WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers conclude this roadtrip today...Texas had its 4-game winning streak end last night and is 4-1 on this trip to Seattle (3-0) and Oakland (1-1)...loss on Tuesday was 1st since defeat to Chicago at home on April 29...Texas has captured 6 of 8 and 9 of its last 13 games beginning April 22...club was 15-12 after 27 games of 2009 (15-13 after 28)...the Rangers have been over the .500 mark for 3 straight days with best mark at 2 over .500 twice.

--Texas is now 3-1 in May...club is 42-20 (.677) in May since the start of 2008, the best winning percentage for the month in the majors in that span ahead of Philadelphia at .607 (42-20) and Tampa Bay at .597 (37-25).

AT THE TOP: The Rangers have held sole possession of 1st place for the 1st time all season the last 3 days...team had been tied for 1st on 3 days previously...this is the 1st time that Texas has been alone in 1st place since July 10, 2009, the final of the 65 days that the club occupied the top position a year ago...advantahe of 1.5 games on Tuesday was team's largest since a 1.5 game lead on June 18, 2009.

ROAD SUCCESS: The Rangers had their 5-game road winning streak ended on Tuesday...it was the team's longest away winning streak since 6 wins in a row, April 29-May 15, 2006...Texas has started the year 7-7 on the the road for the 2nd straight season (8-7 after 15 games)...Texas is one of 6 A.L. clubs with a .500 or better road record in 2010, the only A.L. West team.

This Trip: With a win today, Texas would finish this roadtrip at 5-1...the last time the club had a multi-city trip with only one loss was a 4-1 visit to Cleveland and Tampa Bay, April 28-May 2, 2006...the last time that occurred with at least 5 victories was 5-1 to Tampa Bay and Baltimore, July 23-29, 1999.

SERIES STREAK: A victory this afternoon would also give the Rangers wins in 3 straight series (2-1 vs. Chicago; 3-0 at Seattle) for the 1st time since the club captured 4 series in a row vs. Boston, at Kansas City, vs. Detroit, and vs. Seattle, July 20-August 2, 2009...Texas is 2-0-1 in its last 3 series overall after splitting 4 with Detroit before the Chicago series.

CLOSE GAMES: With Tuesday's 7-6 loss, 16 of the Rangers' 27 games in 2010 have been decided by one (3-5) or 2 (5-3) runs...8 of the team's last 9 contests have been decided by one (1-1) or 2 (4-2) runs beginning April 26...Texas has dropped all 4 one-run games on the road this season and 7 straight away games decided by a run overall since a 9-8 victory here in Oakland on Sept. 23, 2009.

Tuesday was just the 3rd time in 27 games this season that the Rangers have not led at some point in the contest...the lead in 24 games matches the Yankees for the most in the majors.

VERSUS OAKLAND AND THE WEST: Texas is 4-10 against the A's beginning May 31, 2009...the club is 5-7 at the Oakland Coliseum since the start of 2009 after going 21-20 from 2005-08...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 285-278 overall with the A's having a 148-134 advantage in Oakland...Texas had its 5-game winning streak against A.L. West clubs end on Tuesday.

VLADIMIR GUERRERO had a grand slam and 5 RBI on Tuesday...notes from Vlad's performance last night:

--hit his 6th career grand slam, 1st since May 1, 2007 at KC...was his 2nd at the Oakland Coliseum, the other off Rich Harden on Aug. 9, 2005.

--was his 15th career game of 5+ RBI and matched the club's season best (Michael Young on April 25 vs. Detroit).

--was his 410th career homer, moving him past Jason Giambi into 43rd all-time, 4 behind Darrell Evans.

--the 5 RBI give him 1336 career, 82nd all-time, one behind Johnny Mize...he passed Giambi and Ron Santo (1331 each), Duke Snider (1333) and Mike Piazza (1335) on Tuesday.

SOME PITCHING NOTES: The Rangers allowed 10 hits and 7 runs on Tuesday after posting a 1.10 ERA (6 R/5 ER/41.0 IP) during the 4-game winning streak ...it was the most hits and runs surrendered since April 26 vs. Detroit (13 H/7 R)...ERA on Tuesday rose from 3.43 to 3.57, 4th in the A.L. behind Tampa Bay (2.97), Seattle (3.28), and New York (3.38)...the 3.57 mark is the team's lowest ERA through 27 games since 1993 (3.00).

