WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers have won the 1st 4 games on this roadtrip to Seattle (3-0) and Oakland (1-0) since losing to Chicago at home on Thursday...it is the team's longest winning streak of 2010 and is the longest current winning streak in the major leagues...this is the Rangers' longest win streak since 4 victories in a row, Sept. 1-4, 2009...last longer streak was 5 straight victories, July 19-24, 2009...club has captured 6 of 7 and 9 of its last 12 games beginning April 22..at 14-12, Texas has matched its record after 26 games of 2009 (15-12 after 27)...the Rangeres are 2 games over the .500 mark for the 2nd time in 2010 (5-3 on April 14) after finishing 2009 at 87-75.

AT THE TOP: The Rangers have held sole possession of 1st place for the 1st time all season the last 2 days...team had been tied for 1st on 3 days previously...this is the 1st time that Texas has been alone in 1st place since July 10, 2009, the final of the 65 days that the club occupied the top postion a year ago...the Rangers' current 1.5 game advantage is the team's largest since a 1.5 game lead on June 18, 2009...last bigger advantage in the A.L. West was 2.0 games on June 17, 2009.

ROAD SUCCESS: The Rangers has won 5 consecutive away games since losing in Boston on April 21...is the team's longest away winning streak since 6 wins in a row, April 29-May 15, 2006...Texas has started the year 7-6 on the the road for the 2nd straight season (7-7 after 14 games/9-5 after 14 games in 2006)...Texas is one of 5 A.L. clubs with a winning road record in 2010, the only A.L. West team...this marks the 1st time that Texas has started a roadtrip at 4-0 since April 30-May 3, 2002.

TAKING A LEAD: The Rangers have had a lead at some point in 24 of 26 games this season, including the last 7 contests...that is the **most in the majors** (Yankees-23; Twins and Rays-22) according to the Elias Sports Bureau...the exceptions were April 17 at New York and April 26 vs. Detroit and the Rangers were tied at 6-6 in the latter contest....club's 10 losses in games with a lead match Baltimore for most in the majors.

VERSUS OAKLAND AND THE WEST: Texas has won 3 of its last 5 meetings with the A's dating back to Awpt. 21, 2009 but is just 9-11 in the series since the start of 2009 after going 32-25 from 2006-08...Texas is 5-6 at the Oakland Coliseum in 2009 after going 21-20 from 2005-08...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 285-277 overall with the A's having a 147-134 advantage in Oakland.

--The Rangers' 6-1 record vs. the A.L. West is the 2nd best of any ML team against one division in 2010 (more than 3 games)...St. Louis has a 7-1 mark vs. the N.L. East.

MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Texas has won its 1st 3 games in May and has a 42-19 (.689) May record since the start of 2008, the best in the majors, 6 wins more than any team in that span...the Rangers' 3.62 ERA (222 ER/552.1 IP) in those games is 2nd best in that span while their .281 (601-2140) batting average ranks 3rd highest in thre ML.

PITCHING A PLUS: The Rangers have posted a 1.10 ERA (6 R/5 ER/41.0 IP) duiring this 4-game winning streak to lower the season ERA from 3.92 to 3.43, 3rd in the A.L. behind Tampa Bay (3.01) and Seattle (3.25) and lowest since April 18 (3.41)...this 3.43 mark is the team's lowest ERA through 26 games since 1993 (2.91)...Texas has not allowed a homer in the last 4 games (41.0 IP) since Chicago's Paul Konerko went deep in the 9th inning on Thursday...is the staff's longest such strreak since 4 straight games, August 9-13, 2009.

Road: Texas has allowed 6 runs/5 ER in 50.0 innings in the last 5 road games (0.90 ERA) to lower the road ERA from 4.54 to 3.02, trailing only Tampa Bay (2.23) in the A.L.

Starters: The rotation has allowed one run in 14.0 innings in the last 2 games and has posted a 1.72 ERA (9 ER/47.0 IP) in the last 7 games to go from 4.15 to 3.40, 4th in the A.L. and best since April 20 (3.21)...starters have logged at least 6.0 innings in 9 straight games, the team's longest such streak since 10 games in a row, May 8-19, 2009.

#39 Scott Feldman, RHP (1-2, 4.50)

TONIGHT: The 27-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 6th start and appearance of the season tonight in the middle installment of this 3-game set against the A's here in Oakland...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest, as he last started in the Rangers' 7-5 loss on Thursday to the White Sox...has issued 8 walks over past 2 starts, after walking just 3 batters over his first 3 starts...threw his 3rd quality start of the season in his last outing and first since 2nd start of the campaign...is winless over his last 3 starts...longest winless drought in 2009 was a span of 4 starts (June 8-25)...will be starting on the road for the 2nd time in 6 games in 2010...this will also be just his 2nd start in a night game...went to high school in Burlingame, across the Bay, and is a 49ers and Warriors fan.

LAST START; Last started in the Rangers' 7-5 loss on Thursday to the White Sox (6.0 IP, 2 H, 3 R-1 ER, 4 BB, 4 SO)...carried a 2-run lead into the 7th inning, however Chicago took the lead, aided by a pair of Texas errors in the frame...matched a season-high with 4 strikeouts, but also equaled a season-high with 4 walks.

