## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (25-48) vs. OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-40) JUNE 26, 2010 AT THE COLISEUM IN OAKLAND --- GAME #74, ROAD #39 RHP DANIEL McCUTCHEN (0-2, 13.50 ERA) vs. RHP TREVOR CAHILL (6-2, 3.21 ERA)

**THE PIRATES...** have lost four straight games after winning back-to-back games against the Indians last Saturday and Sunday...Lost a season-high 12 straight from 6/6-18 and have gone 5-22 in their last 27 contests, dating back to 5/26...Began season with two straight wins over the Dodgers at PNC Park on 4/5 and 4/7 and had a 7-5 record prior to dropping seven straight games from 4/20-26...Have won a season-high three straight games on three occasions (5/4-6, 4/27-29 and 4/16-18)...Were 34-39 after 73 games last season (35-39 after 74).

**ROSTER MOVE:** Prior to tonight's game the Pirates will recall RHP **Daniel McCutchen** (#34) to start the game...The club will also make a corresponding move prior to the game tonight in Oakland.

**BUC BATS GETTING WARM IN SUMMER:** In the four games played since the summer solstice began on Monday, the Pirates are hitting .277 (39-for-141)...They have raised their team batting average from .237 to .240 in that time - its highest point since 5/10 (.240).

**GROOVY KIND OF DAY:** Tonight the Pirates and Athletics will be wearing uniforms from the 70's as Oakland turns back the clock to that far-out decade...The Buccos will be wearing black pants with black tops while the As will be sporting the psychedelic yellow threads they wore during their championship seasons of the early 70's.

**LONG BALL RETURNS:** Last night **Neil Walker** snapped Pittsburgh's homerless streak at six games and 59 innings...Walker hit the previous home run for the Bucs on June 17 vs. Chicago (AL)...The Pirates are 9-3 when they homer two or more times in the same game, but haven't done that since June 6.

**THE BUCS IN THE BAY AREA:** The Pirates will wrap up interleague play with this three-game series against the Athletics in Oakland...The Pirates have gone 0-7 against the As in interleague action, having been swept in Oakland in 2004 and in Pittsburgh in 2002...Pittsburgh went 1-2 against the Giants across the Bay earlier this season (April 12-14).

**A HOMECOMING OF SORTS:** Bucco infielder **Bobby Crosby** was Oakland's first-round selection (25th pick overall) in the 2001 First-Year Player Draft...He played seven seasons with the Athletics and was named the A.L. Rookie-of-the-Year in 2004 after hitting 22 home runs and knocking in 64 runs in 151 games...Crosby has gone 10-for-19 (.526) in his last five games - all starts at shortstop.

**GOOD TIMING:** In the last three games, the Pirates have gone 12-for-22 (.545) with runners in scoring position...**Bobby Crosby** has four hits in his last five at bats with RISP and **Garrett Jones** has eight hits in his last 11 such at bats.

**SKID MARKS ON THE ROAD:** The Bucs have lost 15 straight games on the road, winning for the last time away from home on May 25 in Cincinnati...**Zach Duke** is the last starting pitcher to win a game on the road, doing so against Roy Halladay on May 18.

**ROAD TRIP:** The Pirates have gone 0-4 on this nine-game road trip following their three games against the Rangers and last night's game in Oakland...The trip also includes three games against the Cubs at Wrigley Field beginning Monday night...The Bucs then play four games at home before returning to the road for six games.

**MR. CLUTCH:** **Lastings Milledge** ranks sixth in the Major Leagues and third in the National League with a .392 batting average with runners in scoring position...He also ranks third among N.L. hitters with a .371 average while batting with runners on base...Milledge has gone 10-for-22 (.455) in his last seven games and 14-for-32 (.438) in his last 11.

**ARMED AND DANGEROUS:** Pittsburgh leads the Majors with 21 outfield assists and 13 of them have gunned down runners at home plate...The Pirates led the Majors Leagues with 45 outfield assists last season.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** The Pirates are 2-11 after the first 13 games of their 15-game stretch against American League opponents against Detroit (0-3), Chicago (0-3), Cleveland (2-1), Texas (0-3) and Oakland (0-1)...The interleague schedule wraps up with tomorrow afternoon's games here in Oakland.

**JUST ANOTHER "W":** Las Sunday **Brendan Donnelly** improved his season record to 3-1 and he has now gone 15-2 since 2006...Donnelly has the highest winning percentage among all Major League relievers since 2002 (32-10, .762).

**SAVING GRACE:** Bucco closer **Octavio Dotel** has converted 11 of his last 12 save opportunities and has held opposing hitters to a .109 average (5-for-46) in those 12 games...Overall he has gone 14-for-17 in save chances this season.

**ON THE D.L.:** LHP **Zach Duke** (left elbow flexor pronator strain), RHP **Chris Jakubauskas** (head contusion and concussion), RHP **Charlie Morton** (right shoulder fatigue) and first baseman **Steve Pearce** (sprained right ankle) are on the 15-day disabled list...RHP **Jose Ascanio** (rehabbing from right shoulder surgery) is on the 60-day D.L.

**DANIEL McCUTCHEN:** The 27-year-old righthander is making his fourth start/fifth appearance of the season with Pittsburgh tonight...He was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis on Friday.

**LAST START:** McCutchen gave up just two runs in 7.0 innings, but suffered a 2-0 loss vs. Durham Monday night.

**WITH INDY:** Daniel went 4-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 10 Triple-A starts this season...He pitched 7.0 innings in each of his last three assignments and at least 6.0 innings in seven of his 10 starts overall...He also posted a 2.73 ERA (26.1ip/8er) in his last four outings (all coming during the month of June).

**WITH PITTSBURGH:** McCutchen was tabbed as the team's fifth starter on 3/23 and was a member of a Major League Opening Day roster for the first time in his career...He suffered a 15-6 loss in his first start with the Bucs and was optioned to Triple-A on 4/12, but returned to the big league club without making an appearance with Indy...After receiving a no-decision in his second start on 4/17, he was the starting pitcher in Pittsburgh's 20-0 loss to the Brewers on 4/22...Daniel then tossed a scoreless inning of relief with the Bucs on 4/24 at Houston before being optioned to Triple-A the following day.

**SAVING THE BEST FOR LAST:** McCutchen made six starts for the Pirates in 2009 and picked up his first Major League victory in his final start on 10/2 at Cincinnati - the exact location he made his big league debut on 8/31.

**THIS & THAT:** Daniel was acquired from the New York Yankees along with pitchers Ross Ohlendorf and Jeff Karstens and outfielder Jose Tabata in exchange for outfielder Xavier Nady and pitcher Damaso Marte on 7/26/08...He pitched collegiately at Oklahoma - the same school where manager John Russell played...Was selected to play for Team USA in the 2009 World Cup, but did not participate due to his promotion to the Major Leagues.
