- is the youngest of 8 children...originally signed by Oakland as an international free agent on Sept. 29, 1996 by Santiago Villalona.
- **CAREER:** Spent time in five organizations during his professional career (OAK, TB, NYY, WAS, MIL)...has appeared in 329 major League games, all as a reliever.
- **1997:** Went 9-3 with 3 CG and a 2.71 ERA in 18 games (7 starts) with Oakland-West of the Dominican Summer League.
- **1998:** Posted a 3.18 ERA in 12 games (11 starts) with Oakland's rookie-level Arizona League entry...fanned 62 in 56.2 innings (9.8 K's per 9.0 innings)...ranked among AZL leaders in strikeouts (3rd), ERA (5th), and innings pitched (5th).
- **1999:** Earned honorable mention honors as a California League postseason All-Star... ranked 3rd in the CL in ERA, and led the Oakland chain with 127 strikeouts.

with 2 home runs and 3 RBI at Baltimore on July 11; hit 3rd career grand slam in the 2nd inning and a 3-run homer in the 8th...left the Aug. 3 game against Chicago in the fifth inning with back spasms...left the Aug. 17 game against Seattle in the third inning with lower back tightness and returned to the starting lineup on Aug. 21...placed on the 15day DL on Aug. 24 with a recurring disc injury and missed the remainder of the season.
