ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Pittsburgh over the weekend, their third sweep of the season and their first since May 21-23 against San Francisco...enter tonight's game on a four-game winning streak, which equals their season high (also April 6-9 and May 26-29)...however, have lost seven of the last 12 games and 10 of the last 16...are in third place in the American League West and trail Texas by nine games...finished the month of May in first place in the AL West and had a one-game lead with a 28-24 record...have gone 10-16 in June while Texas has logged a 20-6 record and Los Angeles 18-8...have lost 10 games in the standings over that 26-game stretch...are 11-15 in the first game of a series, 10-15 in the second game and 14-8 in the third game...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 26 days in second, one day tied for second, 24 days in third and one day in fourth.

IN JUNE: The A's are 10-16 (.385) in the month of June, which is the third worst record in the American League behind Baltimore (8-17) and Toronto (9-16)...have clinched a losing record in June for the second consecutive season after seven consecutive winning Junes...the 16 losses are the A's most in June since 1999 when they went 10-16...the last time the A's lost more than 16 games in June was in 1986 when they went 7-22...are batting .281 (256 for 910), which ranks fourth in the AL...however, have just 64 walks, which ranks second fewest...the last time the A's walked fewer than 69 times in a month of 12 or more games was in July, 1987 when they had 60...have hit 20 home runs this month after connecting for just 15 in both April and May.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 3-3 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (0-3) and Pittsburgh (3-0)...this is part of a six-game road trip against Baltimore (1-0, three games) and Cleveland (three games)...went 2-7 on the last road trip against San Francisco (0-3), Chicago (1-2) and St. Louis (1-2), marking the third time in five trips this year in which the A's finished with two wins or fewer (went 1-5 on a pair of six-game trips from April 27-May 2 and May 11-16)...the A's are 14-24 (.368) on the road and 24-16 (.600) at home...have the fourth worst road record in the American League...have a 5.08 ERA (184 er in 326.0 ip) on the road compared to 2.88 (117 er in 365.0 ip) with six of their eight shutouts at home...have the third highest road ERA in the AL and the lowest home ERA...have allowed 56 home runs on the road compared to 22 at home...**have allowed the most road home runs in the AL and have yielded the fewest at home...**starting pitchers are 9-16 with a 5.00 ERA (116 er in 209.0 ip) on the road compared to 18-11 with a 2.83 ERA (78 er in 248.0 ip at home).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have an 18-10 (.643) record in day games compared to 20-30 (.400) at night...the A's day record is tied for fourth best in the American League and the night record is tied for second worst (Baltimore, 15-37)...have a 2.92 ERA (81 er in 249.2 ip) during the day and a 4.49 ERA (220 er in 441.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 13-7 (.650) in one-run games with the win on Sunday, which is the second best record in the American League (Chicago, 16-8, .667)...however, have lost five of their last eight one-run decisions after winning 10 of their first 12...went 15-23 in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the AL...are 3-3 in extra inning games, which matches the A's extra inning win total from last year...have four walk-off wins after tallying just five in all of 2009.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.59 ERA (21 er in 73.0 ip) and .221 (60 for 271) opponents batting average over the last eight games...the A's lead the American League in shutouts (8) and fewest hit batters (14) and are tied for the lead with Chicago in pickoffs (15)...A's starters are 3-2 with a 2.26 ERA (13 er in 51.2 ip) and .216 (41 for 190) opponents batting average over the last eight games and have struck out 46 in 51.2 innings...have a 3.82 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have the second fewest home runs in the American League (50), third fewest extra base hits (200), and are tied for third fewest runs (316)...lead the AL in stolen base percentage (57 for 70, 81.4%), rank second in sacrifice hits (27) and tied for second in sacrifice flies (26)...the 27 sacrifice hits are the most by an A's team before the All-Star Break since the 1998 club had 30...the A's matched a season low with three hits on Sunday vs. Pittsburgh, did not score an earned run and won the game, 3-2...it marked just the sixth time in Oakland history the A's collected three hits or fewer, did not score an earned run and won (last: September 14, 2002 vs. Seattle).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 11 for their last 27 (.407) with four walks, two home runs and nine RBI...are batting .313 (15 for 48) with six walks, three home runs and 11 RBI for the season...lead the American League in average and home runs and rank second in RBI...the 15 pinch hits are already the A's second best total over the last six seasons (had 16 in 2008)...the three home runs match their combined total from 2005-09...A's pinch hitters combined for a .173 average over the previous six seasons.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have turned four double plays over their last two games, but have just 60 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL (Los Angeles, 58) and fourth fewest in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's finished interleague play with an 8-10 record (3-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-2 vs. Chicago, 1-2 vs. St. Louis, 0-3 vs. Cincinnati, 3-0 vs. Pittsburgh)...it marked the second consecutive season and fourth time in 14 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing record against the National League...are now 70-74 (.486) in interleague play since 2003 but are 136-112 (.548) all-time, which is tied for the sixth best record in the majors...ranked fourth in the majors this year with a 3.34 ERA...hit just eight home runs, which tied for second fewest in the majors and was second fewest in Oakland history (6 in 2006).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 15 times this year and 79 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the 15 players have combined to miss 598 games (39.9 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at seven (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Meloan, Outman)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four.

