THE TWINS: The Twins are 3-3 on the current road trip, after winning the first game in Seattle before dropping three straight to the Mariners, and winning the first two games in Oakland...today, the Twins play the final of a three game series vs. the A's...the Twins are 15-14 on the road this season...following today's game, the Twins return home for an off day tomorrow, before hosting Kansas City (June 8-10), Atlanta (June 11-13) and Colorado (June 15-17) as part of a nine-game, 10-day homestand.

TOLBERT'S TIMELY HIT GIVES TWINS ANOTHER WIN: The Twins beat the A's 4-3 last night in Oakland...Francisco Liriano was the starter but did not factor in the decision, allowing one run on five hits, with two walks and 10 strikeouts in 7.0 innings...he left with a 3-1 lead, but the A's scored two runs off Jesse Crain in the eighth inning to tie the game...Matt Tolbert's rbi single with two outs in the ninth inning proved to be the difference...Alex Burnett (0.1 ip) recorded his first Major League win and Jon Rauch picked up his 15 save of the season...Delmon Young was 1-for-3 with three rbi...Tolbert, Joe Mauer, Jim Thome, Jason Kubel, Danny Valencia and Nick Punto each added a hit for the Twins, who went 2-for-7 with runners in scoring position.

TWINS MAKE ROSTER MOVE - NESHEK TO ROCHESTER: The Twins announced prior to last night's game in Oakland that they returned Pat Neshek from his rehab assignment, reinstated him from the 15-day disabled list and optioned him to Triple-A Rochester...Neshek had been on the disabled list since May 2 (retroactive to April 29) with inflammation in the middle finger on his right hand...in six appearances with the Twins this season, Neshek allowed two runs on two hits in 4.1 innings, with two walks and four strikeouts.

LOOKING FOR THE SWEEP: The Twins are looking for their third sweep of the 2010 season (this will be the ninth attempt)...both sweeps were three-game series at Target Field (Detroit - May 3-5 and Texas - May 28-30)...in 2009 the Twins completed nine sweeps...they swept a three-game series vs. the Los Angeles Angels, April 17-19, a three-game series vs. the Tigers, May 12-14, a three-game series vs. the Brewers, May 22-24, a sweep over the White Sox, July 27-29, a three-game sweep at Kansas City, August 21-23, a three-game sweep vs. Cleveland, September 14-16, a three-game series at Chicago, September 21-23 and a three-game series vs. the Royals, October 2-4...the Twins recorded a total of eight sweeps in 2008.

DELMON DOING HIS THING: Delmon Young has hit safely in eight of his last nine games with an at-bat, going 11-for-34 (.324) with four doubles, one home run and 11 rbi...with three rbi last night, he now has 32 on the season (through 49 games played)...Young did not record his 32nd rbi in 2009 until his 72nd game of the season (August 16 vs. Cleveland).

DELMON DELIVERS: Delmon Young's two-run single in the 6th inning came with the bases loaded...it was just the 13th hit with the bags full for the Twins this season (13-for-68)...their .191 batting average as a team with the bases loaded is the third worst in the Major Leagues, ahead of the Houston Astros (.154) and Toronto Blue Jays (.143).

BURNETT TURNS IT AROUND: Through his first nine appearance of his rookie season, reliever Alex Burnett was 0-1, 4.61 (13.2 ip, 7 er), allowing 13 hits with 10 walks and 15 strikeouts...opponents batted .260 (13-for-50) during that span...since May 11, he has not allowed a run in nine appearances (12.2 ip), allowing just eight hits with one walk and seven strikeouts, while holding opponents to a .186 (8-for-43) batting average...he picked up his first Major League win in last night's game.

SCORING MORE THAN YOUR OPPONENT: The Twins have scored 263 runs this season (11th in all of baseball), while allowing just 215 (sixth fewest in baseball)...with a run differential of +48, only the Tampa Bay Rays (+85), New York Yankees (+85) and Toronto (+50) have a higher number in the American League...the Tigers are the only other team in the American League Central with a positive run differential (+7).

LORD OF THE FLIES: The Twins have already recorded 21 sacrifice flies this season, the second most in the Major Leagues this season (Dodgers and Mets have 24)...in fact since the start of the 2008 season, the Twins have recorded 150 sac flies, the most in baseball (next closest - Boston with 128).

STRUGGLES AT THE TOP: Through seven games on the current road trip, the Twins 1-2 hitters are a combined 3-for-50 (.060) with no runs scored, two walks and 12 strikeouts...their lone rbi came on Matt Tolbert's game-winning single in the ninth inning last night...Denard Span is 0-for-his-last-21, J.J. Hardy is 0-for-his-last-10 and Matt Tolbert snapped an 0-for-10 with his hit last night.

ALL-TIME THOME: Jim Thome has 1,582 career runs batted in...he currently ranks 38th on the All-Time list...he is looking to pass Hall of Famers, Al Kaline (1,583), Harmon Killebrew and Rogers Hornsby (1,584).

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Rochester (International League) catcher Wilson Ramos is the Twins Minor League Player of the Week for May 29-June 4...in six games with the Red Wings last week, Ramos batted .500 (11-for-22) with two walks, four doubles, three rbi and five runs scored, with a .542 on-base percentage...in 35 games at Triple-A this season, Ramos is batting .229 (32-for-140) with seven doubles, four home runs and 15 rbi.

