ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and 10 of the last 16 games after losing 10 of the previous 12 contests...are in third place in the American League West and trail Texas by eight games...finished the month of May in first place in the AL West and had a one-game lead with a 28-24 record...have gone 16-22 since then while Texas has logged a 26-14 record and Los Angeles 23-17...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 26 days in second, one day tied for second, 38 days in third and one day in fourth...are 22-30 against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 22-16 against teams that were below .500...are 13-17 in the first game of a series, 11-18 in the second game and 17-9 in the third game.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 67 of 82 (81.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the American League and second best in the majors (PHI, 84.3%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...have a record of 30-14 when stealing a base and are 14-32 with no stolen bases...the A's pitching staff ranks second in the majors with 16 pickoffs (CWS, 18).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 57 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (58, HOU and SEA)...have hit more than two home runs in a game just twice (4 on June 3 at BOS and 3 on July 10 vs. LAA)...are on pace to hit 103 home runs...the three lowest single season home run totals in Oakland history in a non-strike season are 94 (1968), 100 (1978) and 108 (1979)...the A's pitching staff has allowed 93 home runs, which is tied for fourth most in the American League.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 20-10 (.667) record in day games compared to 24-36 (.400) at night...are tied with New York for the second best day record in the American League (Chicago, 20-9) and have the second worst night record (Baltimore, 19-44)...have a 2.79 ERA (83 er in 267.2 ip) during the day and a 4.33 ERA (256 er in 532.0 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 in this three-game series at Kansas City...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are now 18-26 (.409) on the road compared to 26-20 (.565) at home...have a 4.72 ERA (199 er in 379.2 ip) on the road compared to a 3.00 ERA (140 er in 420.0 ip) at home...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 62 home runs on the road and 31 at home...have yielded the most home runs in the AL on the road and are tied for the fewest at home...starting pitchers are 13-16 with a 4.52 ERA (125 er in 249.0 ip) on the road compared to 19-14 with a 3.00 ERA (95 er in 285.1 ip) at home...the A's went 2-4 on the last homestand against New York (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-1)...return home following the game on Sunday for a six-game homestand against Boston (three games) and Chicago (three games).

OFFENSE: The A's are tied for the American League lead in triples (21) and rank second in sacrifice hits (30)...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.382), the third fewest walks (267) and extra base hits (233) and the fourth fewest runs scored (374)...are on pace for 483 walks and have walked fewer than 500 times in a non-strike season just three times in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979)

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff leads the American League in shutouts (9) and fewest hit batters (16), ranks third in ERA (3.82) and fourth in opponents batting average (.248)...A's starting pitchers are 9-5 with a 2.76 ERA (39 er in 127.0 ip) over the last 20 games and now have a 3.71 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the AL...rank second in opponents batting average (.245).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 13-9 (.591) in one-run decisions, which is the third best record in the American League, but are 6-11 (.353) in games decided by two runs...have lost seven of their last 10 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...are 3-5 (.375) in extra inning games, which is third worst in the AL...have lost four straight extra inning games after winning three of their first four.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 23 (.217) but they are batting .278 (15 for 54) with six walks, three home runs and 11 RBI for the season...lead the American League in home runs, are tied for second in RBI and rank fourth in batting average...the 15 pinch hits are already the A's second best total over the last six seasons (had 16 in 2008)...the three home runs match their combined total from 2005-09...A's pinch hitters combined for a .173 average over the previous six seasons.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 43-46 record, the second consecutive season they had a losing record at the break (were 37-49 last year)...this marks the first time the A's have gone into the break with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since 1996-99 when it happened in four consecutive seasons...have lost the first series after the All-Star Break in each of the previous three seasons...went into the break with 21 triples, which are the most by an A's team before the break since 1977 (also 21) and tied for third most in Oakland history...stole 65 bases, which are their most at the break since 1998 (71)...averaged 4.146 runs per game, which is the lowest mark since 1980 (4.0)...had 29 sacrifice hits, which are the most by an A's team before the break since the 1998 club had 30.

