ANGELS BRIEFING: Halos snapped six-game win streak last night, falling to second place behind the Texas Rangers (club has spent just four days in first place this season)...**Since May 14th, the Angels lead the A.L. with a 17-8 record (Halos were 15-21 thru May 13th)...Halos have won eight of last 10 contests...Angels have won six of last eight series (won four of first 11 series)**...Tonight the Angels play the 10th game (7-1) of a season-long 14-game, 14-day road trip to Kansas City (3-1), Seattle (3-0), Oakland (1-1) and Los Angeles (June 11-13)... **Angels will fly the most air miles in 2010 (50,509), while the Chicago White Sox will fly the fewest (22,832)...2010 marks the Angels' 50th season.**

BOOM STICKS: The Angels have *at least* four extra-base hits in eight of last 11 games and have totaled 48 extra-base hits, 16 home runs and 114 hits in the 11-game span...Halos have scored 144 runs over last 25 games (5.7 per game).

ROAD LOAD: The Halos are in the midst of a season-long 14-day, 14-game road trip, the club's longest trip since a 14-gamer in 2002 (6/14-27)...**Through the first nine games of the trip, the Angels have outscored opponents 54-32...Angels are 10-4 in last 14 road games (4-10 in previous 14 on road).**

AWAY FROM HOME: The Angels are 7-2 on their current road trip...The last time the Halos won eight games in one road trip was June 22 to July 1, 1987 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Chicago, and Cleveland.

MORALES UPDATE: Angels first baseman Kendry Morales is scheduled to undergo surgery tomorrow on his fractured left leg...**Dr. Phil Kwong** will perform the procedure (Foot & Ankle Specialist with Kerlan-Jobe Clinic)...No timetable has been set for a rehab schedule or his return.

EL MAGIC: Tomorrow's starter, **Ervin Santana** owns a 1.50 ERA (114.1 IP – 19 ER) vs. the Athletics, the lowest ERA against Oakland among active pitchers, min. 12 starts (STATS LLC).

JUNE JUMP: Halos are 6-2 to open the month and 23-11 in last two seasons in June (17-9 in 2009)...**In fact, Angels' 56 wins in June since 2007 (56-29) are most in MLB (STATS LLC)**...Below is a comparison of May vs. June this season thru the first eight games of each month.

PICK ME UP: Angels are 8-2 since **Kendry Morales'** injury on May 29th batting .290 (106/365) with 62 runs, 26 doubles and 14 home runs in the span.

WHO'S HOT: **Torii Hunter** ranks T2nd in A.L. since April 28th with 32 RBI...**Hideki Matsui** is batting .419 (13/31) this month...21 of **Mike Napoli's** last 35 hits have been for extra-bases, 3rd most EBH in MLB since 4/29...**Ervin Santana** is tied for the MLB lead with a 5-0 record since May 15th... His 1.80 ERA (35 IP - 7 ER) in the span ranks 4th in the A.L...**Francisco Rodriguez** has retired 21 of the first 25 batters he has faced in his career...He has nine strikeouts and zero walks in 7.1 IP.

@ OAKLAND: Halos are visiting Oakland for first time this season after posting an 8-1 record at the Coliseum in 2009...**The club has won six of last seven at Oakland...Angels are 9-3 in last 12 games vs. A's and 5-3 this season...Angels have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003 (8-12)**...Of the last 83 games between the teams, 44 have been decided by two runs-or-fewer, including 25 one-run decisions...**In the Angels five victories over Oakland this season, they have outscored the A's 28-8...Conversely, in their three losses, they have been outscored 9-29**

NEWEST HALOS: Since joining the Angels this season, **Kevin Frandsen** and **Michael Ryan** have gone a combined 24-for-75 (.320)...Prior to their call ups, they owned a collective .250 (167/668) career average thru 301 games in the Majors.

