TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 6, 2002: During a pre-game ceremony, the Yankees dedicate a plaque in Monument Park in honor of "Mr. October" Reggie Jackson.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 7, 1937: At the fifth All-Star Game, Yankees 1B Lou Gehrig hits a home run and drives in four runs in the AL's 8-3 win.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the second game a three-game series at Oakland in their second trip to the Bay Area this season...following this series, will play four games in Seattle (from Thursday-Sunday), marking their final series before the All-Star break...this seven-game road trip marks their final trip to the West Coast this season...wrapped up a six-game homestand – their final 'stand of the first half – on Sunday, going 1-2 vs. Seattle and 2-1 vs. Toronto.

Own the best record in Baseball (51-31, .622) and lead the AL East by +2.0G...is the team's best start since 2004 (also 51-31)...took over first place in the AL East on 6/20 for the first time since 4/21...are a season-high 20G over .500...are 19-7-1 in series in 2010, marking the most series wins in the Majors...are 9-5-0 in road series this season.

Have won eight of their last 11 road games...overall, have won four of their last five games, eight of their last 12, 10 of their last 15 and 17 of their last 26.

HALFWAY CHECK-UP: The Yankees owned a 50-31 record through 81 games...marked the 11th time the franchise has won at least 50 games at the midway point (81 games) since the advent of the 162-game schedule in 1961...of the 10 prior times they have accomplished the feat (1961, '63, '76, '80, '87, '98, '99, 2002, '03 and '04), the team has advanced to the postseason nine times (all but '87), the World Series six times ('61, '63, '76, '98, '99, '03) and won the championship three times ('61, '98, '99)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the first team in the Majors to record 50 wins over each of the last six seasons has advanced to the postseason.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees won their third straight game, with a 3-1 victory at Oakland...**RHP Javier Vazquez** earned his seventh win of the season, limiting the A's to 1ER on 3H in 7.0IP (2BB, 2K)...retired his final nine batters faced and 14 of the last 17...**RHP Joba Chamberlain** tossed a scoreless eighth (1.0IP, 2K) and **RHP Mariano Rivera** (1.0IP) tossed a perfect ninth to record his 19th save of the season...**DH Nick Swisher** (2-for-4), **CF Curtis Granderson** (1-for-3) and **C Francisco Cervelli** (1-for-4) had consecutive two-out hits in the second to plate two runs...**1B Mark Teixeira** (1-for-5) hit his 14th home run of the season, a solo HR in the sixth inning.

TRIPLE YOUR PLEASURE: The Yankees lead the AL and rank fifth in the Majors with 20 triples this season...is one shy of their total from all of last year...last led the AL in triples in 1971 (43)...nine different Yankees have hit at least one triple this season (Gardner, Cervelli, Granderson, Swisher, Rodriguez, Cano, Jeter, Miranda, Winn).

TEX MARKS THE SPOT: Over his last 16 games (since 6/18), **1B Mark Teixeira** has batted .323 (20-for-62) with 11R, 6 doubles, 4HR and 16RBI, hitting safely in 15 of the contests...has raised his average nearly 20 points over the stretch from .224-.243...over the longer haul, has reached base safely in each of his last 26 games (since 6/6).

COMEBACK KIDS: The Yankees lead the AL with 24 come-from-behind victories, trailing only the Cincinnati Reds (26)...the Yankees led the Majors with 51 come-from-behind wins in 2009.

KEEP IT INTERNAL: **LF Brett Gardner** hit his second career inside-the-park HR in Sunday's win vs. Toronto (also on 5/15/09 vs. Minnesota off Jesse Crain)...has hit the Yankees' last two inside-the-park HRs...the last Yankee to hit an inside-the-park HR prior to Gardner was Ricky Ledee on 8/29/99 vs. Seattle...according to SABR's David Vincent, Gardner is the first player with multiple inside-the-park HRs as a Yankee since Mickey Rivers (1976-79).

Homered in back-to-back games for the first time in his career (hit grand slam on Saturday vs. Toronto)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, became the first player to hit a grand slam and an inside-the-park home run in back-to-back games since Scott Rolen from 7/2-3/99 w/ Philadelphia vs. Chicago-NL...is batting .366 (30-for-82) with 17R, 2 doubles, 2 triples, 3HR, 14RBI and 11BB in 27 games since 5/31.

VETERAN PRESENCE: **RHP Javier Vazquez** made his 400th career start on Monday at Oakland, becoming the seventh pitcher to reach the plateau as a Yankee (joins Catfish Hunter, Whitey Ford, Mike Mussina, Herb Pennock, Andy Pettitte and Red Ruffing)...the Yankees are the only team with two active pitchers each with 400 or more starts (also LHP Andy Pettitte-474GS)...the Yankees are also the only staff in Baseball to boast a trio of pitchers each with more than 2,000.0 career IP (Pettitte-3,031.2, LHP CC Sabathia-2,005.2IP and Vazquez-2,578.0IP)...in addition, the Yankees staff features five of Baseball's 13 active pitchers with at least 1,500 career strikeouts (Pettitte-2,228, Sabathia-1,683, Vazquez-2,326, RHP A.J. Burnett-1,551 and RHP Chan Ho Park-1,684).

