Arthur Rhodes leads all National League relievers with a **0.29era** in 34g...his active **29-inning** scoreless streak, covering 32 apps, is a career high, the longest by a reliever in the Major Leagues this season and the longest by a Reds reliever since **Ted Abernathy** threw 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings from **8/19-9/29, 1967**...no Reds reliever has thrown more than 30.0 straight scoreless frames since **Frank Smith's** club-record 35-inning scoreless stretch from **5/22-6/24, 1952** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

Interleague Play

Major League Baseball's **14th** season of interleague play continues for the Reds this week...their interleague schedule concludes with a home series vs **Cle** this upcoming weekend...all-time vs AL teams, the Reds are **88-110 (.444)**, including **5-6 this season** (2-1 at Cle, 1-2 vs KC, 0-3 at Sea, 2-0 at Oak)...only 3 times in the previous 13 seasons has Cin produced a winning record in interleague play (9-6 in 1997, 7-5 in 2003, 9-6 in 2008)...the Reds' all-time results vs AL teams can be found on **page 305** of the media guide.

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs **Matt Weiss'** Athletics and **Game 6** (2-3) of a 6-game road trip that also included an **0-3 sweep loss** in **Sea**...beginning **6/4** the Reds are **8-10** in a stretch in which they are finishing the first half with **32-36g** outside the NL Central Division, the lone intra-division series scheduled for **7/1-7/4 at Chi**...extending the schedule to beyond the All-Star break, the Reds are playing **39-43g** outside the division...following this series the Reds return to Great American Ball Park for their last homestand of the season's first half, a 6-gamer vs **Cle** (3g) and **Phi** (3g).

JET LAG: This road trip to **Sea** (0-3) and **Oak** (2-0) marks the Reds' first visit of the season to the **West Coast**...in 2009, the Reds went **2-7** during their 3 visits to the **West Coast** (0-3 at SD, 0-3 at LAD, 2-1 at SF)...over the last 5 seasons, the Redlegs are **15-35 (.300)** on the **West Coast** (0-12 at LAD, 4-9 at SD, 7-7 at SF, 3-2 at Oak, 1-5 at Sea)...the **15-35** stretch includes an active **12-game losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium**, where the Reds haven't won since their final appearance of **2005** (a 6-1 victory by **Brandon Claussen** on **7/28/05**)...the Reds were swept in all four 3-game series in **Chavez Ravine** since then.

BATTLING FOR FIRST: For the second straight day the Reds face a **1.0g deficit** behind the first-place Cardinals in the National League Central Division...for a season-high 12 straight days from **6/6-6/17** led the National League Central Division or shared the lead...the Reds haven't been in first place this late in a season since the final week of the **1999** campaign, when for 5 days from **9/27-10/1** they led or shared the division lead...beginning **5/16**, the Reds have spent 28 of the last 38 days in first place or tied for first...the 4-game stretch in first place from **5/16-5/19** was their first perch atop the division at any time during a season since **4/17/07**...the Reds' 2.0-game lead on **5/29** was their biggest since **6/2/04** (+2.5g)...haven't led the division by more than **2.5g** since **5/18/02** (+5.0g).

STREAKING: **Joey Votto** has reached base safely via hit, walk or HBP in each of his last **31g**, the second-longest such streak in the Major Leagues this season (TB's **Evan Longoria**, 32g) and the longest by a Reds' player since **Austin's Kearns'** 32-game on-base streak from **4/19-5/25, 2003**...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

DOT, DOT, DOT....: Last night **3B Scott Rolen** made his 100th start as a Red (62-38 record in his starts, .620)...**Rolen** needs 2 HR for **300** in his career...last night's win was **Dusty Baker's 1,353rd** as a manager, moving him past **Chuck Tanner** and into 26th place alone on the all-time list.

CLOSE, LATE & COMEBACK: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 23 **comeback wins** and rank second with 13 wins in their last **at bat** (Atl 14).

REHAB NOTES: RHP **Edinson Volquez**, on the 60-day disabled list recovering from 8/3/09 "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow, on Thu for Class A Lynchburg made another rehab start vs Kinston and threw 5.0 scoreless innings to earn the 2-0 victory (1h, 0bb, 4k)...in his 2 rehab starts for Lynchburg **Volquez** is **1-0, 0.00** (8ip, 3h, 0r, 0bb, 7k)...he was scheduled to pitch again this morning in Louisville for the Bats vs Toledo.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (23-17 .575): In 8 seasons at GABP the Reds are **304-303-1**...went **4-6** on their most recent homestand (2-2 vs SF, 1-2 vs KC, 1-2 vs LAD)...have followed a 6-series winning streak at GABP by going **0-2-1** in their last 3 home series...went **8-4-1** in their **previous 13 home series**...produced a **winning or .500 record** on **5 of their 6 homestands** (3-3, 3-3, 4-2, 4-1, 5-2, 4-6).