2010 NOTES: Has not allowed a homer in 4 straight, only 2 HR allowed came on Opening Day...team is 2-3 in his 5 starts...is tied for the major league lead with 7 unearned runs allowed...broke camp as the Rangers' Opening Day starter, 4th time in his career to make O.D. roster (also 2006-07, 2009), first time as member of a season-opening rotation...became just 2nd Texas pitcher since 1992 to take no-decision on O.D. in a 5-4 walk-off victory on April 5 vs. Toronto (3 ER/7.0 IP)...became first pitcher other than Kevin Millwood to start a Texas opener since Ryan Drese in 2005...earned first victory of 2010 in 9-2 win on April 11 vs. Seattle (1 ER/7.0 IP) and reached the .500 mark for his career at Rangers Ballpark (8-8)...took loss in Rangers' 7-3 defeat on April 17 at Yankee Stadium...matched the shortest start of his career with 73 pitches over just 2.1 innings (also 2.1 IP on July 29, 2009 vs. Detroit)...opposing starter A.J. Burnett posted 7.0 shutout innings, as Texas did not score until Nelson Cruz's 3-run HR off Alfredo Aceves in 8th.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 3-4, 5.33 (30 ER/50.2 IP) in 13 games/8 starts in his career against the A's...had gone 3-2, 4.11 (16 ER/35.0 IP) in his first 6 starts against Oakland, tossing quality starts in 5 of those outings...has gone 0-2, 12.10 (13 ER/9.2 IP) over his last 2 starts against the A's, both coming last September...delivered his first quality start after joining the Rangers rotation last season on May 6 at Oakland, holding the A's to 2 runs over 6.0 innings of work and picking up the win...helped the Rangers complete a doubleheader sweep of Oakland on May 29, allowing 2 runs over 6.0 innings...took the loss on September 14 against the A's in Arlington, snapping his 7-game win streak at the time...logged his 2nd shortest outing of the year on September 24 at Oakland, surrendering 7 runs over 3.1 innings.

TEXAS TONE-SETTER: Since becoming a full-time starter early in the 2008 campaign, Feldman ranks among staff leaders in several categories over the past 3 seasons...from 2008-10, the right-hander leads all Texas pitchers in wins (24), quality starts (33), and starts (61), while ranking 2nd in innings (367.0 IP) and strikeouts (201) behind Millwood

ON THE ROAD: Will be making just his 2nd road start of the season, as 4 of his 5 starts have come at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington...has made 31 career starts on the road, going 17-10 with a 4.51 ERA (88 ER/175.2 IP)...tied for major league lead with 12 road wins in 2009, going 12-4, 3.56 (41ER/103.2 IP) in 18 road contests, including 12-4, 3.44 (39 ER/102.0 IP) in 17 starts...his 3.56 road ERA ranked 7th in the A.L. and was the lowest qualifying (min. 81.0 road innings) road figure by a Texas pitcher since Ken Hill's 2.85 road ERA in 1996...Feldman won a club-record 8 consecutive road starts from July 10-Sept. 9, 2009, most by any major league pitcher since Jon Garland won 10 straight on the road for the White Sox from May 17-Aug. 24, 2006...Rangers went 13-4 in Feldman's road starts last season.

SPRING TRAINING: Made 4 Cactus League starts for the Rangers this spring, going 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA (5 ER/15.1 IP)...held opposition to one run or less in 3 of 4 out-

SEVENTEEN: Feldman is coming off a 2009 season that saw him win 17 games, most for a Texas pitcher since Kenny Rogers (18) in 2004 and most by a Rangers righthander since Aaron Sele (18) in 1999...was just the third pitcher in team history with 17-or-more wins in 31-starts-or-less, joining Rogers (17 W/31 GS in 1995) and Fergie Jenkins (18 W/30 GS in 1978)...at age 26, was the third-youngest pitcher in team history to record a 17-win season, bettered only by Steve Comer in 1979 and Bobby Witt in 1990...as the Rangers' 30th round selection in the 2003 June draft, is one of just 5 Texas draft picks ever to have 17+ wins for the Rangers, joining Rogers (2 times), Witt (1), Rick Helling (1) and Kevin Brown (1).

2009: In his first full major league season in 2009, Feldman captured Rangers Pitcher of the Year honors after winning 17 games, 4th-most in the American League...established career highs in most categories, including wins, starts (31), innings (189.2), and strikeouts (113)...posted a club-record 12 wins on the road, matching most in the majors...opened the season as Texas' long reliever, compiling a 12.15 ERA (9 ER/6.2 IP) in 3 appearances...entered the rotation on April 25 at Baltimore and went 17-8, 3.79 (77 ER/183.0 IP) in 31 starts the rest of the way...ranked among A.L. starters in opponents slugging pct. (3rd, .359), home runs per 9 innings (6th, 0.74), opponents OPS (7th, .673), opponents batting average (11th, .245), ERA (12th, 3.79), and baserunners per 9 innings (14th, 11.66), all club bests except ERA...topped Rangers starters with .245 opponents average...overall, opposition had .250 (178-713) batting average, .226 (87-385) by left-handers and .277 (91-328) by right-handers.

CAREER: Has been a regular member of the rotation most of last three seasons...topped the club in victories (23) and quality starts (31) from 2008-09 and placed second in starts (56), innings (241.0) and strikeouts (187)...had made just 4 pro starts in 176 total appearances from 2003-07 before making 58 starts in 64 games with Frisco and Texas in 2008-09...rose quickly through the Rangers' system to make his big league debut in 2005, just over two years after being drafted in the 30th round...joins Rangers Hall of Famer Charlie Hough and Brandon Villafuerte as the only players in franchise history born in the State of Hawaii...pitched at Burlingame (CA) High School (graduated 2001)...attended College of San Mateo (CA), earning Coast Conference Pitcher of the Year honors as a freshman in 2002 and sophomore