GETTING STARTED: Since inflating to a 5.23 ERA on May 6th, **Angels' starting pitchers have fashioned a 3.77 ERA (186.1 IP - 78 ER) over the last 31 games**...Starters have allowed three earned runs or less in 28 of last 41 games...**In those 28 games, starters have a 1.78 ERA (192 IP – 38 ER)**...Halos lead the A.L. with five complete games.

HIT OR MISS: In the Halos' 32 victories, the club has hit .308 (90/292) with RISP...In the 29 losses, Angels are 38 for 196 (.194).

BULLPEN BITS: Angel relievers currently rank 13th in the A.L. with a 4.92 ERA...**From 2000-2009, the bullpen had the best ERA in the A.L. (3.71) and 2nd best in MLB in the decade (LAD - 3.63).**

JEKYLL AND HYDE:

- **In Angels' 32 wins**, starters have a **2.13 ERA** (215.1 IP – 51 ER) with 64 walks, 169 strikeouts, a .217 avg. against (172/792) and 15 HRs allowed.
- **In Angels' 29 losses**, starters have a **7.31 ERA** (158.2 IP – 130 ER) with 67 walks, 114 strikeouts, a .321 average against (213/664) and 31 HRs allowed.

THIS N' THAT: Halos are tied for MLB lead with six walk-off wins (Atlanta)...**Angels have held a lead at some point in 13 of 29 losses...Angels have used 44 different lineups in 61 games**...Angels pitchers have walked 233 batters to lead the A.L.

RHP ERVIN SANTANA: 6-3, 3.29 ERA...Has won five straight starts for first time since winning six straight to open '08 season (April 3 – May 5)...Since opening season 0-2, has posted a 6-1 record with a 2.69 ERA (70.1 IP – 21 ER)...Has allowed three earned runs-or-less in eight of last 10 starts...Has won seven of last eight decisions vs. Athletics...Is making 19th career appearance and 17th start vs. Athletics, second start of 2010...Is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (6 IP – 2 ER) in 2010...Was 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (16 IP – 3 ER) in 2009...Is 11-2 with a 1.50 ERA (114.1 IP – 19 ER) lifetime.

#53 BOBBY ABREU (OF) .190 vs. LHP, .303 vs. RHP

- In 7-for-35 skid this trip (.200) but has reached base safely in 30 of last 32 starts.
- Batting .315 (34/108) at home compared to .211 on road (26/123).
- Leads club with 32 walks and 36 runs scored (tied with Aybar)...Tied for team-lead with four outfield assists.
- Connected for 500th career double in first inning June 2nd at KC...Is fifth active player to reach the plateau (l. Rodriguez, M. Ramirez, G. Anderson and T. Helton).
- May 28th marked his 2,000th MLB game...His 1,914 career games in right field are most among actives.
- Since 2001, he has reached safely 2,594 times – 2nd most in span to Albert Pujols (credit STATS LLC).
- Angels are 78-43 over last two seasons when he bats third.
- Hit ninth career grand slam April 13 @ NYY...One of only 16 active players with at least nine grand slams.
- Logged 7th career "walk-off" hit with 2-out RBI single in 9th inning 5/26 vs. Toronto.
- IN 2009:** Batted .293 (165/563) with 96 runs, 29 doubles, 15 HR, 103 RBI and 30 stolen bases in 152 games with Angels...Reached 100 RBI for the 7th consecutive season - A. Rodriguez and A. Pujols are only other players in MLB with a streak of 100+ RBI over at least last seven campaigns.
- Became just the 5th player in history to have five different seasons with 100 RBI and 30 SB...He joined Honus Wagner, Hugh Duffy, Ty Cobb and Barry Bonds...Just second player Angels' history with at least 100 RBIs and 30 steals (Bobby Bonds had 115 RBIs and 41 steals in 1977).
- CAREER NOTES:** Two-time All-Star (2004 & 2005), Gold Glove recipient (2005) and Silver Slugger honoree (2004)...Has 20+ stolen bases in 11 consecutive seasons (1999-2009), the longest current streak in MLB...Has played 150 games for 12 straight seasons, only one of five players in history to have 12 or more consecutive 150-game seasons.