REDS ON THE ROAD (16-16 .500): The Reds are **2-3** on this road trip (0-3 at Sea, 2-0 at Oak)...went **4-5-1** in their **10 previous road series**...produced a **winning or .500 record** on 3 of their previous 5 road trips (2-5, 4-2, 3-0, 2-3, 3-3)...the Reds have **won their last 8 extra-inning road games** dating back to June of last season, tying their club record established over the **1944-45** campaigns...is the longest such streak in the Major Leagues since the **Yankees** won 14 straight extra-inning road games from **1997-2000** and the longest by a National League team since the **Braves'** 9-game streak over the **1999-2000** seasons...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

IN THE STANDINGS (79): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: **FIRST** - 28, **SECOND** - 33, **THIRD** - 4, **FOURTH** - 10, **FIFTH** - 3, **SIXTH** - 1...at **30-20** were a season-high **10g over .500** for the first time since **6/10/06** (36-26)...the season high for **2006** was at **12g over .500** at 36-24 on **6/8**...at **7-11** were a season-high **4g below .500**...from 5/2-5/4 faced season-high **5.0-game deficits**...have spent 49 days above, 9 days at and 21 days below .500.

DH: Reds designated hitters this season are hitting **.156** (5-32, 1hr, 3rbi)...**OF Jonny Gomes** served as the club's **designated hitter** in the 6 of the Reds' 8g at American League parks (3-25, .120, 1hr, 3rbi) and in all 9 of the club's interleague road games in 2009 (11-32, .344, 3 2b, 3hr, 7rbi, 5r, 5bb)...**Miguel Cairo** was the DH in Fri's game at Sea (0-3) and in Mon's game at Oak (2-4).

REDS vs ATHLETICS: The Reds are **3-8** during the regular season vs the Athletics, including **2-0 this season, 1-2 in 2007** at McAfee Coliseum, **0-3 in 2004** at Network Associates Coliseum and **0-3 in 2002** at Cinergy Field.

UP NEXT: REDS vs INDIANS: The Reds are 33-33 all-time vs the Indians, including 2-1 this season and 14-7 the last 4 seasons...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 11-7, including 2-1 in 2009, 5-1 the last 2 seasons and 7-2 the last 3 years...have won 6 of the last 7g there vs Cle.

OHIO CUP: The **Most Outstanding Player** of the intrastate series between the Reds and Indians will receive an individual trophy...Reds **OF Adam Dunn** won the **MOP Award** in 2008 (.300, 5hr, 10rbi), while Cin's **C Ramon Hernandez** earned it last season (.474, 1hr, 5rbi)...with a series win or tie the Reds will retain the **Ohio Cup** trophy, presented by **The Ohio Lottery**, for the third straight year...Cin hasn't lost a series to Cle since **2005** (2-4; 3-3 in 2006, 3-3 in 2007, 5-1 in 2008, 4-2 in 2009)...the Reds took a 2-1 series win in May at Progressive Field.

Last Pitched: Fri at Sea and suffered the 1-0 loss (5.2ip, 4h, 1er, 2bb, 5k, 1hbp, 115 pitches, 64 strikes)...left trailing, 1-0...retired the first 2 batters of the sixth inning but then hit Lopez with a pitch and allowed consecutive singles to Gutierrez and Wilson...Cliff Lee threw a 6-hit complete game in 2 hours, 16 minutes.

Red Hots: The 24-year-old righthander is making his 15th start of the season and his first career appearance vs the Athletics...in 9 starts from 4/30-6/12 went **6-0, 4.02** and 3 times was the victim of blown saves...the 6-game winning streak is a career high and the longest by a Reds pitcher since **Paul Wilson** won 7 straight decisions from **4/7-5/25, 2004**...has 6 quality starts...**5 times was the victim of blown saves, the most for any pitcher in the Major Leagues**...in his 14 starts the Reds went 9-5 and scored 75 runs (5.36 r/g)...were shut out in both of his losses...received votes for National League Pitcher of the Month for May (5gs, 4-0, 1.59, 1sho).

The 1-Hitter: In the 9-0 win on 5/11 at Pit threw a 1-hitter for his first career complete game (0bb, 8k, 102 pitches, 67 strikes)...faced just 28 batters...allowed a 1-out single to Cedeno in the third inning...hit Cedeno with a pitch to begin the sixth, but he was caught stealing...retired his last 11 batters...became the first Reds pitcher to throw a 1-hitter since **LHP John Smiley** did it on 9/22/96/g2 vs StL and the first Reds righthander since **Tim Lincecum** on 9/23/93 at SD...became only the third Reds pitcher since 1900 to throw a shutout while allowing 1 hit or fewer, 0 walks and 8 strikeouts, joining **Smiley** on 9/22/96/g2 vs StL and **RHP Jose Rijo** on 9/25/93 at Col...**Smiley** and **Rijo** also allowed 1 hit and 0 walks with 8 strikeouts.

