#### A's vs. INDIANS

The A's lead the season series 3-2 after taking two of three in Oakland in April and splitting the first two here ...have won eight of their last 10 games against Cleveland...each team has won two seasons series over the previous four years and the A's are 22-18 against Cleveland since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 245-214 against the Indians...that includes 131-94 in Oakland and 114-120 in Cleveland, including 29-51 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 880-1007 vs. the Indians.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

A's second baseman have not committed an error this year...that includes 43 games by Adam Rosales, 41 by Mark Ellis, five by Eric Patterson and one by Steve Tolleson

Daric Barton is hitting .374 (16 for 43) with seven RBI in his last 12 games. He leads the American League in games played (82) and walks (51), and is tied for second in sacrifice hits (10).

**Jack Cust** is batting .348 (23 for 66) over his last 23 games after hitting .229 over his first 15 contests.

Cliff Pennington, who was 3 for 4 with a double and triple last night, is batting .448 (30 for 67) with nine multiple hit games over his last 20 games...is tied for third in the American League with four triples and also is tied for fifth in the AL in stolen base percentage (12 for 14, 85.7%).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1905, in the afternoon game of a doubleheader, Rube Waddell defeats Boston's Cy Young in a 20-inning marathon, 4-2. A's catcher Ossee Schreckengost works all 29 innings of the doubleheader to set a major league record ...in 1988, Mark McGwire homers in the 16th inning for the second consecutive day as the A's defeat the Cleveland Indians 4-2.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two of three and six of the last eight games after going 2-10 over the previous 12 contests...are in third place in the American League West, trailing Texas by nine games...finished the month of May in first place in the AL West and had a one-game lead with a 28-24 record...have gone 12-18 since then while Texas has logged a 22-8 record and Los Angeles 19-11...have lost 10 games in the standings over that 30-game stretch...are 12-15 in the first game of a series, 10-17 in the second game and 15-8 in the third game...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 26 days in second, one day tied for second, 28 days in third and one day in fourth.

**4TH OF JULY:** Oakland is 22-18 all-time in games played on July 4th. The A's have played the Indians three times on the 4th, all in Cleveland. They beat the Tribe, 4-2, in 1988, but lost 8-1 in 1992 and 5-2 last season.

THE HALF WAY MARK: Friday night, Oakland played its 81<sup>st</sup> game of the season, which is the statistical half way point of the season...The A's are now 40-42 which puts them on pace for their best season over the last four years (went 75-87 last year, 75-86 in 2008 and 76-86 in 2007)...have 18 triples and are on pace for their most in a season since 1985 when they had 34...however, have just 51 home runs...in Oakland history, the A's have hit fewer than 110 home runs just three times in a non-strike season (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978, 108 in 1979)...have walked just 241 times and have walked fewer than 480 times in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (433 in 1978 and 472 in 1968)...the defense has turned just 61 double plays and have not had fewer than 140 in a non-strike season 1987 when they had 115...Kurt Suzuki leads the A's with 10 home runs and the last time the A's team leader finished with fewer than 22 home runs was in 1983 when Dwayne Murphy and Davey Lopes had 17 each...Rajai Davis tops the club with 26 steals...five players in Oakland history have stolen 50 or more bases in a season but only one has done it since 1979 (Rickey Henderson, who did it nine times, last in 1998 with 66)...Brad Ziegler and Craig Breslow lead the A's with 40 games pitched...the only pitcher in Oakland history to pitch in more than 78 games in a season is Billy Koch (84 in 2002).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Entering the finale of their six-game road trip today, the A's have scrolled a 3-2 mark against Baltimore (2-1) and Cleveland (1-1) on this East Coast swing...are now 16-26 (.381) on the road and 24-16 (.600) at home...have a 4.90 ERA (197 er in 361.2 ip) on the road compared to 2.88 (117 er in 365.0 ip) with six of their nine shutouts at home...have the fourth highest road ERA in the American League and the lowest home ERA...have allowed 62 home runs on the road compared to 22 at home...have allowed the most road home runs in the AL and have yielded the fewest at home...starting pitchers are 11-16 with a 4.72 ERA (123 er in 234.1 ip) on the road compared to 18-11 with a 2.83 ERA (78 er in 248.0 ip) at home...return home after today's contest for a six-game homestand vs. NY (three games) and LA (three games).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have an 18-10 (.643) record in day games compared to 22-32 (.407) at night...the A's day record is fourth best in the American League and the night record is second worst (Baltimore, 16-41)...have a 2.92 ERA (81 er in 249.2 ip) during the day and a 4.40 ERA (233 er in 477.0 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the AL.

