A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lead the season series 4-2 after winning three of four in Oakland in April and splitting the first two here in Baltimore...have won 14 of their last 17 games against the Orioles...have won 17 of the last 21 games at Camden Yards...have won five consecutive series...won the season series last year, 5-1...swept a three-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Baltimore...have not lost the season series to the Orioles since 1998 and are 69-30 (.697) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season...that is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by any American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 236-236 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 117-124 in Oakland and 119-112 in Baltimore, including 52-38 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 972-916 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded the 34th save of his career Sunday, tying him with Paul Lindblad for 10th on the Oakland career list...has a 1.02 ERA, which ranks fourth lowest among American League relievers this year.

Daric Barton had his seventh sacrifice hit of the season last night, which is two more than Orlando Cabrera's and Adam Kennedy's team leading total of five from all last year.

Rajai Davis' career-high three stolen bases last night boosted him into a tie for the major league lead in stolen bases with 18 (Pierre, CWS).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1984**, Rickey Henderson is 3 for 3 with three stolen bases in the A's 7-1 win over New York...in **1985**, Dwayne Murphy leads off the bottom of the 10th inning with a home run to lift the A's to a 2-1 win over the New York Yankees.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Since enduring a season high five-game losing streak May 12-16, Oakland has won six of its last nine games, including four of its last five contests...last weekend's three-game sweep of San Francisco propelled them to a game over .500 for the first time since May 13... now at 24-23, have spent 35 days over .500 this year after logging just one day over .500 last year (2-1, April 8)... also have been perched exactly at the .500 mark nine times and under .500 eight times...are in second place in the American League West for the 15th consecutive day and trail Texas by two games...have 22 days alone in first this year, six days tied for first, 22 days in second, one day tied for second and one day in fourth...this road trip starts a stretch of 20 games in 20 days for the A's, their longest stretch of games without a day off this year.

THE LONG BALL: Rosales' three-run homer in the first inning last night halted a streak of seven consecutive games without a home run, their longest drought in 27 years...the last time the A's went more than seven consecutive games without a home run was September 14-24, 1983, when they had a nine-game homerless streak...still have just 26 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and second to Houston in the majors...the A's and Astros are the only ML teams that have not hit more than two home runs in a game this year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 5-2 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-0), Detroit (0-2) and San Francisco (3-0) and have won 12 of their last 17 home games...with this Orioles series, begin a 10-game road trip against Baltimore (three games), Detroit (four games) and Boston (three games)...the trip matches the A's longest of the season (August 24-September 2)...have lost 13 of the last 16 road games and have been outscored 97-42 in those 16 games...are 18-9 (.667) at home and 6-14 (.300) on the road...are tied for the third best home record in the AL but have the third worst road mark...the pitching staff has a 2.79 ERA (76 er in 245.0 ip) at home and a 5.39 ERA (104 er in 173.2 ip) on the road...**have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the second highest road ERA**...have allowed 13 home runs in 27 games at home and 32 home runs in 20 contests on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and have the most on the road...starting pitchers are 13-7 with a 2.74 ERA (50 er in 164.1 ip) at home and 5-9 with a 5.32 ERA (63 er in 106.2 ip) on the road...the A's offense is batting .268 (234 for 872) at home compared to .234 (164 for 701) on the road...own the AL's sixth best home batting average and the league's third lowest road batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 12-6 (.667) in day games, which is tied for third best record in the American League...have an 12-17 (.414) record at night, which is sixth worst in the AL...the pitching staff has a 2.61 ERA (47 er in 162.1 ip) during the day compared to 4.67 (133 er in 256.1 ip) at night...the A's day ERA is the lowest in the AL while the night ERA is fifth highest...five of the A's six shutouts have come during the day.

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to two runs or fewer in nine of the last 18 games and have scored 54 runs total over that span (3.0 per game)...have 181 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...have been shutout three times, which is tied for third most in the AL...had six sacrifice flies in seven games on the last homestand and lead the AL with 18 for the season...also rank second with 17 sacrifice hits...have the second lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.361), tied for second fewest extra base hits (111), the fourth fewest walks (142) and the fourth most strikeouts (338)...have reached base on an error 19 times, which is tied for the AL lead.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Pennington's throwing error in the fourth inning Tuesday night snapped an A's streak of six consecutive games without an error, matching the longest errorless streak of the season (April 20-25)...have 28 errors for the season, which is tied for sixth fewest in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed seven runs over the last five games (6 er in 44.0 ip, 1.23 ERA) after yielding 35 over the previous six contests (5.77 ERA)...now have a 3.87 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents batting average (.243) and have hit the fewest batters (7)...A's starting pitchers have gone 4-6 despite a 3.15 ERA (31 er in 88.2 ip) since Dallas Braden pitched his perfect game May 9...the A's are tied for fourth in the American League in complete games (2) but starters are tied for the second fewest innings pitched (271.0).

