ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Prior to last night's 5-1 loss to the Orioles, Oakland had swept a three-game weekend series from San Francisco to move to a game over .500 for the first time since May 13... have spent 34 days over .500 this year after logging just one day over .500 last year (2-1, April 8)... now at 23-23, have been perched at the .500 mark nine times and under .500 eight times...the sweep of the Giants was the A's first three-game sweep of the season...swept a two-game set from Seattle to start the last homestand and were swept a in two-game series by Detroit in between...since enduring a season high five-game losing streak May 12-16, have won five of their last eight games, including three of their last four...are in second place in the American League West for the 14th consecutive day and trail Texas by three games...have 22 days alone in first this year, six days tied for first, 21 days in second, one day tied for second and one day in fourth...this series began a stretch of 20 games in 20 days for the A's, their longest stretch of games without a day off this year.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS: The A's pitching staff tossed back-to-back three-hit shutouts in the final two games of the San Francisco series...it was the first time the A's had back-to-back shutouts since June 9-10, 2007, also against San Francisco...A's pitchers extended their scoreless streak to 25 innings before Ross allowed two Orioles runs on a pair of sac-flies last night...the 25 scoreless innings were the most by Oakland pitchers since May 31-June 2, 2006 when they also reeled off 25 shutout frames...the last time A's pitchers exceeded that total was April 6-9, 2006 when they spliced together 27 scoreless innings...Gonzalez and Bailey combined on Saturday's shutout while Sheets, Wuertz, Blevins, Ziegler and Bailey did it on Sunday...it was the 13th five-pitcher shutout in Oakland history, the first since June 14, 2008 in a 4-0 win over San Francisco (Harden, Ziegler, Embree, Foulke, Street)...the A's yielded just one run in the three-game series against San Francisco, matching the Oakland record for fewest runs allowed in a three-game series...it was the sixth time it happened but it has occurred just one other time since 1992 (September 14-16, 2009 at Texas)...the A's now have an American League leading six shutouts for the season...in the majors, only San Diego (9) has more.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have gone seven consecutive games without a home run, their longest drought in 27 years...the last time the A's went more than seven consecutive games without a home run was September 14-24, 1983, when they had a nine-game homerless streak...have just 25 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and second to Houston in the majors...the A's and Astros are the only ML teams that have not hit more than two home runs in a game this year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 5-2 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-0), Detroit (0-2) and San Francisco (3-0) and have won 12 of their last 17 home games...with this Orioles series, begin a 10-game road trip against Baltimore (three games), Detroit (four games) and Boston (three games)...the trip matches the A's longest of the season (August 24-September 2)...have lost 13 of the last 15 road games and have been outscored 96-36 in those 15 games...are 18-9 (.667) at home and 5-14 (.263) on the road...are tied for the third best home record in the AL but have the second worst road mark to Baltimore (6-19)...the pitching staff has a 2.79 ERA (76 er in 245.0 ip) at home and a 5.63 ERA (103 er in 164.2 ip) on the road...**have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the highest road ERA**...have allowed 13 home runs in 27 games at home and 30 home runs in 18 contests on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and have the most on the road...starting pitchers are 13-7 with a 2.74 ERA (50 er in 164.1 ip) at home and 4-9 with a 5.54 ERA (62 er in 100.2 ip) on the road...the A's offense is batting .268 (234 for 872) at home compared to .230 (153 for 665) on the road...own the AL's sixth best home batting average and the league's lowest road batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 12-6 (.667) in day games, which is the third best record in the American League...have an 11-17 (.393) record at night, which is fifth worst in the AL...the pitching staff has a 2.61 ERA (47 er in 162.1 ip) during the day compared to 4.80 (132 er in 247.1 ip) at night...the A's day ERA is the lowest in the AL while the night ERA is fourth highest...five of the A's six shutouts have come during the day.