Road: Texas has a 1.86 era (12 ER/58.0 IP) in the last 7 road games to lower the road ERA to 3.32, trailing only Tampa Bay (2.21) in the A.L.

Starters: The starters have logged at least 6.0 innings in 10 straight games, the team's longest such streak since 10 games in a row, May 8-19, 2009.

Relievers: Bullpen has a 1.38 ERA (2 ER/13.0 IP) in the last 5 games to go from 3.80 to season low 3.44, 4th best in the A.L.

7 AND 7: Scott Feldman permitted 7 runs over 7.0 innings in taking the loss on Tuesday...in the last 15 seasons (1996-2010), it marked just the 5th time that a Texas starter has allowed at least 7 runs while working a minimum of 7.0 innings.

--The only other ML pitcher with 7+ runs in 7.0+ innings in 2010 is Boston's Josh Beckett, who issued 7 runs in 7.0 innings in a no decision against the Rangers on April 21 at Fenway Park.

10 OR MORE STRIKEOUTS: Colby Lewis has fanned 10 batters in each of his last 2 starts, April 25 vs. Detroit (W) and April 30 at Seattle (ND)...Nolan Ryan holds the Rangers all-time record with 5 straight games of 10 or more strikeouts, August 22-Sept. 12, 1989...since that time, the longest streak by a Texas pitcher is 2 games, done 4 times:

--Lewis is one of 3 ML pitchers with consecutive games of 10+ strikeouts in 2010, joining the Cardinals' Chris Carpenter (April 16 & 21) and the Giants' Jonathan Sanchez (April 14 & 20)...the last major leaguer with more than 2 straight games of double figure strikeout totals was the Red Sox' Jon Lester, 3 in a row from May 31-June 12, 2009.

ROYALS NEXT: The Rangers open a 4-game series with Kansas City on Thursday to begin a 7-game homestand...clubs split 6 games in 2009 with Texas holding a 30-19 advantage since 2004...beginning Thursday, Rangers will play 14 of next 17 games in Arlington through May 23.

SHORTS: The Rangers are 4-5 in steal attempts of 3rd base in 2010 and 36-40 since the start of 2009...Texas is one of just 3 ML clubs not to make a 25-man roster move involving a pitcher this season, joining Detroit and St. Louis...Texas is 6-6 in day games, 3-3 on the road...Ryan Garko and Rangers minor league infield coordinator Spike Owen have been selected to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association 28-man College World Series All-Legends Team, which was announced today...Garko played at Stanford and Owen for Texas...happy birthday to Rangers Clubhouse and Equipment Manager Richard "Hoggy" Price.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

**#48 Colby Lewis, RHP
(3-0, 2.76)**

TODAY'S TILT: The 30-year-old right-hander is set to make his 6th start and appearance in this afternoon's series finale against the Athletics, his former team (more below)...will be his 40th career start...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest for a 3rd consecutive start, as he tossed a career-high 9.0 scoreless innings in the Rangers 11-inning, 2-0 victory on Friday in Seattle...would join Scott Feldman (5-0, 2009) as the only Texas pitchers in the last 12 seasons (1999-2010) to begin a season at 4-0, as Lewis is currently the only Rangers hurler with multiple wins and no losses...is an even 15-15 for his career with a chance to go above the .500 mark for the first time since following a win on April 20, 2003 at Oakland (4-3)...was recently named Rangers Player of the Month for April by a panel of the club's beat writers and broadcasters.

LEWIS ON THE LEADERBOARD: Ranks 4th in the A.L. with 38 strikeouts over 5 starts, 5 behind A.L. leader James Shields...also ranks 2nd with 10.47 strikeouts-per-9 IP, behind the Blue Jays' Brandon Morrow (10.61)...has the 2nd-highest percentage of swings that miss in the A.L. at 30.0%...also ranks among league leaders in pitches-per-game (3rd, 109.4), wins (T6th, 3) and ERA (11th, 2.76)...has held opponents to the 2nd-lowest average in the A.L. at .195 (23-118), while right-handers have batted just .176 (9-51)...has A.L.'s 4th-lowest road avg. at .159 (11-69).

