**THE TWINS:** The Twins are 2-3 on the current road trip, after winning the first game in Seattle before dropping three straight to the Mariners, and winning last night in Oakland...tonight, the Twins play the second of a three game series vs. the A's... the Twins are 14-14 on the road this season...following the series in Oakland the Twins will have an off day Monday before hosting Kansas City (June 8-10), Atlanta (June 11-13) and Colorado (June 15-17) as part of a nine-game, 10-day homestand.

**TWINS WIN IN EXTRA INNINGS:** The Twins beat the A's 5-4 in 11 innings last night, after relinquishing a 4-1 lead...Scott Baker was the starter but did not factor in the decision, allowing four runs on six hits (two home runs), with one walk and three strikeouts in 7.1 innings...Jose Mijares (0.2 ip), Matt Guerrier (2.0 ip) and Jon Rauch (1.0 ip) held the A's scoreless through the final 3.2 innings...Guerrier recorded his first win of the season and Rauch converted his 14th save...Joe Mauer was 2-for-5 with two runs scored...Justin Morneau was 2-for-4 with a double, two-run homer and three runs scored...Jason Kubel drove in a run with a single in five at-bats... Delmon Young was 2-for-5 with a double and two rbi...the Twins were 3-for-11 with runners in scoring position.

**MORNEAU - EYE POPPING NUMBERS:** Justin Morneau has reached base a Major League high 113 times this year (Youkilis is second with 107)...additionally, his .483 on-base percentage and 1.174 OPS ranks as baseball's best, while his 123 total bases are the third-most in baseball...Morneau has reached safely in 49 of 53 games played...his .420 batting average on balls put in play (BABIP) ranks second in baseball...he also has 21 multi-hit games (six three-hit games).

**CANADIAN IN THE BAY:** Justin Morneau has hit safely in his last seven games against the A's in Oakland...during that stretch, he is batting .500 (14-for-28) with two doubles, five home runs and 12 rbi...he has hit 14 career home runs against the A's (eight in Oakland), the most against any team outside of the Central Division.

**MORNEAU SEEING DOUBLE:** Justin Morneau recorded his 20th double in last night's win...it was the 210th double of his career, which ties him with Chuck Knoblauch for eighth on the All-Time doubles list as a member of the Twins...Harmon Killebrew is seventh on that list with 232 doubles.

**MAUER AND THE MULTI-HIT GAME:** Joe Mauer went 2-5 last night, his first multi-hit game since May 22 vs. Milwaukee... the 11 game span between multi-hit games was tied for the second longest such streak in his career (last done, August 25-September 7, 2006)...the only one other time in his career that Mauer had a longer stretch between multi-hit games, was when he went 12 games from May 15-June 7, 2005, without recording two-or-more hits.

**THIRD BASE PERFECTION - PUNTO IS PERFECT:** The Twins are the only team in baseball with 1,000 fielding percentage from their third basemen...in 54 games this season, Nick Punto (86), Brendan Harris (48), Danny Valencia (8), Luke Hughes (4), Alex Casilla (3) and Matt Tolbert (2) have combined to have 153 total chances without committing an error at third base...in addition to his 86 total chances at third base, Nick Punto has played three games at second base and one game at short stop and has yet to commit an error (19 total chances).

**LEFTY OUT OF THE PEN:** Brian Duensing has appeared in 21 games and has allowed just 14 hits...among all left handed relievers with 20 or more appearances, Duensing's .189 batting-average-against ranks as the fifth best (14-for-74)...left handed batters are just 4-for-35 (.114) vs. Duensing...Duensing has retired 18 of 19 first batters faced.

**ALL-TIME THOME:** Jim Thome has 1,582 career runs batted in...he currently ranks 38th on the All-Time list...he is looking to pass Hall of Famers, Al Kaline (1,583), Harmon Killebrew and Rogers Hornsby (1,584).

**THE TWINS WAY - DEFENSE FIRST:** The Twins have committed just 14 errors all season - on pace for just 41 errors this season (next closest is the New York Yankees with 22)...in fact, their .993 fielding percentage is the best in baseball (13 errors in 2,075 total chances)...the Twins have yet to commit an error at third base this season and have committed just one at shortstop...the Twins have played 42 games this season without committing an error...additionally, the Twins have had just one game this season in which they committed more than one error (two errors, 5/29 vs. Texas)...since the start of the 2009 season the Twins have posted a .989 fielding percentage, also the best mark in baseball (just 90 errors in 218 games)...Minnesota is 7-6 when they commit an error and 25-17 when they do not.

#### TWINS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE MONTH - MAY:

New Britain outfielder (Eastern League, Double-A) **Ben Revere** is the Twins Minor League Player of the Month for May...Revere, 22, hit .336 (40-for-119) with six doubles, one home run, 15 rbi, 15 runs scored and 13 walks...he had an on-base percentage of .412 in 30 games...Revere was the Twins first round pick (28th overall) in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...New Britain (Eastern League) righthanded pitcher **Kyle Gibson** is the Twins Minor League Pitcher of the month for May...Gibson, 22, went 5-0 in six starts, while posting a 1.62 ERA (39.2 ip, 7 er) between Single-A Ft. Myers and New Britain...he struck out 31 while walking just 10 batters, and posting a 1.03 WHIP while holding the opponents to a .218 batting average...Gibson was the Twins first round pick (22nd overall) in the 2009 First-Year Player Draft.

**LAST START:** Was the winner in the Twins' 5-4 victory, May 31 at Seattle opposite Doug Fister, who led the AL in ERA at the time of the start (2.03)...twins supported Liriano with three home runs from Young (2-run) and back-to-back solo shots by Cuddyer and Kubel...tied his 2009 win total with his fifth victory...pitched his eighth quality start of the season, coming within two of his 2009 total of 10...relieved by Crain to start the seventh...threw 99 pitches, 65 strikes.