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS: The A's pitching staff tossed back-to-back three-hit shutouts in the final two games of the San Francisco series last weekend...it was the first time the A's had back-to-back shutouts since June 9-10, 2007, also against San Francisco...A's pitchers extended their scoreless streak to 25 innings before Ross allowed two Orioles runs on a pair of sac-flies Tuesday night...Gonzalez and Bailey combined on Saturday's shutout while Sheets, Wuertz, Blevins, Ziegler and Bailey did it on Sunday...it was the 13th five-pitcher shutout in Oakland history, the first since June 14, 2008 in a 4-0 win over San Francisco (Harden, Ziegler, Embree, Foulke, Street)...the A's yielded just one run in the three-game series against San Francisco, matching the Oakland record for fewest runs allowed in a three-game series...it was the sixth time it happened but it has occurred just one other time since 1992 (September 14-16, 2009 at Texas)...the A's now have an American League leading six shutouts for the season...in the majors, only San Diego (9) has more.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-2 in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...went 15-23 in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the American League...are 3-1 in extra inning games, matching the A's extra inning win total from last year...were 3-10 (.231) in extra innings last year, the worst mark in Oakland history...have four walk-off wins after tallying just five in all of 2009.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's used the disabled list for the 14th time when they added Coco Crisp (intercostal strain) yesterday...have now used the DL 78 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at eight (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Cust, Devine, Duchscherer, Meloan, Outman)...have had at least five players on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of 2006, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...the A's are 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments this year and are 16-17 (.485) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in four of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his fifth win of the season in his last start, which is one short of his career high of six from last year...is tied for fifth in the American League in wins (5)...also ranks third in opponents slugging percentage (.290) and fourth in opponents batting average (.205).

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 3-2 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) and .179 (21 for 117) in five starts in May after going 2-1 with a 3.68 ERA and .241 opponents average in four starts in the month of April...last year, he went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts in August and 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA in four starts in September after posting an ERA over 7.00 in each of the first five months of his career...is now 9-8 with a 4.09 ERA (52 er in 114.1 ip) over the last 20 starts of his career after going 3-6 with a 7.52 ERA over his first 19 career appearances, including 13 starts.

DAYS REST: Is 3-1 with a 2.64 ERA (9 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts on four days rest this year and 2-2 with a 4.50 ERA (12 er in 24.0 ip) in his other four starts.

WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 46 batters in 54.2 innings this year, an average of 7.57 per nine innings...however, has issued 24 walks (3.95 per nine innings)...now has 189 strikeouts and 105 walks in 187.1 career innings for an average of 9.09 strikeouts and 5.04 walks per nine innings.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received zero runs of support in each of his three losses this year but has run support of eight or more three times...has now received no run support in each of his five losses dating back to last year...has six career starts with no run support and is 2-13 in 17 career starts with run support of two runs or less...is 10-1 in 16 starts with three runs of support or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .164 (9 for 55) batting average to hitters leading off an inning, which ranks fifth lowest in the American League...has yielded a .167 (10 for 60) batting average against left-handed hitters and .221 (31 for 140) against right-handers...has issued 20 of his 24 walks to right-handed hitters but has allowed two of his three home runs to lefties...the opponents number three hitter is batting .190 (4 for 21) off him, which is the 12th lowest mark in the AL...has a .225 (20 for 89) opponents batting average over his first 45 pitches in a game, .158 (15 for 95) from pitches 46-90 and .375 (6 for 16) after that...has a .157 (21 for 134) opponents batting average with the bases empty and .303 (20 for 66) with runners on base.

START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) on **April 9**...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Matsui in the bottom of the second...also yielded a RBI single to Izturis in the fifth and was relieved by Ramirez after allowing a leadoff double to River in the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle **April 14**...allowed six hits and walked four in 4.2 innings but allowed just two runs...the runs came on a two-run single by Bradley in the fifth inning, tying the game at two...was relieved by Gaudin with two outs in the fifth and he allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the loss...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to New York **April 20**...allowed three runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Posada and a two-run single by Swisher but then retired 11 of the next 12 batters before walking Johnson and Teixeira with one out in the fifth...was relieved by Breslow with the A's trailing 3-0 and Breslow allowed a three-run home run to the first batter he faced, Rodriguez...combined with Kilby and Bailey on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 11-0 win over Cleveland **April 25** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed five of the hits while walking two...all five hits and two walks came over the first four innings and he retired each of the last 10 batters that he faced...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-3 win at Toronto **May 1**...retired each of the first nine batters he faced, giving him a streak of 19 consecutive batters retired...allowed a lead off single to Lewis in the fourth inning and he scored on a fielders choice...was relieved by Ross with a runner on first and two outs in the seventh and Ross allowed the inherited runner to score...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Tampa Bay **May 7** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just three runs but Price shutout the A's on two hits over the first seven innings...allowed a RBI single to Aybar in the fourth and a two-run double to Rodriguez in the seventh...lost his second consecutive start in a 10-1 A's loss at Texas **May 12**...blanked the Rangers on four hits over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth on a Kinsler RBI double and a balk...yielded a two-run home run to Hamilton with no outs in the fifth and was relieved by Gaudin with the A's trailing 4-0...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win over Seattle **May 17**...allowed a RBI single to Lopez in the first but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first, three in the second and two more in the third...also yielded a solo home run to Tuiasosopo in the fourth and a Lopez RBI single in the sixth.