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to two runs or fewer in nine of the last 17 games and have scored 48 runs total over that span (2.8 per game)...have 175 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...have been shutout three times, which is tied for third most in the AL...had six sacrifice flies in seven games on the last homestand and lead the AL with 18 for the season...tied for second with 16 sacrifice hits...have the second lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.360), tied for second fewest extra base hits (109), the fourth fewest walks (139) and the fourth most strikeouts (332)...have reached base on an error an AL leading 19 times.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Pennington's throwing error in the fourth inning last night snapped an A's streak of six consecutive games without an error, matching the longest errorless streak of the season (April 20-25)...have 28 errors for the season, which is tied for seventh fewest in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed six runs over the last four games (5 er in 35.0 ip, 1.29 ERA) after yielding 35 over the previous six contests (5.77 ERA)...now have a 3.93 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents batting average (.246) and have hit the fewest batters (7)...A's starting pitchers have gone 3-6 despite a 3.27 ERA (30 er in 82.2 ip) since Dallas Braden pitched his perfect game May 9...the A's are tied for fourth in the American League in complete games (2) but starters have the third fewest innings pitched (265.0).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-2 in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...went 15-23 in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the American League...are 3-1 in extra inning games, matching the A's extra inning win total from last year...were 3-10 (.231) in extra innings last year, the worst mark in Oakland history...have four walk-off wins after tallying just five in all of 2009.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's used the disabled list for the 13th time when they added Eric Chavez on Saturday...have now used the DL 77 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at seven (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Meloan, Outman)...have had at least five players on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lead the season series 3-2 after winning three of four in Oakland in April and losing last night in Baltimore...have won 13 of their last 16 games against the Orioles...have won 16 of the last 20 games at Camden Yards...have won five consecutive series...won the season series last year, 5-1...swept a three-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Baltimore...have not lost the season series to the Orioles since 1998 and are 68-30 (694) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season...that is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by any American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 235-236 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 117-124 in Oakland and 118-112 in Baltimore, including 51-38 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 971-916 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded the 34th save of his career Sunday, tying him with Paul Lindblad for 10th on the Oakland career list...has a 1.02 ERA, which ranks fourth lowest among American League relievers this year.

Daric Barton had his sixth sacrifice hit of the season Sunday, which is one more than Orlando Cabrera's and Adam Kennedy's team leading total of five from all last year.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1954**, Gus Zernial hits the last grand slam in Philadelphia A's history in a 6-5 win over Boston...in **1975**, Gene Tenace has five RBI including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 11th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Baltimore...in **1989**, Todd Burns, Rick Honeycutt and Eric Plunk combine to shutout the Yankees on one hit in a 4-0 victory at New York.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and are 18-17 (.514) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in two of his five starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 30 and is 2-2 with a 3.68 ERA in five starts with the A's...allowed eight runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings in his first start but is 2-1 with a 2.22 ERA (6 er in 24.1 ip) and .227 (20 for 88) opponents batting average in four starts since then...began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a stress reaction in his left scapula...made one rehab start for Triple-A Sacramento on April 19 and was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento the next day...it was his first career stint on the DL...went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before his promotion to Oakland.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs in four starts this year after setting an Oakland rookie record by allowing 27 home runs last year...it tied the franchise record set by Dan Pfister in 1962...tied for sixth in the American League in home runs allowed last year...three of the five home runs he has allowed this year have been hit by a right-handed hitter after yielding 21 of his 27 home runs last year to lefties...his 21 homers vs. lefties last year tied for the most in the AL (Guthrie, BAL) and were the most by an A's pitcher since Catfish Hunter allowed an Oakland record 26 in 1973...two of his five home runs this year are solo shots as were 20 of his 27 home runs last year...all five of his home runs this year have come on the road after he surrendered 20 of his 27 home runs last year at home...that led the AL and set a Coliseum record, breaking the mark of 19 by Hunter in 1973.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-2 loss at Toronto April 30...allowed a career high tying eight runs (also July 3, 2009 at Cleveland)...yielded three home runs, including a three-run home run to Gonzalez in the second, a two-run home run to Wells in the fifth and a leadoff home run to Gonzalez in the sixth...also allowed a two-run single to Buck in the fourth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Texas May 5 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on four hits and three walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead entering the sixth...Young reached base on a Kouzmanoff error to start the sixth and after Hamilton singled, Cahill was relieved by Ross...Guerrero then had a RBI single for an unearned run.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 13-inning win in Texas on May 11...allowed a RBI single to Young in the third and a solo home run to Murphy in the fourth...the A's scored twice in the fifth to tie the game and he was relieved by Blevins after 5.2 innings with the score tied at 2-2.

FOURTH START: Was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles May 16...allowed a RBI single to Matsui in the second and two-run home run to Abreu in the sixth but those were the only three runs he would allowing in seven innings...Pineiro tossed a complete game shutout, limiting the A's to four hits and a walk.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over San Francisco last Friday in Oakland...blanked the Giants on four hits and a walk over the first six innings and had a 4-0 lead entering the seventh inning...retired the first two batters before allowing a Bowker single and a Torres RBI double...was relieved by Ziegler after the double.

CAHILL vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 14 h, 5 r, 5 er, 0 bb, 9 so) in two career appearances, both starts last year...the win came in the A's 9-4 decision in Oakland on June 6...shutout the Orioles on four hits and no walks over the first six innings and allowed just two runners into scoring position...had a 9-0 lead entering the seventh inning and allowed back-to-back singles to Scott and Huff to start the inning...was relieved by Ziegler who allowed both of the runs to score...then took the loss in a 3-2 decision at Baltimore on August 11...allowed a run in the second inning on a RBI groundout by Mora, but the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to take a 2-1 lead...he then allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth on a RBI single by Roberts and a RBI groundout by Jones.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (8.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 8 so) and .226 (7 for 31) opponents batting average in two starts with Sacramento...his opponents average included a .200 (2 for 10) mark against left-handed pitching and .238 (5 for 21) against right-handers...opponents were 1 for 12 (.083) with runners in scoring position.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-1 with a 5.95 ERA (19.2 ip, 22 h, 13 r, 13 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in six games, four starts...allowed a .289 (22 for 76) opponents batting average...started in each of his first four outings and went 1-1 with a 4.16 ERA...his last two outings came in relief and he allowed seven runs in 6.2 innings for a 9.45 ERA...walked two batters or fewer in all six of his outings.