ALL-STARS: The A's had two All-Stars, 22-year old Trevor Cahill and 26-year old Andrew Bailey, marking the first time Oakland had two All-Star selections since 2004 (Mulder and Hudson)...it was Cahill's first All-Star selection and Bailey's second...Cahill is the A's youngest All-Star since Ben Grieve in 1998 (also 22) and the second youngest Oakland pitcher to Vida Blue in 1972 (21).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 17 times this year, matching the season total from last year...have used the DL 81 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the 17 players have combined to miss 710 games (41.8 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at nine (Anderson, Braden, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

A's vs. ROYALS

The A's defeated the Royals in the first of nine games against them...Oakland has already finished the season series with Baltimore and Detroit and has yet to play Chicago...the A's won the season series from Kansas City last year, 6-2...went 4-1 in Oakland and 2-1 in Kansas City...are 18-18 against the Royals over the previous four seasons...all-time, the A's are 286-236 against the Royals...that breaks down to 158-104 in Oakland and 128-132 in Kansas City...including 108-116 at Kauffman Stadium.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded the 44th save of his career last Sunday, which ties him for seventh on the Oakland career list...has not allowed a run in 10 of his past 12 appearances (1.38 ERA, 2 er in 13.0 ip).

Daric Barton ranks tied for first in the American League with 11 sacrifice hits.

Coco Crisp has either scored or driven in a run in 17 of his 19 games this year.

Cliff Pennington is batting .413 (33 for 80) over his last 25 games...is tied for second in the American League in triples (6).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1934, Bob Johnson, Jimmie Foxx and Pinky Higgins hit consecutive home runs in the fourth inning but the A's lose to St. Louis, 7-4.

In 1969, Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-2 A's win at Seattle against the Pilots...he would duplicate the feat later in the season on September 30, also against Seattle.

In 1974, Sal Bando singles in the A's 2-0 win at Baltimore for the 1000th hit of his major league career.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season...the A's are 11-4 (.733) in his starting assignments this year and are 27-20 (.574) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 11 of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in opponents batting average (.206), third in opponents on-base percentage (.273), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.326), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.750), eighth in ERA (2.94) and tied for 11th in wins (9).

LAST 11 STARTS: Is 8-1 with a 2.49 ERA (20 er in 72.1 ip) and .193 (49 for 254) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts...went 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA and .244 opponents average over his first four starts...included during his current stretch was a career high seven-game winning streak from May 21 to July 1...posted a 2.12 ERA and held the opposition to a .194 batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

WINS: Has a team-leading nine wins, all of which have come since the start of May...had 10 wins in his rookie season of 2009...the only pitcher in Oakland history to win at least 10 games in each of the first two seasons of his career is Tim Hudson (1999-2000)...only seven players have done it in franchise history (Hudson, Jim Nash, Bob Hooper, Lefty Grove, Weldon Henley, Chief Bender and Eddie Plank)...his 19 career wins are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 23rd birthday.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .199 (33 for 166) batting average, which is the lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .189 (18 for 95) with four walks (.222 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is fourth lowest in the AL and the batting average is seventh lowest...has yielded a .133 (16 for 120) batting average the first time through the lineup, .221 (27 for 122) the second time through and .276 (27 for 98) after that...his mark the first time through the lineup is third lowest in the AL.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed a first inning run July 1 at Baltimore, snapping a 15-start stretch dating back to last year where he did not allow a run in the first inning...has a 0.60 ERA (1 er in 15.0 ip) and .087 (4 for 46) opponents batting average in the first inning this year and has a 1.91 (10 er in 47.0 ip) career ERA in the first...this year, he has a 2.25 ERA (15 er in 60.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 4.11 ERA (16 er in 35.0 ip) after that.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 10 home runs in 95.0 innings this year (0.95 per nine innings after allowing 27 in 178.2 innings last year (1.36 per nine innings)...set an Oakland rookie record for home runs last year...has allowed eight of his 10 home runs this year on the road...last year, he surrendered 20 home runs at home to set a Coliseum record...eight of his 10 home runs have been hit by right-handers after yielding 21 of his 27 home runs in 2009 to lefties

