TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 7, 1937: At the fifth All-Star Game, Yankees 1B Lou Gehrig hits a home run and drives in four runs in the AL's 8-3 win.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 8, 2000: The Yankees and Mets play the first two-stadium, split doubleheader in nearly 100 years with the Yankees sweeping both games by the score of 4-2. Game 1 took place at Shea Stadium followed by Game 2 that night at Yankee Stadium. It marked the first day-night DH to take place in different venues since 9/7/1903 when the New York Giants and Brooklyn Superbas did it.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the finale a three-game series at Oakland in their second trip to the Bay Area this season...following tonight's game, will head to Seattle to play four games at Safeco Field from Thursday-Sunday, marking their final series before the All-Star break...this seven-game road trip is their final trip to the West Coast this season...wrapped up a six-game homestand – their final 'stand of the first half – on Sunday, going 1-2 vs. Seattle and 2-1 vs. Toronto.

Own the best record in Baseball (52-31, .627) and lead the AL East by +2.0G...is the team's best start since 2004 (also 52-31)...took over first place in the AL East on 6/20 for the first time since 4/21...are a season-high 21G over .500...are 20-7-1 in series in 2010, marking the most series wins in the Majors this season.

Have won three straight road games and nine of their last 12 away from Yankee Stadium...overall, have won four straight, five of their last six games, nine of their last 13, 11 of their last 16 and 18 of their last 27.

Became the Majors' first team to record 50 wins, doing so in their 81st game (on Sunday vs. Toronto)...marked the 11th time the franchise has won at least 50 games by the midway point (81 games) since the advent of the 162-game schedule in 1961...of the 10 prior times they have accomplished the feat (1961, '63, '76, '80, '87, '98, '99, 2002, '03 and '04), the team has advanced to the postseason nine times (all but '87), the World Series six times ('61, '63, '76, '98, '99, '03) and won the championship three times ('61, '98, '99).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees won their fourth straight game, defeating the Athletics, 6-1, at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...**3B Alex Rodriguez** (2-for-3) recorded his first multi-HR game of the year, including his 21st career grand slam...drove in five of the Yankees' six runs in the game...**LHP CC Sabathia** earned his team-high 11th win of the season, limiting the A's to 1ER in 7.0IP with a season-high 10K (7H, 3BB, 1WP).

SWEEPING SENSATION: The Yankees are looking to complete their fifth series sweep of the season and first on the road in 2010...will look to sweep the A's at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum in a series of at least three games for just the third time in the last 31 years (since 1980) – also 5/31-6/2/96 (3G) and 5/13-15/05 (3G).

ALEX THE GREAT: 3B Alex Rodriguez hit his 21st career grand slam in the third inning of Tuesday's win at Oakland...is now tied with Manny Ramirez and trails only Lou Gehrig (23) for the most slams all time...has 597 career HR and needs just 3HR to become the seventh player ever to reach 600HR...Sammy Sosa (609) is next on Baseball's all-time list.

Also hit a solo home run in Tuesday's win at Oakland, giving him his first multi-homer game of the season and 55th of his career, surpassing Manny Ramirez for most among active players.

Rodriguez leads the Majors with three grand slams this season, marking the fourth time in his career he has hit at least three slams in a season (also 1996, 1999, 2007)...*Elias* notes that Jimmie Foxx (1932, 1934, 1938, 1940) is the only other player in Major League history with four such seasons...is 7-for-13 with a Major League-leading 3HR and 24RBI in 2010 with the bases loaded in 2010...is batting .325 (27-for-83) with 8 doubles, 6HR and 54RBI with runners in scoring position.

Now owns 252HR as a Yankee, surpassing Graig Nettles (250) and tying Jorge Posada for seventh on the club's all-time list...reached 250HR in 963G as a Yankee...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, only Babe Ruth (250HR in first 774G w/ NYY) reached the total in fewer games as a Yankee.

LOCKED WHEN LOADED: The Yankees lead the Majors with nine grand slams (Cano, Gardner, Granderson, Posada-2, Rodriguez-3, Teixeira)...with the bases loaded this season, the Yankees are batting a Major League best .422 (43-for-102) with 5 doubles, 9HR, 12BB and 123RBI...the Yankees hit just three slams in 2009...are one shy of their club record set in 1987...last led the AL in GS in 2004 (9GS) and last led the Majors in 2003 (9GS).

According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the Yankees' nine grand slams are the most ever by a team before the All-Star break.

GOING STREAKING: With his win last night, **LHP CC Sabathia** has now won seven straight starts since 6/3 (7-0, 1.88 ERA, 52.2IP, 37H, 11ER, 17BB, 49K, .199 opp. avg.)...marks the second time in his career he has won seven consecutive starts (also 8/5-9/7/05 w/ Cleveland)...has become the first Yankee to earn a win in seven straight starts since Roger Clemens won eight in-a-row from 5/26-7/4/01.

With one start remaining prior to the All-Star break (Sunday at Seattle), is looking to become just the sixth Yankee since 1990 to win at least 12 games prior to the All-Star Game (also Jimmy Key, 13-2 in 1994; Andy Pettitte, 13-4 in 1996; David Cone, 12-2 in 1998; Roger Clemens, 12-1 in 2001; and Mike Mussina, 12-3 in 2002).

