### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Snapped a season-high-tying four-game winning streak last night in losing 9-6 to the Orioles...have lost eight of the last 13 games and 11 of the last 17... swept a three-game series from Pittsburgh over the weekend, their third sweep of the season and their first since May 21-23 against San Francisco...are in third place in the American League West and trail Texas by 10 games...finished the month of May in first place in the AL West with a one-game lead and 28-24 record...however, they posted a 10-17 mark in June while Texas logged a 21-6 record and Los Angeles went 18-9... lost 11 games in the standings during the month of June, a 27-game stretch...are 11-15 in the first game of a series, 10-16 in the second game and 14-8 in the third game...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 26 days in second, one day tied for second, 25 days in third and one day in fourth.

**IN JUNE:** The A's finished the month of June with a 10-17 (.370) mark, which is the third worst record in the American League behind Baltimore and Toronto (both 9-17)...it was their second straight losing record in June after seven consecutive winning Junes...the 17 losses are the A's most in June since 1986 when they went 7-22...batted .281 (266 for 945) for the month, which ranked fourth in the AL...however, had just 67 walks, which ranked second fewest...the last time the A's walked fewer than 69 times in a month of 12 or more games was in July, 1987 when they had 60... hit 21 home runs in June after connecting for just 15 in both April and May.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's went 3-3 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (0-3) and Pittsburgh (3-0)...are 1-1 on this six-game road trip against Baltimore (1-1, three games) and Cleveland (three games)...went 2-7 on the last road trip against San Francisco (0-3), Chicago (1-2) and St. Louis (1-2), marking the third time in five trips this year in which the A's finished with two wins or fewer (went 1-5 on a pair of six-game trips from April 27-May 2 and May 11-16)...the A's are 14-25 (.359) on the road and 24-16 (.600) at home...have the fourth worst road record in the American League...have a 5.17 ERA (192 er in 334.0 ip) on the road compared to 2.88 (117 er in 365.0 ip) with six of their eight shutouts at home...**have the second highest road ERA in the AL and the lowest home ERA...**have allowed 61 home runs on the road compared to 22 at home...**have allowed the most road home runs in the AL and have yielded the fewest at home...**starting pitchers are 9-16 with a 4.98 ERA (119 er in 215.0 ip) on the road compared to 18-11 with a 2.83 ERA (78 er in 248.0 ip at home).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have an 18-10 (.643) record in day games compared to 20-31 (.392) at night...the A's day record is tied for third best in the American League while the night record is tied for second worst (Baltimore, 16-38)...have a 2.92 ERA (81 er in 249.2 ip) during the day and a 4.57 ERA (228 er in 449.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the AL.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's improved to 13-7 (.650) in one-run games with Sunday's win vs. Pittsburgh, which is the best record in the Major Leagues...however, have lost five of their last eight one-run decisions after winning 10 of their first 12...went 15-23 in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the AL...are 3-3 in extra inning games, which matches the A's extra inning win total from last year...have four walk-off wins after tallying just five in all of 2009.

**PITCHING:** A's pitchers have compiled a 3.22 ERA (29 er in 81.0 ip) and .235 (72 for 306) opponents batting average over the last nine games...the A's lead the American League in shutouts (8) and fewest hit batters (14) and are tied for the lead with Chicago in pickoffs (15)...A's starters are 3-2 with a 2.50 ERA (16 er in 57.2 ip) and .224 (48 for 214) opponents batting average over the last nine games and have struck out 50 in 57.2 innings...starters have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have the second fewest home runs in the American League (51), third fewest extra base hits (201), and fourth fewest runs (322)...lead the AL in stolen base percentage (57 for 70, 81.4%), are tied for first in sacrifice hits (28) and rank third in sacrifice flies (26)...the 28 sacrifice hits are the most by an A's team before the All-Star Break since the 1998 club had 30...the A's matched a season low with three hits on Sunday vs. Pittsburgh, did not score an earned run and won the game, 3-2...it marked just the sixth time in Oakland history the A's collected three hits or fewer, did not score an earned run and won (last: September 14, 2002 vs. Seattle).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 11 for their last 29 (.379) with four walks, two home runs and nine RBI...are batting .300 (15 for 50) with six walks, three home runs and 11 RBI for the season...lead the American League in home runs, rank second in RBI and are third in average...the 15 pinch hits are already the A's second best total over the last six seasons (had 16 in 2008)...the three home runs match their combined total from 2005-09...A's pinch hitters combined for a .173 average over the previous six seasons.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have turned four double plays over their last three games, but have just 61 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL (Los Angeles, 60) and fourth fewest in the majors.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's finished interleague play with an 8-10 record (3-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-2 vs. Chicago, 1-2 vs. St. Louis, 0-3 vs. Cincinnati, 3-0 vs. Pittsburgh)...it marked the second consecutive season and fourth time in 14 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing record against the National League...are now 70-74 (.486) in interleague play since 2003 but are 136-112 (.548) all-time, which is tied for the sixth best record in the majors...ranked fourth in the majors this year with a 3.34 ERA...hit just eight home runs, which tied for second fewest in the majors and was second fewest in Oakland history (6 in 2006).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 15 times this year and 79 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the 15 players have combined to miss 605 games (40.3 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at seven (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Meloan, Outman)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