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but was ineligible to pitch as he started on the Sunday before the game...his age of 22 years, 134 days on the date of the game made him the youngest Athletic to be named to an All-Star team since Ben Grieve in 1998 (22 years, 64 days)...he is the second youngest Oakland pitcher to Vida Blue, who was 21 years and 350 days in 1971.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 30 and allowed eight runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings in a start that day at Toronto...then went 4-1 with a 1.96 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in six starts in May and 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in five starts in June...ranked fourth in the American League in ERA in May, tied for fifth in wins and tied for seventh in opponents batting...was eighth in opponents batting in June...is 2-1 with a 3.15 ERA (7 er in 20.0 ip) and .181 (13 for 69) opponents batting average over his first three starts in July.

THE DISABLED LIST: Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a stress reaction in his left scapula...made one rehab start for Triple-A Sacramento on April 19 and was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento the next day...it was his first career stint on the DL.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's final game before the All-Star Break, a 5-2 win over Los Angeles last Sunday in Oakland...blanked the Angels on one hit, a walk and a hit batter over the first four innings before allowing an unearned run in the fifth...Frandsen reached on a Pennington error and scored on a Mathis RBI single...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings.

CAHILL vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 2-0 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 3 hr) in two career starts, both last year in Oakland...the first win came in a 12-3 A's victory on May 12...the A's scored a run in the first and seven in the second and he blanked the Royals on four hits and two walks over the first four innings before allowing a leadoff home run to Crisp in the fifth inning...also allowed a solo home run to Jacobs in the sixth...also picked up the victory in a 10-4 decision on September 2...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on a DeJesus RBI double, a Callaspo RBI ground out and a Jacobs solo home run...those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (8.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 8 so) and .226 (7 for 31) opponents batting average in two starts with Sacramento...his opponents average included a .200 (2 for 10) mark against left-handed pitching and .238 (5 for 21) against right-handers...opponents were 1 for 12 (.083) with runners in scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Vin Mazzaro (4-2, 3.81 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th appearance and ninth start of the season...the A's are 4-4 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and 10-15 (.400) in his career...is 3-2 with a 3.12 ERA (15 er in 43.1) and .234 (37 for 158) opponents batting average in seven starts since June 8 when he replaced the injured Brett Anderson in the starting rotation...is 3-2 with a 3.69 ERA (19 er in 46.1 ip) and .231 (39 for 169) opponents batting average in eight starts and 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) and .409 (18 for 44) opponents average in three relief appearances...in his last start, had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss to Los Angeles on July 9 in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against the Royals, a 9-4 A's win at Kansas City on August 7, 2009 (5.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

12-16, 4.04 ERA (265.1 ip, 255 h, 128 r, 119 er, 113 bb, 235 so, 37 hr) Save/Save Opportunities: 20/28 (71.4%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 15 of the past 18 games and now has a 3.02 ERA (15 er in 44.2 ip) over that span...has allowed seven runs in 29.1 innings (2.15 ERA) in 11 games in June (22 h, 10 bb, 29 so)...ranks second in the American League in home runs allowed (37) and losses (16), is third in strikeouts (235), fourth in hits allowed (255), fifth in innings pitched (265.1) and is tied for seventh in wins (12)...has nine save opportunities over the last 31 games and 28 for the season, which the second fewest in the American League (Cleveland and Detroit, 27)...has a 3.01 ERA (45 er in 134.2 ip) at home compared to a 5.10 ERA (74 er in 130.2 ip) on the road.

- Earned his 44th career save last Sunday, which ties him for seventh place in Oakland history (Koch, Foulke).
- Has not allowed a run in 10 of his past 12 appearances (1.38 ERA, 2 er in 13.0 ip)...has a 1.70 ERA for the season, which is ninth lowest among American League relievers.
- Has a 1.29 ERA (3 er in 21.0 ip) in Oakland and a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) on the road...has allowed two of his three home runs on the road.
- Has yielded a .162 (6 for 37) batting average with runners in scoring position.
- Has two saves in three career appearances against Kansas City (3.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so).
- Was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team and appeared in the game for the first time...entered the game in the seventh inning with a runner on second and two outs...walked Furcal but then struck out Phillips to end the inning.
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).