LAST START: Did not factor into the decision in the Rangers' 11-inning, 2-0 victory on Friday night at Safeco Field despite holding the Mariners scoreless over a career-high 9.0 innings (9.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 10 SO, 116 pitches-79 strikes)...became the first Rangers pitcher to work at least 9.0 scoreless frames without a decision since Nolan Ryan (10.0 IP) on Aug. 17, 1990 vs. Chicago-AL (Game 1)...permitted 4 baserunners over his first 3 frames (3 singles, walk) before retiring the final 21 batters he faced, beginning with the first out of the 3rd inning...took the mound opposite lefty Cliff Lee, who allowed 3 hits over 7.0 scoreless frames.

THE TEN SPOT: Lewis recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts for the 2nd consecutive start and the 3rd time this season...he became the first Texas pitcher with 10+ strikeouts at least 3 times in one month since Nolan Ryan had 3 such efforts in Sept. 1990...his 38 total punchouts was the 2nd-most strikeouts ever for a Ranger in April behind Ryans' 49 in 1989...Lewis is just the second Texas pitcher in the last 19 seasons (1991-2010) to record 10-or-more strikeouts in consecutive starts, joining right-hander Aaron Sele, who pulled the trick in 1999 on Aug. 7 vs. Toronto (10 K's) and Aug. 12 vs. Detroit (13 K's)...Sele is the only other Ranger with as many as 3 starts of 10+ strikeouts in a single season over the last 19 years (3, 1999)...Ryan had 6 in 1991...Lewis' 10-strikeout effort on April 14 at Cleveland came more than 6 years after his first (Aug. 15, 2003)...according to Elias, no other active pitcher had gone 5-or-more years between his first and second game with double-digit strikeouts.

2010 NOTES: Team is 4-1 in his starts...has left with the lead and in position to win in 4 of his 5 outings, as his 6.61 run support average is 13th in the A.L....club has scored 6-or-more runs 4 times...has gone 6.0-or-more innings in 3 of 5 starts...this is his 2nd big league season with multiple wins (also 10-9 for Texas in 2003)...started the Rangers' 4th game of the season on April 9 vs. Seattle (6-2 victory) and earned his first big league win since a start with Texas on April 7, 2004 at Oakland...was first start/appearance with Texas since April 17, 2004 at Seattle...exited with a 6-1 lead, only run allowed came in first inning...was first time in his career to throw at least 7.0 innings and allow one-run-or-less...earned win in start on April 14 at Cleveland, as outing was moved up a day due to case of food poisoning for original starter C.J. Wilson...matched career high with 10 K's and left with a 4-0 lead...took no decision in a 7-6 loss on April 20 at Fenway Park in Boston despite exiting with a 6-2 lead after 5.0+ innings (3 ER/5.0 IP)...Red Sox plated 3 runs in final 2 at-bats to win in walk-off fashion...earned 3rd win in 8-4 victory on April 25 vs. Detroit (4 ER/6.1 IP), setting down 15 of the last 16 batters he faced...allowed Austin Jackson's first major league HR to start game...matched season and career high with 10 K's.

VS. OAKLAND: Lewis will be making today's start against his former team, as he spent the 2007 campaign with the A's organization...went 0-2, 6.45 (27 ER/37.2 IP) in 26 games/one start, before heading to Japan for 2 seasons...is 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (9 ER/24.0 IP) in 6 career games against the Athletics, including 2-0, 3.98 (9 ER/20.1 IP) in 4 starts...both career wins came here at the Oakland Coliseum, where he is 2-1, 3.15 (12 ER/34.1 IP) in 17 games, including 2-0, 2.70 (5 ER/16.2 IP) in 3 starts.

BACK TO TEXAS: Signed a two-year contract with Texas with a club option for 2010 on Jan. 19 after spending each of the last two seasons pitching in Japan...spent his first 9 pro seasons in the United States after being drafted by Texas in 1999...2010 marks the 3rd time for Lewis to begin a season in Rangers Opening Day rotation (also 2003-04).