**TWO STARTS AGO...:** Did not factor into the decision in the Twins' 3-2 defeat, May 26 vs. New York (AL) opposite Andy Pettitte who pitched 8.0 strong innings...it was his first no-decision since his first start, April 9 at Chicago (AL)...held Yankee batters to a 2-for-15 clip with men on base...Guerrrier and Rauch relieved Liriano, while Rauch gave up a solo homer to Nick Swisher with two outs in the top of the ninth...Liriano threw 112 pitches, 73 strikes.

**APRIL ACE:** Liriano was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for April after posting a 3-0 record with just three earned runs allowed on 18 hits in 29.0 innings...he was the only AL pitcher with a sub-1.00 ERA in April...this was his first Pitcher of the Month honor.

**THE LATIN LEFTIES:** Had his 23.0 scoreless innings streak snapped in the first inning of his start on May 2...the streak spanned from the start of April 15 vs. Boston to May 2 at Cleveland...since 1993, only Johan Santana had posted a longer streak for the Twins, when he went 33.0 consecutive scoreless innings in 2004.

**FACIN' AGES:** In his last five starts, he has paired up against Seattle's Doug Fister, New York's Andy Pettitte (twice), Boston's Jon Lester and Baltimore's Jeremy Guthrie...they have combined to go 4-1, 2.63 (37.2 ip, 11 er) in those five starts opposite Liriano.

**THE ZERO HERO:** The Twins have shutout an opponent four times this season, Liriano started three of those games: April 15 vs. Boston, April 21 vs. Cleveland and April 27 at Detroit...the other shutout coming on May 9 vs. Baltimore when Nick Blackburn started.

**NO FLY ZONE:** Snapped his streak of 51.2 consecutive innings without allowing a home run in the second inning of his start, May 20 at Boston, when Adrian Beltre hit a solo home run...he later gave up a three-run shot to Kevin Youkilis the next inning...the Beltre home run was his first allowed since September 27, 2009 at Kansas City (Yuniesky Betancourt)...he is second in the American League in fewest home runs allowed behind Cliff Lee's one homer allowed (minimum 50.0 ip).

» Of his 21 home runs allowed last season, just one was hit by a left-handed batter: Ken Griffey Jr. on Opening Day, April 6 (also the last to do it)...he has allowed just four homers to lefties in his career: Jack Cust, Curtis Granderson, Travis Hafner and Griffey.

**FACING THE A'S:** Is making his seventh career start and ninth appearance...last faced Oakland in a relief appearance on September 11, 2009 at the Metrodome (2.0 scoreless inning) in a Twins 12-5 loss...last start was a no-decision on June 10, 2009 at the Coliseum, allowing three runs on five hits in 6.0 innings, in a Twins 6-3 defeat opposite Dallas Braden...last win was on August 20, 2008 at the Dome, allowing one run (none earned) on five hits in 5.0 innings opposite Dallas Braden again (Twins won 3-1)...overall, in his last four appearances (three starts), he has allowed four earned runs on 17 hits in 20.0 innings (1.80 ERA)...each of his last three starts, he has faced off against Dallas Braden.

**BROUGHT TO YOU BY THE LETTER "K":** Liriano has 432 strikeouts in 423.0 career innings (9.2 K/9.0 IP)...has struck out five-or-more batters 50 times in 87 career games (57%)...has a career-high of 12 strikeouts, accomplished twice in his career, last done July 28, 2006 vs. Detroit...he has struck out 10-plus batters five times in his career...he has struck out five-plus in eight of his 10 starts.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS:

- » With men on base, last season, opponents batted .322 (73-for-227), this season opponents are hitting .250 (28-for-112) in such instances.
- » In 2009, opponents batted .218 the first time through the order, .315 the second time through the order, .328 the third time, and .400 the fourth time...this season, they are hitting .259 the first time, .265 the second time, .260 the third time and .231 the fourth time.
- » In 2009, number two batters in opposing lineups had the highest batting average off Liriano at .349...number eight batters in opposing lineups had the lowest, batting at .200...this season, third-place hitters have the highest at .387 while number five batters have the lowest at .111 (3-for-27).

MISC. LIRIANO:

- » He has yet to walk a left-handed batter this season, facing a total of 50 lefties...just nine of those left-handed batters have reached base safely...the last lefty he walked was Alex Avila on September 30 at Detroit.
- » He has already cut his 2009 total of 10 quality starts in over half with eight...his career-high for quality starts in a season is 10 done in '09 and 2006.

**WINTER WARM-UP:** Liriano participated in the Dominican Winter League with Leones del Escogido...he started three games, posting an ERA of 1.54 (11.2 ip, 2 er) with eight hits, two walks, 17 strikeouts and an opponent batting average of .186.

**2009 QUICK HITS:** Went 5-13, 5.80 (136.2 ip, 88 er) with 122 strikeouts and 65 walks in 29 games (24 starts).

- » Was the Twins Opening Day starter on April 6 vs. Seattle, allowing four runs on four hits in 7.0 innings, suffering the loss...first career Opening Day start.
- » Was fourth in the American League among lefties in strikeouts before the All-Star break (93) and 10th in innings pitched (102.0).
- » Was placed on the 15-day disabled list, August 18 with left arm fatigue and reinstated, September 9.
- » His 13 losses tied him for second in the American League with four other pitchers.
- » Finished second in the American League in strikeouts-per-9.0 innings for a left-handed pitcher, behind Boston's Jon Lester (9.96).