YANKEES STARS ALIGN: Seven Yankees have now been named to the 2010 American League All-Star team, the most selections for any team in the Majors...**2B Robinson Cano** (second career All-Star selection) and **SS Derek Jeter** (11th) were elected via the fan vote...**RHP Phil Hughes** (first) and **RHP Mariano Rivera** (11th) were selected through the "Player Ballot"...**3B Alex Rodriguez** (13th) and **LHP CC Sabathia** (fourth) were chosen by AL Manager Joe Girardi in conjunction with Major League Baseball...**LHP Andy Pettitte** (third) was added to the

roster yesterday after Boston's Clay Buchholz went on the disabled list, as the next highest ranking pitcher on the Player Ballot.

This season marks the most All-Star selections for the franchise since eight Yankees were selected in 2004 (Giambi, Gordon, Jeter, Matsui, Rivera, Rodriguez, Sheffield, and Vazquez)...the four All-Star pitchers are the most for the team since 2001 (Clemens, Pettitte, Rivera and Stanton).

Jeter and **Rivera** are the only players to be named to the All-Star team with their current team at least 11 times, according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...both players now tie Bill Dickey (11) for fifth-most All-Star selections in franchise history, trailing Mickey Mantle (20), Yogi Berra (18), Joe DiMaggio (13) and Elston Howard (12).

According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, **Cano** and **Jeter** will look to join Willie Randolph and Bucky Dent (1980 and 1981) as the only other Yankees 2B/SS combo to start an All-Star game together.

"SEND SWISH": **OF Nick Swisher** is one of five finalists for the 2010 All-Star Game Final Vote...fans may vote at yankees.com through Thurs. at 4:00 p.m. and be entered to win tickets to an upcoming Yankees game and a Swisher autographed baseball.

GOING STREAKING: LHP CC Sabathia has won six straight starts since 6/3 (6-0, 2.00 ERA)...is just the second time in his career he has won six consecutive starts (also seven in-a-row from 8/5-9/7/05 w/ Cleveland)...with a win tonight, will be the first Yankee to earn a win in seven straight starts since Roger Clemens won eight straight from 5/26-7/4/01.

AT THE HALF: Yankees LHP CC Sabathia (10-3), **RHP Phil Hughes** (10-2) and **LHP Andy Pettitte** (10-2) are the just the fourth trio of Yankees pitchers to each have 10-or-more wins by the All-Star Break in the last 50 years (also 2003: Pettitte-11, Wells-11, Mussina-10; 1998: Cone-12, Wells-11, Pettitte-10; and 1976: Ellis-10, Figueroa-10 and Hunter-10)...the *Elias Sports Bureau* notes that they became the first trio of pitchers with 10-or-more wins through a club's first 80 games since the 1999 Houston Astros (Jose Lima, Shane Reynolds and Mike Hampton)...*Elias* also notes that of the Yankee trios listed above, only Cone, Wells and Pettitte in 1998 accomplished the feat within the club's first 80 games as it was done this year.

A PEEK AHEAD: Following the upcoming All-Star Break, the Yankees will play 40 of their remaining 74 games at Yankee Stadium (54.1%)...the team will not play any games further west than Arlington, Tex., the remainder of the 2010 regular season following this current trip...of the Yankees' 80 remaining games this season, 34 are against teams currently leading their division or within 5.0 games of the Wild Card (42.5%).

OUT FRONT: The Yankees are 32-8 this season when scoring the game's first run...is the second-best mark in the Majors behind the Cardinals who are 32-7 in such situations.

LOCKED WHEN LOADED: The Yankees lead the Majors with eight grand slams (Cano, Gardner, Granderson, Posada-2, Rodriguez-2, Teixeira)...with the bases loaded this season, the Yankees are batting a Major League best .420 (42-for-100) with 5 doubles, 8HR, and 118RBI...the Yankees hit just three slams in 2009...the club record is 10GS in 1987...last led the AL in GS in 2004 (9GS) and last led the Majors in 2003 (9GS).

CAN'T GET INTO DRIVE: SS Derek Jeter has gone a career-high 19 consecutive games without driving in a run according to the *Elias Sports Bureau* (last RBI came on 6/12 vs. Houston)...his longest previous RBI drought was a 13-game stretch from 7/16-30/04.

FOUR GOODNESS' SAKE: The Yankees are 43-5 this season when holding their opponent to four-or-fewer runs (82-14 in 2009), but are just 8-26 (21-45 in 2009) when allowing five runs or more...are 40-2 when allowing three-or-fewer runs.