### A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lead the season series, 6-3...won three of four in Oakland in April and are 3-2 in Baltimore...Tuesday night's win clinched the season series for the third consecutive year and 11<sup>th</sup> time in the last 12 years...have won 16 of the last 20 games and have won six consecutive series...have won 18 of the last 24 games at Camden Yards...are 71-31 (.696) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 238-237 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 117-124 in Oakland and 121-113 in Baltimore, including 54-39 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 974-917 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** is batting .407 (11 for 27) with two doubles, two triples, two homers, six RBI and three stolen bases in his seven games since coming off the DL June 22.

**Kurt Suzuki** has a team-leading 10 home runs, which is tied for second among AL catchers. He also ranks third among AL catchers in RBI (34) despite missing 19 games while on the DL and three on the Bereavement List.

**Cliff Pennington** is batting .426 (23 for 54) with seven multiple hit games over his last 17 games after going 3 for his previous 46.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1902**, Rube Waddell becomes the first major league pitcher to strikeout the side on nine pitches. He turns the trick in the third inning of the A's 2-0 win over Baltimore...in **1979**, the A's collect a club record 29 hits in a 13-12, 15 inning win at Texas

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and are 25-19 (.568) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in eight of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

**SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Is 6-0 with a 2.24 ERA (52.1 ip, 36 h, 13 r, 13 er, 18 bb, 42 so, 3 hr) and .198 (36 for 182) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...the winning streak is a career high and is tied for the second longest streak in the American League this year (Lester, BOS 8)...it is the longest winning streak by an A's starting pitcher since Dan Haren had a 10-game winning streak from April 18-July 1, 2007...his previous career high was four from August 27 to September 22, 2009.

**WINS:** Is 7-2 and his .778 winning percentage is fourth best in the American League...all seven of his wins have come since the start of May, which is tied for seventh most in the AL over that span ...last year he did not record his seventh win until August 27 (number eight came on September 2).

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Has 75.0 innings pitched, which is four innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 70 innings, he ranks third in the American League in opponents batting average (.213) and ninth in ERA (2.88).

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has not allowed a run in the first inning this year and opponents are 3 for 37 (.081) with three walks...now has a streak of 15 consecutive starts without a run in the first inning dating back to last year and has not allowed a first inning run since September 9, 2009 at Chicago (AL)...has a 1.84 (9 er in 44.0 ip) career ERA in the first inning...this year, he has a 1.69 ERA (9 er in 48.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 5.00 ERA (15 er in 27.0 ip) after that.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 30 and allowed eight runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings in a start that day at Toronto...then went 4-1 with a 1.96 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in six starts in May and 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in five starts in June...ranked fourth in the American League in ERA in May, tied for fifth in wins and tied for seventh in opponents batting...was eighth in opponents batting in June.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .205 (9 for 44) average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .218 (36 for 165) with RISP last year, which was the eighth lowest mark in the American League...opponents are batting .187 (14 for 75) when leading off an inning...has yielded a .144 (14 for 97) batting average the first time through the lineup, .227 (22 for 97) the second time through and .284 (21 for 74) after that...has limited the opponents three, four and five hitters to a .167 (16 for 96) batting average.

