RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered a 6-2 loss to the Chicago White Sox yesterday afternoon at Comerica Park. Rick Porcello (3-4) took the loss for Detroit after allowing four runs in seven innings of work. Johnny Damon belted a solo home run for the Tigers, while Brennan Boesch finished with two hits. Brandon Inge added a run-scoring single for the Tigers. The Tigers begin a seven-game road trip with the first game of a two-game series at Oakland this evening. The trip continues with a three-game series at Los Angeles and a two-game series at Seattle.

WINNING OVER THE WEST: The Tigers have compiled a 30-20 record against clubs from the American League's West Division since the start of the 2009 season. Detroit's .600 winning percentage against the American League's West Division is second-best among league clubs since the start of the 2009 season. The Yankees have compiled a 31-19 record, a .620 winning percentage, versus the American League's West Division.

MIGGY AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE WEST: Miguel Cabrera enters this evening's game versus the Athletics batting .351 (133x379) with 71 runs scored, 35 doubles, a triple, 20 home runs and 91 RBI in 98 games against clubs from the American League's West Division during his career. He is tops among all active major league players with a .351 batting average versus the American League's West Division, while he is third with a .607 slugging percentage.

CABRERA'S A ROAD WARRIOR: Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game at Oakland hitting .421 (32x76) with eight doubles, seven home runs and 28 RBI in 19 games on the road this season. He is tops among all American League players with a .421 batting average and 28 RBI on the road this season, while he is second with seven home runs and an .803 slugging percentage.

ACTION JACKSON TAKES HIS SHOW ON THE ROAD: Austin Jackson has hit safely in 18 of his 19 games on the road this season, batting .353 (30x85) with six doubles, three triples, a home run and five RBI. He is seventh among all American League players with a .353 batting average on the road this season.

PAPA GRANDE POWERS THE PEN: Jose Valverde has not allowed a run in his last 17 outings for the Tigers, tossing 16.2 scoreless innings. He is tops among all American League relievers with a .123 batting average against, while he is second with a 0.51 ERA and tied for third with 10 saves.

DRIVING THEM IN: Brennan Boesch has collected at least one RBI in 12 of his first 20 career games with the Tigers. He is the first Tigers player since at least 1920 to collect at least one RBI in 12 of his first 20 career games.

MORE ON BOESCH: Brennan Boesch is hitting .413 (26x63) with eight doubles, two triples, three home runs and 18 RBI over his last 17 games dating back to April 28. He is tops among all American League players with a .413 batting average during that stretch, while he is tied for second with 13 extra-base hits, is third with a .746 slugging percentage and tied for fifth with 18 RBI.

BOESCH PROVIDES EXTRA-BASE POP: Brennan Boesch has collected 14 extra-base hits in his first 20 games with the Tigers. He has collected at least one extra-base hit in 11 of the 20 games, becoming the first Tigers player since at least 1920 to collect at least one extra-base hit in 11 of his first 20 career games.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Tigers have collected at least one extra-base hit in 36 of the club's 39 games this season. Detroit is third among all American League clubs with 128 extra-base hits this season. Additionally, the Tigers are second in the league with 91 doubles.

LOOKING AT THE ROOKIE LEADERS: Austin Jackson and Brennan Boesch have both enjoyed success during their rookie campaigns. Jackson is tops among all American League rookies with 28 runs scored and 53 hits, while he is second with a .329 batting average. Boesch is leading all league rookies with a .387 batting average and 19 RBI, while he is second with 29 hits and three home runs.

BULLISH BEHAVIOR: Through the club's first 39 games this season, Tigers relievers have compiled an 11-4 record and 2.49 ERA (134.0IP/37ER). Tigers relievers lead the American League with 11 victories, a 2.49 ERA and 134.0 innings pitched.

CABRERA IN A GROOVE WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game versus the Athletics hitting .444 (20x45) with runners in scoring position. He is tied for second among all American League players with a .444 batting average with runners in scoring position this season.

TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

'10 Season (Detroit): 4-2, 3.88 ERA, 8 G, 8 GS, 0 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 48.2 IP, 39 H, 22 R, 21 ER, 20 BB, 46 SO.

'09 Season (Detroit): 19-9, 3.45 ERA, 35 G, 35 GS, 3 CG, 1 SHO, 0 SV, 240.0 IP, 219 H, 99 R, 92 ER, 63 BB, 269 SO.

JUSTIN'S CASE: In his fifth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his ninth start of the season this evening against the Athletics.

AROUND FOR ANOTHER FIVE: Verlander agreed to terms on a five-year contract with the Tigers on February 4, 2010. The five-year contract will keep Verlander in a Tigers uniform through the 2014 season.

THREE STRAIGHT QUALITY STARTS: Verlander has posted a quality start in each of his last three outings, compiling a 3-0 record and 1.71 ERA (21.0IP/4ER).

FINE IN HIS LAST FOUR: Verlander has compiled a 3-1 record, 1.35 ERA (26.2IP/4ER) and 27 strikeouts in his last four starts dating back to April 27. He is tops among all American League pitchers during the stretch with a 1.35 ERA, while he is tied for the lead with three wins and is ninth with 27 strikeouts.

AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS: Verlander enters his start this evening at Oakland tied for seventh among all American League pitchers with four wins.

AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE WEST: Verlander enters his start this evening at Oakland with an 18-10 record and 3.34 ERA (212.2IP/79ER) in 33 starts during his career against opponents from the American League's West Division.

QUALITY WORK AGAINST OAKLAND: Verlander is making the eighth start of his career against Oakland this evening. He has registered a quality start in five of his previous seven outings against the club.

MR. MAY: Verlander is making the 27th start of his career during the month of May this evening against the Athletics. In his previous 26 outings during the month, he is 17-6 with a 2.65 ERA (176.2IP/52ER). Verlander is tied for the lead among all active American League pitchers with 17 wins during May since the start of the 2006 season, while he is third with a 2.65 ERA.

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: Verlander has limited righthanded batters to a .158 batting average (12x76) through his first eight starts of 2010. Lefties are hitting .262 (27x103) against Verlander this season.

GET ME THROUGH THE FIRST: Through his first eight starts of the season, opponents are hitting .353 (12x34) in the first inning against Verlander. Opponents are hitting .186 (27x145) from the second inning on versus Verlander.

RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: Verlander is making his sixth career start at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this evening. In his previous five outings, he is 1-3 with a 3.38 ERA (32.0IP/12ER).

AMONG THE AL BEST SINCE 2006: Verlander enters his start this evening against the Athletics tops among all American League pitchers with 138 games started since the start of the 2006 season, while he is tied for the lead with 69 wins and 785 strikeouts and is fourth with 877.1 innings pitched.

LEADING THE LEAGUE IN STRIKEOUTS: Verlander topped the American League with a career-high 269 strikeouts in 2009 to become the first Tigers pitcher to lead the league in strikeouts since Jack Morris did so in 1983 with 232 strikeouts. His total of 269 strikeouts marks the fifth-highest single-season total in Tigers history.

MORE ON THE STRIKEOUTS: Verlander became the first Tigers pitcher to strike out at least 200 batters in a season since Jeremy Bonderman fanned 202 batters in 2006. He became the eighth different pitcher in franchise history to fan at least 200 batters in a season. It marked the 20th time the feat has been accomplished in club history.

AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS IN '09: Verlander led the American League with 35 games started, 240.0 innings pitched and 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings during the 2009 season, while he tied for the league lead with 19 wins, finished third with 4.27 strikeouts per walk, fifth with 10.80 baserunners per nine innings, tied for fifth with three complete games, sixth with a 3.45 ERA and 8.21 hits per nine innings, tied for sixth with a .243 batting average against and eighth with a .679 winning percentage.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad in both 2007 and 2009. Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
