OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics have lost seven of their past eight games and 10 of their last 12 and are now a season-high six games under .500...are 6-16 in June, which is the second-worst record in the American League (Baltimore, 4-15 plus tonight)...have now been shut out four times this season...are 0-3 on this six-game homestand against Cincinnati (0-3) and Pittsburgh (three games).
- Vin Mazzaro** pitched a season-high seven innings...snapped his 19-start streak of throwing six innings or less, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...is 0-5 with 4.61 ERA (21 er in 41.0 ip) in seven career interleague starts.
- Craig Breslow** has retired each of the last 16 batters he has faced and opponents are 1 for 30 (.033) against him over his last 10 games.
- Kevin Kouzmanoff** (1 for 4) is batting .391 (34 for 87) in 22 games in June...is batting .382 (21 for 55) in interleague play this season and is a career .329 (68 for 207) interleague hitter...has a .377 career average (32 for 85) against Cincinnati, his best average against any National League team.
- Adam Rosales** (0 for 4) is now hitless in his past 17 at-bats.
- Bob Geren** was ejected by second base umpire Jerry Crawford in the fourth inning...it was his second ejection this season and the eighth of his career.

CINCINNATI NOTES

- The Cincinnati Reds have now won three games in a row after losing six of their previous seven...went 3-3 on this six-game road trip through Seattle (0-3) and Oakland (3-0)...begin a six-game homestand on Friday against Cleveland (three games) and Philadelphia (three games).
- Johnny Cueto** has won seven of his past eight decisions...is 3-1 with a 2.92 ERA (8 er in 24.2 ip) in four interleague starts this year...is 4-3 with a 1.93 ERA (9 er in 42.0 ip) in seven career road starts against American League teams...Reds starters had a 2.33 ERA (10 er in 38.2 ip) during this road trip.
- Jay Bruce** (3 for 3) has back-to-back three-hit games for the first time this season.
- Miguel Cairo** (2 for 5) is batting .357 (20 for 56) over his past 17 games.
- Brandon Phillips** (2 for 5) is hitting .398 (41 for 103) over his past 24 games after batting .257 (48 for 187) in his first 48 contests.
- Joey Votto** (0 for 2, 3 bb) has reached base safely in each of his past 32 games, which ties him with Evan Longoria for the longest such streak in the Major Leagues this season...it ties him with Austin Kearns for the longest reaching base streak by a Reds player since 2003 (April 19-May 25).