A-LIST: 3B Alex Rodriguez has 595 career HR and needs 5HR to become the seventh player to reach 600HR...has 250HR as a Yankee, tying Graig Nettles (250) for eighth on the club's all-time list...reached 250HR in 963G as a Yankee...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, only Babe Ruth (250HR in first 774G w/ NYY) reached the total in fewer games as a Yankee.

SECOND TO NONE: 2B Robinson Cano is tied for first in the AL (second in the Majors) with Seattle's Ichiro Suzuki with 110H...ranks second in the Majors in batting average (.342) behind Minnesota's Justin Morneau (.344)...is tied for second in the AL in multi-hit games (33), ranks third in total bases (182) and is fourth in runs scored (59)...among all Major League 2B, is first with 55RBI, tied for first with 16HR (w/ Florida's Dan Uggla) and second with 59R and a .394 OBP...has reached safely in 74 of 82G in 2010 and started all but one team game at 2B...leads the Majors with 23RBI off LHP and is second with 10HR...*Elias* notes he is the first Yankees left-handed hitter with at least 10HR off LHP in consecutive seasons since Reggie Jackson (1979-80).

✧ Since 5/17, is batting .354 (64-for-181) with 33R, 14 doubles, 7HR and 32RBI in 45 games...had a 17-game hitting streak to kick off the stretch from 5/17-6/3.

JUMPIN' JULY: The Yankees have had 17 consecutive winning Julys (1993-2009), including a 18-9 (.667) mark in 2009...are 4-1 this July...according to *Elias Sports Bureau*, it marks the longest winning stretch of Julys in Major League history, breaking the previous record held by Pittsburgh (15 consecutive seasons, 1899-1913).

REHAB NOTES: DH Nick Johnson (inflamed right wrist tendon) has reported to the Yankees' minor league complex in Tampa to continue his rehab...**RHP Sergio Mitre** (strained left oblique) was scheduled to pitch 2.0 innings today for the GCL Yankees after yesterday's scheduled game was rained out.

AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: The Yankees play the second game of a three-game series at Oakland tonight...are 3-1 at the Coliseum this season, winning last night and taking two of the three from 4/20-22...have guaranteed their third straight non-losing road season series, and ninth in the last 13 years (since 1998)...their six games in Oakland in 2010 are their most since 2005 (went 5-1)...went 2-1 at Oakland in 2009...are 16-9 (.640) at the A's since the start of the 2004 season, marking the highest winning pct. by any AL team in Oakland over the span...had lost 11 of the previous 15 games there from 2001-03.

AT YANKEE STADIUM: The Yankees will welcome the A's to the Bronx for a four-game series from 8/30-9/2...went 5-1 at home against the A's in 2009 including a win in the first-ever night game at Yankee Stadium on 4/21...have won the home season series in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2004-05...have won eight of their last nine home games vs. the A's and are 18-9 vs. Oakland in the Bronx since 2004.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: LHP CC SABATHIA (10-3, 3.33 ERA)

LHP CC Sabathia, 29, will make his 18th start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...will be his 20th career start against the Athletics, fifth with the Yankees...**last started** on 7/1 vs. Seattle, winning his sixth straight start by limiting the Mariners to 1ER on 5H in 8.0IP (2R, 2BB, 4K)...tossed a season-high 117 pitches...the Yankees have scored just 10 combined runs over his last three starts (has won all three, allowing just three total runs, two of them earned)...leads the team in IP (116.1) and K (93) and is tied for the lead in wins (10 – w/ Hughes and Pettitte) and starts (17- w/ Burnett)...is in the second year of a seven-year contract signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08...is a native of Vallejo, Calif., growing up approximately one half-hour outside of Oakland

WINNING WAYS: Has won six straight starts since 6/3 after going winless in five straight starts from 5/8-29...is just the second time in his career he has won six consecutive starts (also seven in-a-row from 8/5-9/7/05 w/ Cleveland)...marks his fifth career winning streak of six or more decisions...with a win tonight, will be the first Yankee to earn a win in seven straight starts since Roger Clemens won eight straight from 5/26-7/4/01.

✦ At 10-3, has recorded at least 10 wins prior to the All-Star Break for just the second time in his career (also 12-3 in 2007 prior to the Midsummer Classic).

CC2K: Owns 2,005.2 career IP, surpassed 2,000.0 career innings pitched in his last start on 7/1 vs. Seattle...became the youngest pitcher to reach the mark since Greg Maddux reached the plateau in 1995 and the youngest lefthander since Fernando Valenzuela in 1990...the Yankees have three pitchers with at least 2,000.0IP (also Pettitte and Vazquez), becoming the only team to boast such a trio (credit: *Elias*).