A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lead the season series 6-2...won three of four in Oakland in April and are 3-1 in Baltimore...last night's win clinched the season series for the third consecutive year and 11th time in the last 12 years...have won 16 of the last 19 games and have won six consecutive series...have won 18 of the last 23 games at Camden Yards...are 71-30 (.703) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 238-236 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 117-124 in Oakland and 121-112 in Baltimore, including 54-38 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 974-916 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Kevin Kouzmanoff is batting .350 (36 for 103) with five home runs and 14 RBI in June and his 36 hits rank fifth in the American League.

Kurt Suzuki has a team-leading 10 home runs, which is tied for second among AL catchers. He also ranks third among AL catchers in RBI (34) despite missing 19 games while on the DL and three on the Bereavement List. His six homers in June is tied for seventh most in the AL.

Cliff Pennington is batting .431 (22 for 51) with seven multiple hit games over his last 16 games after going 3 for his previous 46.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1995**, Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in **2001**, Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season, which is tied for the American League lead...the A's are 6-10 (.375) in his starting assignments and his teams are 115-122 (.485) in his 237 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in 13 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up his first win since May 8 in his last start, snapping a four-game losing streak...posted a 3.91 ERA (22 er in 50.2 ip) and .238 (45 for 189) opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned eight starts...the eight-start streak without a win was one short of his career high of nine (July 4-October 2, 2001 and July 17-August 28, 2004)...the losing streak was his longest streak since dropping five straight from April 9-June 2, 2005...has seven losses for the season, which is tied for ninth in the American League

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-5 with a 6.95 ERA (35 er in 45.1 ip) and .312 (58 for 186) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 3.19 ERA (17 er in 48.0 ip) and .233 (41 for 176) opponents batting average in eight starts at home...has the third highest road ERA in the American League...has yielded 10 of his 14 home runs on the road and is tied for second in the AL in road home runs...has not won on the road since August 26, 2008 at St. Louis and is 0-6 with a 6.92 ERA (41 er in 53.1 ip) over his last 10 road starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Received five runs of support in his last start, matching his season high...has three runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 16 starts this year and his season run support of 3.18 (33 rs in 93.1 ip) is fourth lowest in the American League.

IN JUNE: Is 1-4 with a 5.23 ERA (18 er in 31.0 ip) and .280 (35 for 125) opponents batting average in five starts in June...this is the sixth time in his career he has lost four games in a month (last: September, 2004)...has never lost five in a month...over the last 12 years, the only A's pitcher to lose five games in a month is Joe Kennedy (September, 2005).

EXTRA BASE HITS: Has yielded a Major League leading 48 extra base hits, tied for first in doubles (28) allowed and ranks second in triples (6)...is tied for sixth in the American League in home runs (14)...has a .500 opponents slugging percentage, which is third highest in the AL...set an Oakland record by allowing eight extra base hits on May 2 at Toronto...broke the previous mark of seven (eight times, last by Mike Oquist on May 4, 1999).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .324 (34 for 105) average with runners in scoring position, including .375 (18 for 48) with RISP and two outs...opponents are 27 for 84 (.321) with 12 walks (.406 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has issued 24 of his 37 walks to left-handed hitters.

ALL STARTS: Has made 237 career appearances and all have been starts...those are the fourth most appearances in major league history among pitchers who have never made a relief appearance.