**CLOSE CALLS:** With their 5-4, 10-inning loss last night, the A's are now 13-8 (.619) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League (Chicago, 16-9) and third best in the majors...however, have lost six of their last nine one-run decisions after winning 10 of their first 12...went 15-23 in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the AL...are 3-4 in extra inning games, which matches the A's extra inning win total from last year...have four walk-off wins after tallying just five in all of 2009.

**PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-0 with a 2.28 ERA (13 er in 51.1 ip) and .210 (39 for 186) opponents batting average over the last eight games...starters now have a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...the A's pitching staff as a whole has a 2.82 ERA (34 er in 108.2 ip) and .228 (93 for 408) opponents average over the last 12 games...with Friday night's 3-0 whitewash, the A's lead the American League in shutouts with nine...also lead the AL in fewest hit batters (14) and rank second in pickoffs (15).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have hit one home run or less in each of the last 18 games and have 51 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Seattle, 50)...have the third fewest extra base hits (210)...lead the AL in stolen base percentage (59 for 72, 81.9%), rank second in sacrifice hits (28) and are tied for third in sacrifice flies (26)...the 28 sacrifice hits are the most by an A's team before the All-Star Break since the 1998 club had 30.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 11 for their last 30 (.367) with four walks, two home runs and nine RBI...are batting .294 (15 for 51) with six walks, three home runs and 11 RBI for the season...lead the American League in home runs, tied for second in RBI and rank third in batting average...the 15 pinch hits are already the A's second best total over the last six seasons (had 16 in 2008)...the three home runs match their combined total from 2005-09...A's pinch hitters combined for a .173 average over the previous six seasons.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have turned just 61 double plays, which is tied with Los Angeles for the fewest in the American League and is tied for third fewest in the majors.

**IN JUNE:** The A's went 10-17 (.360) in the month of June, which was the third worst record in the American League (Baltimore and Toronto, 9-17)...it was the A's worst record in June since going 7-22 (.241) in 1986...hit .281, which ranked fourth in the AL...however, had just 67 walks, which was second fewest in the AL...those were the A's fewest walks in a month of 12 or more games since they had 60 in July, 1987.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Including placing Braden yesterday, the A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 80 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the 16 players have combined to miss 620 games (38.8 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at eight (Anderson, Braden, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Meloan, Outman)...have had at least five players on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four.

**BRIEFLY:** Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 1-1 with a 2.59 ERA in five games, four starts, when the A's called for the first time on May 4...started that night against Texas, had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day...went 2-0 with a 4.15 ERA in two more starts with the River Cats before returning to Oakland May 20...went 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) in three relief appearances before taking Anderson's spot in the starting rotation on June 8.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 2-2 with a 4.22 ERA (15 er in 32.0 ip) and .237 (28 for 118) opponents batting average in six starts and 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) and .409 (18 for 44) opponents average in three relief appearances.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed seven home runs and six have come with runners on base...four have been hit by the opponents cleanup hitter...has yielded a .522 (12 for 23) batting average against the opponents number two hitter...opponents are 12 for 36 (.333) with eight walks and a hit by pitch (.467 onbase percentage) off him when leading off an inning.

**SIX INNINGS OR LESS:** Tossed 7.0 innings June 23 against Cincinnati, snapping an Oakland record streak of 19 consecutive starts with 6.0 innings pitched or fewer...broke the previous mark of 14 held by five pitchers, most recently by Kirk Saarloos from July 19, 2004 to June 11, 2005.