JAPAN: Went 26-17, 2.82 (111 ER/354.1 IP) with just 46 walks and 369 strikeouts in 55 games/54 starts the last 2 seasons with Nippon Professional Baseball's Hiroshima Carp...won a pair of Central League strikeout titles while holding opponents to a .234 batting average in that span...**2009:** Led Central League with 186 strikeouts and ranked among the league leaders in wins (T7th, 11), ERA (8th, 2.96), and innings (8th, 176.1) in his second season at Hiroshima...led the Carp in wins, had the second lowest ERA and tied for second in complete games (2)...was deactivated for roughly 2 weeks on April 18 due to paralysis of the facial nerves on his right side...pitched a 5-hit CG SHO on Sept. 9 at Yakult...worked 6 or more innings in 20 of 28 starts and allowed more than one walk only 4 times...fanned season high 10 batters three times and had 9 strikeouts on four other occasions...hit 3 homers...**2008:** Topped the C.L. with 183 strikeouts, 20 more than any other pitcher...ranked second in ERA (2.68) and wins (15) and pitched the fourth most innings (178.0)...issued just 27 walks, including 5 in final 4.7 innings over last 6 starts...had a pair of CG SHO, 6-hitter on May 1 at Yomiuri and 4-hitter on Sept. 27 vs. Yakult...recorded 10 or more strikeouts 4 times with season best 13 on June 4 at Yokohama...worked at least 7.0 innings in 19 of 26 starts including 14 straight outings at one point.

MLB (1999-2007): Entered 2010 with a career major league record of 12-15, 6.71 in 72 games/34 starts with the Rangers (2002-04), Tigers (2006), and A's (2007)...major league debut came on Opening Day of 2002 with Texas (April 1 at Oakland)...won 10 games for the Rangers in 2003 before missing most of next 2 seasons with shoulder injuries...opened the 2004 season in Rangers' rotation, but made just 3 starts before going on disabled list with right shoulder soreness...was later diagnosed as torn rotator cuff and missed rest of the year...was awarded to Detroit on a waiver claim in Oct. 2004...last major league game came with Oakland in a 1.0-inning scoreless relief appearance on Sept. 26, 2007 at Fenway Park in Boston...was claimed on waivers by Kansas City on Nov. 2, 2007, but released on Dec. 4 in order to sign with Hiroshima.

A RANGER FROM THE GET-GO: Was the 38th overall player in the country selected by Texas in the 1999 First Year Player Draft...chosen by Texas as a compensation pick between the first and second rounds...drafted out of Bakersfield (CA) Junior College (graduated '99) where he pitched for 2 seasons...was 4-5, 2.86 with 108 strikeouts in 88.0 innings in 1999...earned first team Western State Conference honors that year...played baseball at North Bakersfield (CA) High School (graduated '97).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - LHP Matt Harrison (1-1, 4.97 in 5 games/starts)

The 24-year-old left-handed is scheduled to make his 6th start and appearance of the season in tomorrow night's homestand opener against Kansas City...earned win in last start on Saturday at Seattle (6.0 IP, 7 H, 3 R-2 ER, 3 BB, 3 SO, 0 HR, 127 pitches), posting his 3rd quality start of the year in Rangers' 6-3 win, a matchup with Felix Hernandez...was his 14th career win in 31st game/start, fastest to 14 wins in Texas history (previous Kevin Brown, 14 W in first 33 career games)...was Harrison's first ML win since May 14, 2009 vs. Seattle, as he had gone 0-4 in previous 8 starts...the career-high 127 pitches remain 2nd-most by a ML starter in '10 (Rox' Ubaldo Jimenez, 128 pitches in no-hitter 4/17 at ATL)...most pitches for a Texas starter since R.A. Dickey (131) on May 2, 2004 vs. Boston...allowed 2 runs in the 3rd inning on 3 singles and a walk...gave up unearned run in the 5th after a Michael Young throwing error to begin the inning...exited with a 5-3 lead...despite quality start, still has 7.88 ERA (14 ER/16.0 IP) last 3 starts to rise from 1.38...is 1-1, 5.40 (7 ER/11.2 IP) in 2 career games/starts vs. Royals...won on 8/27/08 at The K (6.2 IP, 2 R-1 ER) and lost on 4/17/09 in Arlington (5.0 IP, 6 R-ER).
