his 2.81 ERA (26 ER/83.1 IP) in 14 night games was more than 3 runs lower than his 5.93 mark (38 ER/57.2 IP) in 12 day games...was team's 4th starter to open the year.

CAREER: Is in the midst of his 8th major league campaign after being selected by Oakland in the 17th round of the 2000 June draft...he has led the majors in strikeouts per 9 innings in each of the last two seasons, posting a 10.91 figure in 2009 and a 11.01 mark in 2008 (minimum 25 starts)...has compiled three different seasons of 10-or-more wins and appeared in four postseason games with the A's and Cubs...has cleared 30 starts and 150.0 innings once in his career (2004), enduring seven separate stints on the disabled list in the major leagues...was acquired by the Chicago Cubs in a 6-player trade on July 8, 2008 prior to the club's playoff run...graduated from Claremont Secondary (Victoria, BC) in 1999...was originally drafted by Seattle in the 38th round of the 1999 June draft, but did not sign...attended Central Arizona Junior College, where he graduated in 2001.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP Scott Feldman (1-2, 4.50 in 5 games/starts)

The 27-year-old is scheduled to make his 6th start and appearance of the season on Tuesday in the middle installment of this 3-game set against the A's here in Oakland...Feldman grew up in the Bay Area and graduated from Burlingame High School in 2001...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest, as he last started in the Rangers' 7-5 loss on Thursday to the White Sox (6.0 IP, 2 H, 3 R-1 ER, 4 BB, 4 SO)...carried a 2-run advantage into the 7th inning, however Chicago took the lead, aided by 2 Texas errors in the frame...matched a season-high with 4 strikeouts, but also equaled a season-high with 4 walks...has issued 8 walks over past 2 starts, after walking just 3 batters over his first 3 starts...has gone 3-4 with an 5.33 ERA (30 ER/50.2 IP) in 13 career games against Oakland, including 3-4, 5.84 (29 ER/44.2 IP) in 8 starts...was 2-2, 7.06 (17 ER/21.2 IP) in 4 starts against the Athletics in 2009...Feldman's .643 winning pct. from 2009-10 (18-10) is currently 8th-best in the American League over that span.
