Arthur Rhodes leads all National League relievers with a **0.29era** in 33g...his active **28.2-inning** scoreless streak, covering 31 apps, is a career high, the longest by a reliever in the Major Leagues this season and the longest by a Reds reliever since **Ted Abernathy** threw 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings from **8/19-9/29, 1967**.

The Reds' bullpen didn't allow a run in any of the last 4g (8.1ip) and posted a **0.79era** in the last 5g (11.1ip, 1er).

At The Plate

Reds batters lead the National League in hitting (.274), hits (653), total bases (1061), HR (83), RBI (327), slugging (.445) and hitting with RISP and 2 outs (80-287, .279)...lead the Major Leagues in hitting with RISP (172-592, .291) and in pinch-hit HR (7).

In The Field

The Reds lead the National League with a **.990** fielding percentage...the Reds' 11-game errorless streak from **5/4-5/16** was their longest since a **13-game** errorless stretch from **6/29-7/15, 1997**.

On The Basepaths

Reds baserunners rank third in the National League in stolen bases (50-73, .685) and rank second in the Major Leagues in number of times going from first to third on a single (**50**, Tex 53).

Interleague Play

Major League Baseball's **14th** season of interleague play continues for the Reds this week...their interleague schedule concludes with a home series vs **Cle** next weekend...all-time vs AL teams, the Reds are **86-110 (.439)**, including **3-6 this season** (2-1 at Cle, 1-2 vs KC, 0-3 at Sea)...only 3 times in the previous 13 seasons has Cin produced a winning record in interleague play (9-6 in 1997, 7-5 in 2003, 9-6 in 2008)...the Reds' all-time results vs AL teams can be found on **page 305** of the media guide.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Debbie Gallas'** Athletics and **Game 4** (0-3) of a 6-game road trip that also included an **0-3 sweep loss** in **Sea**...beginning **6/4** the Reds are **6-10** in a stretch in which they are finishing the first half with **32-36g** outside the NL Central Division, the lone intra-division series scheduled for **7/1-7/4** at **Chi**...extending the schedule to beyond the All-Star break, the Reds are playing **39-43g** outside the division...following this series the Reds return to Great American Ball Park for their last homestand of the season's first half, a 6-gamer vs **Cle** (3g) and **Phi** (3g).

SLEEPLESS IN SEATTLE: The Reds scored 1 run in their 3 weekend losses at **Safeco Field**, including 1-0 defeats Friday and Sunday...prior to last weekend hadn't lost a 1-0 decision on the road since **April 2008**...in Sea Reds batters hit **.152** (14-92), including **1-for-12 with RISP**, and stranded **18 baserunners**...the Reds have been shut out twice in the last 3g, 3 times in the last 6g and 4 times in the last 12g...scored **1 run** in their last 30 innings dating back to a 2-run fifth frame in Thursday's 7-1 win vs LAD.

JET LAG: This road trip to **Sea** (0-3) and **Oak** marks the Reds' first visit of the season to the **West Coast**...in **2009**, the Reds went **2-7** during their 3 visits to the **West Coast** (0-3 at SD, 0-3 at LAD, 2-1 at SF)...over the last 5 seasons, the Redlegs are **13-35 (.271)** on the **West Coast** (0-12 at LAD, 4-9 at SD, 7-7 at SF, 1-2 at Oak, 1-5 at Sea)...the **13-35** stretch includes an active **12-game losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium**, where the Reds haven't won since their final appearance of **2005** (a 6-1 victory by **Brandon Claussen** on **7/28/05**)...the Reds were swept in all four 3-game series in **Chavez Ravine** since then.

BATTLING FOR FIRST: For the second straight day the Reds face a **1.5-game deficit**, their largest since **5/14** (-1.5g)...haven't been more than **1.5g** out of first place since **5/11** (-2.0g) and haven't been **2.5g** out since **5/10** (-3.0g)...for a season-high 12 straight days from **6/6-6/17** led the National League Central Division or shared the lead...the Reds haven't been in first place this late in a season since the final week of the **1999** campaign, when for 5 days from **9/27-10/1** they led or shared the division lead...beginning **5/16**, the Reds have spent 28 of the last 36 days in first place or tied for first...the 4-game stretch in first place from **5/16-5/19** was their first perch atop the division at any time during a season since **4/17/07**...the Reds' 2.0-game lead on **5/29** was their biggest since **6/2/04** (+2.5g)...haven't led the division by more than **2.5g** since **5/18/02** (+5.0g).