**IN RELIEF:** Tossed 5.0 innings of relief against Detroit May 20 in the first relief appearance of his career after 19 starts...it is the longest outing by an A's reliever this year...relieved starting pitcher Tyson Ross who pitched 4.0 innings in the A's 5-2 loss...his second outing also came against Detroit on May 30 and he pitched the final two innings of the A's 10-2 loss...allowed five unearned runs in the eighth inning...tossed 3.1 innings of relief June 3 at Boston after Brett Anderson left the game following the second inning with an injury...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-8 win...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances and also allowed one home run in each outing...struck out two of his first batters faced and walked the other

2010 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Texas on May 4 in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first and three times in the second to take a 5-0 lead but he allowed four runs in the third inning on just one hit, a Guerrero grand slam...issued three walks in the inning and was relieved by Breslow after walking the leadoff batter in the fourth inning...left with a 5-4 lead...the 3.0 innings pitched matched his fewest as a starter...picked up the win in the A's 10-1 victory over Los Angeles on *June 8* in Oakland...did not walk a batter for the second time in his career...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a single to Rivera and a double to Ryan to start the inning but then retired the final three batters, with Rivera scoring on a Frandsen ground out...had his two-game winning streak snapped in the A's 6-2 loss at San Francisco *June 13*...allowed a career high tying two home runs (fourth time)...the Giants scored an unearned run in the second on a Molina RBI single and he allowed back-to-back home runs in the sixth inning, a two-run shot by Huff and a solo home run by Uribe...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at St. Louis June 18...allowed a two-run home run to Holliday in the first but the A's came back with four runs in the second inning...he retired 12 of the next 15 batters following the home run but then allowed RBI singles to Holliday and Pujols in the fifth inning...left after six with the scored tied at 4-4...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Cincinnati June 23...allowed two runs in the first inning as he loaded the bases with two outs before Bruce had a two-run single...those were the only two runs he would allow in seven innings as he shutout eh Reds on four hits and a hit batter over his final six innings...Cueto, Masset and Cordero combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win at Baltimore on Tuesday...issued a career high six walks in 6.0 innings but allowed just three hits and one run...put the leadoff batter on base in each of the first five innings but the only run came when Lugo was hit by a pitch to start the fifth inning...Lugo moved to second on a wild pitch and scored on an Izturis double....retired the side in order in the sixth and was relieved after walking Lugo to start the seventh.

**MAZZARO vs. CLEVELAND:** Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 5-2 A's loss at Cleveland exactly one year ago today...faced the minimum over the first two innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Valbuena in the third inning...Francisco followed with a two run home run...also allowed a leadoff home run to Sizemore in the sixth inning and had runners on first and second with no outs in the seventh when he was relieved by Breslow...Breslow allowed one of those runs to score.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA in seven games, six starts, with the River Cats...allowed two home runs in 37.1 innings...opponents hit .245, including .204 (11 for 54) by left-handed hitters and .270 (24 for 89) by right-handers...yielded a .200 (8 for 40) mark with runners in scoring position...allowed six of his 16 runs in the first inning for a 9.00 ERA (6 er in 6.0 ip) and .360 (9 for 25) opponents batting average...had a 2.01 ERA (7 er in 31.1 ip) and .220 (26 for

RHP Ben Sheets (3-7, 4.98): Is scheduled to make his 18<sup>th</sup> start of the season, which is tied for the American League lead .... has tossed at least six innings in 14 of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer seven times...has yielded at least three extra base hits in each of his last seven starts, which is tied for the longest such streak in Oakland history (Mike Oquist, July 24-August 28, 1998 and Dan Haren, August 21-September 22, 2007).... has been tagged for a Major League-leading 51 extra base hits for the season... his season run support of 3.53 (39 rs in 99.1 ip) is seventh lowest in the American League... had a no decision in his last start, an A's 9-6 loss at Baltimore last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 7 h , 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 2 hr)... is 1-1 with a 1.38 ERA (13.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 8 bb, 9 so) in two career starts vs. New York... the loss came in his only start this year, a 3-1 setback April 21 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 0 hr).
