ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won three of their first four games to start the road trip, including stirring late-game heroics in victories over Baltimore (7-5) and Detroit (5-4) the past two nights....have also won three straight, six of the last seven, and eight of the last 11 after a season high five-game losing streak...are now three games over .500 for the first time since May 11...are a ½ game behind Texas in the American League West, which is the closest the A's have been to first since they were tied for the lead with the Rangers on May 11...have spent each of the last 17 days in second...have 22 days alone in first this year, six days tied for first, 24 days in second, one day tied for second and one day in fourth...have spent 37 days over .500 this year after logging just one day over .500 last year (2-1, April 8)...have been perched at exactly .500 nine times and under .500 eight times...are 14-11 in the month of May with three games remaining...have posted a winning record in the second month of the season just once over the previous five seasons (14-13 in 2007)...this road trip starts a stretch of 20 games in 20 days for the A's, their longest stretch of games without a day off this year...it also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 26 games on the road...swept a three-game series from San Francisco last weekend, the A's first three-game sweep of the season.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this 10-game road trip against Baltimore (2-1), Detroit (1-0, four games) and Boston (three games)...the trip matches the A's longest of the season (August 24-September 2)...have lost 13 of the last 18 road games and have been outscored 106-54 in those 18 games...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-0), Detroit (0-2) and San Francisco (3-0) and have won 12 of their last 17 home games...are 18-9 (.667) at home and 8-14 (.364) on the road...are tied for the second best home record in the American League and have the third worst road record...the pitching staff has a 2.79 ERA (76 er in 245.0 ip) at home and a 5.31 ERA (113 er in 191.2 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the second highest road ERA...have allowed 13 home runs in 27 games at home and 35 home runs in 22 contests on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and have the most on the road...starting pitchers are 13-7 with a 2.74 ERA (50 er in 164.1 ip) at home and 5-9 with a 5.17 ERA (69 er in 120.0 ip) on the road...the A's offense is batting .268 (234 for 872) at home compared to .241 (186 for 771) on the road...have the fifth best home batting average in the AL and the sixth lowest road batting mark.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's continue to work their magic in close games, as evidenced by last night's 5-4 win over the Tigers...are now 9-2 in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...went 15-23 in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the American League...Oakland trailed 5-2 entering the eighth inning Thursday night in Baltimore and scored five times to win 7-5...it marked the first time this year the A's overcame a deficit of three or more runs and won...are 3-1 in extra inning games, matching the A's extra inning win total from last year...were 3-1 (.231) in extra innings last year, the worst mark in Oakland history...have four walk-off wins after tallying just five in all of 2009.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 16 runs over the last seven games (15 er in 62.0 ip, 2.18 ERA) after yielding 35 over the previous six contests (5.77 ERA)...now have a 3.90 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents batting average (.243) and have hit the fewest batters (8)...lead the AL with six shutouts after tossing back-to-back three-hit shutouts in the final two games of the San Francisco series...it was the first time the A's had back-to-back shutouts since June 9-10, 2007, also against San Francisco...had a 23-inning scoreless streak from May 21 to 25, which was the A's longest since a 25-inning streak from May 31-June 2.

STARTING PITCHING: Ben Sheets (last night) and Gio Gonzalez (Thursday) both allowed three runs, snapping a five-game streak where A's starters allowed one run or less...that was the longest such streak since July 24-28, 2003 when the A's also had a five-game streak...A's starters are now 3-0 with a 1.64 ERA (8 er in 44.0 ip) over the last seven games and are 4-6 despite a 3.26 ERA (37 er in 102.0 ip) since Dallas Braden pitched his perfect game on May 9...have a 3.77 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...are tied for fourth in complete games (2) but have the fourth fewest innings pitched (284.1).