LAST START: He combined with Bailey on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over San Francisco last Saturday in Oakland...tossed a career high 8.0 innings and allowed two hits while walking one...allowed a two-out single to Sanchez in the first and a one-out walk to Huff followed by a Torres single in the second...then **retired each of the final 20 batters he faced** before he was relieved by Bailey to start the ninth.

GONZALEZ vs. BALTIMORE: Was the winning pitcher in his only career start, a 9-1 A's win at Baltimore on August 10, 2009...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, scattered seven hits and walked just one...the biggest threat came in the seventh inning when Mora singled and Wieters doubled to start the inning...the game was delayed by rain for 52 minutes and when it resumed he was relieved by Breslow who retired the next three batters to end the inning.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-2 with a 2.96 ERA (24.1 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 8 er, 13 bb, 25 so, 2 hr) in six games, five starts...tied for third in the Cactus League with his 25 strikeouts...held the opposition to a .175 (14 for 96) batting average but issued 13 walks in 24.1 innings...pitched in relief of Brett Anderson in his first appearance March 8 but his final five outings were starts...compiled a 2.42 ERA in his starts and allowed two runs or fewer in each outing.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Ben Sheets (2-3, 5.04 ERA): Is scheduled to make his American League leading 11th start of the season...has posted a 1-0 mark with a 2.52 ERA (25.0 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 7 er, 12 bb, 29 so, 1 hr) and .193 (17 for 88) opponents batting average over his last four starts...that comes after a two-game stretch where he allowed eight runs on April 27 at Tampa Bay and nine on May 2 at Toronto to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least eight runs in back-to-back starts... his season run support of 3.09 (19 rs in 55.1 ip) is fifth lowest in the American League... in his last start, combined with Wuertz, Blevins, Ziegler and Bailey on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over San Francisco last Sunday... however, ended up with a no decision as he tossed six innings but left with the score tied at 0-0... is 1-0 with a 4.26 ERA (12.2 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 11 so) in two career starts vs. Tigers, both in Detroit... was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 Milwaukee win on June 14, 2007... had a 4-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Sheffield and an Ordonez RBI single...had a no decision in the Brewers' 6-5 loss on June 9, 2001.

Save/Save Opportunities: 9/13 (69.2%)

The A's bullpen last recorded saves in its last two home wins (Saturday and Sunday) but has just nine saves for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...has just 13 save opportunities, which is tied for second fewest, but has the fourth best save percentage (69.2%)...the pen has allowed 32 runs in its last 14 games (31 er in 48.2 ip, 5.73 ERA) and now has a 4.74 ERA (49 er in 93.0 ip) over its last 27 games after posting a 2.96 ERA over its first 18 contests...tied for third in the AL in innings pitched (147.2) and strikeouts (124)...has a 2.90 ERA (26 er in 80.2 ip) at home and a 5.51 ERA (41 er in 67.0 ip) on the road.

- Has not allowed a run in his last four outings (4.2 ip) after yielding his only runs of the season in back-to-back outings at Texas May 11-13 (2 er in 1.1 ip)...now has a 1.02 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth lowest among American League relievers...has not allowed a run in 38 of his 41 outings since July 31, 2009 (4 er in 41.0 ip, 0.99 ERA).
- Recorded the 34th save of his career on Sunday, which ties Paul Lindblad for 10th on the Oakland career list (Caudill is 9th, 37).
- Has yielded a .143 (4 for 28) average against left-handed hitters and .235 (8 for 34) against right-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in 13 games at home this year (13.0 ip) and has a 3.86 ERA (2 er in 4.2 ip) in five outings on the road (2 er in 4.2 ip)...has not allowed a run in his last 18 appearances (18.0 ip) in Oakland dating back to September 5 of last year.
- Picked up the save in his only outing against Baltimore this year on April 16 (1.0 ip, 1 h)...has not allowed a run and has converted all three of his save opportunities in four career outings against the Orioles (4.1 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 4 so).
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).

- Tied his career high for strikeouts with four last night in 2.0 shutout frames, allowing only an infield single in facing seven batters...also fanned four in a relief appearance against Texas in Oakland Sept. 24, 2009.
- Has flung 2.1 scoreless innings over his last two appearances, striking out five of the eight batters he's faced...prior to those two games, he had allowed four straight hits over his previous two outings...opponents were 7 for their last 7 with a sacrifice hit prior to Sunday.