DOT, DOT, DOT....: **Dusty Baker's** next victory will be the **1,352nd** of his career, tying **Chuck Tanner** for 26th on the all-time list...pitching coach **Bryan Price** tomorrow will celebrate his 48th birthday...he was born in San Francisco...**Scott Rolen** needs 3 HR for **300** in his career.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Reds lead the Major Leagues in overall hitting with RISP (172-592, .291) and lead the National League in hitting with RISP and 2 outs (80-287, .279).

POSITION PLAYERS: Reds **left fielders** lead the National League in RBI (54) and rank near the top among the left field leaders in hitting (.299, 2nd), slugging (.513, 2nd) and HR (11, 4th)...Reds **catchers** lead the NL hitting (.297) and on-base percentage (.394).

CLOSE, LATE & COMEBACK: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 23 **comeback wins** and rank second with 12 wins in their last at **bat** (Atl 14).

REHAB NOTES: RHP **Edinson Volquez**, on the 60-day disabled list recovering from 8/3/09 "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow, on Thu for Class A Lynchburg made another rehab start vs Kinston and threw 5.0 scoreless innings to earn the 2-0 victory (1h, 0bb, 4k)...in his 2 rehab starts for Lynchburg **Volquez** is **1-0, 0.00** (8ip, 3h, 0r, 0bb, 7k).

REDS ON THE ROAD (14-16, .467): The Reds are **0-3** on this road trip (0-3 at Sea)...went **4-5-1** in their **10 previous road series**...produced a **winning or .500 record** on 3 of their previous 5 road trips (2-5, 4-2, 3-0, 2-3, 3-3)... the Reds have **won their last 7 extra-inning road games** dating back to June of last season...is the longest streak in the Major Leagues since the Marlins won 7 consecutive extra-inning road games spanning the 2008-09 seasons...is the longest streak by the Reds since they won a franchise-record 8 straight extra-inning games on the road over the 1944-45 campaigns...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

IN THE STANDINGS (77): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: **FIRST** - 28, **SECOND** - 31, **THIRD** - 4, **FOURTH** - 10, **FIFTH** - 3, **SIXTH** - 1...at **30-20** were a season-high **10g over .500** for the first time since **6/10/06** (36-26)...the season high for **2006** was at **12g over .500** at 36-24 on **6/8**...at **7-11** were a season-high **4g below .500**...from 5/2-5/4 faced season-high **5.0-game deficits**...have spent 47 days above, 9 days at and 21 days below .500.

DH: Reds designated hitters this season are hitting **.087** (2-23, 1hr, 3rbi)...**OF Jonny Gomes** served as the club's **designated hitter** in the 5 of the Reds' 6g at American League parks (2-20, .100, 1hr, 3rbi) and in all 9 of the club's interleague road games in 2009 (11-32, .344, 3 2b, 3hr, 7rbi, 5r, 5bb)...**Miguel Cairo** was the DH on Fri at Sea (0-3).

REDS vs ATHLETICS: The Reds are 1-8 during the regular season vs the Athletics, including **1-2 in 2007** at McAfee Coliseum, **0-3 in 2004** at Network Associates Coliseum and **0-3 in 2002** in the final season of Cinergy Field...during that 2004 series in Oak - the first stop in an 0-7 road trip that also included Cle (0-3) and Phi (0-1) - the Reds allowed 51 hits and 40 runs in 13-2, 10-6 and 17-8 losses...the Athletics' 40 runs scored were a club record for a 3-game series and the most allowed by Reds pitching in a 3-game series since the Boston Braves scored 40 runs in 12-6, 13-1 and 15-11 wins from 5/4-5/6, 1950 at Crosley Field...the Reds entered that series 8-1 in their previous 9 road games and led the NL Central by 2.0g...finished that 0-7 road trip tied for second and facing a 2.0-game deficit...the rest of the season wouldn't get closer to first place than 2.0g...**the teams split their 2 World Series meetings**...Oak won in 7 games in 1972 and Cin capped its 1990 Wire-to-Wire season with a 4-game sweep in 1990.

11 starts went **5-0, 2.22**...in his last 2 starts is **0-1, 8.71** (10.1ip, 10er)... leads the pitching staff with **10 quality starts** in 13 apps...pitched into the seventh inning in 7 of his 13 starts and threw 6.0 innings in 5 others...in his 13 starts the Reds went 8-5 and scored 56 runs (4.31 r/g)...received votes for National League Rookie of the Month for May (6gs, 2-0, 1.88).