Career Highs: Innings: 9.0, 5/11/10 at Pit (longest) & 0.2 (shortest), 7/6/09 at Phi; **Hits:** 10 (4x), last on 6/7/10 vs SFL; **Runs:** 9, 7/6/09 at Phi; **Earned Runs:** 9, 7/6/09 at Phi; **Walks:** 8, 6/11/08 vs StL; **Strikeouts:** 10 (2x), 4/3/08 vs Ari (ML debut) & 7/22/08 vs SD; **HR allowed:** 3 (2x), 5/16/08 vs Cle (Blake & Hafner, Peralta) & 6/20/09 vs WSox (Beckham, Podsednik, Pierzynski).

Cueto's Most Recent Starts: 4/7 vs StL, in the second game of the season received no decision in the 6-3 loss (6ip, 5h, 2er, 3bb, 3k)...left trailing, 2-0, but the Reds tied it with a pair of runs in the bottom of the sixth inning...StL scored 4 runs in the top of the seventh to take a 6-2 lead...allowed RBI-singles to Freese in the second inning and to Ludwick in the third...**4/12 at Fla**, in his second start of the season was the victim of a blown save in the 10-inning, 6-5 victory (5ip, 9h, 4er, 1bb, 2k, 110 pitches)...left leading, 5-4, but the Marlins tied it in the seventh inning with a 2-out, RBI-infield single by Paulino off Herrera...**4/17 at Pit**, in the 5-4 walkoff loss was a victim of a blown save for the second straight start (5ip, 5h, 3er, 4bb, 4k, Cedeno solo HR, 103 pitches, 56 strikes)...left leading, 4-3, but was the victim of a blown save when the Pirates scored 2 runs in the ninth off Cordero...**4/24 vs SD** and suffered the 5-0 loss (6ip, 7h, 5er, 1bb, 5k, 2hr, 92 pitches, 62 strikes)...allowed 3 runs on home runs, including a 2-out, solo HR to Gonzalez in the first inning and a 2-run HR to Venable in the sixth...**4/30 at StL** and in his second appearance of the season vs the Cardinals earned the 3-2 win (5ip, 5h, 2er, 1bb, 1bb, 3k, 82 pitches, 48 strikes)...left leading, 3-2, and did not return after a rain delay of 2:32 in the middle of the sixth inning...in the third inning retired the first 2 batters but then allowed 2 runs on 3 hits, including Holliday's 2-run single...5 Reds relievers held StL scoreless...**5/5 vs NYM** and was the victim of a blown save in the 10-inning, 5-4 win (6ip, 7h, 3er, 2bb, 8k, Wright solo HR, 118 pitches, 69 strikes)...left leading, 4-3, but the Mets tied it with a run in the ninth off Cordero...Cabrera hit his fifth career walkoff HR (off Feliciano)...**5/17 vs Mil** and earned the 6-3 win (7ip, 7h, 1er, 1bb, 7k, 1hr, 113 pitches, 67 strikes)...left the game with the score tied, 1-1, but was the pitcher of record during the Reds' 5-run seventh inning...allowed only a solo HR to Hart with 1 out in the fourth inning...**5/22 at Cle** and earned the 6-4 victory (6ip, 4h, 2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 93 pitches, 57 strikes)...left leading, 5-2...left the game with a blister on his right index finger...allowed only Hafner's 2-run HR in the sixth inning...**5/27 vs Pit** and threw 6.0 shutout innings to earn the 8-2 victory (3h, 2bb, 9k, 101 pitches, 64 strikes)...left leading, 8-0...his 9 strikeouts were a season high...allowed 2 singles to Clement and a double to Cedeno...**6/1 at StL** and was the victim of a blown save in the 9-8 victory (5+ip, 10h, 8er, 1bb, 0k, 2hr, 83 pitches, 53 strikes)...was his first career appearance without a strikeout (72nd start)...left leading, 7-6, but was charged with 2 runs scored on Del Rosario...with 2 outs in the first inning allowed an RBI-single to Holliday and a 2-run HR to Rasmus...allowed Jay's first career homer in the fourth...in the sixth allowed RBI-singles to Freese and Jay...**6/7 vs SF**, in his first career appearance vs the Giants was the victim of a blown save in the 6-5 loss (6ip, 10h, 4er, 1bb, 5k, 102 pitches, 70 strikes)...left trailing, 4-3, but the Reds took a 5-4 lead on pinch hitter Cairo's 2-run single...the Giants re-took the lead in the seventh with 2 runs off Del Rosario that were charged to Herrera...allowed a 2-out, 2-run single to Zito in the second inning and a 2-run single to Uribe in the third...**6/12 vs KC** and earned the 11-5 win (6ip, 5h, 5er, 4bb, 6k, 109 pitches, 70 strikes)...left leading, 11-5...took a 4-0 lead into the top of the second inning but allowed all 5 of his runs in that frame, including 4 runs with 2 outs.