2010 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss to Seattle on Opening Night **April 5** in Oakland...it was his first start since September 27, 2008 against the Chicago Cubs...became the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in the last five years (Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...it was his seventh career Opening Day start and he is 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (12 er in 41.2 ip) in those seven starts...picked up his first win since September 6, 2008 in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore **April 15**...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to New York **April 21** in Oakland...Hughes no-hit the A's over the first seven innings before Oakland scored its only run in the eighth...allowed eight runs on **April 27** at Tampa Bay and nine on **May 2** at Toronto to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least eight runs in back-to-back starts...Mark Mulder was the other (September 15-21, 2004) but Sheets was the first with at least eight earned runs...the nine runs against the Blue Jays were his most in a game since August 15, 2005 at Colorado when he allowed 10 runs...snapped his three-game losing streak in the A's 4-2 win over Tampa Bay on **May 8**...combined with Wuertz, Blevins, Ziegler and Bailey on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over San Francisco **May 23**...however, ended up with a no decision as he tossed six innings but left with the score tied at 0-0...it was the 17th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher had a no decision in a shutout...had his fourth consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Detroit **May 28**...it was the first time in his career he had four straight no decisions...hurled 7.0 innings, snapping a career long streak of 13 consecutive starts of fewer than seven innings...tossed 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Los Angeles **June 7** to go over the 1500 innings pitched mark in his career...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at St. Louis **June 19**.

LAST START: He won for the first time since May 8 in the A's 14-4 victory over Pittsburgh last Friday in Oakland...struck out a season high nine batters in 6.0 innings and did not issue a walk...allowed two runs in the first inning on a McCutchen RBI double and an error but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first...allowed a RBI double to Doumit in the third but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and once in the fourth to take a 5-3 lead...also allowed a solo home run to Walker in the fifth.

SHEETS vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-1 with a 3.75 ERA (12.0 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two career starts...the win came in his only start this year, a 6-2 decision on April 15 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 shutout innings despite allowing five hits and walking three...stranded eight base runners and left runners in scoring position in four of his six innings...left with a 5-0 lead and the bullpen allowed single runs in the seventh and ninth innings...the loss came in a 5-4 Milwaukee loss at Baltimore on June 15, 2003...allowed a RBI single to Surhoff in the second inning but the Brewers scored twice in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead...he then yielded four runs in the bottom of the fourth on two-run home runs by Batista and Cruz.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (7-2, 2.88 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season ... is 6-0 with a 2.24 ERA (52.1 ip, 36 h, 13 r, 13 er, 18 bb, 42 so, 3 hr) and .198 (36 for 182) opponents batting average over his last eight starts... the winning streak is a career high and is tied for the second longest streak in the American League this year (Lester, BOS 8)... his .778 winning percentage is fourth best in the American League... all seven of his wins have come since the start of May, which is tied for seventh most in the AL over that span... has not allowed a run in the first inning this year and opponents are 3 for 37 (.081) with three walks... in his last start, combined with Breslow and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Pittsburgh Saturday in Oakland... tossed 7.2 innings, allowed both of the hits and struck out a career high 10... is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (19.0 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in three career starts vs. the Orioles, including a win in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's win at Baltimore May 26... retired each of the first seven batters he faced May 26 and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run on an Atkins home run in the third inning... left after six innings with a 6-1 lead.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

12-13, 4.12 ERA (234.0 ip, 228 h, 116 r, 107 er, 100 bb, 203 so, 30 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 17/24 (70.8%)

The A's bullpen has allowed three runs in 15.1 innings over the past six games (1.76 ERA) since being charged with three losses in the previous five games (10 er in 12.1 ip, 7.30 ERA)...is now 3-6 with four saves, three blown saves and a 4.52 ERA (73.2 ip, 73 h, 37 r, 37 er, 33 bb, 70 so, 10 hr) in June...the pen ranks second in the American League in home runs allowed (30), is third in innings pitched (234.0), strikeouts (203) and wins (12), is fourth in hits allowed (228) and is tied for fourth in losses (13)...has had three save opportunities over the past two games but has just five over the last 19 games and 24 for the season, which is tied with Tampa Bay and Cleveland for the fewest in the American League...has a 3.00 ERA (39 er in 117.0 ip) at home compared to a 5.23 ERA (68 er in 117.0 ip) on the road.

- His next appearance will be the 100th of his Major League career.
- Has not allowed a run in seven of his past eight appearances (1.13 ERA, 1 er in 8.0 ip) after allowing a run in three of his previous four appearances (5.07 ERA, 3 er in 5.1 ip)...has a 1.69 ERA for the season, which is tied for sixth lowest among American League relievers.
- Has 41 career saves, which is good for ninth in Oakland history (Koch and Foulke are tied for seventh, 44).
- Has a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) in Oakland and a 2.57 ERA (4 er in 14.0 ip) on the road...has allowed both of his home runs on the road.
- Has yielded a .176 (9 for 51) batting average to left-handed hitters and a .182 (6 for 33) mark with runners in scoring position.