IN THE CLUTCH: **RHP Mariano Rivera** was selected as the winner of the "Major League Baseball Clutch Performer of the Month Award Presented by Pepsi" for June...Rivera went 2-0 with seven saves during June, tossing 13.0 scoreless innings over 11 appearances and allowing just 4H with 2BB and 16K.

COMEBACK KIDS: The Yankees lead the AL with 25 come-from-behind victories, trailing only the Cincinnati Reds (26)...the Yankees led the Majors with 51 come-from-behind wins in 2009.

"SEND SWISH": **OF Nick Swisher** is currently leading the 2010 All-Star Game Final Vote...fans may vote an unlimited amount of times at yankees.com through Thursday at 4:00 p.m. and be entered to win tickets to an upcoming Yankees game and a Swisher autographed baseball.

TEX MARKS THE SPOT: Over his last 17 games (since 6/18), **1B Mark Teixeira** has batted .308 (20-for-65) with 12R, 6 doubles, 4HR and 16RBI, hitting safely in 15 of the contests...has raised his average from .224 over the stretch...over the longer haul, has reached base safely (H, BB or HBP) in each of his last 27 games (since 6/6).

GETTING INTO DRIVE: SS Derek Jeter had 1RBI in Tuesday's win at Oakland, his first RBI since 6/12 vs. Houston when he drove in a season-high four runs...snapped a career-long streak of 19 consecutive games without driving in a run... according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, surpassed his longest previous RBI drought of 13 consecutive games from 7/16-30/04.

KEEP IT INTERNAL: LF Brett Gardner hit his second career inside-the-park HR in Sunday's win vs. Toronto (also on 5/15/09 vs. Minnesota)...has hit the Yankees' last two inside-the-park HRs...according to SABR's David Vincent, Gardner is the first player with multiple inside-the-park HRs as a Yankee since Mickey Rivers (1976-79).

✧ Homered in back-to-back games for the first time in his career (hit grand slam on Saturday vs. Toronto)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, became the first player to hit a grand slam and an inside-the-park home run in back-to-back games since Scott Rolen from 7/2-3/99 w/ Philadelphia vs. Chicago-NL...is batting .360 (31-for-86) with 17R, 2 doubles, 2 triples, 3HR, 14RBI and 11BB in 28 games since 5/31.

YANKEES STARS ALIGN: Seven Yankees have now been named to the 2010 American League All-Star team, the most selections for any team in the Majors...**2B Robinson Cano** (second career All-Star selection) and **SS Derek Jeter** (11th) were elected via the fan vote...**RHP Phil Hughes** (first) and **RHP Mariano Rivera** (11th) were selected through the "Player Ballot," though Rivera has now withdrawn from the game...**3B Alex Rodriguez** (13th) and **LHP CC Sabathia** (fourth) were chosen by AL Manager Joe Girardi in conjunction with Major League Baseball...**LHP Andy Pettitte** (third) was added to the roster on Tuesday after Boston's Clay Buchholz went on the disabled list, as the next highest ranking pitcher on the Player Ballot.

✧ This season marks the most All-Star selections for the franchise since eight Yankees were selected in 2004 (Giambi, Gordon, Jeter, Matsui, Rivera, Rodriguez, Sheffield, and Vazquez)...the four All-Star pitchers are the most for the team since 2001 (Clemens, Pettitte, Rivera and Stanton).

✧ **Jeter** and **Rivera** are the only players to be named to the All-Star team with their current team at least 11 times, according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...both players now tie Bill Dickey (11) for fifth-most All-Star selections in franchise history, trailing Mickey Mantle (20), Yogi Berra (18), Joe DiMaggio (13) and Elston Howard (12).

✧ According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, **Cano** and **Jeter** will look to join Willie Randolph and Bucky Dent (1980 and 1981) as the *only other Yankees 2B/SS combo to start an All-Star game together*.

OUT FRONT: The Yankees are 32-8 this season when scoring the game's first run, matching the St. Louis Cardinals (also 32-8) for the best mark in the Majors in such games.

FOUR GOODNESS' SAKE: The Yankees are 44-5 this season when holding their opponent to four-or-fewer runs (82-14 in 2009), but are just 8-26 (21-45 in 2009) when allowing five runs or more...are 41-2 when allowing three-or-fewer runs.

SECOND TO NONE: Among all Major League second basemen, **2B Robinson Cano** is first with 55RBI, tied for first with 16HR (w/ Florida's Dan Uggla), second with 110H and a .390 OBP, and tied for second with 59R...has reached safely in 74 of 83G in 2010 and started all but one team game at 2B...has 23RBI off LH, tied with Albert Pujols for most in the Majors and is second with 10HR (Pujols-11HR)...*Elias* notes he is the first Yankees left-handed hitter with at least 10HR off LHP in consecutive seasons since Reggie Jackson (1979-80).

