FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and sixth start of the season...the A's are 2-3 (.400) in his starting assignments this year and 8-14 (.364) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in two of his five starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer three times.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 1-1 with a 2.59 ERA in five games, four starts, when the A's called for the first time on May 4...started

that night against Texas, had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day...went 2-0 with a 4.15 ERA in two more starts with the River Cats before returning to Oakland May 20...went 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) in three relief appearances before taking Anderson's spot in the starting rotation on June 8...is 1-2 with a 3.91 ERA (10 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts since then.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (14 er in 26.0 ip) and .250 (25 for 100) opponents batting average in five starts and 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) and .409 (18 for 44) opponents average in three relief appearances.

SIX INNINGS OR LESS: Tossed 7.0 innings in his last start last Wednesday against Cincinnati, snapping an Oakland record streak of 19 consecutive starts with 6.0 innings pitched or fewer...broke the previous mark of 14 held by five pitchers, most recently by Kirk Saarloos from July 19, 2004 to June 11, 2005.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed seven home runs and six have come with runners on base...four have been hit by the opponents cleanup hitter...has yielded a .600 (12 for 20) batting average against the opponents number two hitter.

IN RELIEF: Tossed 5.0 innings of relief against Detroit May 20 in the first relief appearance of his career after 19 starts...it is the longest outing by an A's reliever this year...relieved starting pitcher Tyson Ross who pitched 4.0 innings in the A's 5-2 loss...his second outing also came against Detroit on May 30 and he pitched the final two innings of the A's 10-2 loss...allowed five unearned runs in the eighth inning...tossed 3.1 innings of relief June 3 at Boston after Brett Anderson left the game following the second inning with an injury...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-8 win...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances and also allowed one home run in each outing...struck out two of his first batters faced and walked the other.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Texas on May 4 in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first and three times in the second to take a 5-0 lead but he allowed four runs in the third inning on just one hit, a Guerrero grand slam...issued three walks in the inning and was relieved by Breslow after walking the leadoff batter in the fourth inning...left with a 5-4 lead...the four walks matched his career high (sixth time) and the 3.0 innings pitched matched his fewest as a starter.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-1 win over Los Angeles on June 8 in Oakland...did not walk a batter for the second time in his career...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a single to Rivera and a double to Ryan to start the inning but then retired the final three batters, with Rivera scoring on a Frandsen ground out.

THIRD START: He had his two-game winning streak snapped in the A's 6-2 loss at San Francisco June 13...allowed a career high tying two home runs (fourth time)...the Giants scored an unearned run in the second on a Molina RBI single and he allowed back-to-back home runs in the sixth inning, a two-run shot by Huff and a solo home run by Uribe.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at St. Louis June 18...allowed a two-run home run to Holliday in the first but the A's came back with four runs in the second inning...he retired 12 of the next 15 batters following the home run but then allowed RBI singles to Holliday and Pujols in the fifth inning...left after six innings with the scored tied at 4-4.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Cincinnati last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning as he loaded the bases with two outs before Bruce had a two-run single...those were the only two runs he would allow in seven innings as he shutout eh Reds on four hits and a hit batter over his final six innings...Cueto, Masset and Cordero combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

MAZZARO vs. BALTIMORE: Is 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA (12.2 ip, 13 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both last year...combined with Wuertz, Breslow and Bailey on a five-hit shutout in his first start, a 3-0 A's win on June 7 in Oakland...tossed 7.1 innings and allowed all five of the hits without walking a batter...allowed a leadoff single to Jones but then retired 15 of the next 16 hitters, allowing another single to Jones in the third...was relieved by Wuertz after allowing a one-out single to Andino in the eighth inning...also picked up the win in a 6-2 A's win at Baltimore August 12...blanked the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 4-0 lead entering the bottom of the sixth...allowed a two-run home run to Huff and another run when Scott scored on a Rajai Davis error on a Wieters single...was relieve by Breslow with a runner on third base and one out and Breslow retired the final two batters to preserve the 4-3 lead.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA in seven games, six starts, with the River Cats...allowed two home runs in 37.1 innings...opponents hit .245, including .204 (11 for 54) by left-handed hitters and .270 (24 for 89) by right-handers...yielded a .200 (8 for 40) mark with runners in scoring position...allowed six of his 16 runs in the first inning for a 9.00 ERA (6 er in 6.0 ip) and .360 (9 for 25) opponents batting average...had a 2.01 ERA (7 er in 31.1 ip) and .220 (26 for