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed two home runs June 20 to snap a career high tying four-game homerless streak (also August 11-27, 2009)...now has eight home runs for the season...last year, he set an Oakland rookie record by allowing 27 home runs...has allowed all eight of his home runs this year on the road...last year, he surrendered 20 home runs at home to set a Coliseum record...six of his eight home runs have been hit by right-handers after yielding 21 of his 27 home runs in 2009 to lefties.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA (26.0 ip, 18 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 26 so) in four interleague starts this year...tied for second in the majors in wins (Buehrle, CWS 4)...is now 5-2 with a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) in eight career interleague starts compared to 12-13 with a 4.36 ERA in 36 career starts against American League competition.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-0 with a 1.35 ERA (5 er in 33.1 ip) in five starts at home and now has a six-game home winning streak dating back to last year...has a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over that seven start stretch...is 3-2 with a 4.10 ERA (19 er in 41.2 ip) on the road.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a stress reaction in his left scapula...made one rehab start for Triple-A Sacramento on April 19 and was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento the next day...it was his first career stint on the DL.

**LAST START:** He combined with Breslow and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Pittsburgh last Saturday in Oakland...tossed 7.2 innings, allowed both of the hits and struck out a career high 10...yielded a two-out single to Tabata in the third and a leadoff single to Milledge in the eighth and allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position.

**CAHILL vs. BALTIMORE:** Is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (19.0 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in three career starts, including a win in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's win at Baltimore on May 26...retired each of the first seven batters he faced and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run on an Atkins home run in the third inning...left after six innings with a 6-1 lead...went 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA in two starts last year...the win came in the A's 9-4 decision in Oakland on June 6...shutout the Orioles on four hits and no walks over the first six innings and allowed just two runners into scoring position...had a 9-0 lead entering the seventh inning and allowed back-to-back singles to Scott and Huff to start the inning...was relieved by Ziegler who allowed both of the runs to score...then took the loss in a 3-2 decision at Baltimore on August 11...allowed a run in the second inning on a RBI groundout by Mora, but the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to take a 2-1 lead...he then allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth on a RBI single by Roberts and a RBI groundout by Jones.

**WITH SACRAMENTO:** Was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (8.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 8 so) and .226 (7 for 31) opponents batting average in two starts with Sacramento...his opponents average included a .200 (2 for 10) mark against left-handed pitching and .238 (5 for 21) against right-handers...opponents were 1 for 12 (.083) with runners in scoring position.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Gio Gonzalez (6-5, 3.74 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 17<sup>th</sup> start of the season, which will equal the most in the American League ...has allowed just one run in each of his last two starts but has two no decisions, receiving a combined three runs of support in the two starts... now has run support of two runs or less in each of his last four starts and 10 of his 16 starts this year... has received support of one run or less in each of his last seven losses dating back to last year... has six career starts with no run support and is 2-15 in 22 career starts with run support of two runs or less, while is 11-1 in 18 starts with three runs of support or more... allowed only one run in his last start, an A's 3-2 win over Pittsburgh last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 2 so, 1 hr)... is 2-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 3 er, 8 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in three career starts vs. the Indians, including a win in his only start this year when he combined with Kilby and Bailey on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 11-0 win in Oakland April 25... tossed 7.0 innings and allowed five of the hits while walking two.... all five hits and two walks came over the first four innings and he retired each of the last 10 batters that he faced.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

**12-14, 4.27 ERA (236.0 ip, 233 h, 121 r, 112 er, 103 bb, 206 so, 33 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 17/25 (68.0%)**

The A's bullpen allowed five runs in two innings on Wednesday after allowing three runs in 15.1 innings over the previous six games (1.76 ERA)...finished the month of June with a 3-7 record, four saves, four blown saves and a 4.52 ERA (75.2 ip, 78 h, 42 r, 42 er, 36 bb, 73 so, 13 hr)...the pen ranks second in the American League in home runs allowed (33), is tied for second in losses (14), is third in innings pitched (236.0), strikeouts (206) and wins (12) and is tied for third in hits allowed (228)...has had four save opportunities over the past three games but has just six over the last 20 games and 25 for the season, which is tied for the second fewest in the American League...has a 3.00 ERA (39 er in 117.0 ip) at home compared to a 5.52 ERA (73 er in 119.0 ip) on the road.

- Has not allowed a run in seven of his past eight appearances (1.13 ERA, 1 er in 8.0 ip) after allowing a run in three of his previous four appearances (5.07 ERA, 3 er in 5.1 ip)...has a 1.69 ERA for the season, which is seventh lowest among American League relievers.
- Has 41 career saves, which is good for ninth in Oakland history (Koch and Foulke are tied for seventh, 44).