JUMPIN' JULY: The Yankees have had 17 consecutive winning Julys (1993-2009), including a 18-9 (.667) mark in 2009...are 5-1 this July...according to *Elias Sports Bureau*, it marks the longest winning stretch of Julys in Major League history, breaking the previous record held by Pittsburgh (15 consecutive seasons, 1899-1913).

REHAB RUNDOWN: **RHP Sergio Mitre** (strained left oblique) made his first rehab appearance on Tuesday, starting and tossing 2.0 perfect innings and striking out five of his six batters faced in the GCL Yankees' 7-2 win vs. the GCL Tigers...**DH Nick Johnson** (inflamed right wrist tendon) has reported to the Yankees' minor league complex in Tampa to continue his rehab.

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will play the finale of a three-game series at the Athletics tonight, in their second trip to Oakland this year...took two of three from the A's here from 4/20-22...is the sixth of 10 games between the clubs in 2010, marking their most contests since 1999 (Yankees were 8-4)...went 7-2 vs. the A's in 2009, marking their sixth season series win in the 2000s and second straight...are 16-4 against the A's since the start of the 2008 season, including an eight-game win streak from 6/12/08-7/24/09, which was their most consecutive wins vs. the A's since 1993-94...are 35-18 (.660) against the A's since 2004, marking the highest winning percentage over the stretch by any AL team.

AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: The Yankees play the finale of a three-game series at Oakland tonight...are 4-1 at the Coliseum this season, winning the first two games of this series and taking two of the three from 4/20-22...have guaranteed their third straight non-losing road season series, and ninth in the last 13 years (since 1998)...their six games in Oakland in 2010 are their most since 2005 (went 5-1)...went 2-1 at Oakland in 2009...are 17-9 (.654) at the A's since the start of the 2004 season, marking the highest winning pct. by any AL team in Oakland over the span...had lost 11 of the previous 15 games there from 2001-03.

AT YANKEE STADIUM: The Yankees will welcome the A's to the Bronx for a four-game series from 8/30-9/2...went 5-1 at home against the A's in 2009 including a win in the first-ever night game at Yankee Stadium on 4/21...have won the home season series in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2004-05...have won eight of their last nine home games vs. the A's and are 18-9 vs. Oakland in the Bronx since 2004.

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will begin a four-game series vs. the Mariners on Thursday...is their second meeting this year after dropping two out of three at Yankee Stadium last week (6/29-7/1)...are playing seven games within a 13-day stretch...went 6-4 against Seattle in 2009, marking their seventh straight non-losing season series vs. the Mariners (since 2003)...have won 16 of their last 24 games against Seattle and are 29-19 vs. the Mariners since the start of the 2005 season.

AT SAFECO FIELD: The Yankees will make their lone trip to Seattle, playing a four-game series from Thurs.-Sun. to close out the first half...went 4-3 at Safeco Field in 2009, snapping a streak of three straight losing road season series...the Yankees' .588 win pct. (30-21) is the highest of any AL team all time at Safeco Field.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: RHP A.J. BURNETT (6-7, 4.90 ERA)

RHP A.J. Burnett, 33, will make his 18th start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...will be his eighth career start against the Athletics, second with the Yankees...**last started** on 7/2 vs. Toronto, tossing 6.2 scoreless IP and recording a no-decision in an 11-inning, 6-1 Yankees loss (4H, 3BB, 6K, 2WP, 1HP)...the no-decision snapped a streak of losing five *consecutive starts*, which tied for the longest such streak in his career (also five in-a-row from 8/24-9/14/05 w/ Florida)...also snapped a three-start streak of lasting 4.0-or-fewer IP (6/16-26)...was his longest scoreless start since tossing 7.0 scoreless IP on 4/17 vs. Texas...with five losses and one no-decision in his last six starts, is one loss shy of his career-high single-season losing streak of six set over his final seven starts of 2005 (8/24-9/25/05)...has allowed the first run of the game in 12 of his 17 starts this season...is in the second season of a five-year contract signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08.

LEAVING THE PAST BEHIND: Lost each of his five June starts, going 0-5 with an 11.35 ERA...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, became the first Yankee ever to have an ERA above 11.00 in a month in which he pitched at least 20.0 innings...lost *five consecutive starts* for the second time in his career (also 8/24-9/14/05 w/ Florida).

✎ *Elias* also notes that Burnett became the first Yankee to appear in five games and lose them all in a calendar month since Stan Bahnsen in April 1969...marked the fifth time Burnett has gone winless in a month in which he made at least five starts, second as a Yankee (also August 2009, 0-4, 6GS).

RING 'EM UP: Owns 1,551 career strikeouts, reaching the 1,500K mark in his 5/4 start vs. Baltimore – his 254th career appearance and 250th start – and 1,621st career inning pitched...among active pitchers, only Johan Santana reached 1,500 strikeouts in fewer innings pitched, doing so in just under 1,447.0IP.

MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Has held opponents without an earned run five times this season, tying the Angels' Jered Weaver and Boston's Clay Buchholz for the most such starts in the AL this season...among Major League hurlers, only Colorado's Ubaldo Jimenez (6) has made more starts in which he did not allow an earned run.
