RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers knocked off the Athletics 5-1 last night in Oakland. Justin Verlander (5-2) went the distance to earn the win for Detroit. Danny Worth led the Tigers with three hits and an RBI, while Casper Wells added two hits and two RBI. Brandon Inge belted a solo home run for Detroit. The Tigers continue a seven-game road trip with the final game of a two-game series at Oakland this afternoon. The trip continues with a three-game series at Los Angeles and a two-game series at Seattle.

WINNING OVER THE WEST: The Tigers have compiled a 31-20 record against clubs from the American League's West Division since the start of the 2009 season. Detroit's .608 winning percentage against the American League's West Division is second-best among league clubs since the start of the 2009 season. The Yankees have compiled a 31-19 record, a .620 winning percentage, versus the American League's West Division.

MIGGY AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE WEST: Miguel Cabrera enters this afternoon's game versus the Athletics batting .347 (133x383) with 71 runs scored, 35 doubles, a triple, 20 home runs and 91 RBI in 99 games against clubs from the American League's West Division during his career. He is tops among all active major league players with a .347 batting average versus the American League's West Division, while he is third with a .601 slugging percentage.

CABRERA'S A ROAD WARRIOR: Miguel Cabrera enters today's game at Oakland hitting .400 (32x80) with eight doubles, seven home runs and 28 RBI in 20 games on the road this season. He is tops among all American League players with a .400 batting average and 28 RBI on the road this season, while he is second with seven home runs and a .763 slugging percentage.

ACTION JACKSON TAKES HIS SHOW ON THE ROAD: Austin Jackson has hit safely in 19 of his 20 games on the road this season, batting .356 (32x90) with six doubles, three triples, a home run and six RBI. He is seventh among all American League players with a .356 batting average on the road this season.

PAPA GRANDE POWERS THE PEN: Jose Valverde has not allowed a run in his last 17 outings for the Tigers, tossing 16.2 scoreless innings. He is tops among all American League relievers with a .123 batting average against, while he is second with a 0.51 ERA and tied for third with 10 saves.

DRIVING THEM IN: Brennan Boesch has collected at least one RBI in 12 of his first 21 career games with the Tigers. He is the first Tigers player since at least 1920 to collect at least one RBI in 12 of his first 21 career games.

MORE ON BOESCH: Brennan Boesch is hitting .394 (26x66) with eight doubles, two triples, three home runs and 18 RBI over his last 18 games dating back to April 28. He is second among all American League players with a .394 batting average during that stretch, while he is tied for second with 13 extra-base hits, is fifth with a .712 slugging percentage and tied for sixth with 18 RBI.

BOESCH PROVIDES EXTRA-BASE POP: Brennan Boesch has collected 14 extra-base hits in his first 21 games with the Tigers. He has collected at least one extra-base hit in 11 of the 21 games, becoming the first Tigers player since at least 1920 to collect at least one extra-base hit in 11 of his first 21 career games.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Tigers have collected at least one extra-base hit in 37 of the club's 40 games this season. Detroit is third among all American League clubs with 130 extra-base hits this season. Additionally, the Tigers are second in the league with 92 doubles.

LOOKING AT THE ROOKIE LEADERS: Austin Jackson and Brennan Boesch have both enjoyed success during their rookie campaigns. Jackson is tops among all American League rookies with 29 runs scored and 55 hits, while he is second with a .331 batting average. Boesch is leading all league rookies with a .372 batting average and 19 RBI, while he is second with 29 hits and three home runs.

BULLISH BEHAVIOR: Through the club's first 40 games this season, Tigers relievers have compiled an 11-4 record and 2.49 ERA (134.0IP/37ER). Tigers relievers lead the American League a 2.49 ERA, while the club is tied for the lead with 11 victories and is second with 134.0 innings pitched.

CABRERA IN A GROOVE WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Miguel Cabrera enters today's game versus the Athletics hitting .435 (20x46) with runners in scoring position. He is third among all American League players with a .435 batting average with runners in scoring position this season.

INJURY UPDATE: OF Carlos Guillen (left hamstring strain, 15-day DL on April 23), RHP Zach Miner (right elbow tendinitis, 15-day DL on March 26), LHP Bobby Seay (left shoulder strain, 60-day DL on March 26).

BOOK ON BONDO: In his eighth season with the Tigers, Bonderman makes his seventh start of the 2010 season this afternoon against the Athletics.

RETURNING TO THE ROTATION: Bonderman returns to the Tigers starting rotation as he missed much of the last year and a half as he continued rehabilitation from thoracic outlet compression syndrome surgery.

FINE WORK IN MAY: Bonderman has compiled a 1.93 ERA (14.0IP/3ER) and 12 strikeouts in three outings (two starts) during May.

QUALITY WORK IN OAKLAND: Bonderman is making his fifth career start in Oakland this afternoon. He has recorded a quality start in three of his previous four outings in Oakland.

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: Entering his start this afternoon, righthanded batters are hitting .203 (13x64) versus Bonderman in 2010. Lefties are batting .300 (21x70) against him this season.

FIRST TIME THROUGH: Bonderman has limited opponents to a .130 batting average (7x54) the first time through the lineup this season. Opponents are hitting .338 (27x80) against him over the remainder of the game.

MOVING UP THE LIST: Bonderman enters his start this afternoon with 846 strikeouts during his career for the Tigers, 18th-most in franchise history. He is five strikeouts shy of tying Milt Wilcox for 17th place all-time in club history with 851 strikeouts.

RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: Bonderman is making the fifth start of his career at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this afternoon. In his previous four outings, he is 2-1 with a 2.89 ERA (28.0IP/9ER).

FANNING BATTERS WITH THE BEST OF THEM IN FRANCHISE HISTORY: During his major league career with the Tigers, Bonderman has averaged 7.32 strikeouts per nine innings pitched. Among all pitchers in franchise history with at least as many innings pitched as Bonderman, he is second in club history, just behind John Hiller's 7.51 strikeouts per nine innings during Hiller's 15-year career with the Tigers.

IT HAPPENED, BUT IT DIDN'T HAPPEN: Bonderman started on May 7 at Cleveland, allowing six runs on seven hits in 2.1 innings of work. The game was halted due to rain after four innings with the Tigers leading 7-6 and eventually postponed after a two hour and 12 minute rain delay. Since the game was not official, none of the statistics accumulated count.

SUSPENSION SERVED: Jeremy Bonderman served his three-game suspension over the course of Detroit's first three games of the 2010 season, a suspension he received late in the 2009 season. He was ejected after hitting Minnesota's Delmon Young in the ninth inning on October 1.

BONDERMAN'S SURGERY: Bonderman underwent successful surgery to correct thoracic outlet compression syndrome on June 30, 2008, a procedure performed by Dr. Greg Pearl in Dallas, TX. The procedure included a first rib resection and veinous bypass.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Bonderman was acquired by the Tigers on August 22, 2002, as the player to be named along with Carlos Pena and Franklyn German from Oakland, in exchange for Jeff Weaver on July 6, 2002. He became the first player to ever be selected after his junior year of high school when he was selected in the first round of the June 2001 draft by Oakland.