OFFENSE: Despite not recording a single strikeout Thursday night (at Baltimore) for the first time this season, A's batters have fanned 343 times, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...have been held to two runs or fewer in nine of the last 20 games and have scored 69 runs total over that span (3.45 per game)...have 193 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL...have been shutout three times, which is tied for third most in the AL...tied for first in the AL in sacrifice flies (19) and rank second in sacrifice hits (18)...A's leadoff hitters are batting .237 (49 for 207) with 17 walks, owning the lowest on-base percentage (.292) and third lowest batting average in the American League.

EXTRA BASE HITS: Adam Rosales' three-run homer in the first inning Wednesday night in Baltimore halted a streak of seven consecutive games without a home run, the A's longest drought in 27 years...it was the A's longest homerless streak since September 14-24, 1983, when they had a nine-game homerless streak...have 28 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Houston, 25)...the A's and Astros are the only ML teams that have not hit more than two home runs in a game this year...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.365) and the third fewest extra base hits (117).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Cliff Pennington's throwing error in the fourth inning Tuesday night snapped an A's streak of six consecutive games without an error, matching the longest errorless streak of the season (April 20-25)...have one error in the last 10 games and 28 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's used the disabled list for the 14th time when they added Coco Crisp (intercostal strain) on Wednesday...have now used the DL 78 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at eight (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Crisp, Devine, Duchscherer, Meloan, Outman)...have had at least five players on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS

The A's and Tigers meet for the second and final time in 2010 with this four-game set...the A's trail the series, 1-2, having been swept 2-0 in Oakland last week but winning the opener here...the A's will complete the season series with Detroit before playing a single game against Boston, Chicago, Kansas City or Minnesota...the A's lost the season series last year, 4-5...went 4-2 in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Detroit...it was just the A's second series loss in the previous nine seasons...Oakland is 49-29 (.628) against the Tigers since 2001...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 229-222 against the Tigers...that includes 128-97 in Oakland, 99-123 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 23-17 at Comerica Park...all-time, the A's are 897-975 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded the 36th save of his career last night, which moves him within one save of ninth place (Bill Caudill, 37) on the Oakland career saves list...has a 1.37 ERA, which ranks fourth lowest among American League relievers this year.

Daric Barton had his eighth sacrifice hit of the season last night, which is the most by an Athletic before the All-Star Break since Mark Ellis had nine in 2003. It also ties him for the AL lead this year.

Rajai Davis' career-high three stolen bases Wednesday gives him 18 this season, second most in the majors (Pierre, CWS, 19).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1909**, Frank Baker hits the first home run at Shibe Park...in **1990**, Rickey Henderson breaks Ty Cobb's American League stolen base record with his 893rd career steal in a 2-1 A's loss to Toronto...in **2000**, Randy Velarde turns the 10th regular season unassisted triple play in major league history but the A's lose at New York, 4-1.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and 35th of his career...the A's are 1-3 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and are 15-19 (.441) in his career starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in three of his four starts this year, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer in all four starts.

DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 27 retroactive to April 25 with a left elbow inflammation and proximal medial forearm strain...it was his first career stint on the disabled list...made one rehab start with Triple-A Sacramento Monday against Nashville and had a no decision in the River Cats 8-3 win (3.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hbp)...tossed 57 pitches, including 35 strikes.

FIRST 13, LAST 21: Was 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs allowed over the first 13 starts of his career through June 20 of last year...is 9-5 with a 2.85 ERA (41 er in 129.1 ip), .236 (114 for 484) opponents batting average and seven home runs in his 21 starts since June 29, 2009...had a 2.96 ERA from June 29 through the end of the 2009 season, which was fourth best in the AL behind Lester (2.35), Greinke (2.37) and Hernandez (2.44).

