Duensing/Gonzalez Come-from-behind wins: 9 highest winning percentage in the American League behind Matsuzaka (.703),

Lester (.698) and Cl. Lee (.969)...additionally, his 31 wins are tied for fifth-most for a right-handed pitcher since 2008.

THE VALENCIA FILE: Infielder Danny Valencia, who made his Major League debut last night, was originally drafted by the Twins in the 19th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Miami...following the 2009 season, he was ranked as the sixth-best prospect in the Twins organization by Baseball America.

NEED TO SCORE MORE THAN ONE: The Twins have been held to just one run in each of the last three games against the Mariners...the last time the Twins were held to one run or fewer in three consecutive games was August 5-7, 2007 (first two games vs. Cleveland, third game at Kansas City)...it also marks the first time in history the Mariners have held the Twins to one run or fewer in three straight games.

THIRD BASE PERFECTION - PUNTO PERFECT EVERYWHERE: The Twins are the only team in baseball with 1.000 fielding percentage from their third basemen...in 54 games this season, Nick Punto (86), Brendan Harris (48), Danny Valencia (5), Luke Hughes (4), Alexi Casilla (3) and Matt Tolbert (2) have combined to have 148 total chances without committing an error at third base...in addition to his 86 total chances at third base, Punto has played two games at second base and one game at short stop and has yet to commit an error (12 total chances).

MORE ON MR. DEFENSE: In games since 2006, Nick Punto has committed just 16 errors in 612 chances at third base... in fact, among third basemen with at least 600 total chances only Eric Chavez has committed fewer errors (12)...over the five season span, Punto has posted a .974 fielding percentage at third base.

MORNEAU SEEING DOUBLE: Justin Morneau recorded his 19th double Wednesday night vs. Seattle...it was the 209th double of his career, which currently puts him in ninth place on the Twins All-Time doubles list...Morneau's next double will tie Chuck Knoblauch for eighth on the list with 210 career doubles as a member of the Twins.

LEFTY OUT OF THE PEN: Brian Duensing has appeared in 21 games and has allowed just 14 hits...among all left handed relievers, Duensing's .189 batting-average-against ranks as the ninth best (14-for-74)...left handed batters are just 4-for-35 (.114) vs. Duensing...Duensing has retired 18 of 19 first batters faced.

ALL-TIME THOME: Jim Thome has 1,582 career runs batted in...he currently ranks 38th on the All-Time list...he is looking to pass Hall of Famers, Al Kaline (1,583), Harmon Killebrew and Rogers Hornsby (1,584).

FOUR STRIKEOUTS IN ONE INNING: Seattle starter Felix Hernandez struck out Denard Span, Matt Tolbert, Joe Mauer (reached first on a wild pitch) and Justin Morneau in the eighth inning of last night's game...it marked the first time in Twins history they have struck out four times in one inning.

**TWINS TO HOLD OPEN TRYOUTS:** The Minnesota Twins announced that they will hold a two-day open tryout at the Metrodome, June 21-22. Registration is set to begin at 9:00 a.m. (CST) near Gate D on Monday, June 21st (parking will be available). Only players that are eligible to sign a professional contract may participate. To be eligible players must

be a high school graduate, junior in college or at least 21 years of age. All players will be invited to take part in drills, skills tests and fundamental evaluations on day one (June 21) while only select players will be invited back for day two...Notable Twins signings from years past are right handed pitcher Charley Walters who signed in 1966 and made his Twins debut in 1969 and right handed pitcher Gary Serum, who signed in 1975 and debuted with the Twins in 1977...in addition to the two-day camp in Minneapolis, 9 ERA )2 ERA the Twins will host a one-day camp at Hammond Stadium in Fort Myers, FL on June 12, registration is 38 ERA set for 9:00 am (EST).

LAST START: Was the winner in the Twins' 6-3 victory, May 30 vs. Texas opposite lefty Derek Holland...started the final game of a three-game series against Texas at Target Field, leading the Twins to their 30th win of the season (30-20)...beat the Rangers for the third straight time (since 2009)...walked three, one of them scored...relieved by Burnett to start the seventh...threw 97 pitches, 65 strikes.

TWO STARTS AGO...: Did not factor in the decision in the Twins' 1-0 defeat, May 25 vs. New York (AL) opposite A.J. Burnett...started the first game of a three-game series with the Yankees...game was called official and postponed with a 0-0 tie after five innings, due to rain...just four batters reached base, with only one of them reaching as far as second base...two of his four baserunners were doubled-off with a GIDP...Baker threw 50 pitches, 34 strikes...play resumed at 4:00 the next day (May 26)...Brian Duensing relieved Baker and gave up a solo home run to Derek Jeter in the sixth, proving to be the only run of the game.

