ANGELS BRIEFING: Tonight the Halos play the fifth game (0-4) of a seven-game road trip to Chicago (0-4) and Oakland (7/9-11) leading up to the All-Star break...Angels have dropped five straight road games since winning 12 of 14 away from Anaheim...Halos are 11-5-1 over last 16 series played...With 1-0 loss yesterday, the Halos suffered their fourth road series sweep and second four-game sweep this season (May 3-6 at Boston)...Angels have dropped consecutive series for first time since April 30 – May 6 at Detroit and Boston...Angels are off to a 2-6 start in July after posting an 18-9 record in June...**Angels' are 25-16 since May 25th**...2010 marks the Angels' 50th season.

SHINING STAR: Since receiving his fourth career All Star selection on July 4, **Torii Hunter** has gone 9-for-17 (.529), reaching base in 12 of 20 plate appearances...Torii has reached base safely in 26 of his last 43 plate appearances (.605 on-base pct.) and leads the Halos with a .383 mark.

LOOKING FOR LUCKY NO. 7: Tonight's start **Joel Piñeiro** has won six consecutive appearances, dropping his ERA from 5.16 to 3.96...His six consecutive wins give him second longest active streak in the Majors behind C.C. Sabathia.

WORKING THEIR MAGIC: Yesterday, **Ervin Santana** tossed his third complete game of the season to bring the Halos' season total to eight, tied for most in the A.L. with Seattle.

LUMBER SLUMBER: Since scoring 11 runs with 14 hits on Independence Day, the Halos' offense has totaled just five runs on 22 hits in four games at Chicago...In past four games, the club is 4-for-29 (.138) with RISP...Halos have been denied an extra-base hit in three of last four games (occurred in just three of previous 84 games this season).

@ OAKLAND: Halos are visiting Oakland for second time this season...Club has posted a 10-3 record at the Coliseum since start of 2009...Angels are 10-4 in last 14 games vs. A's and 6-4 this season...**Angels have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003 (8-12)**...In the Angels six victories over Oakland this season, they have outscored the A's 35-9...Conversely, in their four losses, they have been outscored 10-35.

HOWIE ABOUT THAT: **Howie Kendrick** has hit safely in 10 consecutive road games, batting .452 (19/42) with 3 HR and 11 RBI...His 52 RBI rank second in the Majors by a second baseman to **Robinson Cano** (55)...**Kendrick** has 32 RBI his last 40 games.

DYNAMIC DUO: In four games at Chicago, **Torii Hunter** and **Howie Kendrick** posted a combined .481 batting average (13/27), accounting for 13 of the Angels' 22 hits in the series.

TOP OF THE CHARTS: **Jered Weaver** leads the A.L. with 130 strikeouts (2nd in Majors behind Lincecum, 131) and a 10.2 SO/9 IP ratio...He has 34 K's and four walks over his last four outings...Weaver is on pace to become just the second Angel hurler since 2000 with 200+ K's (E. Santana in 2008)...**The last Angel pitcher to lead the Majors in strikeouts was Nolan Ryan in 1977 (341).**

READ ALL ABOUT IT: In this week's issue of *ESPN The Magazine*, the "2010 Ultimate Standings" reveal **Mike Scioscia** as the "Ultimate Skipper" in all of sports and the Angels' as the top overall franchise in MLB... On the cover of *Baseball America* is the Angels' 2009 First Round Draft pick **Mike Trout (OF)** who has quickly ascended as one of the top prospects in all of minor league baseball.

ROAD WARRIORS: Angels are 16-10 in last 26 road games, outscoring opponents 107-84 in the span...Halos tied Phillies for MLB-lead with 48 road wins in 2009...**Since 2004, Angels have the best road record in baseball at 297-233 (.560) while the Phillies rank second in the span (284-243; .539).**

NOW YOU KNOW: Angels have outscored opponents 53-33 in the first inning this season (+20).

GOING DEEP: Halos' starting pitchers lead the Majors in innings pitched (548).

JULY GUYS: Five Angels celebrate birthdays in July: **Rivera** (7/3), **Kendrick** (7/12), **Hunter** (7/18), **Shields** (7/22) & **Jepsen** (7/26).

HARD TO FAN: **Kevin Frandsen** has struck out just twice over his last 103 plate appearances and just five times in 119 plate appearances since his debut on May 8th (fewest in MLB in the span).

FAST FACTS: **Angels are 25-14 in games played from Friday-Sunday** compared to 21-28 from Monday-Thursday...Angels are 14-10 in one-run games...**Halos are 23-15 since losing Kendry Morales to injury**...In the Halos' 46 victories, the club has hit .322 (135/419) with RISP...In the 41 losses, Angels are 55 for 298 (.185).

GETTING STARTED: Since inflating to a 5.23 ERA on May 6th, **Angels' starting pitchers have fashioned a 3.88 ERA (363.2 IP – 157 ER) ERA over the last 59 games**...Starters have allowed three earned runs or less in 46 of last 68 contests.

JEKYLL AND HYDE:

- In Angels' 46 wins, starters have a **2.10 ERA** (313.1 IP – 73 ER) with 89 walks, 248 strikeouts, a .213 avg. against (244/1147) and 22 HRs allowed.
- In Angels' 42 losses, starters have a **7.08 ERA** (235 IP – 185 ER) with 95 walks, 169 strikeouts, a .315 average against (307/973) and 42 HRs allowed.

THIS N' THAT: 18 times in the last 35 games an Angel starter has held the opponent to two earned runs or less...Angels have connected for four grand slams this year (were only team in MLB without a slam in 2009)...**Halos' average home attendance of 39,534 is second in A.L. to Yankees (45,600)**...Angels are 35-13 when they score first...Halos lead A.L. with six walk-off wins...**Angels have held a lead at some point in 18 of 42 losses**...Angels have used 69 different lineups in 88 games...Halos pitchers have walked 314 batters, 2nd most in A.L...**Angels will fly the most air miles in 2010 (50,509), while the Chicago White Sox will fly the fewest (22,832)**...Angel relievers rank 11th in A.L. with a 4.65 ERA...From 2000-2009, the bullpen had the best ERA in the A.L. (3.71) and 2nd best in MLB in the decade (LAD - 3.63).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

July 9

(1971) Angels fell to the Oakland A's, 1-0 in 20 innings, setting a club record for the longest extra-inning game in club history; (2007) Vladimir Guerrero wins the Home Run Derby in San Francisco hitting 17 homers and beating Toronto's Alex Rios 3-2 in the final round...He is the third Angel to win the derby...Guerrero's home runs averaged 435 feet, the longest of any of the eight participants.

- **Is playing in 14th professional season, seeking first ML hit.**
- One of standout performers with Halos in 2010 Spring Training (.395; 15/38, 3 2B, 2 3B & 2 HR)...Angels are fifth organization he has played for (Braves, Royals, Mets & White Sox).