LAST START: Was the loser in the Twins' 7-1 defeat, June 1 at Seattle, opposite lefty Jason Vargas...snapped his career-high five-game win-streak, losing for the first time since his second start of the season, April 11 at Chicago (AL)...of his five runs allowed, four came in the fourth inning, highlighted by a Jose Lopez two-run homer...relieved by Burnett in the fourth, who retired the final batter of the inning...Blackburn threw 80 pitches, 53 strikes.

TWO STARTS AGO...: Was the winner in the Twins' 8-2 victory, May 27 vs. the Yankees opposite Javier Vazquez... Blackburn recorded his second win against the New York Yankees this season, allowing two earned runs in 7.0 innings pitched...he did not allow a walk and recorded two strikeouts...relieved by Mijares...threw 92 pitches, 57 strikes.

WHAT AN A-MAY-ZING MONTH: Blackburn finished the month of May going 5-0, 2.65 (37.1 ip, 11 er) with one complete game in five starts...he went 7.0-plus in each start during the month...he is one of four pitchers in baseball to win five games without a loss, joining Jon Lester, Shaun Marcum and Carlos Silva.

GOT YOUR BACK: The Twins have a record of 8-2 in Blackburn's 10 starts...the two losses coming on April 11 at Chicago (AL) and June 1 at Seattle...the Twins are 12-2 in Blackburn's last 14 games started, dating back to September 16, 2009.

TWIN KILLINGS: He has induced 12 ground ball double plays this season, the second-most in the American League to Andy Pettitte (13)...he has induced at least one in each start...since the start of 2008, he is tied for third in the American League in GIDP's with Felix Hernandez at 57, behind Mark Buehrle (70), Joe Saunders (62).

FEELING MINNESOTA: Blackburn is 19-7, 3.53 (226.2 ip, 89 er) in 38 career games (35 starts) at home...last season he went 7-4 in 16 Dome starts...he has won his last four starts at Target Field, posting a 2.37 ERA (30.1 ip, 8 er) during that span.

ROAD WOES: He is 2-2, 6.44 (29.1 ip, 21 er) in five road start this season, dropping his last on June 1 at Seattle while winning his previous road start, May 16 at New York (AL)...for his career, he is 9-19, 4.85 (248.2 ip, 134 er), with three of those nine wins coming in his last five decisions, dating back to September 21, 2009 at Chicago (AL).

SOMETHING'S GOTTA GIVE: Is making his sixth career start and appearance against the A's...his last start was a loss on September 11, 2009 at the Metrodome, allowing six runs on six hits in 3.0 innings in a Twins 12-5 loss opposite Clayton Mortensen...his start prior to that, was July 20, 2009 at Oakland opposite Gio Gonzalez when the Twins scored 13 runs behind Blackburn but managed to lose 14-13...he has pitched 8.0 innings in two of those previous five starts...the Twins are 0-5 against Oakland when Blackburn starts.

THE STREAKER: He set a new career-high for a win-streak on May 27, after beating Detroit, Baltimore, Milwaukee and New York (AL) twice, all in May...his previous high for a win-streak was four from May 21-June 18, 2009, beating the White Sox, Red Sox, Rays and Pirates in six starts, posting an ERA of 1.64 (44.0 ip, 8 er) during the stretch.

THEFT PROTECTION: According to Elias Sports Bureau, Blackburn has gone 92.0 innings without allowing a stolen base...the last time a runner was credited with a stolen base was Rajai Davis, September 2009.

200-CLUB: In 2009, Blackburn surpassed the 200.0 innings pitched mark for the first time in his career after finishing the season with 205.2 innings...Minnesota had not had a pitcher with over 200.0 innings pitched since Johan Santana (219.0) and Carlos Silva (202.0) both did it in 2007...Scott Baker accomplished the feat last season as well with 200.0 innings pitched...since the start of 2008, Blackburn ranks 12th in the American League with 460.0 innings pitched.

2009 QUICK HITS: Went 11-11, 4.03 (205.2 ip, 92 er) in 33 starts...led the Twins staff in innings pitched and tied for first in starts.

- » Went 8-4, 3.06 (123.1, 42 er) with three complete games in 18 first-half starts.
- » Tossed his first career complete game June 18 vs. Pittsburgh and followed it up with two more complete games in his next three starts.
- » Won a career-high four straight games from May 28 through June 18...also struck out a career-high seven May 26 vs. Boston.
- » Tossed the seventh-most innings in the AL (13th most in the Majors) before the break with 123.1 ip.
- » Finished third in the American League in fewest walks-per-9.0 ip with 1.79...behind Halladay (1.32) and Pavano (1.32).
- » His 240 hits allowed led the AL and his three complete games tied him for fifth.

COMPLETELY DOMINANT: Blackburn tossed back-to-back complete games June 18 and June 24 of last season, the first time a Twins pitcher has recorded back-to-back CG's since Brad Radke did it tossing 9.0 innings on June 9, 1998 against the Cubs earning a win, then coming back in his next start, June 15 with 8.0 innings in a loss against Detroit.