2009 RECAP: Was one of two 21-year olds to spend the season in the A's starting rotation and led the Oakland pitching staff in starts (32), innings pitched (178.2) and losses (13)...was 10-13 with a 4.63 ERA...led Major League rookies in games started...ranked second among American League Rookies in innings pitched, tied for seventh in wins and ninth in strikeouts (90)...the games started fell one short of the Oakland rookie record of 33 set by Joe Blanton in 2005 and he is one of eight rookie 10-game winners in Oakland history...his 13 losses were fourth most by an Oakland rookie...is one of four 21-year olds in Oakland history to win 10 or more games and his 32 starts were fourth most in Athletics history by a pitcher under the age of 22...fellow 21-year old Brett Anderson had 11 wins in 30 starts, making the A's the 13th team since 1900 to have two pitchers under the age of 22 win 10 or more games (last: Kansas City, 1984 with Mark Gubicza and Bret Saberhagen) and the fourth with 30 or more starts (last: Chicago-AL, 1980).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-3, 3.46 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season... has tossed at least seven innings in four of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer five times...has received zero runs of support in each of his three losses this year ...in his last start, combined with Bailey on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over San Francisco Saturday in Oakland ... tossed a career high 8.0 innings and allowed two hits while walking one, retiring the final 20 Giants he faced...in his only career appearance vs. Baltimore, he beat the Orioles, 9-1, at Camden Yards Aug. 10, 2009...scattered seven hits and walked one in 6.0 scoreless innings in that game.... the contest was delayed by rain for 52 minutes and when it resumed he was relieved by Breslow.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

7-7, 4.17 ERA (144.2 ip, 140 h, 71 r, 67 er, 58 bb, 120 so, 18 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 9/13 (69.2%)

The A's bullpen has recorded the saves in its last two wins (Saturday and Sunday) but has just nine saves for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...has just 13 save opportunities, which is tied for second fewest, but has the fourth best save percentage (69.2%)...the pen has allowed 32 runs in its last 13 games (31 er in 45.2 ip, 6.11 ERA) and now has a 4.90 ERA (49 er in 90.0 ip) over its last 26 games after posting a 2.96 ERA over its first 18 contests...ranks third in the AL in innings pitched (144.2) and fourth in strikeouts (120)...has a 2.90 ERA (26 er in 80.2 ip) at home and a 5.77 ERA (41 er in 64.0 ip) on the road.

- Has not allowed a run in his last four outings (4.2 ip) after yielding his only runs of the season in back-to-back outings at Texas May 11-13 (2 er in 1.1 ip)...now has a 1.02 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth lowest among American League relievers...has not allowed a run in 38 of his 41 outings since July 31, 2009 (4 er in 41.0 ip, 0.99 ERA).
- Recorded the 34th save of his career on Sunday, which ties Paul Lindblad for 10th on the Oakland career list (Caudill is 9th, 37).
- Has yielded a .143 (4 for 28) average against left-handed hitters and .235 (8 for 34) against right-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in 13 games at home this year (13.0 ip) and has a 3.86 ERA (2 er in 4.2 ip) in five outings on the road (2 er in 4.2 ip)...has not allowed a run in his last 18 appearances (18.0 ip) in Oakland dating back to September 5 of last year.
- Picked up the save in his only outing against Baltimore this year on April 16 (1.0 ip, 1 h)...has not allowed a run and has converted all three of his save opportunities in four career outings against the Orioles (4.1 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 4 so).
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).

- Struck out the only batter he faced Sunday after facing four batters over his previous two outings and allowed four hits...opponents were 7 for their last 7 with sacrifice hit prior to Sunday.
- Has allowed five runs over his last four games (1.0 ip, 7 h, 5, r, 5 er, 2 so) after yielding just three runs over his previous 12 games and 11.0 innings (2.45 ERA).
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .222 (6 for 27) batting average and has a .361 (13 for 36) mark against right-handers...has also yielded both of his home runs and issued five of his six walks in righties and has 10 of his 16 strikeouts against lefties.

- Began the 2009 season at Triple-A Sacramento but was promoted to Oakland July 31 following the Orlando Cabrera trade...started 60 of the A's final 61 games at shortstop and hit .279 with seven stolen bases in 60 games...hit .264 with 27 steals in 99 games with the River Cats.
