ANGELS BRIEFING: The 2010 MLB All Star Game is two days away...Today the Halos play the final game (1-5) of a seven-game road trip to Chicago (0-4) and Oakland (1-1) leading up to the All-Star break...Last night, the Halos suffered their most lopsided loss of the season (1-15) and today will seek to avoid dropping three consecutive series for first time this season...Angels have not lost three consecutive series since July 17-25, 2007 (TB, Minn., Oak.)...Halos are 11-5-1 over last 16 series played...Angels are off to a 3-7 start in July after posting an 18-9 record in June... Angels' are 26-16 since May 25th...2010 marks the Angels' 50th season.

<u>THE WAIT IS OVER:</u> Last night, **Cory Aldridge** connected for his first career base hit; an RBI triple in the eighth inning...Aldridge is playing in his 14th professional season and had appeared in 1,364 minor league games and 12 big league games tallying 4,873 at-bats in pro ball before recording his first hit.

FIRST HALF RECAP: The Halos will enter the All-Star break out of first place for the first time since 2006 when they were third in the West with a 43-35 record...Last season, Halos were 49-37 in the first half and held a 1.5 game lead atop the A.L. West...Despite their success this decade, the Angels have entered the All Star break in first place in just four of the last 11 seasons.

<u>SHINING STAR:</u> Since receiving his fourth career All Star selection on July 4, **Torii Hunter** has gone 10-for-22 (.454), reaching base in 16 of 27 plate appearances...<u>Torii has reached base safely in 30 of his</u> last 50 plate appearances (.600 on-base pct.) and leads the Halos with a .384 mark.

<u>@ OAKLAND:</u> Halos are visiting Oakland for second time this season...<u>Club has posted a 11-4 record at the Coliseum since start of 2009</u>...Angels are 11-5 in last 16 games vs. A's and 7-5 this season...**Angels have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003 (8-12)**...<u>In the Angels seven victories over</u> Oakland this season, they have outscored the A's 41-14. .. Conversely, in their five losses, they have been outscored 11-50.

UP NEXT VS. SEATTLE: Halos are 7-2 against M's in 2010 with a 3-1 mark at Angel Stadium...The club has not dropped a season series to the Mariners since an 8-11 mark in 2003; the club is 76-47 vs. Seattle during that span.

<u>HOWIE ABOUT THAT:</u> Howie Kendrick has hit safely in 11 of last 12 road games, batting .400 (20/50) with 3 HR and 11 RBI...His 52 RBI rank second in the Majors by a second baseman to Robinson Cano (55)...Kendrick has 32 RBI his last 42 games.

<u>DYNAMIC DUO:</u> In four games at Chicago, **Torii Hunter** and **Howie Kendrick** posted a combined .481 batting average (13/27), accounting for 13 of the Angels' 22 hits in the series.

TOP OF THE CHARTS: Today's starter Jered Weaver ranks third in the Majors with 130 strikeouts (F. Hernandez and Lincecum, 131) and a 10.2 SO/9 IP ratio...He has 34 K's and four walks over his last four outings...Weaver is on pace to become just the second Angel hurler since 2000 with 200+ K's (E. Santana in 2008)...The last Angel pitcher to lead the *Majors* in strikeouts was Nolan Ryan in 1977

READ ALL ABOUT IT: In this week's issue of **ESPN The Magazine**, the "2010 Ultimate Standings" reveal **Mike Scioscia** as the "Ultimate Skipper" in all of sports and the Angels' as the top overall franchise in MLB... On the cover of **Baseball America** is the Angels' 2009 First Round Draft pick **Mike** Trout (OF) who has quickly ascended as one of the top prospects in all of minor league baseball.

NOW YOU KNOW: Angels have outscored opponents 55-33 in the first inning this season (+22).