SEASON-OPENING SCORELESS STREAK: Allowed three runs in the third inning April 18, snapping his season-opening scoreless streak at 14.0 innings...that was the third longest season-opening streak by a starter in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough set the record with a 16.0 inning streak in 1980...did not allow a run in his first two starts to become the first starting pitcher in Oakland history, among pitchers who began the season with the A's, to start the season with two consecutive scoreless outings...Vin Mazzaro (2009) and Ron Darling (1991) did not allow a run in their first two starts in their respective seasons, but they did not start the year with the A's...the last A's pitcher to do it was Alex Kellner of the 1953 Philadelphia A's, who started the season with back-to-back complete game shutouts and a 21.0 inning scoreless streak.

FIRST WILD PITCH: Was charged with the first wild pitch of his career in the sixth inning April 13 at Seattle, snapping a career-opening streak of 31 starts and 186.1 innings without a wild pitch...the streak of 31 consecutive starts without a wild pitch was sixth longest in Oakland history by a starter...it was the longest since Barry Zito had a streak of 38 starts from July 2, 2002 to July 13, 2003...did not have a wild pitch last year and his 175.1 innings were the most in the majors among pitchers with no wild pitches...they were third most in Oakland history behind Catfish Hunter (234.0 ip in 1968) and Steve McCatty (185.2 ip in 1981).

LONG-TERM CONTRACT: Agreed to terms on a four-year contract through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015 on April 16...the 2015 season would be Anderson's first possible season in which he would be eligible for free agency.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Seattle April 8 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 shutout innings, scattering three hits and a walk...retired 10 consecutive batters before allowing a Figgins single and a Gutierrez walk to start the seventh inning...was relieved by Chad Gaudin who retired the next three batters...the bullpen allowed two runs in the ninth.

SECOND START: He did not allow a run for the second consecutive start but had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed six hits and two walks...the Mariners were 0 for 6 with four strikeouts with runners in scoring position off him as he stranded nine base runners in his six innings.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Baltimore April 18...retired each of the first eight batters he faced before the Orioles scored three times with two outs in the third inning on a two-run double by Wigginton and a RBI single by Markakis...also allowed a RBI single to Montanez in the fourth and a two-run double to Reimold in the fifth and left after six innings, trailing 6-2.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-1 loss to Cleveland on April 24 in Oakland...shutout the Indians on one hit and one walk over the first five innings before allowing his only run in the sixth inning on a Choo RBI single...Carmona limited the A's to a run in 7.1 innings and Anderson left after six innings with the score tied at 1-1...the bullpen then allowed two runs in the eighth and three in the ninth for the loss.

ANDERSON vs. DETROIT: Is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (8.2 ip, 10 h, 10 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts last years...the loss came on May 15 at Detroit, in a 14-1 A's loss...allowed a career high nine runs in a career low 3.1 innings but only three of the runs were earned...was charged with five unearned runs in the first inning after errors by Giambi and Crosby...allowed a RBI single to Ordonez and a Raburn grand slam...allowed two more runs in the third inning on an error and a fielders choice, and two in the fourth, one of which scored on a Cabrera RBI double...picked up the win in a 7-1 victory on June 29 in Oakland...blanked the Tigers on four hits and two walks over the first five innings and the A's scored twice in the fourth and three times in the fifth to give him a 5-0 lead...walked Thames, struck out Raburn and walked Inge to start the sixth inning and was relieved by Wuertz...Wuertz allowed one of the inherited runners to score.

THIS SPRING: Was 0-1 with a 4.42 ERA (18.1 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in five games, all starts...allowed a .254 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...did not allow a run in three of his five starts...also pitched in a simulated game against minor leaguers March 23.

