ANGELS BRIEFING: Since May 14th, the Angels lead the A.L. with a 16-7 record (Angels were 15-21 thru May 13th)...Halos have won five straight games to match a season-high and eight of last nine contests to move to a season-best three games over .500...Angels have won six of last eight series (won four of first 11 series)...Tonight the Angels play the eighth game (6-1) of a season-long 14-game, 14-day road trip to Kansas City (3-1), Seattle (3-0), Oakland (June 7-10) and Los Angeles (June 11-13)...Angels will fly the most air miles in 2010 (50,509), while the Chicago White Sox will fly the fewest (22,832)...2010 marks the Angels' 50th season.

BOOM STICKS: The Angels have at least four extra-base hits in eight of last nine games and have totaled 44 extra-base hits, 15 home runs and 100 hits in the nine-game span (.526 slugging pct.)...Halos have scored 139 runs over last 23 games (6 per game).

ROAD LOAD: The Halos are in the midst of a season-long 14-day, 14-game road trip, the club's longest trip since a 14-gamer in 2002 (6/14-27)...Through the first seven games of the trip, the Angels have outscored opponents 49-20...Halos batted .330 (38/115) in three-game sweep at Seattle...Angels are 9-3 in last 12 road games (2-10 in previous 12 on road).

JUNE JUMP: Halos are 5-1 to open the month and 22-10 in last two seasons in June (17-9 in 2009)...Below is a comparison of May vs. June this season (thru first six games of month).

PICK ME UP: Angels are 7-1 since Kendry Morales' injury on May 29th batting .310 (92/297) with 58 runs, 25 doubles and 13 home runs in the span.

WHO'S HOT: Torii Hunter is batting .417 (10/24) this month with six runs, two home runs and 10 RBI...He has 32 RBI his last 32 games with an at-bat and ranks 2nd in A.L. since April 28th with 32 RBI...Hideki Matsui is tied for 2nd in A.L. batting .522 (12/23) this month and has a 1.477 OPS (4th in A.L.)...21 of Mike Napoli's last 34 hits have been for extra-bases, 3rd most EBH in MLB since 4/29...Ervin Santana is tied for the MLB lead with a 5-0 record since May 15th...His 1.80 ERA (35 IP - 7 ER in the span ranks 4th in the A.L)...Francisco Rodriguez has retired 21 of the first 25 batters he has faced in his career...He has nine strikeouts and zero walks in 7.1 IP.

FRONT LINE FACT... During the five-game win streak, Halos starters are a combined 5-0 with a 2.05 ERA (30.2 IP - 7 ER).

@ OAKLAND: Halos visit Oakland for first time this season after posting an 8-1 record at the Coliseum in 2009...The club has won five straight at Oakland, outscoring the A's, 26-12 in those contests...Angels are 8-2 in last 10 games vs. A's and 4-2 this season...Angels have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003 (8-12)...Of the last 81 games between the teams, 43 have been decided by two runs-or-fewer, including 25 one-run decisions.

HOWIE RECOGNIZED: MLB Network named Howie Kendrick's two-home run day, including his three-run walk-off home run (May 30 vs. Seattle) as the #1 offensive play and #3 overall play of the week for the week of May 30-June 5.

GETTING STARTED: Since inflating to a 5.23 ERA on May 6th, Angels' starting pitchers have fashioned a 3.67 ERA (174 IP - 71 ER) ERA over the last 29 games...Starters have allowed three earned runs or less in 27 of last 39 games...In those 27 games, starters have a 1.79 ERA (185.2 IP - 37 ER)...Halos lead the A.L. with five complete games.

HIT OR MISS: In the Halos' 31 victories, the club has hit .307 (88/287) with RISP...In the 28 losses, Angels are 38 for 191 (.199).

BULLPEN BITS: Angel relievers currently 13th in the A.L. with a 4.84 ERA...From 2000-2009, the bullpen had the best ERA in the A.L. (3.71) and 2nd best in MLB in the decade (LAD - 3.63).

JEKYLL AND HYDE:

- In Angels' 31 wins, starters have a 2.15 ERA (209 IP - 50 ER) with 62 walks, 164 strikeouts, a .218 avg. against (167/767) and 14 HRs allowed.
- In Angels' 28 losses, starters have a 7.31 ERA (152.2 IP - 124 ER) with 66 walks, 108 strikeouts, a .326 average against (207/634) and 30 HRs allowed.

THIS N' THAT: Halos are tied for MLB lead with six walk-off wins...Angels have held a lead at some point in 13 of 28 losses...Angels have used 43 different lineups in 59 games...Angels pitchers have walked 232 batters to lead the A.L.