8.0's ENOUGH: Has tossed 8.0 innings in each of his last three starts and five times total this season – equaling the total by the rest of the staff combined...his streak of three straight outings of at least 8.0IP is his longest since 7/13-23/08 w/MIL...is the second time he has recorded such a stretch in his career (also a career-high stretch of four straight outings from 8/12-29/06).

THE FIRST 50: Made his 50th start as a Yankee on 6/25 at Los Angeles-NL, recording the win in a 2-1 Yankees victory...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, only two other pitchers posted both as many wins and as many strikeouts over their first 50 starts with the Yankees: Ron Guidry (31-10, 347K) and David Cone (28-10, 374K).

CREATURE OF COMFORT: Is undefeated in his last 15 starts at Yankee Stadium – dating back to last year's All-Star break, posting an

11-0 record with a 2.03 ERA (106.2IP, 24ER) and a .187 opponents avg. (70-for-374)...the Yankees have gone 13-2 in those starts...according to *Elias*, is the longest active home winning streak in the Majors.

300 AND COUNTING: Made his 300th career start on 6/3 vs. Baltimore, becoming the youngest pitcher at the time of his 300th start since Dwight Gooden (age 29 years, 205 days on 6/9/94) and the youngest lefty since Fernando Valenzuela (age 29 years, 226 days on 6/15/90) – credit: *Elias*.

✦ The last pitcher with as many IP as a starter as Sabathia (1960.2) going into his 300th start was Pedro Martinez (2042.1 on 6/2/04)...the last pitcher with as many strikeouts as a starter as Sabathia (1,644) heading into his 300th career start was current teammate Javier Vazquez (1,662 on 6/11/07).

✦ Became the eighth pitcher to make his 300th career start with the Yankees since 1955, just the second such pitcher to win (also Jimmy Key in 1994) – credit: *Elias*.

✦ His career .627 (141-84) winning pct. was the third-highest among active pitchers through their first 300 career starts behind Tim Hudson (.655, 144-76) and teammate Andy Pettitte (.642, 156-87).

LEAN LEFT: Allowed a two-run home run to Baltimore's Luke Scott on 6/3 at Yankee Stadium...is the only HR he has surrendered to a left-handed batter at the current Yankee Stadium...snapped a streak of 37 consecutive *home* starts without allowing a homer to a left-handed batter, dating back to 4/5/08...has allowed 3HR to lefties in 2010, matching his total from all of last year.

ON THE OTHER HAND: Has held right-handed batters to a .212 batting average (69-for-325), marking the third-lowest average among Major League left-handed pitchers (Lester-.202 and Chen-.205).

FIVE ALIVE: Went 82-46 (.641) over the previous five seasons (2005-09), leading the Majors in wins and IP (1,113.1)...was also tied with Roy Halladay for the most SHO (9) and ranked third in strikeouts (990).

✦ Since his debut in 2001, has a 145-84 (.633) record, marking the most wins in the Majors...is second in shutouts (11) to only Roy Halladay (17), ranks third in complete games (30), fourth in strikeouts (1,679), fifth in IP (1,997.2), and tied for fifth with Jamie Moyer in games started (304).

YOUNG GUN: Leads all active Major League pitchers under the age of 30 in wins (146), strikeouts (1,683) and innings pitched (2005.2)...the last Major Leaguer to compile as many wins prior to his 30th birthday was Greg Maddux who won 151 games before turning 30.

CC SWEETNESS: According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Sabathia is the only pitcher in the Majors to start at least 34 games in each of the last three years (2007-09)...is looking to become the first pitcher to accomplish the feat in at least four straight seasons since Barry Zito (six years, 2001-06).

KEEP ON KEEPIN' ON: Has recorded at least 11 wins in each of his first nine seasons to begin his Major League career, marking the longest current such streak among active pitchers...with 19 wins in 2007, 17 wins in 2008 and 19 wins in 2009, became the first pitcher since Mike Mussina (2001-03) to win at least 17 games in three straight seasons (credit: *Elias*)...has accomplished the feat while pitching for three different clubs over the stretch (19-7 w/ CLE, 2007; 17-10 w/ CLE and MIL, 2008; and 19-8 w/ the Yankees, 2009), joining Randy Johnson (over two overlapping spans of three seasons from 1997-99 and 1998-2000 with SEA, HOU and ARZ) as the only pitchers to accomplish the feat in the last 100 years (Credit: *Elias*).

AMONG THE BEST: Owns a .635 career winning percentage (146-84), eighth-highest among lefthanders with at least 300 starts since 1900 and the sixth-highest among left-handers who began their careers since 1950.

✦ Among active Major League lefthanders, ranks second in ERA (3.60), third in wins (146), fourth in strikeouts (1,683), winning percentage (.635) and opponents batting average (.244), and fifth in innings pitched (2005.2) and starts (305).
