ANGELS BRIEFING: The Angels have won seven of their last eight contests, outscoring their opposition 50-14 in those seven victories...Since May 14th, the Angels lead the A.L. with a 18-8 record (Halos were 15-21 thru May 13th)...<u>Halos have won nine of last 11 contests</u>...Angels have won six of last eight series (won four of first 11 series)...Today the Angels play the 11th game (8-2) of a season-long 14-game, 14-day road trip to Kansas City (3-1), Seattle (3-0), Oakland (2-1) and Los Angeles (June 11-13)...<u>Angels will fly the most air miles in 2010 (50,509), while the Chicago White Sox will fly the fewest (22,832)</u>...2010 marks the Angels' 50th season.

MO-JOE: Joe Saunders has tossed two complete games (one shutout) in his last six starts after posting just one shutout in previous 102 career starts...The Angels lead the A.L. with six complete games...Halos starters have tossed five complete games since May 16.

BOOM STICKS: The Angels have *at least* three extra-base hits in 10 of last 12 games and have totaled 50 extra-base hits, 17 home runs and 130 hits in the 12-game span...Halos have scored 151 runs over last 26 games (5.8 per game).

ROAD LOAD: The Halos are in the midst of a season-long 14-day, 14-game road trip, the club's longest trip since a 14-gamer in 2002 (6/14-27)...Through the first 11 games of the trip, the Angels have outscored opponents 61-33...Angels are 11-4 in last 15 road games (5-10 in previous 15 on road).

<u>ROLLIN' ON THE ROAD</u>: The Angels are 8-2 on their current road trip, matching the most road wins on a single trip since June 22 - July 1, 1987 when they went 8-1 at TEX, CHI, and CLE...The last time they won nine on a trip was April 12-26, 1984 when they went 9-5 at OAK, MINN, TOR, BOS and MIL.

<u>MORALES UPDATE:</u> Angels first baseman Kendry Morales is scheduled to undergo surgery on his fractured left leg today...Dr. Phil Kwong will perform the procedure (Foot & Ankle Specialist with Kerlan-Jobe Clinic)...No timetable has been set for a rehab schedule or his return.

EL MAGIC: Today's starter, Ervin Santana owns a 1.50 ERA (114.1 IP – 19 ER) vs. the Athletics, the lowest ERA against Oakland among active pitchers, min. 12 starts (STATS LLC).

JUNE JUMP: Halos are 7-2 to open the month and 24-11 in last two seasons in June (17-9 in 2009)...In fact, Angels' 57 wins in June since 2007 (56-29) are most in MLB (STATS LLC)...Below is a comparison of May vs. June this season thru the first nine games of each month.

PICK ME UP: Angels are 9-2 since Kendry Morales' injury on May 29th batting .300 (122/406) with 69 runs, 27 doubles and 15 home runs in the span.

WHO'S HOT: Torii Hunter ranks T2nd in A.L. since April 28th with 33 RBI...Hideki Matsui is batting .417 (15/36) this month...**Joe Saunders** has thrown two complete games in his last six starts and has allowed one earned run-or-less in five of his last seven outings...**Ervin Santana** is tied for the MLB lead with a 5-0 record since May 15th... His 1.80 ERA (35 IP - 7 ER) in the span ranks 4th in the A.L...**Francisco Rodriguez** has retired 21 of the first 25 batters he has faced in his career...He has nine strikeouts and zero walks in 7.1 IP.

@ OAKLAND: Halos are visiting Oakland for first time this season after posting an 8-1 record at the Coliseum in 2009...<u>The club has won seven of last eight at Oakland</u>...Angels are 10-3 in last 13 games vs. A's and 6-3 this season...**Angels have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003 (8-12)**...<u>In</u> the Angels six victories over Oakland this season, they have outscored the A's 35-9...Conversely, in their three losses, they have been outscored 9-29

GETTING STARTED: Since inflating to a 5.23 ERA on May 6th, Angels' starting pitchers have fashioned a 3.64 ERA (195.1 IP - 79 ER) ERA over the last 32 games...Starters have allowed three earned runs or less in 29 of last 42 games...In those 29 games, starters have a 1.75 ERA (201 IP - 39 ER)...Halos lead the A.L. with six complete games.

HIT OR MISS: In the Halos' 33 victories, the club has hit .312 (96/308) with RISP...In the 29 losses, Angels are 38 for 196 (.194).

BULLPEN BITS: Angel relievers currently rank 13th in the A.L. with a 4.92 ERA...From 2000-2009, the bullpen had the best ERA in the A.L. (3.71) and 2nd best in MLB in the decade (LAD - 3.63).

THIS N' THAT: Halos are tied for MLB lead with six walk-off wins (Atlanta)...Angels have held a lead at some point in 13 of 29 losses...Angels have used 44 different lineups in 62 games...Angels pitchers have walked 236 batters to lead the A.L.