2009 RECAP: Was one of two 21-year olds to spend the season in the A's starting rotation...set an Oakland rookie record with 150 strikeouts...led the A's pitching staff in strikeouts and wins (11) and finished second in starts (30)...compiled an 11-11 record and 4.06 ERA...led all Major League rookies in strikeouts...tied for third among American League rookies in games started, ranked fourth in innings pitched (175.1) and tied for fourth in wins...had one of five shutouts by an AL rookie and one of 11 complete games...his strikeouts broke the previous Oakland rookie record of 141 set by Rick Langford in 1977...fell one short of the Oakland rookie record of 12 wins set by Chris Codioli in 1983 and matched by Joe Blanton in 2005...became the eighth Oakland rookie to make 30 or more starts...is one of four 21-year olds in Oakland history to win 10 or more games and his 30 starts tied for fifth most in Athletics history by a pitcher under the age of 22...fellow 21-year old Trevor Cahill had 10 wins in 32 starts, making the A's the 13th team since 1900 to have two pitchers under the age of 22 win 10 or more games (last: Kansas City, 1984, with Mark Gubicza and Bret Saberhagen) and the fourth with 30 or more starts (last: Chicago-AL, 1980).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Dallas Braden (4-4, 3.23 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season ... has tossed seven or more innings in five of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked one batter or fewer eight times ... is 1-3 despite a 2.38 ERA (9 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts in May after going 3-1 with a 4.20 ERA in five starts in April ... pitched the 19th perfect game in Major League history on Mother's Day, May 9, against Tampa Bay ... had a no decision in his last start, an A's 5-1 loss at Baltimore Tuesday... tossed just 4.0 innings as he left the game early with a sprained left ankle, suffered in mid-May... is 2-3 with a 6.63 ERA (36.2 ip, 45 h, 27 r, 27 er, 10 bb, 19 so, 5 hr) in seven career starts vs. Detroit.

9-7, 4.14 ERA (152.1 ip, 147 h, 74 r, 70 er, 62 bb, 127 so, 19 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 11/15 (73.3%)

The A's bullpen has converted 11 of 15 (73.3%) save opportunities...has the third fewest save opportunities in the American League and is tied for the fourth fewest saves, but ranks third best in save percentage...the pen has allowed seven runs in the first four games of the road trip (7 er in 11.2 ip, 5.40 ERA) and now has a 5.53 ERA (44 er in 71.2 ip) on the road compared to a 2.90 ERA (26 er in 80.2 ip) at home...has a 4.80 ERA (51 er in 95.2 ip) over its last 26 games after posting a 2.96 ERA over its first 18 contests...ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (150.1), third in strikeouts (127) and tied for third in wins (8).

- Cabrera's leadoff HR in the ninth last night snapped a five-game scoreless string for him, but he still slammed the lid on his 10th save...prior to the homer, he had not allowed a run in his last 5.2 innings and five outings...other than last night, the only runs of the season he had yielded were in back-to-back outings at Texas May 11-13 (2 er in 1.1 ip).
- Now has a 1.37 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth lowest among American League relievers...has not allowed a run in 39 of his 43 outings since July 31, 2009 (5 er in 32.0 ip, 1.41 ERA).
- Recorded the 36th save of his career last night, which moves him within one save of ninth place (Bill Caudill, 37) on the Oakland career saves list.
- Last night was his first outing vs. Detroit this year...had a win and did not allow a run in three outings against Detroit last year (3.0 ip, 3 h, 6 so).
- Has not allowed a run in 13 games at home this year (13.0 ip) and has a 4.05 ERA (3 er in 6.2 ip) in seven outings on the road...has not allowed a run in his last 18 appearances (18.0 ip) in Oakland dating back to September 5 of last year.
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).

- Tied his career high for strikeouts with four Wednesday night in 2.0 shutout frames, allowing only an infield single in facing seven batters...also fanned four in a relief appearance against Texas in Oakland Sept. 24, 2009.
- Has flung 2.1 scoreless innings over his last two appearances, striking out five of the eight batters he's faced...prior to those two games, he had allowed four straight hits over his previous two outings...opponents were 7 for their last 7 with a sacrifice hit prior to May 23.
- Has allowed five runs over his last five games (3.0 ip, 8 h, 5, r, 5 er, 6 so, 15.00 ERA) after yielding just three runs over his previous 12 games and 11.0 innings (2.45 ERA).
