PITTSBURGH PIRATES (25-47) vs. OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-40) JUNE 25, 2010 AT THE COLISEUM IN OAKLAND --- GAME #73, ROAD #38 RHP BRAD LINCOLN (0-1, 6.50 ERA) vs. RHP BEN SHEETS (2-7, 4.95 ERA)

THE PIRATES....have gone 2-3 in their last five games after losing a season-high 12 straight from 6/6-18...Have gone 5-21 in their last 26 contests, dating back to 5/26...Began season with two straight wins over the Dodgers at PNC Park on 4/5 and 4/7 and had a 7-5 record prior to dropping seven straight games from 4/20-26...Have won a season-high three straight games on three occasions (5/4-6, 4/27-29 and 4/16-18)...Were 33-39 after 72 games last season (34-39 after 73).

THE BUCS IN THE BAY AREA: The Pirates will wrap up interleague play with this three-game series against the Athletics in Oakland...The Pirates have gone 0-6 against the As in interleague action, having been swept in Oakland in 2004 and in Pittsburgh in 2002...Pittsburgh went 1-2 against the Giants across the Bay earlier this season (April 12-14).

GROOVY TIMES AHEAD: Tomorrow night, the Pirates and Athletics will be wearing uniforms from the 70's as Oakland turns back the clock to that far-out decade...The Buccos will be wearing black pants with gold tops while the As will be sporting the green and yellow threads they wore during their championship seasons of the early 70's.

MOSKOS & PRESLEY TO TRIPLE-A: LHP Daniel Moskos and OF Alex Presley have been promoted from Double-A Altoona to Triple-A Indianapolis...Moskos, Pittsburgh's #1 selection (fourth overall) in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft is currently leading the Eastern League in saves (17) and went 2-1 with a 1.45 ERA (31.0ip/8r/5er) in 28 games in his first season as a closer...Presley, the club's 8th-round pick in 2006, is currently leading the league in hitting (.350) and triples (7), going 86-for-246 with 13 doubles, six home runs and 47 RBI in 67 games with the Curve.

A HOMECOMING OF SORTS: Bucco infielder Bobby Crosby was Oakland's first-round selection (25th pick overall) in the 2001 First-Year Player Draft...He played seven seasons with the Athletics and was named the A.L. Rookie-of-the-Year in 2004 after hitting 22 home runs and knocking in 64 runs in 151 games...<u>Crosby has recorded four multi-hit contests in</u> the last four games, going 10-for-15 in his four starts at shortstop.

GOOD TIMING: In the last two games, the Pirates have gone 9-for-15 with runners in scoring position...**Bobby Crosby** has four hits in his last five at bats with RISP and **Garrett Jones** has seven hits in his last 10 such at bats.

SKID MARKS ON THE ROAD: The Bucs have lost 14 straight games on the road, winning for the last time away from home on May 25 in Cincinnati...**Zach Duke** is the last starting pitcher to win a game on the road, doing so against Roy Halladay on May 18.

ROAD TRIP: The Pirates have gone 0-3 on this nine-game road trip following their first three games against the Rangers. ...The trip also includes this three-game set in Oakland and concludes with three against the Cubs at Wrigley Field beginning Monday night...The Bucs then play four games at home before returning to the road for six games.

<u>STILL GOING STRONG:</u> D.J. Carrasco ranks eighth in the Majors with 39.1 innings pitched this season and ranks first among all Major League pitchers with 128.2ip since the start of the 2009 season.

MR. CLUTCH: Lastings Milledge ranks sixth in the Major Leagues and third in the National League with a .392 batting average with runners in scoring position...He also ranks third among N.L. hitters with a .371 average while batting with runners on base...Milledge has gone 10-for-22 (.455) in his last seven games and 14-for-32 (.438) in his last 11.

ARMED AND DANGEROUS: Pittsburgh leads the Majors with 21 outfield assists and 13 of them have gunned down runners at home plate...The Pirates led the Majors Leagues with 45 outfield assists last season.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: The Pirates are 2-10 after the first 12 games of their 15-game stretch against American League opponents against Detroit (0-3), Chicago (0-3), Cleveland (2-1) and Texas (0-3)...The interleague schedule wraps up with these three games in Oakland.

JUST ANOTHER "W": Sunday afternoon Brendan Donnelly improved his season record to 3-1 and he has now gone 15-2 since 2006...Donnelly has the highest winning percentage among all Major League relievers since 2002 (32-10, .762).

SAVING GRACE: Bucco closer **Octavio Dotel** has converted 11 of his last 12 save opportunities and has held opposing hitters to a .109 average (5-for-46) in those 12 games...Overall he has gone 14-for-17 in save chances this season.

ON THE D.L.: LHP Zach Duke (left elbow flexor pronator strain), RHP Chris Jakubauskas (head contusion and concussion), RHP **Charlie Morton** (right shoulder fatigue) and first baseman **Steve Pearce** (sprained right ankle) are on the 15-day disabled list...RHP **Jose Ascanio** (rehabbing from right shoulder surgery) is on the 60-day D.L.

BRAD LINCOLN: The 25-year-old righthander is making fourth career start tonight...He was recalled from Indianapolis and made his Major League debut on June 9.

LAST START: Lincoln received a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 5-3 win over the Indians at PNC Park last Sunday...He surrendered a two-run homer to Carlos Santana in the 1st inning and an RBI-double to Santana in the 3rd...The Pirates tied the game in the 7th and plated a pair of runs in the 8th for the victory.

FIRST START: Brad made his Major League debut on 6/9 in Washington and received a no-decision (6.0ip/7h/5r/5er)...He fell behind in the 1st inning on a two-run homer by Adam Dunn and also allowed three runs in the 4th...At the plate he went 2-for-3 with an RBI, singling off John Lannan in the 2nd inning in his first career at bat.

2010 REVIEW: Lincoln went 6-2 with a 3.16 ERA (68.1ip/24er) and 55 strikeouts this season with Indianapolis before his promotion to the big leagues...He went 5-1 in his last seven starts, and did not allow a run in his final two outings (11.0ip)...At the time of his promotion, he was tied for third in the International League in wins.

MAKING A COMEBACK: After being selected in the first round of the 2006 Draft, Brad missed the entire 2007 season after undergoing reconstructive surgery to repair ligament damage in his right elbow...He then split the '08 season between Low-A Hickory and High-A Lynchburg, where he went 6-9 with a 4.69 ERA in 19 combined starts.

WITH HONORS: Lincoln pitched collegiately at the University of Houston, where he compiled a career record of 19-11, a 3.30 ERA and 296 strikeouts in three seasons...He was the winner of the Brooks Wallace Award, given to college baseball's top player, and the 20th annual Dick Howser trophy as the 2006 College Baseball Player-of-the-Year...He was also a semifinalist for the Roger Clemens Award (College Baseball's Pitcher-of-the-Year).

DANIEL McCUTCHEN: The 27-year-old righthander is expected to be recalled from Triple-A and would be making his fourth start/fifth appearance of the season with Pittsburgh tomorrow night...Began season with Bucs and suffered loss in first start on 4/11 at Arizona...Was optioned to Triple-A on 4/12, but was recalled and went 0-1 in three games (two starts) before being optioned again on 4/25...Made last appearance with Pirates in relief and tossed 1.0 scoreless inning at Houston on 4/24...Went 4-5 with a 3.86 ERA (60.2ip/26er) in 10 starts with Indianapolis, suffering a loss in his last start on 6/21 vs. Durham (7.0ip/2er)...Posted a 1-2 record and a 4.21 ERA in six starts with the Pirates last season.