Tough Luck: The Reds went **8-5** in his 13 starts...3 of the losses were by 1 run, the other was by 2 runs, 4 were in the opponent's final at bat, and 2 were walkoff losses...was the victim of a blown save in the 10-9 loss at Atl on 5/20, when the Reds failed to hold 8-0 and 9-1 leads and allowed 7 runs in the bottom of the ninth.

Historic: Is the 21st player since the draft began in **1965** to play in the majors without appearing in a minor league game, the seventh Reds player to do it and the first player from the June 2009 draft to make his debut.

Perfect: Was the first Reds pitcher to begin his Major League career **5-0** since **RHP Tim Layana** in 1990 (Layana's only career wins) and the first Reds *starter* to win his first 5 career decisions since **1976**, when **RHP Santo Alcalá** began **5-0**...according to Elias Sports Bureau, **at 5-0** was the first pitcher in **Reds history** to remain undefeated through his first 12 Major League starts...prior to this season, **RHP Bronson Arroyo**, in **2006**, was the last Reds pitcher to begin any season **5-0**.

At The Plate: Among all National League pitchers ranks second in hitting (.385, 26ab minimum, Haren .410)...produced 2-hit games on 4/11 vs Cubs, 5/20 at Atl and 6/5 at Wsh...is the first Reds pitcher with 3 multi-hit games in a season since **Jimmy Haynes** produced 3 in **2002**...**Jose Rijo** had 4 multi-hit games in **1993**...has hit safely in 7 of his 13 starts...from **5/20-6/5** had a 4-game hitting streak (6-10, .600, 1 2b), the longest by a Reds pitcher since **Bobby Livingston's** 4-game hitting streak from **6/1-7/26, 2007**...in his Major League debut singled twice off **Tom Gorzelanny** to become the first Reds pitcher with 2 hits in his first career game since **Benny Frey** did it on 9/18/29 vs Phi (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

The Promotion: Joined the roster on 4/11, the day of his debut and the first day the Reds needed a fifth starter...took the 25-man roster spot of **IF/OF Juan Francisco**, who was optioned to Louisville, and the 40-man roster spot of **LHP Pedro Viola**, who was designated for assignment...wore uniform number 76 in spring training...earned his spot in the season-opening rotation by going **1-0, 3.00** in 2 starts and 4 relief apps during **spring training** (18ip, 16h, 6er, 4bb, 10k, 1hr).

His Debut: On 4/11 vs Cubs, in his first professional appearance allowed just 1 run in 6.2 innings but received no decision in the 3-1 victory (4h, 7bb, 5k, 1wp, 106 pitches)...

in his first career inning loaded the bases with nobody out but didn't allow a run... first career strikeout was **Marlon Byrd** (first inning)...following that game donated his cap to the National Baseball **Hall of Fame** and Museum in **Cooperstown**...the autographed lineup card and a game-used baseball went to the **Reds Hall of Fame**.

Second To Debut: On 4/11 vs Cubs became the second Reds player to make a Major League debut this season...**RHP Logan Ondrusek** made his big league debut with a perfect eighth inning on Opening Day vs STL.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: Bronson Arroyo

Last Pitched: Thu afternoon vs LAD, issued a career-high 6 walks but still earned the 7-1 victory (7ip, 5h, 1er, 6bb, 1k, 104 pitches, 56 strikes)...left leading, 7-1...allowed only an RBI-single with 2 outs in the second inning to pitcher John Ely, his first career RBI...in the bottom of that frame Arroyo hit his fifth career HR, a 3-run shot that gave the Reds a 3-1 lead they would not relinquish...participated in three 3-6-1 double plays.

Red Hots: Tomorrow will make his 15th start of the season...in 6 starts from 4/29-5/26 put together a season-high 5-game winning streak (5-0, 2.66)...has 7 quality starts...in his 14 starts the Reds went 9-5 and scored 68 runs (4.86 r/g)...on 6/17 vs LAD hit his fifth career home run (3-run off John Ely).

Workhorse: In each of the last 5 seasons produced at least 32 starts and 200 innings pitched...is 1 of only 4 pitchers to record at least 200 innings in each of the last 5 seasons (Dan Haren, Javier Vazquez, Mark Buehrle)...since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season leads all Major League pitchers with 150 starts and leads the National League with 965.0 innings pitched.