**EVERYTHING'S GREAT SINCE '08:** Since the start of 2008, Baker's .646 winning percentage is the fourthhighest winning percentage in the American League behind Matsuzaka (.703), Lester (.698) and Cl. Lee (.969)...his 31 wins are tied for fifth-most for a right-handed pitcher since then.

**EVOLUTION OF AN ACE:** He entered the 2010 season with the fifth-highest career winning percentage (minimum of 70 decisions) in Twins history, behind Santana (.679), Pascual (.607), Grant (.588) and Perry (.587)... overall, he ranks 15th All-Time in strikeouts (next, Kyle Lohse - 561), 19th in starts (next, Carlos Silva - 124), tied for 17th in wins (next, Allan Anderson - 49), and 21st in innings pitched (next, Carlos Silva - 773.2).

**ROAD WORK:** Is 26-20, 4.48 (357.2 ip, 178 er) in 62 career road games (60 starts)...he is just 1-3, 5.86 (27.2 ip, 18 er) in five road starts this season...he has dropped each of his last two road decisions with his last win away from Target Field coming on April 10 at Chicago (AL)...he is 10-4 in his last 14 road decisions, dating back to June 9, 2009 at Oakland.

**FACING THE A'S:** Is making his fifth career start against Oakland...he has won each of his four starts and all three at Oakland-Alameda County Stadium...his last start was on June 9, 2009 at Oakland, allowing three runs on four hits in 8.0 innings pitched with 10 strikeouts and one walk...he has held A's batters to a .220 (20-for-91) batting average with no home runs, four walks and 18 strikeouts.

» His last loss against an American League West opponent was April 5 at Los Angeles (AL)...his last loss prior to that was August 26, 2008 at Seattle.

TAKE IT OUTSIDE: He has a career record of 30-18 in 64 career games (63 starts) on grass and a record of 18-19 in 58 career games (57 starts) on turf.

#### INSIDE THE NUMBERS:

- » Opponents are batting .258 off Baker the first time through the line-up, .270 the second time, .316 the third time and .500 the fourth time through.
- » Six of his seven home runs allowed have come between pitches 46-60.

- » Surpassed 700.0 career innings pitched in his start on May 14, 2010 at New York (AL).
- » He is 26-16, 4.13 (366.1 ip, 172 er) in 61 career starts vs. American League Central opponents.

   » He has allowed just three earned runs-or-less in 81 of his 120 career starts (68%) and has a 42-14

2009 QUICK HITS: Went 15-9, 4.37 (200.0 ip, 97 er) with 162 strikeouts and 48 walks in 33 starts...set career-highs in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts. » Went 7-7, 5.42 (101.1 ip, 61 er) in 17 starts before the break and 8-2, 3.28 (98.2 ip, 36 er) in 16 starts

- after the break...his eight wins Post-ASG was tied for fifth in the AL.
- » Started the season on the 15-day disabled list with shoulder stiffness after being tagged as the Opening Day starter, April 6 vs. Seattle...replaced with Francisco Liriano.
- $\, {\rm *}\,$  Set a career-high with 10 strikeouts June 4 vs. Cleveland.
- » Third career complete game and second career shutout, August 14 vs. Cleveland, allowing just two hits.
- » Set a new career-high, winning seven straight from July 12-September 5.
- » Started the tie-breaking 163rd game allowing three runs on six hits in 6.0 innings, giving up all three runs in the third inning, two on a Miguel Cabrera home run...relieved after walking his first batter in the seventh.
   » He led the twins staff in wins, was tied for firth in starts and was second in innings pitched.
- » Twins went 15-5 in his final 20 starts, 9-2 in his final 11, and 20-13 overall.
- » Finished in a tie for 10th in the American League in wins with Boston's Jon Lester...his 3.38 strikeoutsper-walk were seventh, his 33 starts tied him for fourth, his 162 strikeouts placed him 13th, his .625 win-percentage placed him 14th and his 200.0 innings tied him for 16th.

NO LOVE FOR LEFTIES: Baker finished 2009 with lefties batting .217, the fourth-lowest for a right-handed pitcher in all of baseball, behind Garza (.196), Lincecum (.209), and Gallardo (.213).
